The USD113 Parents As Teachers Program continues to serve families throughout the district. This is a valuable program that is available to ALL families with children under the age of 5 years, which makes this program unique.

We offer Personal Visits with the families to discuss various developmental topics, child development, and questions or concerns parents may have. An activity is included for each child to do at the visit, and for continued learning between visits. Screenings are completed annually for all children. These include the Ages and Stages Questionnaires, Health record, vision and hearing screenings. Group Connections are held at the SES Preschool room and are open to the public. And finally, we strive to connect families to Resources in the community and beyond. Referrals are made based on screenings, and any concerns or needs of the family.

The included data is from July 1, 2023 to March 5, 2024. These numbers will continue to change (increase) until the end of the program year, June 30, 2024.
