Upcoming / Current Projects

Taylorsville High auditorium house lighting replacement is complete. We conducted a punch walk with the designer and identified two remaining items to be addressed. All other work has been completed. Training for maintenance staff and school personnel was held mid-January.

Taylorsville High wing addition is in design.

Magna STEAM Academy is scheduled to be complete by mid-2026. The solar panel system is the final piece of the project.

Brockbank Junior STEM remodel is in punch list stage. The security glazing has been installed and will be ready for inspection after the required 30-day curing period. All remaining work is anticipated to be complete by mid-February. The fire alarm system is now complete, with only a few minor punch list items remaining.



Upcoming / Current Projects

Skyline High Auditorium abatement is scheduled to be complete by late February. On the interior of the building, the ceiling work is complete, and crews are working on the lower balcony ceiling. East side classrooms are also in progress. On the exterior, about 1/3 of the A1 panels on the south side have been completed. Crews are working on the north end and will move to the east side once that area is finished.

Mountain View Corridor air quality project (tree planting) is complete. The extended warranty has been completed.

Carbon monoxide detection and fire alarm replacement projects are under final review by designer prior to bid.

This year's "Top 10" projects have been funded and are awaiting design selection.



Upcoming / Current Projects

HVAC projects are progressing as follows:

- Bacchus Elementary boiler replacement is complete.
- Bridger Elementary chiller replacement has begun and is on schedule to be complete this spring.
- GEC Annex air handling unit replacement is 90% complete. The air handler was installed over winter break. The contractor is finalizing the controls and will follow up with training for GSD Maintenance Staff.
- Walker Elementary commissioning is progressing.
- Cyprus High commissioning of air handling units is 15% complete. All 8 air handlers have been commissioned with adjustments needed. The commissioning agent has been working with the General Contractor for start-up and balance reports of the remaining mechanical equipment. The commissioning agent will also collaborate with the controls contractor to expedite the process.

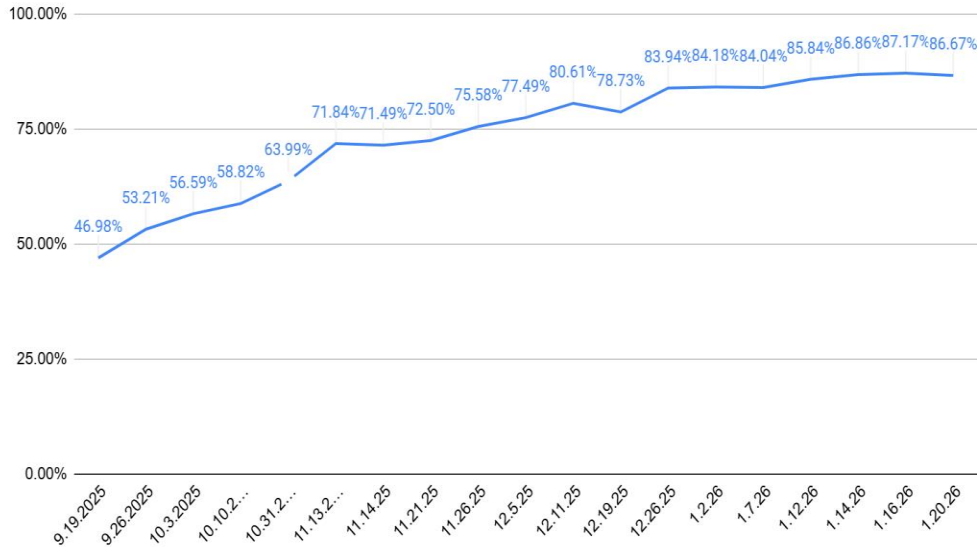

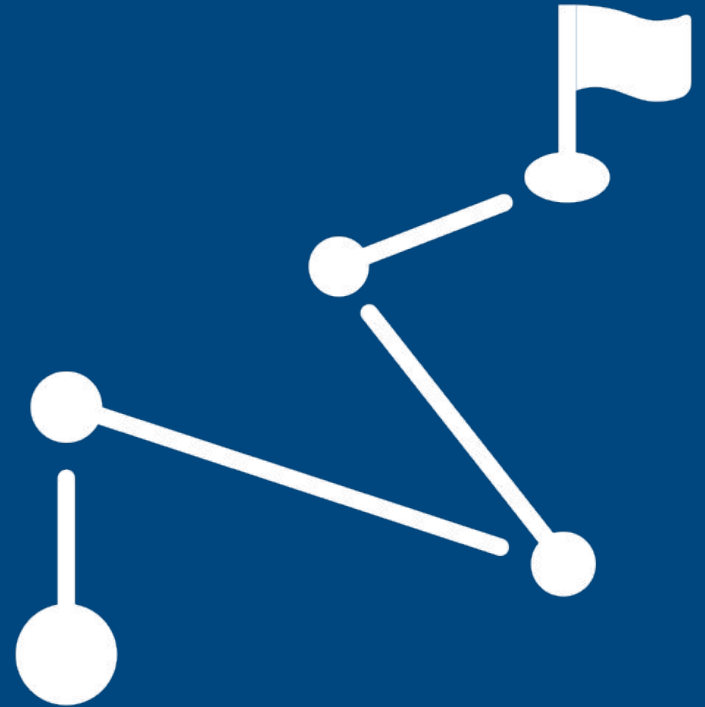

Instructional Material Definitions SB55

- **Learning Material**- material or resource used to deliver or support a student's learning.
- **Instructional Material**- material that a local school board adopts and approves for use with the LEA.
- **Supplemental Material**- material an educator selects for classroom use and a local school board has not considered, adopted, approved, or prohibited for classroom use within the LEA.



Instructional Material Definitions (Granite)

- **Instructional Material that Requires Board Review**
 - **Core** Instructional Material - Instructional materials are acquired through a large-scale adoption process, which is budgeted for through the formal textbook adoption cycle.



Instructional Material Acquisition SB55

Local school board shall -

- Make instructional material that the school district uses readily accessible and available for parent view.
- Establish an open process, involving educators and parents of students enrolled in the LEA to review and recommend instructional materials for board approval.



Instructional Material Acquisition SB55

- Post the recommended learning material online and in the C&I department to allow for review and comment by parents and patrons.
- Before adopting the recommended instructional material, hold at least two public meetings on the recommendation providing opportunity for opinion.
- Adopts or approves the instructional materials in an open board meeting.

Instructional Material Rationale

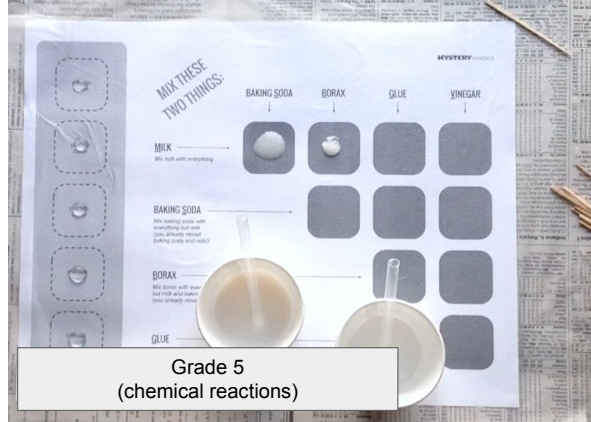
- **Aligned Curriculum:** K-5 program fully aligned to Utah SEEd Standards.

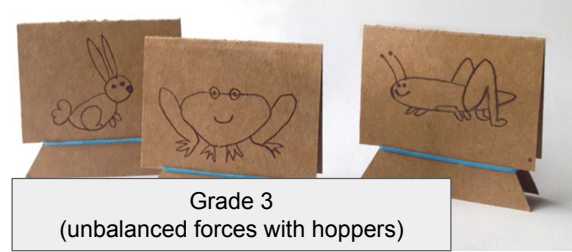

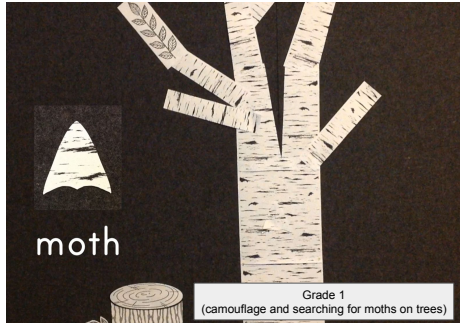

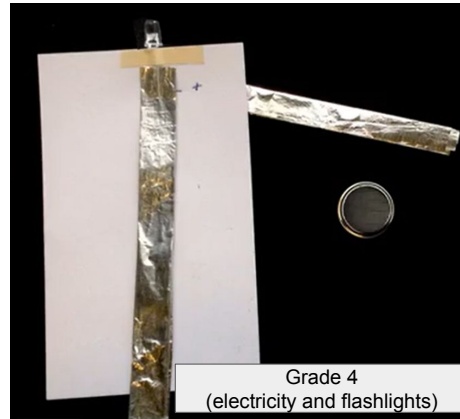

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

Strategic Plan Update

Dr. Joan Bramble, Organizational Effectiveness Director and Amber Clayton, School Leadership and Improvement Director gave a report on the strategic plan. Their report focused on leading and lagging indicators for academic and talent development priorities. The annual assessment report will be presented in February.

Audit Report

Todd Hauber introduced Matt Geddes, Squire & Company auditor, who briefly summarized the fiscal year 2025 audit and compliance reports. The opinion they issued is that the district's financial position presents fairly in all material respects. Review of financial statements finds the information contained to be accurate and reliable. There were no findings of material weakness or significant deficiencies in internal controls. The compliance audit reviewed Title I and Special Education programs. Special Education programs received a clean opinion. For Title I there was a qualified opinion, the only compliance exception was regarding transfer students. One school was missing required documentation of where students were transferring to. A corrective action plan was identified, and the district is working on that plan. Finally, the district complied with all material respects with the compliance requirements outlined in the State Auditor compliance guide.

Todd Hauber then acknowledged Chris Lewis, Accounting Director, whose leadership results in these positive outcomes. Taxpayer dollars are well taken care of under his guidance and the work of his team. The 2025 annual financial report is available on the Granite School District website.

Taylorsville City Taxing Entity Committee Presentation

Todd Hauber introduced Dina Blaes, Chief of Strategic Engagement for Taylorsville City, who presented information about the RDA of Taylorsville Taxing Entity Committee (TEC). The city is requesting to extend an urban renewal project area. The project area covers 65.11 acres at 5400 S and Bangerter Highway. The city plans a required sewer upgrade for redevelopment, residential development of 600 units on 16.5 acres, property acquisition, building façade improvements, improved circulation on public roadway, and mixed-use development opportunities. If approved the tax collection period would extend from 2029 to 2038 with a cap of \$22,010,037, inclusive of what has been collected through tax year 2024.

Todd Hauber reviewed the rubric used to evaluate these requests, the outcome evaluated this project neutral for Granite School District. Historically Granite has not supported residential development, however a policy shift may be warranted since we are experiencing declining enrollment instead of growth.

Board member Clarke Nelson and Todd Hauber are designated to represent Granite's interests on this proposal, they will be voting. Board members can contact them if they have input or questions.

STUDY ITEMS:

Strategic Use of Technology

Dr. Noelle Converse, Curriculum and Instruction Director and Chris Larsen, Educational Technology Director, presented an overview of digital technology use during instruction. Effective frameworks are in place for technology integration. Digital technology coaches provide technology integration coaching, co-teaching, professional learning and support to all teachers. Technology is a tool to extend, enhance and engage student learning. Programs provide diagnostic assessment tools to efficiently evaluate student learning. Several examples of lessons that incorporate effective technology use in Granite schools were shown. The average time (device powered on) our students spend on a Chromebook during the school day is 71 minutes.

Board discussion:

President McDermott asked about the effectiveness of I Ready and its impact on proficiency.

Julie Jackson hears from parents who believe their students are on electronic devices all the time. She worries we are losing students because we insist on using technology. Some schools limit or completely remove technology from the classroom. There is research showing that technology is harmful to learning and development.

Connie Burgess appreciates teachers who work hard to use digital technology appropriately.

Kim Chandler thanked those who facilitated this discussion. She was looking for more information from parent's perspective. Why do we believe that the way we are using technology is the best and right way to use it? She is concerned about data collection and mining. It is difficult for parents to review digital curriculum. Gamification of learning is an issue that leads students to want to be entertained. She has observed classrooms where students only sit at a computer. She is not convinced that technology is helping our students to learn, it impedes learning. Let's explore how we can provide an alternative for parents who want no tech classrooms.

Karyn Winder said there was more information in the presentation than board members could use. It is more helpful to have highlights and takeaways to determine if use of digital technology in the classroom is effective. She hears from parents who support responsible use of technology in classrooms and do not want these tools completely removed. Karyn requested more information about how many minutes kids are on technology devices in each school.

Kris Nguyen appreciated the amount of information provided in the presentation. She asked if the amount of time on devices is what we expect and consider appropriate.

President McDermott summarized next steps to provide additional information to the Board. Gather data regarding Chromebook use by school. Survey parents and students regarding effectiveness and the amount of time technology is used in classrooms. Evaluate the research that asserts technology is hurting development and learning. Identify sources for analog textbooks. Consider how we can serve parents who do not want tech in the classroom.

Payroll Adjustment 2026-2027

Todd Hauber explained a proposal to change the timing of the 24 equal pay schedule cycle. This change better synchronizes pay dates with contract terms. When the District shifted from a monthly pay day to a semi-monthly pay day it caused all 12-month employees to be paid in advance of the actual reporting period. This practice needs to be corrected. A draft payday schedule for 2026-2027 was presented. By staggering paydays in July and August it will ease the transition for employees. Association leaders continue to meet with leadership to identify challenges and support needed. An opt-in 25 pay period schedule will be available to help affected employees with payment timing. Information about the change will be communicated to employees in advance of it taking effect. The pay day adjustment may trigger a need to update the Board policy on payment of salaries.

Regarding the additional flooring amounts found in the abatement of the Skyline High Auditorium Building prior to demolition.

The original NESHAP inspection and report called out the location of asbestos containing material (ACM) vinyl tile and mastic in the black box theater room and offices in the choral and band rooms. We also indicated in the yellow sections that there was a possibility of ACM floor mastic underneath the carpet in the auditorium and in the choral and band rooms. We were not permitted to do extensive, destructive testing because of complaints from the drama, choral and band teachers.

The paper layer on the risers in the choral and band rooms were only found after a hole was cut into the wooden risers to see if there was any flooring underneath. In the process, we found a black paper layer that was adhered to the carpet layer in a very uncommon installation. This material would not have been found without a very destructive inspection.

While we strive to ensure all materials are found prior to a project being bid, we are limited by any restrictions for destructive testing.



Granite School District Board of Education:

Thank you for your ongoing support for Granite School District’s Comprehensive School Counseling Program. The program was first approved by the GSD Board of Education in April 1992. Each school year, College and Career Readiness leaders report to the Board as an information or consent agenda item to meet the requirement outlined in the Utah State Board of Education Rule 277-462-4 (i) to *provide evidence of LEA governing board approval of the program*. Last spring each of our school counseling teams were evaluated through the State Office of Education review process. Each school team demonstrated evidence of the implementation of a comprehensive school counseling program to USBE specialists. We are honored to report that school counseling departments in all secondary schools met USBE and GSD counseling program components and requirements and have qualified to receive annual funding appropriated by the Utah State Legislature since 1998.

GSD’s Comprehensive School Counseling Program:

- Aligns with the district’s strategic plan, Board goals, and essential practices that support student achievement.
- Reaches every student through individual planning, classroom instruction, and responsive services.
- Utilizes data to identify achievement gaps and monitor student outcomes and program implementation.

GSD school counselors focus on outcomes. The data chart below captures a five-year look at our aggregate progress toward college and career readiness indicators for graduating seniors. School counselors are integral to these measures as they deliver a comprehensive program of services to all secondary students through individual college and career readiness planning meetings (CCR-Plan), classroom instruction, and responsive services (social skills and dispositions support).

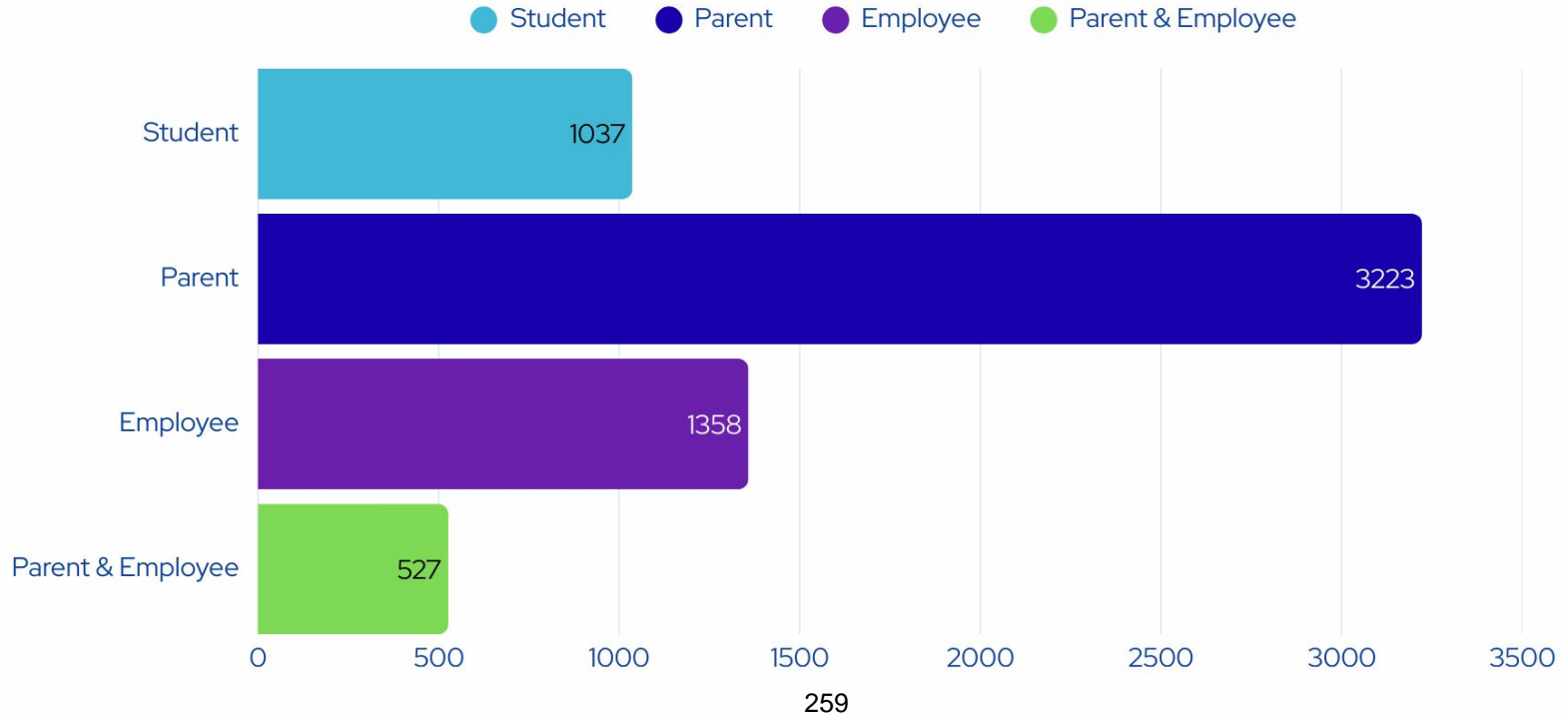

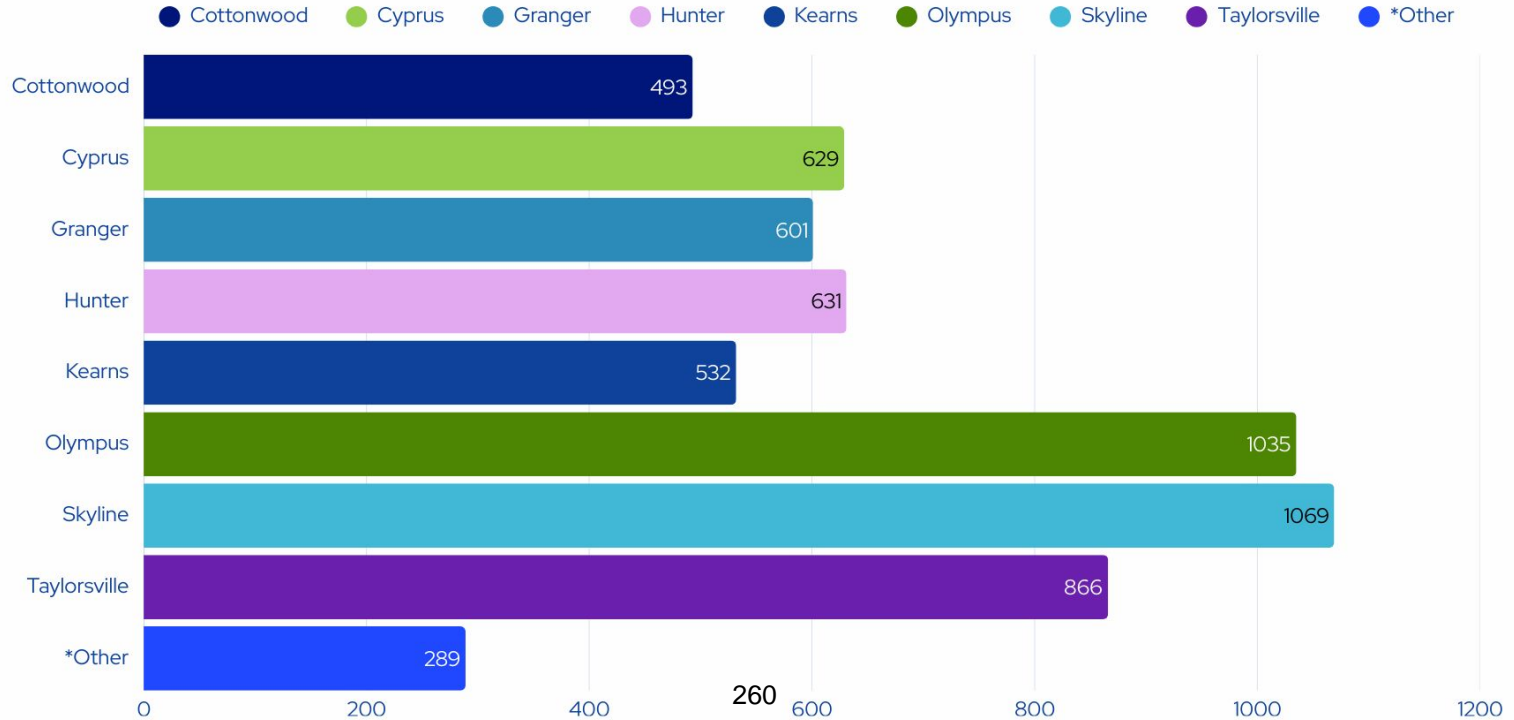

Relationship to Granite



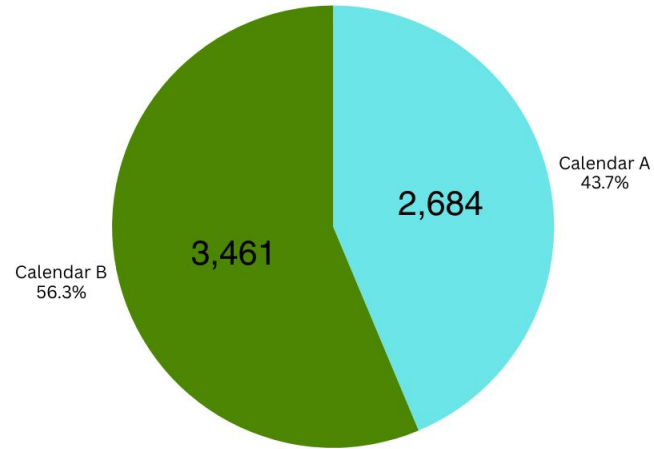
Total Responses by Network

Themes from free response comments:

- **Strong desire for a later school start in August**
Many families and staff want to preserve August for summer activities, vacations, and heat concerns in schools, with some preferring a Labor Day start.
- **Mixed but intense opinions on Winter vs. Spring Break length**
 - Some strongly want **two weeks for winter break** for family time and traditions.
 - Others want a **full week spring break** and feel 2–3 days is insufficient.
A common request was an “Option C” combining both.
- **Broad preference to end school before Memorial Day**
Many respondents said post–Memorial Day school days are unproductive and poorly attended, and they prefer ending in May.
- **High priority on ending Semester 1 before Winter Break**
Teachers, parents, and students emphasized that finals and grading should wrap up before the holidays to allow a true break.
- **Frustration with “random” single days off and uneven breaks**
Many want fewer scattered days off and instead prefer longer, more predictable breaks (e.g., full-week spring/fall breaks).
- **Scheduling alignment matters (college calendars, other districts, divorced families, work schedules)**
Respondents noted childcare, university schedules, and shared custody arrangements as major calendar considerations.
- **Concerns about weather and facilities**
Starting too early in August raises heat and HVAC concerns; some also noted June weather can still be cool, affecting outdoor learning and summer plans.
- **General dissatisfaction with both options and desire for a hybrid calendar**
Many comments asked for a blended model (later August start, semester ending before winter break, full spring break, and reasonable winter break).

You should take a couple days from the longest Christmas break ever and extend the spring break longer

<p>Why does school start in August, my choice is mainly for the later start date and 2 weeks for Winter Break with a shorter Spring Break. Alas I think it is ridiculous to have them come back after Memorial Day. I am a former teacher and absolutely no learning happens that last week.</p>
<p>Why do we keep starting in mid August? Why are there so many random breaks in the middle of the year? We much prefer starting after Labor Day and ending just before Memorial Day and cutting out loads of these random breaks. The other break gets out too late and spring break is way to short

The only thing that needs to be changed on calendar A is the spring break. It should be the 3-7 like in calendar B.

The only reason I prefer this one is because Calendar A only has 2 days off for Spring Break. I think this would be very difficult on students, families and faculty.

The number of days in each quarter is much more balanced.

The most important thing to me is to start school later in August so I appreciate calendar A starting Aug 23.

The more time off during the school year the better. I also like a compression of summer for retention- if we had it my way, we would be in a year round schedule. Much better for academics, but harder for families...

The Mondays off following a break are difficult to manage. I prefer the earlier start, and end of calendar B, but don't like all the extra Mondays.

The Monday off after winter break and week long spring break

The main thing that is driving my vote is the winter break. I would rather not be in school on the 23rd of December.

The main reason is to have school end sooner, and in May, not June. I also prefer this length of spring break and the shorter winter break, which my children would also prefer.

The main reason is finishing the 1st semester before the holiday break.

The main reason is because by April the students are sick and tired of each other. They need a full week away from each other to make to the end of the year without daily behavior problems. Starting early in August is good but I wish winter break was longer and we went later into June. That would have made a perfect calendar.

The main reason I chose B was that the term ends before Christmas break. For my AP students, who have lots of final exams, they hate having to study and remember the content after a long break. It doesn't feel like a vacation with a final exam still looming on the horizon. And some mean teachers assign homework over the break of the semester didn't end. That stinks.

On B, it would be nice to shorten spring break and Christmas break (start Jan 2) and end school as early as possible.

My family also needs one full week off school for Spring Break in order to travel without missing additional days.

The colors are nice to look at. The first one is honestly really confusing to look at.

The Christmas break is nice & after the break everyone wants school to hurry & get over with.

The children need more of a summer and going back that early affects their break time

The calendars aren't great. A longer summer is better for kids and teachers.

In this option, school starts later in August (which we like) and Christmas break starts sooner (which we like. A lot of celebrating takes place BEFORE the holiday, fun to have the extra time).

In some states/districts there's laws on school calendars because of its impact on the tourism industry. It is significantly easier to travel in August than in a specified week in April when everyone else is also traveling. Also, I like my kids and having them home another week in the summer would be fun.

In option B going back to school August 16 is too early to allow enough time for summer vacation. However, spring break is too short in option A

In my opinion winter break needs to be more long

In my opinion starting earlier and getting out earlier is Ideal.

In Granite School District, the school year has steadily shifted earlier over the past 25 years. School typically started in late August (25-27). Today, Granite starts often around (12-15). The hotter part of summer in the last 10 years has shifted to August. Why would you remove kids from non a/c schools, cooler recess etc in May/June and forcing them back during the hottest month of August. Let them vacation, swim, boat and do fun summer activities in a month that is actually summer!!

In all my years of doing this, this was the hardest to choose between.

Christmas break needs more lead days before actual Christmas, but not having a full spring break is awful.

I'm okay with getting out of school for summer the first week of June for having school start later in August. I'd also really prefer Winter break starting the 18th instead of the 23rd since that's only 2 days before Christmas, and it'd give more time before the holidays.

I'm not liking either one. I chose Calendar A because it does not end first term on the 22nd of December--two days before Christmas? That is ludicrous. The high school kids won't come; the younger kids will be bonkers ... and all employees need time to prepare for Christmas and enjoy holiday events. But we also NEED a mental health break in April/May! From March 27th to June 2ns with only 3 days off??? That is physically overwhelming.

I'm an attendance clerk - if we have school after Memorial Day, almost no kids are going to show up.

If you didn't give the kids as many days off just the bare minimum like only Thursday and Friday for thanksgiving and then the federal holidays only and the week between Christmas and New Year's you could start school the Tuesday after Labor Day and end the Friday before Memorial Day and no other day off you could give the kids and teachers a longer summer break.

If we're not going to get school starting after Labor Day either way, we might as well at least get it ending before Memorial Day.

If there had been an option to have a one-week spring break and end the school year a week later, I would have picked that.

If so tired of your two choice options. Every year, you come up with a really bad calendar, and an even worse calendar. Then you can justify the bad calendar by saying that its the one people voted for. Instead of grouping it all together, ask individual questions. Have people rank what is most important to them. In option B we will also start quarter 4 before we have to start most of the end of year testing while option A we will be starting some of the testing before we even get to quarter 4.

Calendar B starts so early in August, term 2 is weird, but it's great the term ends in December. I watched the videos on how the calendar is made and I understand. It's just strange that some years the calendar works out so nicely, like this current school year, and other year's it just seems off.

I honestly don't like either option.

I have to come back two weeks before the teachers come back and coming back during the middle of July seems too soon. I also don't think bringing the kids back that early is great either.

I have things I like about both calendars, but ultimately, there will be a big celebration in my church in September of 2027, and I want to be more available on the 22nd of September because it will be a significant day.

I have noticed that my students have fewer school burnouts, are more productive while in school, have had better academic success, and have had an all around positive mindset about school in general when they have lengthier consecutive days off, worriedly with some 3 day weekends thrown in, as opposed to mostly 3 day weekends, with a longer winter break. So as a parent, I definitely prefer option B because it gives longer breaks for major holidays, uea, and spring break, and last day is in May.

I have no opinion, as i'm graduating this year apparently.

I have loved the semester ending lining up with Winter Break. Also a two week winter break is great for those who can travel and very very difficult for those who can't.

I have liked having 2nd quarter end with winter break. I also prefer the week spring break even if it's at the cost of a two week winter break.

I have easier classes .

I have always preferred being done before Memorial Day.

I have always been a big fan of starting later into August and taking school a little further into June. The days off during school are less important to me.

I hate when the semester hangs over into January. It's dumb.

I hate them both. Please go back to the drawing board. 2 weeks at Christmas and 1 week for Spring break is more important than anything. There are too many random Fridays and Mondays off. Please just combine days off so we can actually travel somewhere.

i hate the under class men

I hate the short Spring break in calendar A. I think kids need more breaks and longer breaks during the school year. I wish that the winter break in calendar B is longer, but it is better than a two day Spring break.

I hate the Christmas break having to work until the 22nd but to cut our spring break to two days when we only get two days for fall break is un doable to me. Again - how does Jordan District start later and still end up with a week for fall and a week for spring with a two week Christmas break every year? I wish this district could figure it out. (And they always start LATER in August than we do)

I hate teaching so early in August. It's too hot for enjoyable recess and more Kindergarten students always show up to register after Labor day. When we start so early they've already missed so much! I also do not like ending the 1st semester before winter break.

I hate starting so early in August. Being a teacher and a parent, it is hard to start so early in August.

I hate starting earlier in August, especially when there are so many random days the kids have off of school anyway.

I hate staring school so early in August. Also, I'd rather have a longer summer and shorter breaks

I hate school starting in the beginning of August, give us our summers back.

I hate having kids fall behind due to larger breaks.

I hate going back so early in the summer

I hate coming back so early in August. It's too hot and distracting. Most of our vacations are in early August because of our summer schedule, which we can't take because the students go back earlier every year.

I hate coming back from Winter break and continuing quarter 2. It is almost impossible at the secondary level to get the momentum back to finish a quarter strong after a long break.

I enjoy the longer winter break, because that's when most people are the busiest, and can't/won't focus on school-work
I enjoy the longer winter break to spend with my family.
I enjoy the longer Spring Break and they student break we get coming back after our Winter Break.
I enjoy that winter break is equal on the two options. I don't think Spring break needs to be a whole week and that allows for a slightly later start time with us still getting out of school about the same time. Ending Q2 before break has been nice, but having 3 weeks in January to allow review/reassessments for Q2 is plenty of time and is a nice start into Q3.
I enjoy starting earlier and ending earlier.

I don't thinks kids will show up on the last days on school with the option of school ending in June.
I don't think much gets done after the kids have Memorial Day break and go back for 3-4 days.
I don't see the point of the last week being right after a holiday.
I don't really care for either option, but starting halfway into August seems absurd. The breaks are too long. Start after Labor Day, end at Memorial Day. make the breaks work. I know it can be done.
I don't like to get out in June I think getting getting out in may is a good thing

I believe there are pros and cons to both, but I like B a little bit better, it gives a little shorter winter break which as a parent gives more time to prep for x-mas, it gives a full week for spring break where more ppl are able to vacation, and school ends before memorial day which gives kids 2 full months plus some for summer

I believe the transition to a new terms line up better with the breaks.

I believe the kids would rather have more summer then more days off during the school year. I wish you could figure out a way to make it work with starting later in August and still ending by the end of May. That would be ideal! Thank you

I believe that the semester break falling at the start of Winter Break works better for students and teachers alike. The two weeks off feels more like a true break that way, and students do not feel as much pressure to study over break. Also, I believe that having a full week off for Spring Break is important for staff to finish the school year strong and without burn out.

I believe that summer is the time for kids to be kids, have uninterrupted family time even with summer sports they are allowed more time at home, outside play, social interactions, and extra curricular time with loved when's than when in school. Kids now days are given less free time because of demanding schedules, increase in competitive activities etc. it allows more time for a less rigid schedule and demands which I feel is necessary for the development and mental health of kids.

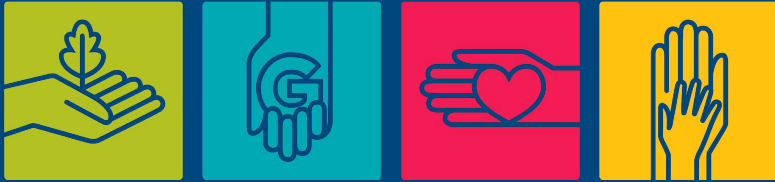

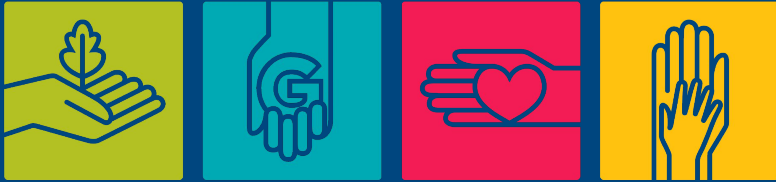

The Genesis of FTE - Data-Driven Projections

Where the numbers come from and the "Gatekeeper" function.

The Source: All FTE allocations are rooted in student enrollment projections generated and overseen by Steve Hogan in the Planning & Boundaries Department.

Projection Variables: Some of the variables that are considered:

- Historical Enrollment: Multi-year "cohort survival" trends.
- Birthrate Data: Used specifically to predict incoming Kindergarten and 1st-grade populations.
- Community Development: Real-time monitoring of new building projects and housing density within school boundaries.

The HR "Gatekeeper" Role: Human Resources serves as the fiscal steward. We ensure that FTE is allocated based on these projections and negotiated staffing ratios. FTE is not granted outside of these parameters without a formal review.

The Appeal Process & Administrative

How we handle unique school needs through the Committee.

SLIDS as Strategic Guides: School Leadership and Improvement Directors (SLIDs) supervise principals and provide an expert "second look" at staffing. Because they have extensive experience, they can identify unique building-level issues that data alone might miss.

The Student Enrollment Staffing Committee: If a school requires a deviation from the official student enrollment projection (more or less FTE), an appeal is made to this committee.

- **Committee Members:** Todd Hauber (B.A.) Mitch Nerdin (Chief of Staff), Tyler Howe (Assistant Superintendent), Steve Hogan (Planning and Boundaries), and Patrick Flanagan (Human Resources Director).

Ensuring Precision: This committee acts as the final check-and-balance, ensuring that any adjustments are justified after the Spring Surplus begins in March. This helps to prevent "staffing creep" and keeps the district fiscally lean.

Current Negotiated Staffing Ratios (2025-26)

The district adheres to specific general education classroom staffing ratios as part of the GSD/GEA Tentative Agreement:

- **Elementary (K-2):** 1 FTE for every 24 students.
- **Elem - Jr. (3-8):** 1 FTE for every 27.25 students.
- **High School (9-12):** 1 FTE for every 28.25 students.



The Fiscal Impact of Surplus Management

Managing FTE accurately in the Spring and Fall is a vital component of fiscal responsibility.

The Cost of "Over-Staffing"

- **Spring Surplus:** In 2018 we had need to move 13 surplus teacher contracts from schools with decreased student enrolment to schools who were expected to grow. The adjustments (teacher surplus) allowed the district to avoid an additional cost of about \$975,000.
- **Fall Staffing Adjustment:** Monitoring student enrollment counts weekly in the Fall prevents the district from paying for unneeded FTE while ensuring high-growth areas are supported.

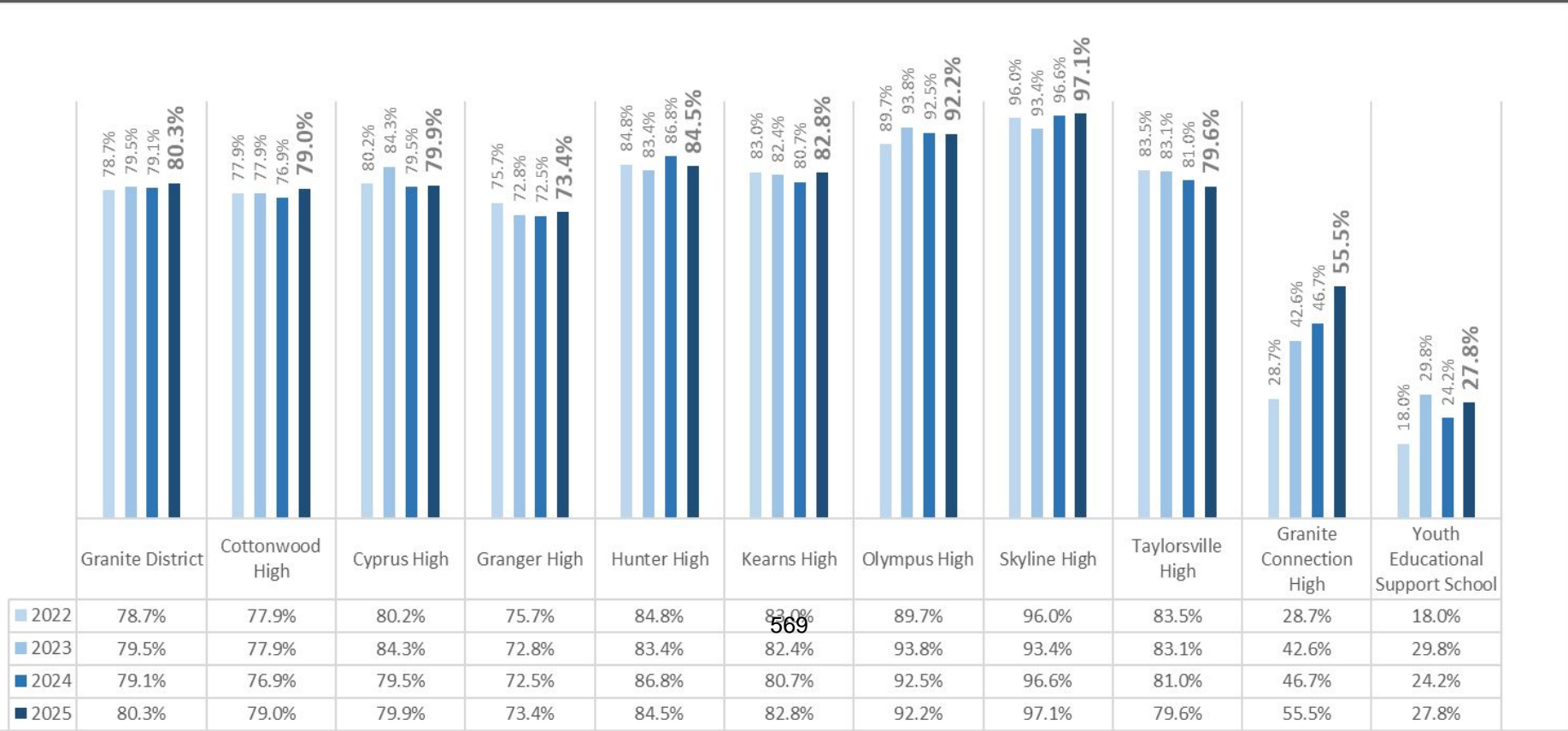

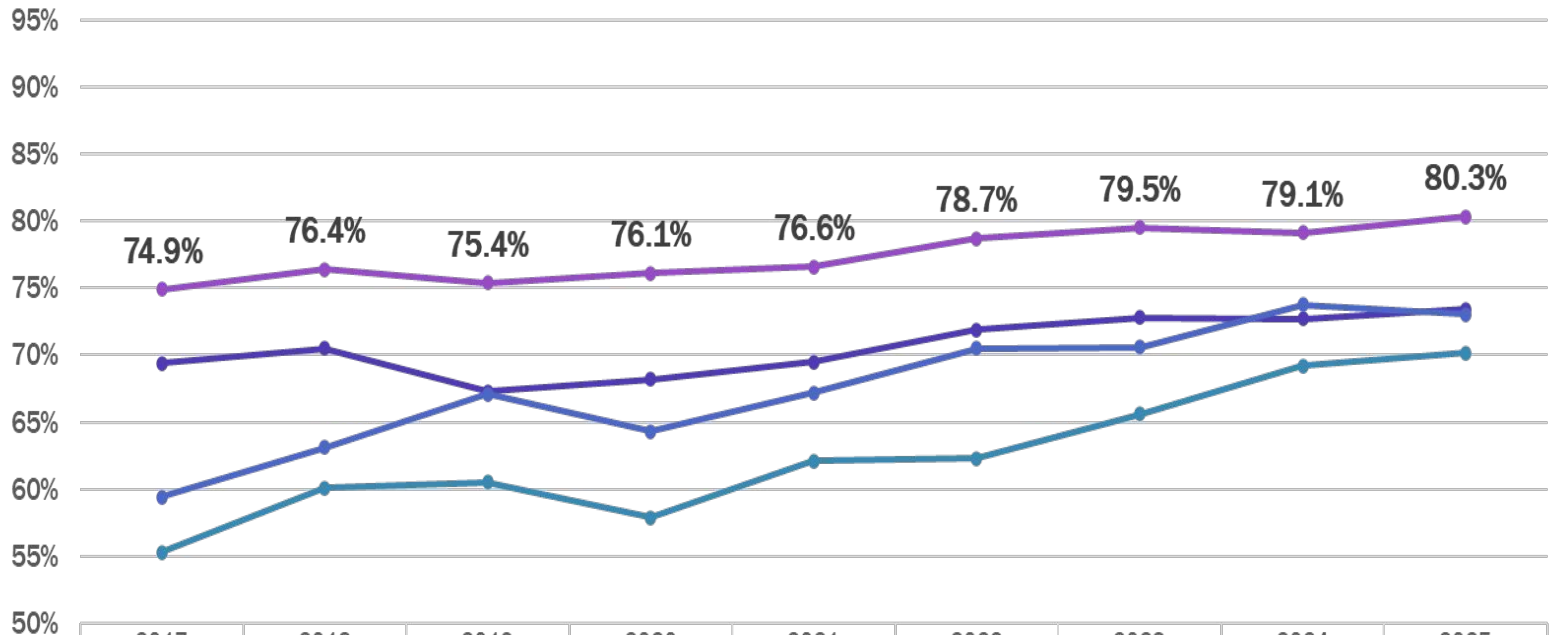

Graduation Rates by School

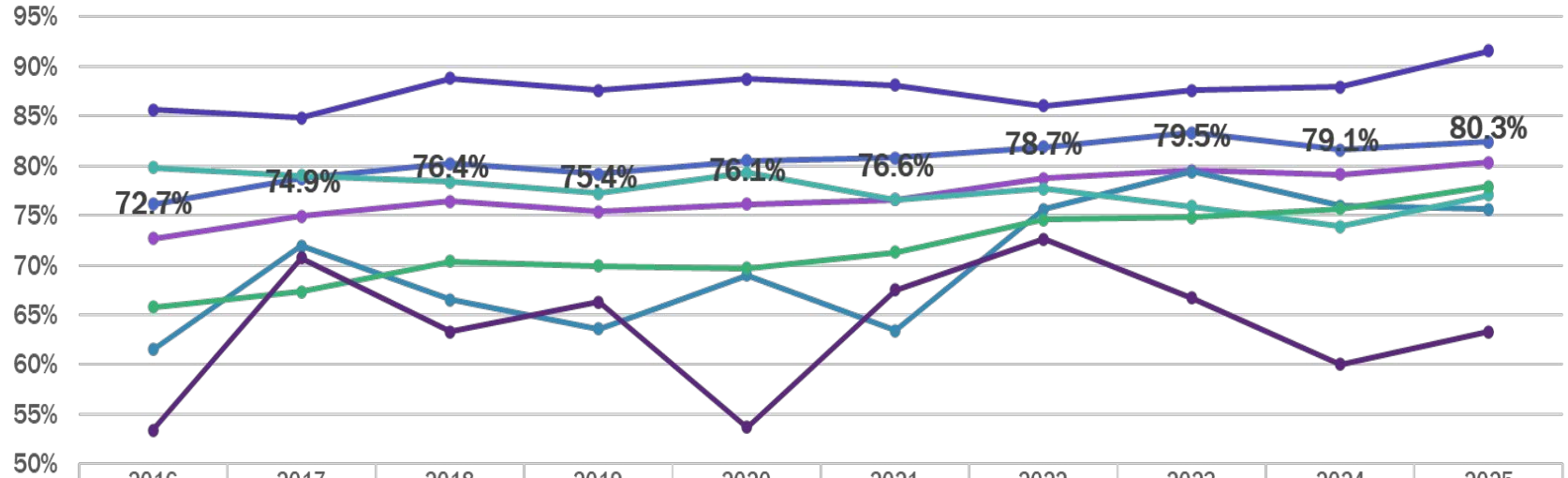

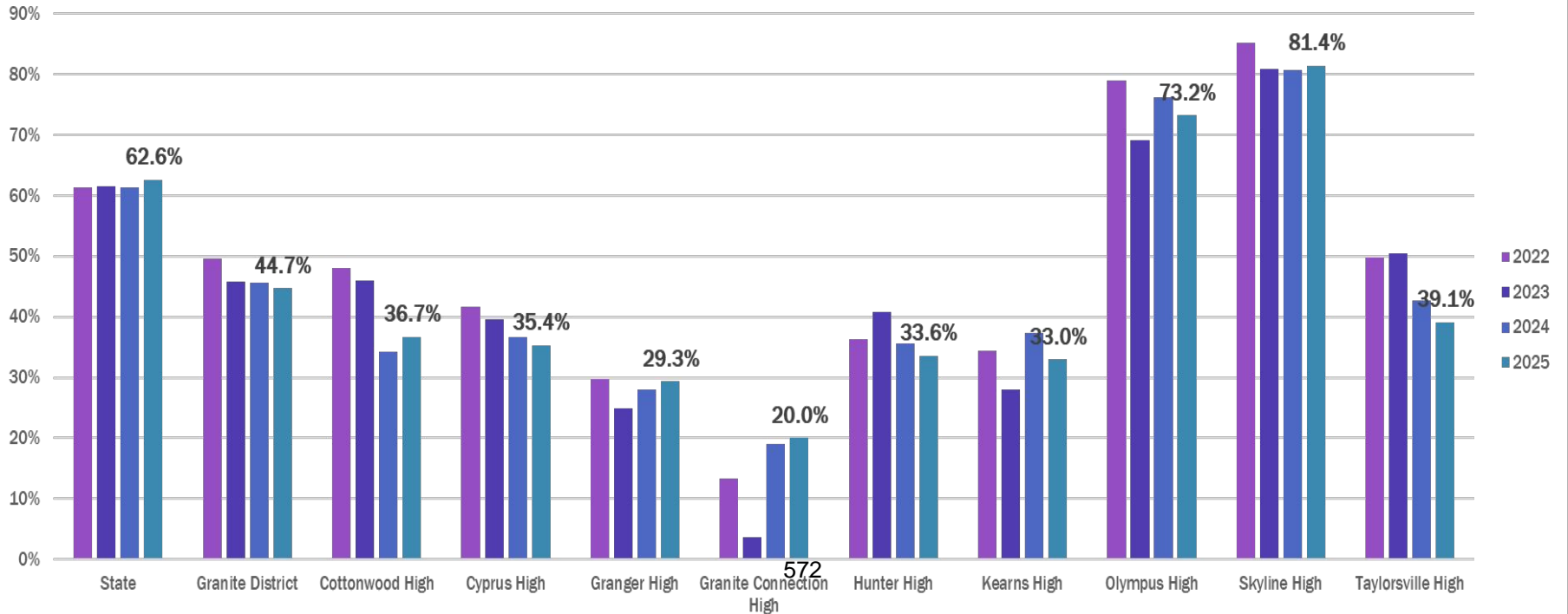

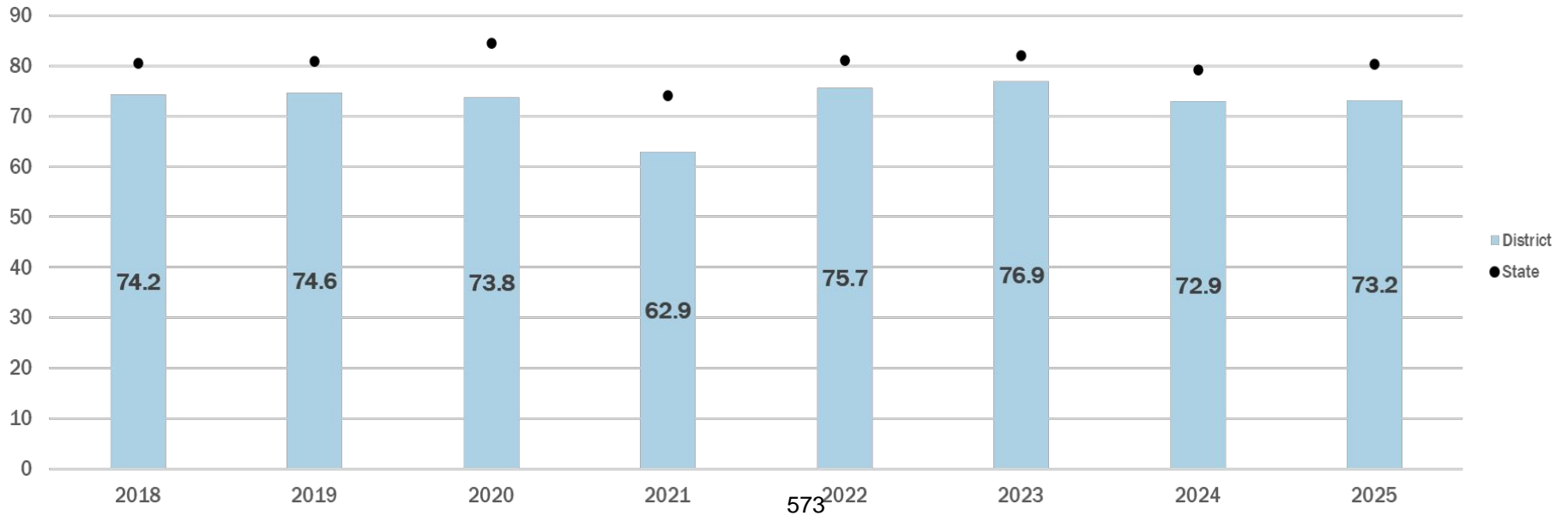
ACT Spring Administration

Percent of 11th Graders Scoring 18 or Higher on Spring ACT

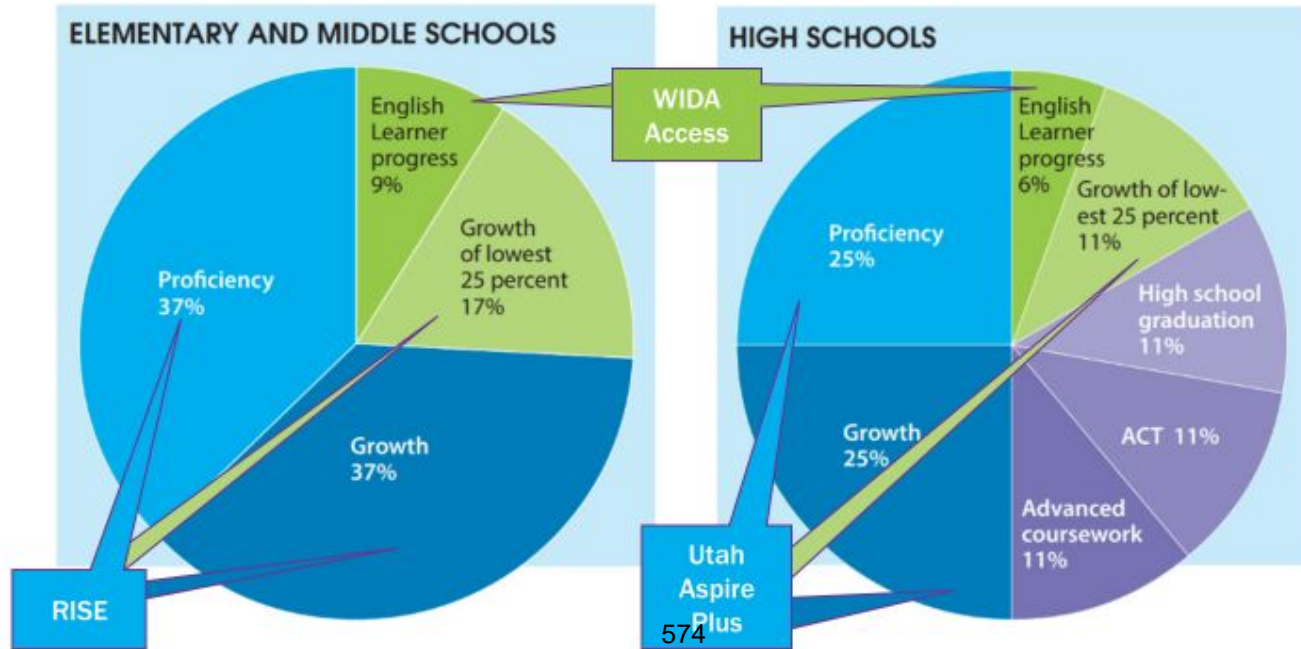

Percent of students earning C or better in Advanced Courses (AP, IB, CE) or completing a CTE Pathway

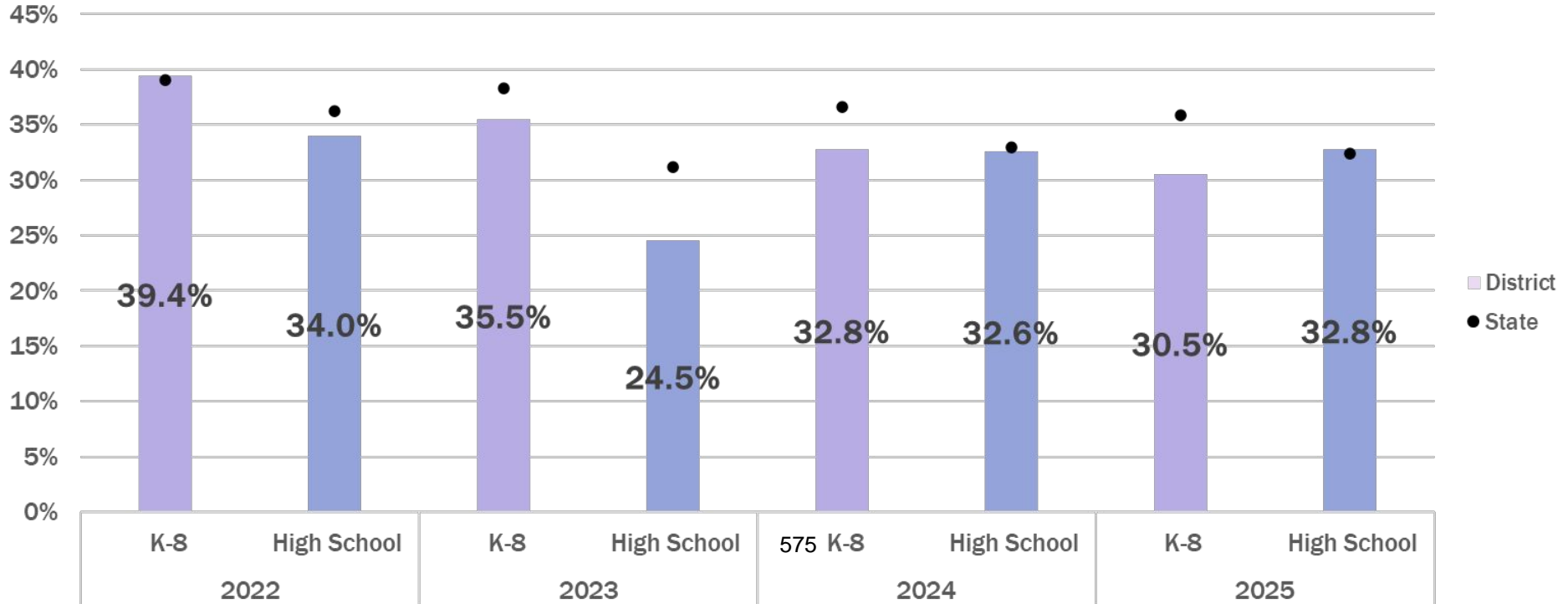

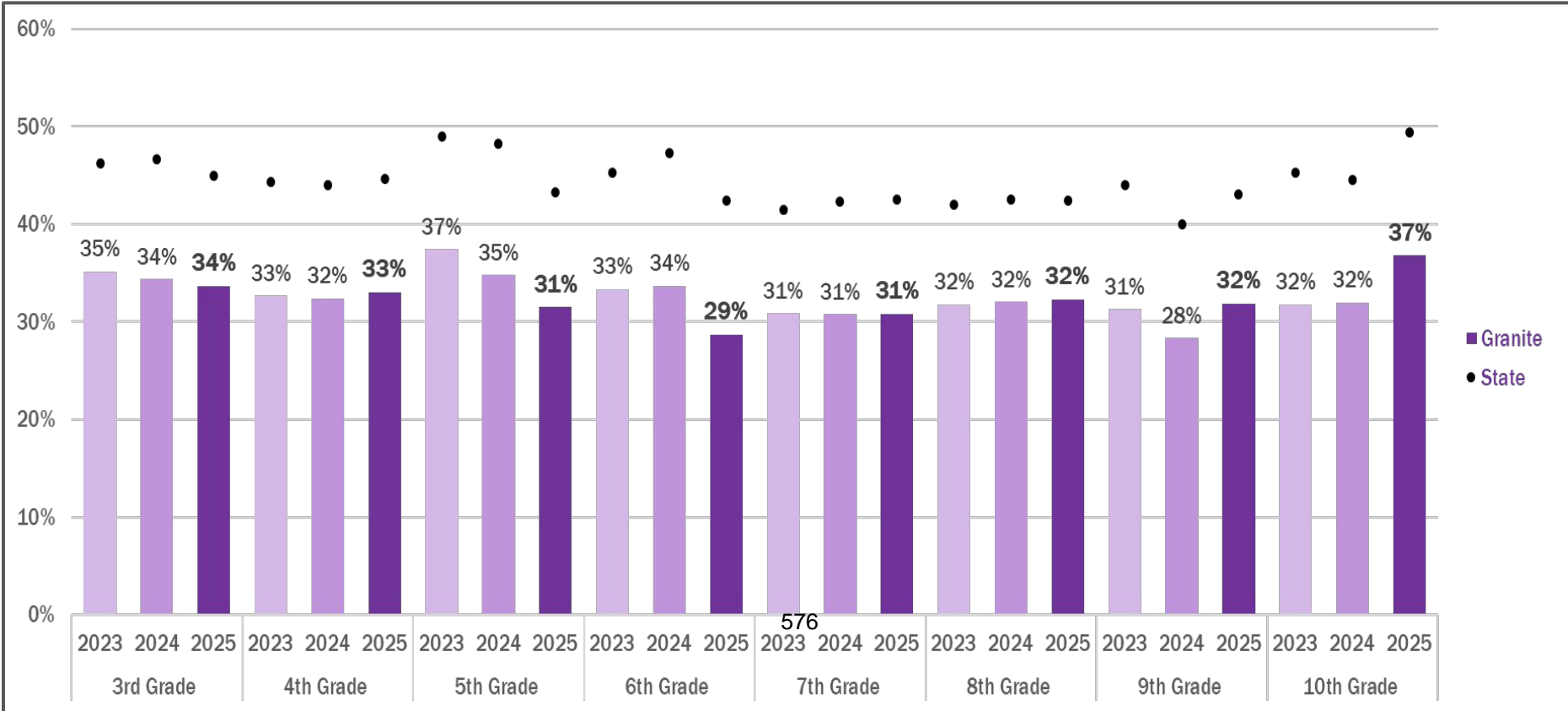

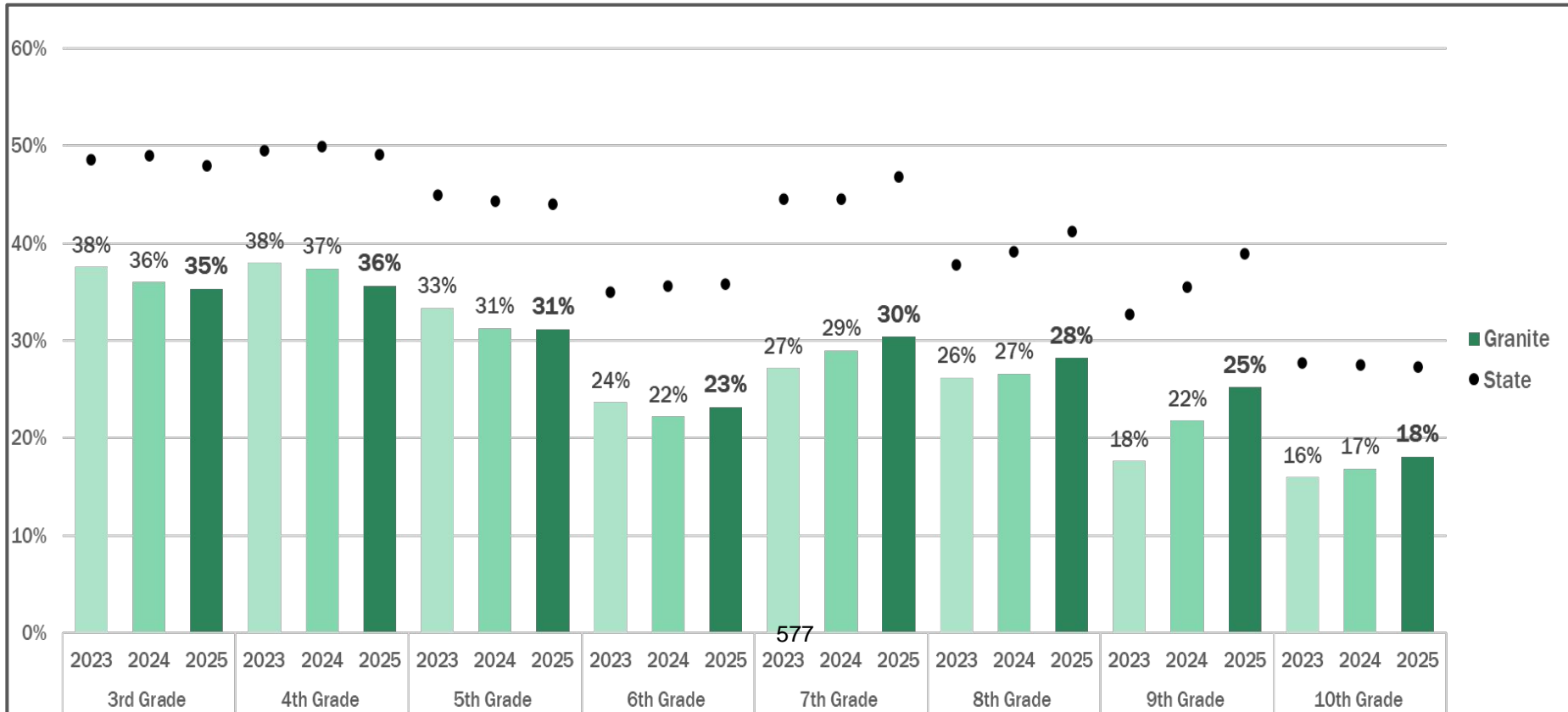
Percent of English Learners Making Adequate Progress



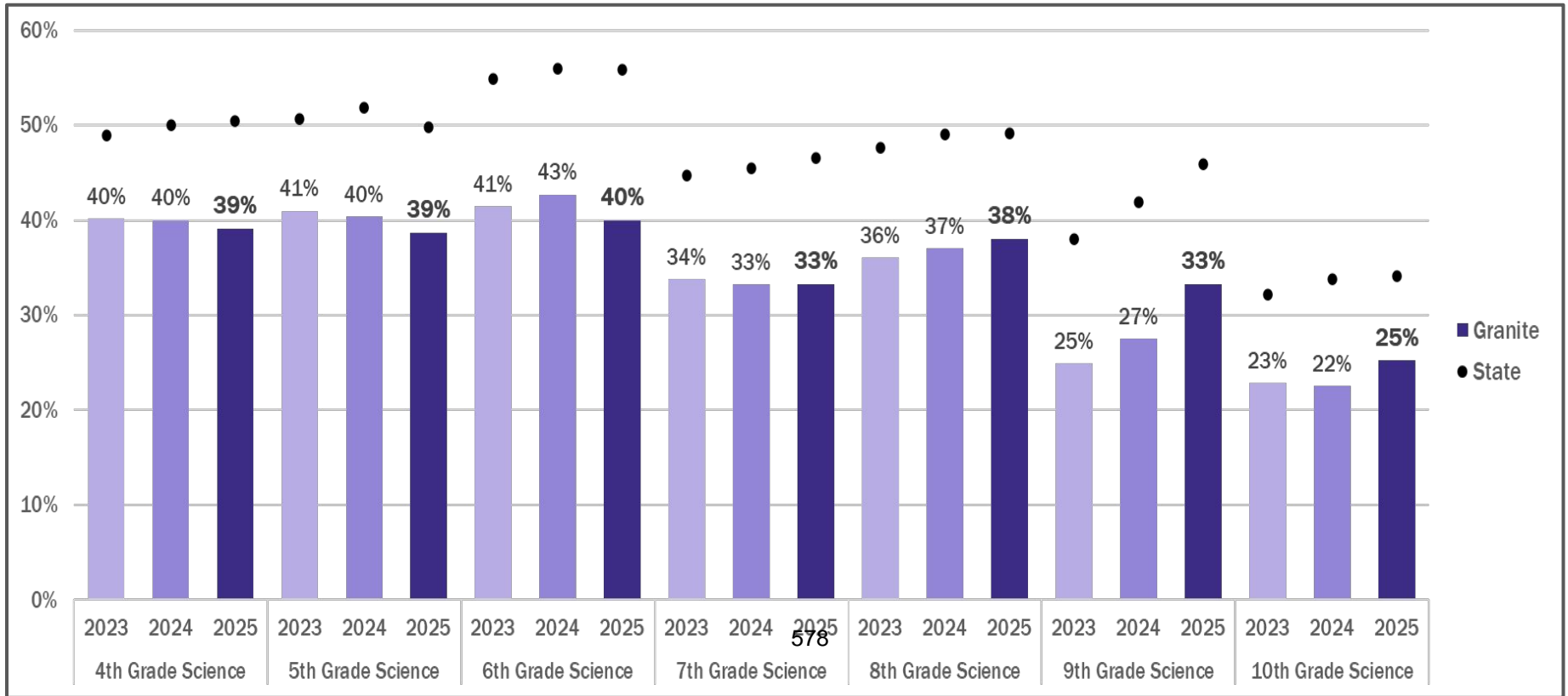

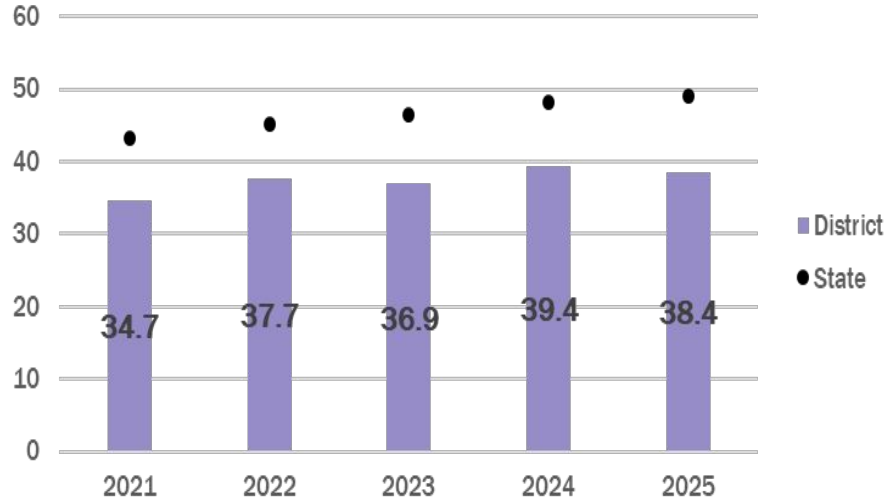

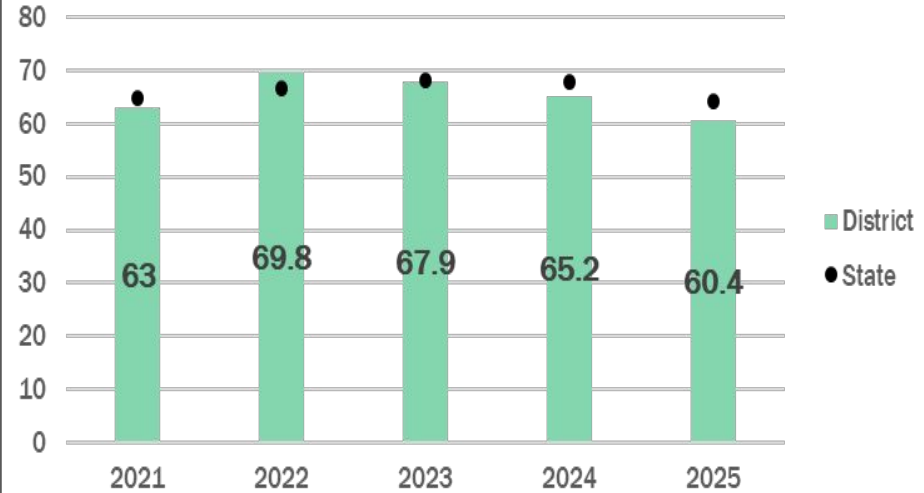


Early Literacy Measures

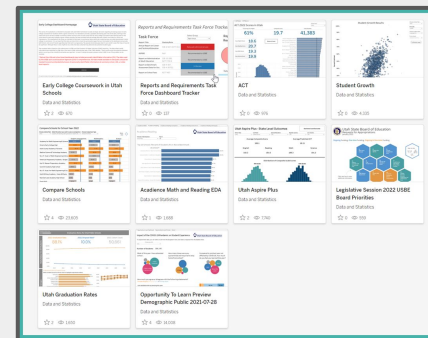

Policy and Legal Services will present three Second Readings during the next Board of Education meeting. A description of the policies under consideration is provided below.

Article VII.C.2. School Grounds Access and Safety

This is a consolidation of policies regarding grounds use that takes into account new state school safety rules from HB 84 legislation and balances them against our obligation to use schools as civic centers for the community. This policy also clarifies which activities are prohibited on school grounds and under which circumstances animals may be on school property. There were no changes suggested by the board and no other changes are being recommended since first reading.

Article X.A.4. High School Graduation Standards and Requirements

These are updates to our existing policy that adds guidelines for the Focused Graduation Pathway program as required by state law. The Focused Graduation Pathway program allows students at Granite Connection High School, who are behind on credits required for graduation, to obtain needed credits through General Educational Development (GED) exams. This program will not be used to facilitate early graduation. No changes were made from the first reading.

Fiscal Policy Manual – Section 7, Section 16

These sections of the Fiscal Policy Manual are being updated to increase the minimum threshold for certain purchase or contract requirements. Previously the minimum threshold before multiple bids were required to be obtained by principals before making purchases was \$499 and it is now \$999. This change puts us in line with other districts in the state. Recommendations were made by the Accounting and Purchasing departments since the first reading. Slight cleanup to Section 7 is recommended to remove any references to payments by school check. School checks are no longer used. In addition, the minimum threshold in Section 16 also needs to be updated to match the threshold in Section 7.

Article VII.C.2. School Grounds Access and Safety

A. Statement of Purpose and Authority

Based on its statutory responsibility and authority to do all things necessary for the maintenance, prosperity, and success of schools and students, the Board of Education of Granite School District (“Board”) recognizes the value in having facilities of Granite School District (“District”) also be an integral part of the community. The Board enacts the following policy to allow for District property to operate in a way that is safe and benefits students, patrons, and employees of the District.

B. Statement of Policy

This policy establishes the authority of the Board to regulate access to District property. The Board retains plenary authority over all property and buildings in the District including access and use of District property. School grounds are intended for curricular and school activity purposes. Community members frequently seek to reserve grounds for structured and unstructured activities during non-school hours. The guidelines of this subsection are intended to protect the viability of grounds.

C. Priorities

1. School-Sponsored Activities and Programs

The primary use for grounds is for the school and its programs. All other uses are subordinate to this primary use. Principals, after consultation with ~~the School Leadership and Improvement Director~~ District leadership, are authorized to place constraints that are more restrictive than the guidelines of this policy if necessary for health and safety, to protect District property, and/or to maintain or rehabilitate grounds.

2. Government-Sponsored Activities and Programs

The second priority for scheduling the use of grounds is for use by government-sponsored recreation such as county or municipal recreation programs. These uses are subject to the District rental policy and a District rental agreement.

3. Other Public Use

The third priority for scheduling the use of grounds is for use by other entities, whether non-profit or for-profit. Within this priority, preference is given to entities providing opportunities primarily for District students and patrons. These uses are subject to the District rental policy and a District rental agreement. Use of District property, including athletic facilities, for commercial purposes or personal gain without entering into a rental agreement and without proof of insurance is prohibited.

4. Community Use

Community use of school property is an important part of maintaining strong relationships between schools and communities. District property is generally made available for community use when not in use for school activities. Schools can implement additional limitations to access grounds at the discretion of the principal in consultation with District leadership. Community use shall be considered subordinate to other uses described above. The District shall have limited liability for accidents or injuries that occur on District property.

D. Assessment and Care of Fields

1. The school principal, in consultation with school custodial and District maintenance personnel, is responsible for oversight of grounds maintenance and the regulation of non-school uses pursuant to these guidelines.
2. Any users of District properties, whether subject to a rental agreement or not, shall be responsible to make reasonable efforts to clean trash or refuse left by activity participants or spectators. Failure to do so may result in revocation or prohibition of future use.

E. Cancellations

The District reserves the right to cancel scheduled activities as required by field or weather conditions. The sole remedy for such cancellation shall be a refund of rental fees previously received by the school.

F. Fees and Deposits

District administration may establish and assess school grounds use fees. Fees help cover costs, including utilities, personnel, and maintenance.

G. Prohibited Uses

1. All illegal conduct or activities is prohibited on District property. Illegal conduct includes, but is not limited to illegal possession, use, or distribution of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, nicotine, or other controlled substances, regardless of mode of use or ingestion.
2. Conduct or activities that places students in danger or that disrupts school, school programming, or activities is prohibited on District property. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to all abusive conduct, as defined in Utah Code §53G-9-601; all disruptive acts described in District policy Article V.C.7.; loitering or remaining on campus without invitation; filming or recording students without license or permission; engaging in any conduct that constitutes discrimination,

bullying, harassment, and retaliation; and/or engaging in any other illegal, uncivil, or malicious speech, actions, or conduct.

3. Conduct that is dangerous in nature or that is reasonably foreseeable to cause bodily injury or death is prohibited on all district property. Examples of such activities include, but are not limited to, discharging firearms, practicing archery (outside a school program), and sledding or other winter sports.
4. All vandalism or other conduct that is reasonably foreseeable to cause or lead to destruction or damage to property is prohibited. Examples of such conduct include engaging in sports or activities that, by their nature, are likely to cause damage to facilities, fields, and playing surfaces (golf, skateboarding, etc.); setting off fireworks; and operating motorized vehicles unlawfully or outside of designated roadways.
5. Permission for access to school grounds can be granted or revoked at any time subject to the discretion of District administration, and individuals remaining on property after permission has been revoked shall be considered trespassing.
6. Any illegal or disruptive conduct or activities shall be reported to law enforcement as appropriate and individuals engaging in such conduct shall be subject to criminal prosecution, restricted access, and/or the consequences of other District policies.

H. Dogs and Other Animals on District Property

1. Dogs and other animals brought onto school property for a reason other than an educational purpose shall not be on District property at any time, except for service animals for individuals with qualifying disabilities under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and pursuant to District policy Article IX.A.I.y Access and Accommodations for Individuals with Disabilities. Individuals with qualifying disabilities may apply for accommodations with the Office of Access and Opportunity.
2. _____ Parents picking up students shall not bring dogs or other animals onto District property. Patrons walking animals shall remain on public sidewalks and walkways follow municipal laws and ordinances when picking up students or walking with an animal near a school.
3. _____ Law enforcement may be contacted to assist the school with compliance with this policy.

Article X.A.4. Senior High School Graduation Standards and Requirements

A. Statement of Purpose

It is the responsibility of the Granite School District Board of Education (Board) to prepare students for college, career, and life as adults. A large part of this responsibility is to assist students in earning a high school diploma. State law, Utah State Board of Education (USBE) rules, and USBE's Portrait of a Graduate all establish a framework for high school completion in Granite School District (District). As such, to receive a diploma, each student shall meet the District graduation academic standards and requirements and demonstrate proficiency in social skills and dispositions identified as the ideal characteristics of a graduate of Granite School District.

B. Graduation Requirements

Schools may offer a Granite District Diploma or a School Diploma for students enrolled in the school during the student's final year.

1. Granite District Diploma (24 credits)
 - a. The requirements for a Granite District Diploma are those established by USBE and enumerated in R277-700.
 - b. Participation in school commencement for Granite District Diploma recipients is contingent upon a 3.0 Characteristics Point Average (CPA) on the identified ideal characteristics of a graduate of Granite School District.
 - c. A student with significant cognitive disabilities who accesses core standards through the Special Education Essential Elements and completes credits subject to the IEP may be awarded an Alternate Diploma.
 - d. Special schools/programs may establish their own CPA criteria for participation in commencement exercises.

2. School Diplomas (27 credits)
 - a. The requirements for a Granite District Diploma are those established by USBE and enumerated in R277-700, including additional credit requirements as determined by the Board and enumerated in the Student Planning Guide.
 - b. Participation in school commencement for Granite District Diploma recipients is contingent upon a 3.0 Characteristics Point Average (CPA) on the identified ideal characteristics of a graduate of Granite School District
 - c. A student with significant cognitive disabilities who accesses core standards through the Special Education Essential Elements and completes credits subject to the IEP may be awarded an Alternate Diploma.
 - d. Schools may establish requirements in addition to the foregoing for a School Diploma of Merit.

C. Certificate of Completion

A Certificate of Completion may be awarded to a student who meets either of the Following criteria as established by R277-705-4.

1. A student who has completed their senior year and is exiting or aging out of the school system without meeting all state or LEA requirements for a diploma may receive a Certificate of Completion.
2. A student with significant cognitive disabilities who has not met requirements for an Alternate Diploma, subject to the student's IEP, may receive a Certificate of Completion.

D. Earning Credit

1. Students of any age may earn credit toward graduation by any of the following methods:
 - a. Successful completion of credit-bearing courses (in-person or online courses) offered by secondary schools accredited by AdvanceEd or approved by the USBE.
 - b. Successful completion of concurrent enrollment classes.
 - c. Passing score through a demonstrated competency pathway.
2. School counselors shall make information regarding approved options for earning credit toward high school graduation readily available to students and parents.

E. Credit Recovery

1. Credit recovery programs are District or school programs outside of the regular school program that provide students with an option for recovering credit for a previously failed course. Credit is awarded upon successful course completion or demonstration of competency through a District approved assessment.
2. If a student's CPA falls below 3.0 (not proficient), schools shall provide opportunities for remediation to improve scores.

F. Non-Accredited Providers

Students seeking credit for work completed in non-accredited settings (e.g., home school, non-accredited private schools, etc.) must be referred to the District Credit Review Committee (Review Committee) for evaluation of the work. Credit awarded by the Review Committee shall be reflected on the student's transcript. The Review Committee is authorized to review and award credit based on criteria summarized below.

1. Alignment of the syllabus or course outline with the State Core Standards.

2. Course content that matches State Core Standards course requirements as demonstrated through submission of coursework, test scores, etc.
3. Passing scores through a demonstrated competency pathway.

G. Transfer Grade Conversion

Transfer credits will be evaluated from authenticated transcripts or comparable original documents from a transferring institution by a review committee. The transcript or other original document from a transferring institution must reflect the total educational experience of the student. Review committees will use the generally accepted 4.0 scale to evaluate transfer credits from other schools in the United States. Based on the information provided in the transcript, a review committee may elect to use the NCAA Guide to International Academic Standards for Athletics Eligibility to evaluate transfer credits from foreign schools. If direct grade conversion is not possible, transfer credits will be issued on a pass/fail basis. If further clarification or arbitration of grade evaluation is desired, parents/guardians may submit the transcript to the International Education Research Foundation (IERF) at the parents'/guardians' own expense.

H. Focused Graduation Pathway

As authorized under Admin. Code R277-722, the District provides the Focused Graduation Pathway (FGP) at Granite Connection High School. The FGP provides an alternative route to high school completion for eligible eleventh and twelfth grade students who are significantly behind on credits. FGP allows students to earn core credit through successful completion of General Educational Development (GED) exams while remaining enrolled in high school. Students demonstrate readiness through a GED Ready practice test and are allowed to earn core credit by successfully completing GED exams in Language Arts, Social Studies, Math, and Science. Students may access information for the FGP through school counselors and the Student Services & Prevention website. FGP shall not be used to facilitate early graduation.

Section 7. Procurement

A. Purpose

This section establishes policy governing the initiation, authorization, and review of purchases in the district and is applicable to all purchases using public funds. The scope includes all qualifying purchases of goods or services at the district and in all locations where district activities are held and public funds are expended. It is expected that in all dealings, district employees will act in an ethical manner that is consistent with the Public Officers' Employees' Ethics Act, the Utah Educators' Standards, and State procurement law.

B. State Law Requirements

This policy is established pursuant to Utah Code 63G-6a-101 *et. seq.* and Utah Administrative Rules, Title R33, and requires all district employees to comply with the same. The Board of Education has authority to establish procurement policies that are more restrictive than State laws or rules. Certain components of the law particularly relevant to district employees are included below.

1. Contracts must follow the guidelines outlined in the State Procurement Code, specifically regarding the length of multi-year contracts (Utah Code 63G-6a-1204(7)).
2. Construction and improvements must comply with the provisions of the State Procurement Code (Utah Code 63G-6a-1302 the Utah State Board of Administrative Rules, and Title IX).
3. Exclusive contracts must comply with the guidelines outlined in the State Procurement Code (Utah Code 63G-6a-101 *et. seq.*), the district's procurement policy, and the Utah Public Officers' and Employees' Ethics Act (Utah Code 67-16-1 *et. seq.*).

C. Restricted Authority

1. No purchase shall be made and no indebtedness shall be incurred by any officer or employee of the district that exceeds the authority given in this policy except those authorized by the Board of Education (Utah Code 53A-3-405).
2. The Business Administrator/Treasurer and the Director of Purchasing or designated agents are the only persons authorized to engage in the following procurement-related activities:
 - a. obligate the district for the purchase of goods and services, which includes any type of leasing agreement (the only exception to this the event of an emergency wherein loss or harm will result without immediate action);

- b. establish and manage an inventory of supplies and certain equipment, and as the need develops, replenish that inventory through means of competitive bidding or inquiry with established sources of supply;
 - c. manage the transfer of surplus equipment for purposes of use in other district schools and departments; and
 - d. determine the value of equipment within the schools and warehouses that is deemed obsolete or not repairable and direct the disposal of such items by means of a sale or salvage through the central warehouse on a cash-only basis.
3. Fiscal administrators are authorized by the Board of Education to enter into contracts or agreements that obligate the district to the end of the current school/fiscal year. These must be within the threshold limits established in 7.E. Vending and concession contracts are an exception to the one-year restriction and may have a term up to three years.

D. General Policies

1. Any district employee who purchases goods and services shall promote positive supplier relationships by providing an environment where all business concerns, large and small, women owned, majority or minority owned are afforded an equal opportunity to compete for district business.
2. Competitive prices shall be sought from all available sources whenever possible before negotiations for purchase are entered into, and preference shall not be given in such a way that one vendor has an advantage over any other vendor.
3. The Director of Purchasing, or designated agents, reserves the right negotiate any quotation received by a department or school.
4. Where only one source of supply exists, the Director of Purchasing or designated agent shall negotiate the price and quality and conditions of delivery.
5. The purchasing department may cancel all, or any part of a Purchase Order that fails to meet the specifications regarding quality, price, delivery, or service specified thereon.
6. The fiscal administrator is charged with primary responsibility for all financial matters of his/her school or department. Such responsibility is non-delegable. Because it is not possible for the fiscal administrator to be personally involved in every financial matter at his/her school or department, he/she may designate specific individuals to perform specific tasks or functions on his/her behalf. Nonetheless, the fiscal administrator retains ultimate responsibility and should therefore ensure his/her designees are properly trained. Fiscal administrators do not have authority to instruct or permit violation of district policy and procedure.
7. All transactions will be subject to audit for compliance by appropriate district personnel at any time.
8. The Director of Purchasing, or designated agents, may substitute equivalent product provided the Director of Purchasing notifies the originator of the purchase requisition prior to the substitution.

9. The district will not recognize employees as independent contractors for services that are related to or an extension of their employment job duties.

E. Purchases and Procurement Thresholds

Please see “Exhibit 1 – Purchasing Thresholds”.

1. Schools and departments are authorized to make necessary purchases within stated procurement thresholds. The dollar thresholds for purchases are to be applied to the whole purchase, not individual items.
 - a. A “small purchase” is the procurement of goods or services for which the total cost is less than \$50,000 (Utah Code 63G-6a-408). Under that amount, there are additional dollar thresholds that must be applied to specific types of purchases.
 - b. The “individual procurement threshold” for the district is \$999.99. This is the maximum amount that the district can expend to obtain a single item/service from one vendor at one time without requiring competitive purchasing procedures (Utah Code 63G-6a-408).
 - c. The “annual cumulative threshold” for the district is \$50,000. This is the maximum total annual amount that the district can expend to obtain individual procurement item(s) costing less than \$999.99 from the same vendor during the fiscal year (July 1—June 30).
 - d. If a purchase exceeds \$50,000, it is not considered a small purchase and shall be processed through a bidding process or a request for proposal (RFP) process (Utah Code 63G-6a-408 and R33-6 & 7).
 - e. If purchases from the same vendor are ongoing, continuous, and regularly scheduled, and exceed the annual cumulative threshold of \$50,000 during the fiscal year (July 1—June 30), a contract shall be utilized if feasible (Utah Code 63G-6a-408(6)).
2. Without regard to amount:
 - a. If a service is to be purchased from an individual or sole proprietor, the purchase must be made on a Pay Voucher or District Requisition and processed through the accounting department to facilitate compliance with IRS regulations concerning issuance of 1099 forms from the district.
 - b. If desired goods are available from the district warehouse, schools or departments shall make the purchase from the district warehouse using a District Stores Issue.
 - c. If desired goods or services are available on a district or State contract (available on the purchasing department website), schools or departments shall make purchases from a source identified in the contract using either a Pay Voucher, ~~a school check (secondary schools)~~, a P-card if the total purchase is under the

transaction limit of the card, or a District Requisition. Exceptions to this requirement need written approval from the Purchasing Department.

- d. The requirement to obtain quotes may be waived by the Director of Purchasing when deemed necessary and reasonable, consistent with Utah law.
3. For purchases that total up to \$999.99:
 - a. If the items being purchased are not available from the warehouse or on a State or district contract, the school or department's fiscal administrator may make a best source selection and proceed with the purchase utilizing a P-card, ~~school check~~, or District Pay Voucher.
 4. For purchases that total between \$1,000 and \$4,999.99:
 - a. If the items being purchased are not available from the warehouse or on a State or district contract, the school/department shall obtain a minimum of two written quotes, consistent with quote requirements in F.4.a.i through v above, and document them on the District Quote Form (available on the purchasing department website).
 - b. The school/department shall then select the best source (defined as the lowest cost vendor able to provide the item(s) considering factors such as timeliness, quality, etc.) and make the purchase using one of the following:
 - i. If using district budgeted funds, submit the written quotes, District Quote Form, and a District Requisition to the purchasing department. A Purchase Order will be issued by the purchasing department.
 - ii. If using school funds:
 1. If the vendor is a 1099 vendor, the school should submit a Pay Voucher, ~~with a school check~~, District Quote Form, and supporting documents attached.
 2. Otherwise, the school should issue a School Purchase Order and retain the District Quote Form and supporting documents with the School Purchase Order.
 - c. Sole source vendor purchases in this dollar range must be pre-approved by the purchasing department using the district Sole Source Form. No purchase may occur until the approved form is returned to the requesting school or department.
 5. For purchases that total over \$5,000:
 - a. The school/department initiates the purchase using a District Requisition. All such purchases are required to be approved by an Assistant Superintendent. Once the Requisition is received by the purchasing department, it will be processed as follows:

- i. Purchases up to \$49,999.99 – Purchasing will obtain and document quotes, select the best vendor based on criteria such as price, availability, quality, etc., then issue a District Purchase Order.
 - ii. Purchases of \$50,000 and over – Purchasing will obtain formal bids, select the best vendor based on price, availability, quality, etc., submit a recommendation to the Board of Education, then upon Board approval, issue a District Purchase Order.
- b. Sole source vendor purchases in this dollar range must be approved by the purchasing department using the district Sole Source Form. Purchasing will complete the purchase.

6. Artificially Dividing a Purchase

- a. It is unlawful to intentionally divide a procurement purchase into two or more smaller purchases, to divide an invoice or Purchase Order into two or more invoices or Purchase Orders, or to make smaller purchases over a period of time (Utah Code 63G-6a-2404.3).
- b. Dividing a purchase, or intentionally splitting a purchase of similar items that would typically be purchased at the same time from the same vendor to avoid requiring competitive quotes is unlawful (e.g., uniforms, club or athletic equipment, textbook orders, etc.).
- c. Purchase splitting often occurs when making purchases on a purchase card. Employees should not split invoices to stay under single transaction purchase limits on P-cards or the established purchasing thresholds.
- d. It may be determined after an order is placed or received that a large enough quantity was not ordered, or the correct sizes were not obtained, and additional items must be ordered. If this occurs, the employee initiating the purchase must include a written explanation of the purpose of the purchase and justification as to why it is not considered splitting a purchase. This should be retained with the vendor invoice.
- e. Penalties for dividing purchases range from a class B misdemeanor to a second degree felony, depending on the total value of the divided procurements.

F. Exceptions to Thresholds

- 1. Instructional materials listed on the State’s Recommended Instructional Materials Systems (RIMS List) and are available from a book depository within Utah are exempt from the thresholds up to \$50,000 and can be purchased directly by a school/ department utilizing a Pay Voucher, School Purchase Order (secondary schools) or a District Requisition as appropriate. Orders in excess of \$50,000 must be submitted utilizing a District Requisition. The expenditure of any sum in excess of \$50,000 requires prior approval of the School Board.

2. Items purchased for resale to the public for either student fundraisers or resource development.
3. Travel expenditures for students and employees.
4. The purchase of AP exams.
5. Expenditures of funds held in a school's Welfare Funds program that are intended to benefit a non-profit organization or other charitable cause in the community.

G. Ethical/Legal Standards in the Utah Procurement Code

State law mandates that **all public employees** comply with ethical/legal standards when administering or using public funds. Utah Code 67-16-4 & 5 *et. seq.* outlines conduct considered unlawful and proscribes penalties for violating these ethical laws.

67-16-4. Improperly disclosing or using private, controlled, or protected information -- Using position to secure privileges or exemptions -- Accepting employment that would impair independence of judgment or ethical performance -- Exception.

1. Except as provided in Subsection (3), it is an offense for a public officer, public employee, or legislator to:
 - a. accept employment or engage in any business or professional activity that he might reasonably expect would require or induce him to improperly disclose controlled information that he has gained by reason of his official position;
 - b. disclose or improperly use controlled, private, or protected information acquired by reason of his official position or in the course of official duties in order to further substantially the officer's or employee's personal economic interest or to secure special privileges or exemptions for himself or others;
 - c. use or attempt to use his official position to:
 - i. further substantially the officer's or employee's personal economic interest; or
 - ii. secure special privileges or exemptions for himself or others;
 - d. accept other employment that he might expect would impair his independence of judgment in the performance of his public duties; or
 - e. accept other employment that he might expect would interfere with the ethical performance of his public duties.

2.
 - a. Subsection (1) does not apply to the provision of education-related services to public school students by public education employees acting outside their regular employment.
 - b. The conduct referred to in Subsection (2)(a) is subject to Section 53A-1-402.5.
3. This section does not apply to a public officer, public employee, or legislator who engages in conduct that constitutes a violation of this section to the extent that the public officer, public employee, or legislator is chargeable, for the same conduct, under Section 63G-6a-2404 or Section 76-8-105.

67-16-5. Accepting gift, compensation, or loan -- When prohibited.

1. As used in this section, "economic benefit tantamount to a gift" includes:
 - a. a loan at an interest rate that is substantially lower than the commercial rate then currently prevalent for similar loans; and
 - b. compensation received for private services rendered at a rate substantially exceeding the fair market value of the services.
2. Except as provided in Subsection (4), it is an offense for a public officer or public employee to knowingly receive, accept, take, seek, or solicit, directly or indirectly for himself or another a gift of substantial value or a substantial economic benefit tantamount to a gift:
 - a. that would tend improperly to influence a reasonable person in the person's position to depart from the faithful and impartial discharge of the person's public duties;
 - b. that the public officer or public employee knows or that a reasonable person in that position should know under the circumstances is primarily for the purpose of rewarding the public officer or public employee for official action taken; or
 - c. if the public officer or public employee recently has been, is now, or in the near future may be involved in any governmental action directly affecting the donor or lender, unless a disclosure of the gift, compensation, or loan and other relevant information has been made in the manner provided in Section 67-16-6.
3. Subsection (2) does not apply to:
 - a. an occasional nonpecuniary gift, having a value of not in excess of \$50;
 - b. an award publicly presented in recognition of public services;
 - c. any bona fide loan made in the ordinary course of business; or
 - d. a political campaign contribution.

- 4 This section does not apply to a public officer or public employee who engages in conduct that constitutes a violation of this section to the extent that the public officer or public employee is chargeable, for the same conduct, under Section 63G-6a-2404 or Section 76-8-105.

State law mandates **procurement professionals** comply with ethical/legal standards when administrating or using public funds. Utah Code 63G-6a-2404 *et. seq.* outlines conduct considered unlawful and proscribes penalties for violating procurement laws.

1. For purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:
 - a. **“Contract administration professional”** means an individual who is directly under contract with the district or employed by a person under contract with the district and has responsibility in developing a solicitation or grant, or conducting the procurement process; or supervising or overseeing the administration or management of a contract or grant. This does not include an employee of the district. (Utah Code 63G-6a-2402).
 - b. **“Procurement professional”** means an individual who is an employee, and not an independent contractor, of the district, and who, by title or primary responsibility has procurement decision making authority and is assigned to be engaged in or is engaged in the procurement process or the process of administering a contract or grant, including enforcing contract or grant compliance, approving contract or grant payments, or approving contract or grant change orders or amendments. Procurement professional excludes:
 - i. Any individual who, by title or primary responsibility, does not have procurement decision making authority;
 - ii. The superintendent, business administrator, principal, or vice principal of the district, or the chief assistant or deputy of the superintendent, business administrator, principal, or vice principal (Utah Code 63G-6a-2402).
 - c. **“Hospitality gift”** means a token gift of minimal value, including, a pen, pencil, stationery, toy, pin, trinket, snack, beverage, or appetizer, given for promotional or hospitality purposes. This does not include money, a meal, admission to an event for which a charge is normally made, entertainment for which a charge is normally made, travel, or lodging (Utah Code 63G-6a-2402).
 - i. Utah Code 63G-6a-2404 states that it is **not** unlawful for a person to give or receive, offer to give or receive, or promise or pledge to give or ask for a promise or pledge of, a hospitality gift if the total value of the hospitality gift is less than \$10; and the aggregate value of all hospitality gifts from the person to the recipient in a calendar year is less than \$50.
 - ii. Any hospitality gift exceeding the \$10 and \$50 threshold is considered a gratuity, and the provisions below apply.

d. **“Gratuity”** means anything of value given without anything provided in exchange or in excess of the market value of that which is provided in exchange, including a gift or favor, money, a loan at an interest rate below the market value or with terms that are more advantageous to the borrower than terms offered generally on the market, anything of value provided with an award (other than a certificate, plaque, or trophy), employment, admission to an event, a meal, lodging, travel, entertainment for which a charge is normally made, and a raffle, drawing for a prize, or lottery.

i. Gratuity does not include:

- a. An item, including a meal in association with a training seminar, that is:
- b. Included in a contract or grant; or
- c. Provided in the proper performance of a requirement of a contract or grant;
- d. An item requested to evaluate properly the award of a contract or grant;
- e. A rebate, coupon, discount, airline travel award, dividend, or other offering included in the price of a procurement item;
- f. A meal provided by an organization or association, including a professional or educational association, an association of vendors, or an association composed of public agencies or public entities, that does not, as an organization or association, respond to solicitations;
- g. A product sample submitted to a public entity to assist the public entity to evaluate a solicitation;
- h. A political campaign contribution;
- i. An item generally available to the public; or
- j. Anything of value that one public agency provides to another public agency (Utah Code 63G-6a-2402).

e. **“Kickback”** means a negotiated bribe in connection with a procurement or the administration of a contract or grant; and does not include items in subsection 4.e.(1) (Utah Code 63G-6a-2402).

2. Utah Code 63G-6a-2404 makes it unlawful:

- a. For a person who has or is seeking a contract with or a grant from a public entity knowingly to give, or offer, promise, or pledge to give, a gratuity to the district, a procurement professional or contract administration professional, or an individual who the person knows is a family member of an individual.

- b. For a “procurement professional” or “contract administration professional,” or a family member of either, knowingly to receive or accept, offer or agree to receive or accept, or ask for a promise or pledge of, a gratuity from a person who has or is seeking a contract with or a grant from a public entity.
 - c. For a person who has or is seeking a contract with or a grant from a public entity knowingly to give, or offer, promise, or pledge to give, a kickback to the district, a procurement professional or contract administration professional, or an individual who the person knows is a family member of an individual.
 - d. For a “procurement professional” or “contract administration professional,” or a family member of either, knowingly to receive or accept, offer or agree to receive or accept, or ask for a promise or pledge of, a kickback from a person who has or is seeking a contract with or a grant from a public entity.
3. Penalties for violating this statute are established in Utah Code 63G-6a-2404 & 2407. Individuals will adhere to these penalties and report violations to the attorney general’s office, as required by statute. Penalties range from a class B misdemeanor to a second degree felony and individuals are subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal from public employment or return the value of the unlawful gratuity.

Section 16. Food & Beverage Purchases

A. Purpose

This section establishes policy governing the expenditure of public funds on food and beverage in the Granite School District. In general, the use of public funds to purchase food and beverage is permissible when compliant with the following criteria:

1. Doing so clearly serves a public and/or educational purpose.
2. The amount spent per person is within the limits established below.
3. The food and beverage is suitable to the type and duration of the occasion.

The use of public funds to purchase food and beverage used to express appreciation or provide a gift to an employee or volunteer is subject to Section 15, Tokens of Appreciation, Incentives, and Gifts policy, as well as this Food and Beverage policy.

B. Allowable Expenditures

Specific instances when it is allowable to use public funds to purchase food and beverage are as follows:

1. At district or school sponsored gatherings where the primary attendees are parents, patrons, or volunteers.
2. Community Meetings – When seeking to build community connections and/or increase parent/student engagement and involvement in the educational process, simple refreshments may be appropriate.
3. District/School Meetings and Functions – When faculty or staff are asked to attend District/School meetings or functions that necessarily occur before or after the official workday.
 - a. Administrators are expected to be cautious when determining the appropriateness of utilizing public funds to provide food and beverages at District meetings or functions by considering:
 - i. The rationale of holding the meeting before or after the official workday or over the lunch hour rather than at some other time during the workday.
 - ii. The benefit derived from eating while meeting (as distinguished from simply meeting) and whether the benefit flows to the District/School as opposed to simply providing perks to individuals.
 - b. Examples of District meetings or functions that may have a compelling reason to schedule participants over a mealtime include, but are not limited to:
 - i. All-day administrative meetings.

- ii. All-day staff development meetings.
 - iii. All-day strategic planning meetings.
 - iv. Executive staff meetings over a mealtime when persons cannot meet at other times and the topic is of high priority.
 - v. Board meetings.
 - vi. Situations where employees are required to work extra hours outside a regular shift to serve a specific District/school purpose or need.
4. District-Provided Professional Development – When faculty or staff are asked to attend District-provided professional development that necessarily occurs before or after the official workday and that necessarily lasts longer than 90 minutes, simple refreshments may be appropriate.
 5. Grant-Funded Meetings or Events – The grant must specifically provide for food and beverage in the grant agreement (such as parental involvement meetings) and the expenditure must also be directly connected to the grant objectives. Federal guidelines must be adhered to.
 6. Events Funded by Morale Budget Monies
 7. Employee Retirement Open House - The cost of the refreshments (food and beverage) should not exceed \$3.00 per person, based on estimated attendance.
 8. District Annual Retirement Dinner, District 25-Year Banquet, and School Award Banquets
 9. Emergency Sustenance – In emergency situations such as natural disasters or to provide for health and safety needs.

C. Expenditures Not Allowed

Instances where public funds may NOT be used to purchase food and beverage include:

1. Prohibited Substances – Public funds shall not be used to purchase alcoholic beverages or other substances not permitted on school property.
2. Food or Beverage Beyond Per Diem – Food and beverage shall not be purchased using public funds while on District-related travel except as covered by designated per diem schedules and procedures.
3. Celebratory Gatherings, Entertainment, or Employee/Volunteer Appreciation Meals – It is inappropriate to use public funds to purchase food or beverage (or other amusement) for celebratory gatherings (e.g. anniversaries, birthdays, and showers) or employee/volunteer appreciation meals outside of the annual allotment of Employee Morale Funds. Costs associated with such events are the responsibility of the individuals who furnish the food or beverage or who choose to attend.
4. Regular Work Meetings – Public funds shall not be used to purchase food for standard District meetings or functions unless the meeting or function meets the criteria described in detail above.

D. Outside Entities

Outside entities that wish to provide meals or refreshments for District personnel or functions may do so provided they pay the vendor directly and such occurrences do not violate the Utah State Procurement Ethics Law, Utah State Employee Ethics Act, Utah Educator Standards, or District policy.

E. District Food Services

For those specific instances when public funds may be used to purchase food and beverage, it is suggested that schools and departments consider arranging such events through the District's food services or the GEC Café.

F. Purchasing Thresholds

1. Allowable food and beverage expenditures are subject to District purchasing thresholds. Purchases that total up to \$499,999.99, the department/school may select the best source without seeking competitive quotes.
2. For purchases that total between \$500-1,000 and \$4,999.99, the department/school must get two bids from comparable vendors.
3. For purchases that total over \$5,000, the department/school must work with the Purchasing Department to obtain quotes.

G. Written Requests

Requests for exceptions to this policy must be made in writing and submitted directly to the Superintendent for each event or occasion. Written requests shall be considered based upon the merits and timeliness of such requests and the exigent or unique circumstances. Once approved, the requestor shall send a copy to Accounting.
