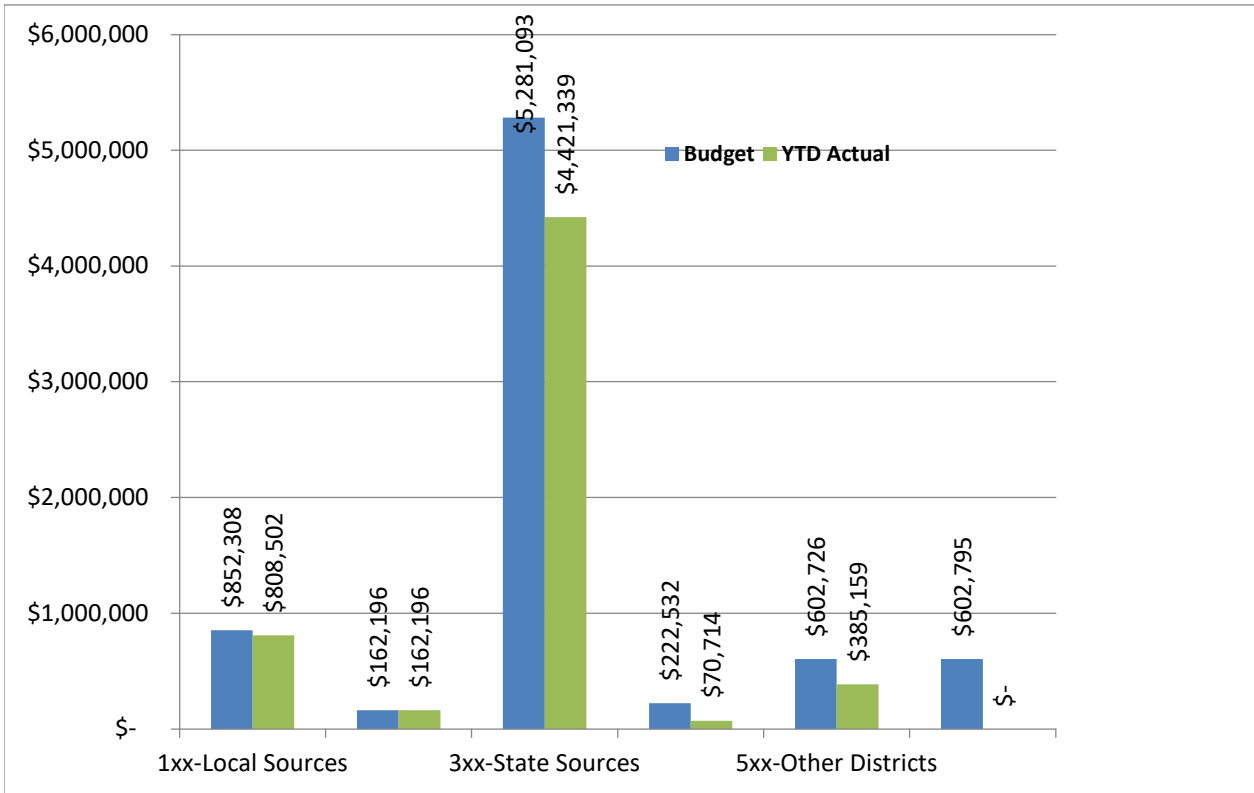

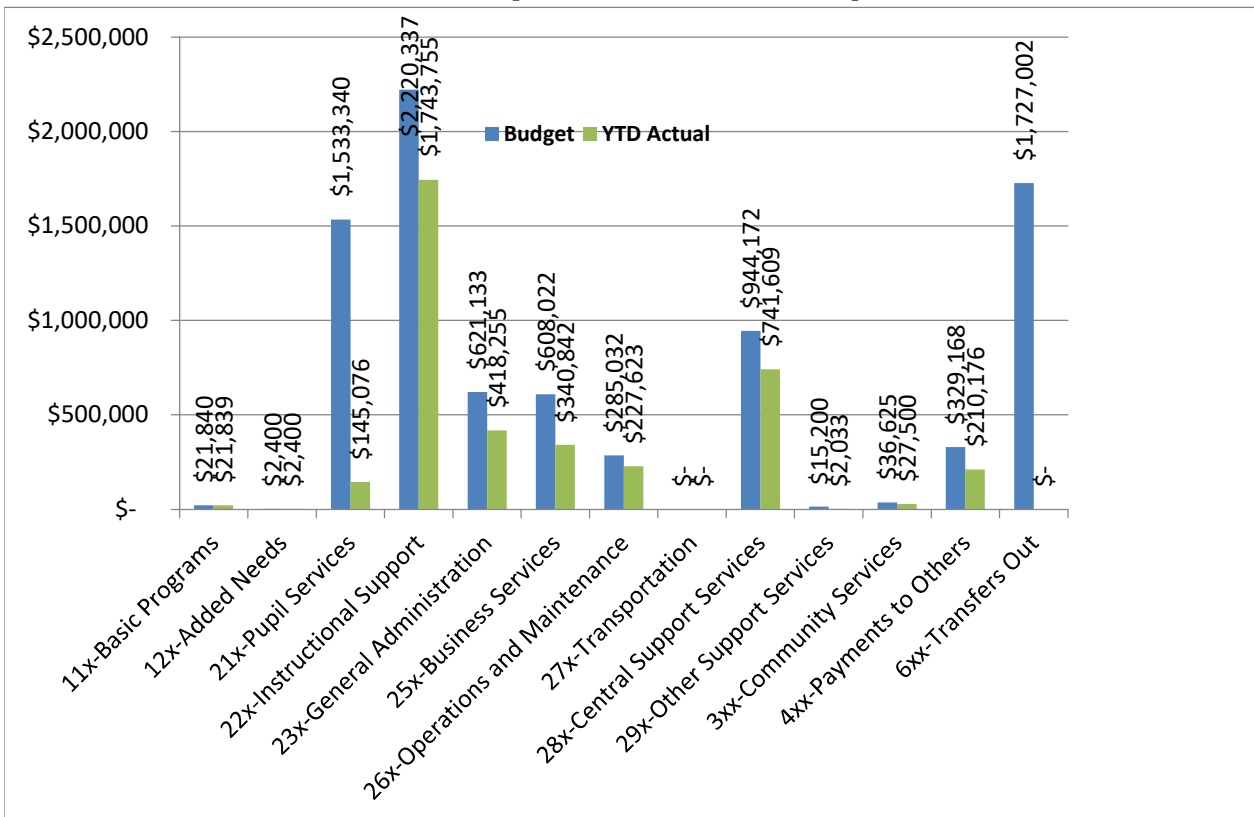

General Fund Revenues as of April 30, 2026

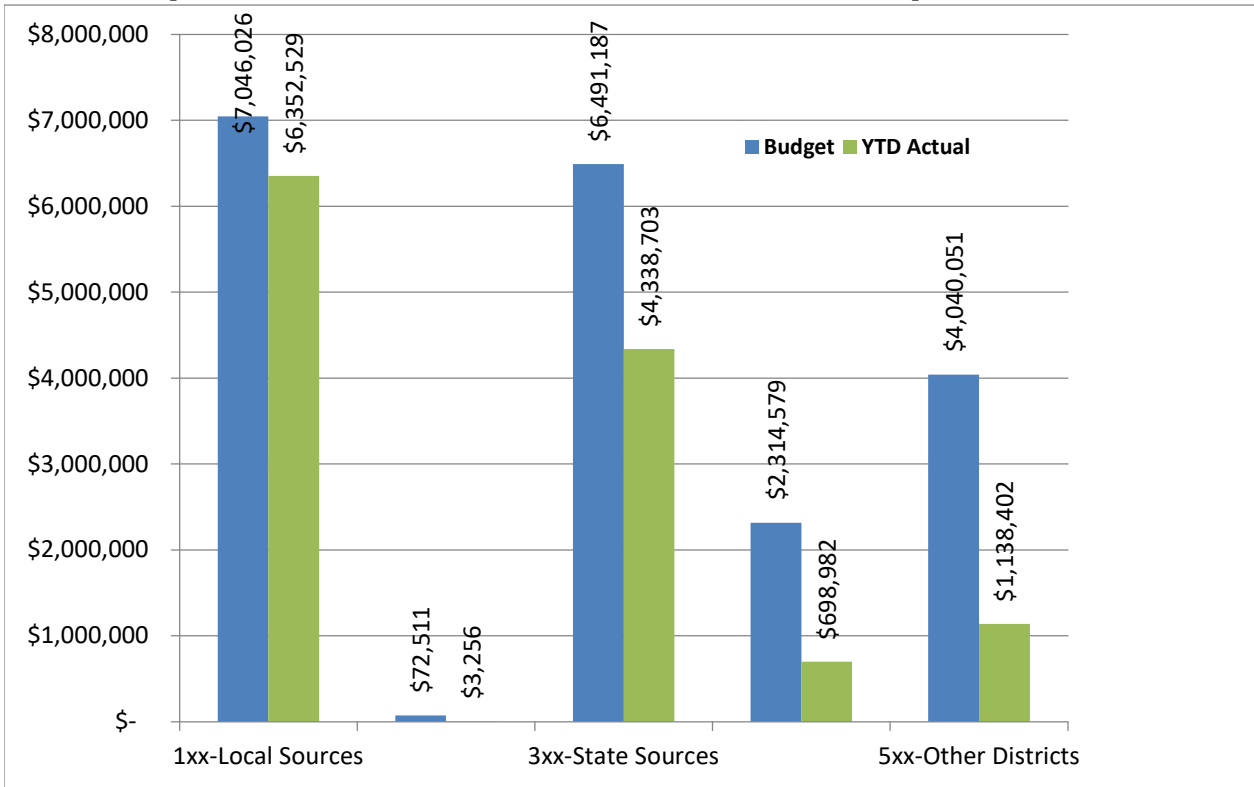


General Fund Expenditures as of April 30, 2026

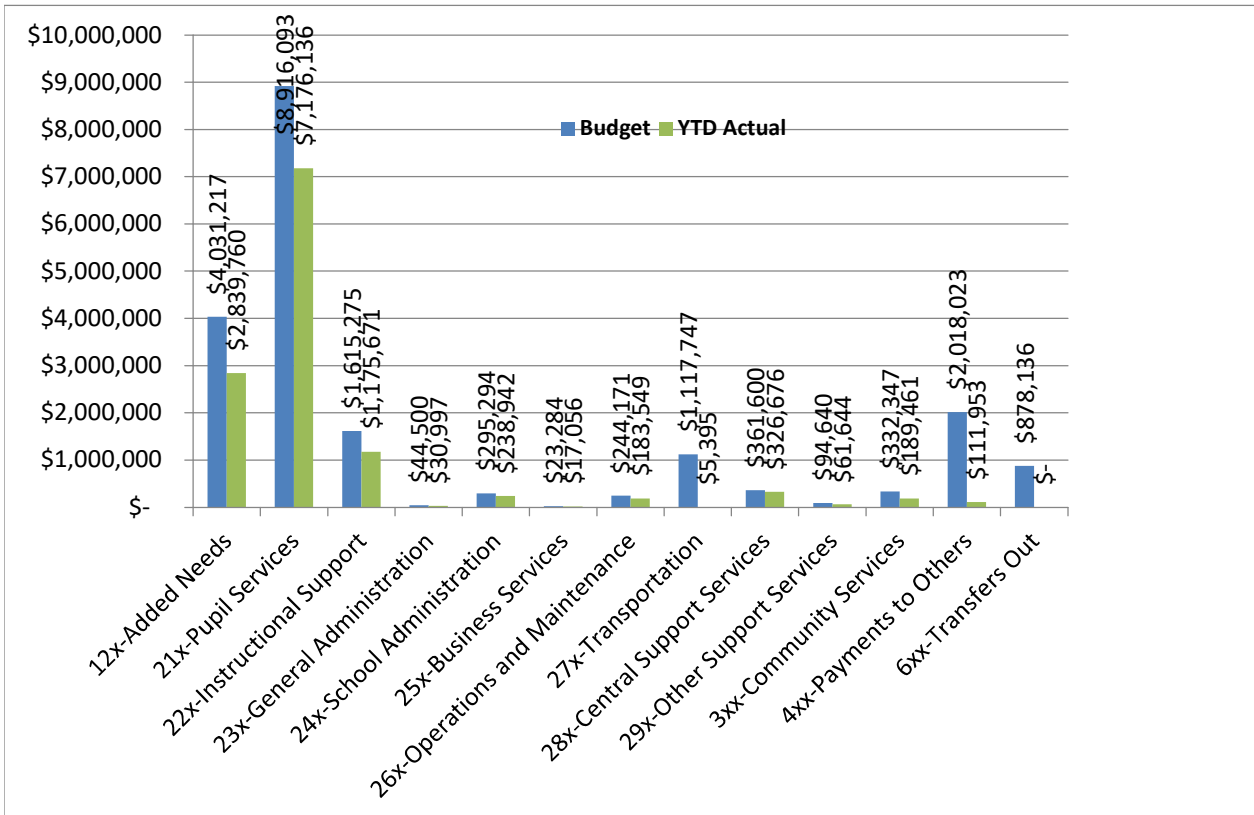

Special Education Fund Expenditures as of April 30, 2026

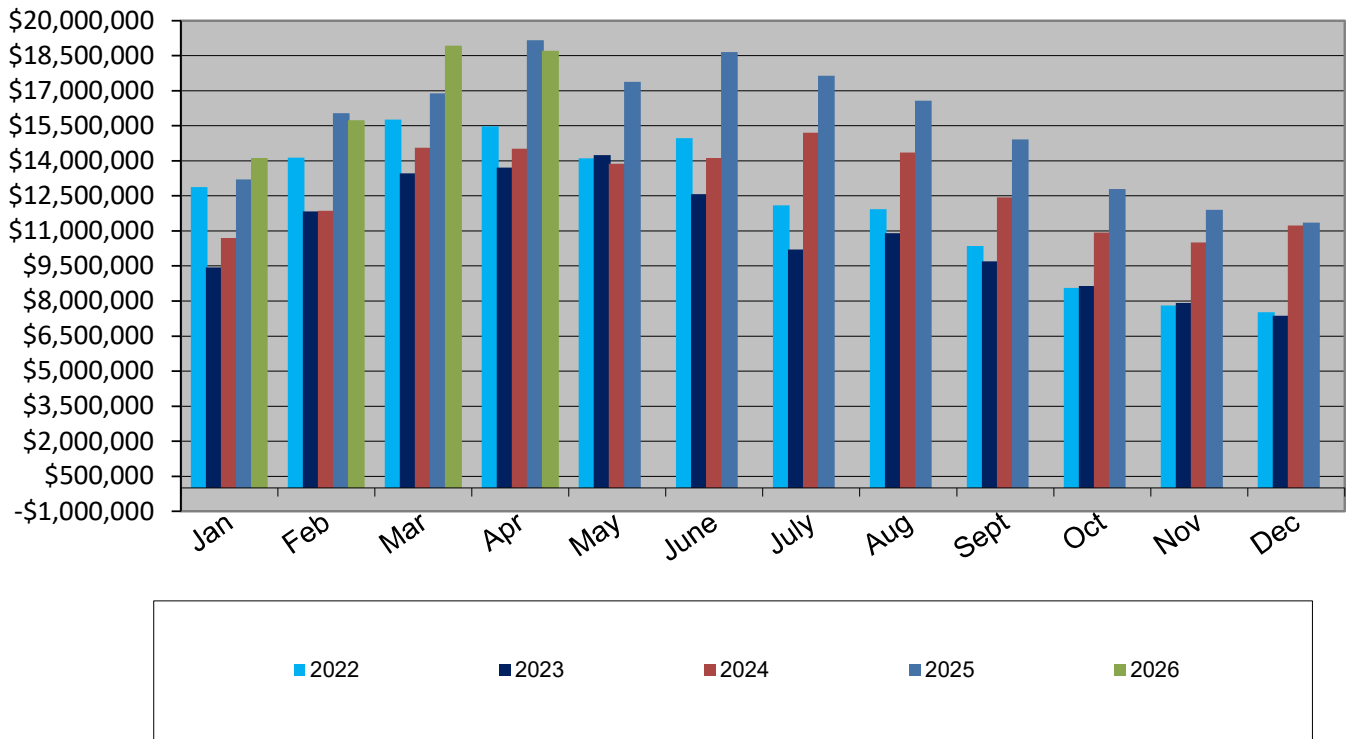

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT **May 2026**

EUPISD Employees of the Year

Each year, two employees are selected by their peers as EUPISD's Employees of the Year. Congratulations to Joe Sbar, School Psychologist, and Taylor Wollan, School-Based Mental Health Provider at the Learning Center, who have been selected this year!

CTE Millage

Our regional CTE millage renewal was overwhelmingly approved by the voters on May 5, 2026. 65% of voters in Chippewa, Luce, and Mackinac Counties supported the renewal, which is a testament to the importance of CTE in the EUP. Thank you to our local district administrators and staff who were influential in the passage of the millage.

Legislative Update

While Lansing is ahead of last year's schedule, there are significant differences among the three budget versions. The May Consensus Revenue Estimating Conference (CREC) is May 15th. Once updated revenue forecasts are available, budget negotiations begin in earnest.

The House began moving a property tax reform package. This would eliminate the School Education Tax (6 mills) and other revenue-generating taxes. The legislators assume the taxes would be backfilled, but a law cannot dictate specific funding to a future legislature. Occupational Therapy

School-based occupational therapy plays a vital role in helping students develop the skills they need to participate fully and confidently in their educational day. Occupational therapists (OTs) and occupational therapy assistants (OTAs) work as a team to support areas such as fine motor development, handwriting, sensory regulation, executive functioning, self-care routines, visual-motor and visual-perceptual skills, play, and social participation.

OTs lead the evaluation process, set individualized goals, design intervention plans, and collaborate closely with teachers and families to adapt tasks, materials, and environments so students can access learning in the least restrictive setting. OTAs provide hands-on intervention under the supervision of the OT, helping students practice targeted skills, use adaptive tools, and build independence across school routines.

Together, OTs and OTAs focus on enabling students to engage meaningfully in classroom activities, navigate daily school expectations, and participate more independently in their learning environment. Their work not only supports academic success but also promotes confidence, functional skill development, and fuller participation in the school community.

Tri-County Superintendents Special Education Committee

The EUPISD Tri-County Superintendents' Special Education Committee meets monthly to provide guidance, input, and recommendations related to regional special education and mental health support across the three-county area. Bringing together superintendent-level leadership, the committee serves as a collaborative forum to examine data, discuss emerging needs, and ensure services remain responsive to students and districts alike.

The committee is currently reviewing trends in special education eligibility to better understand patterns across the region and inform future planning. Throughout its work,

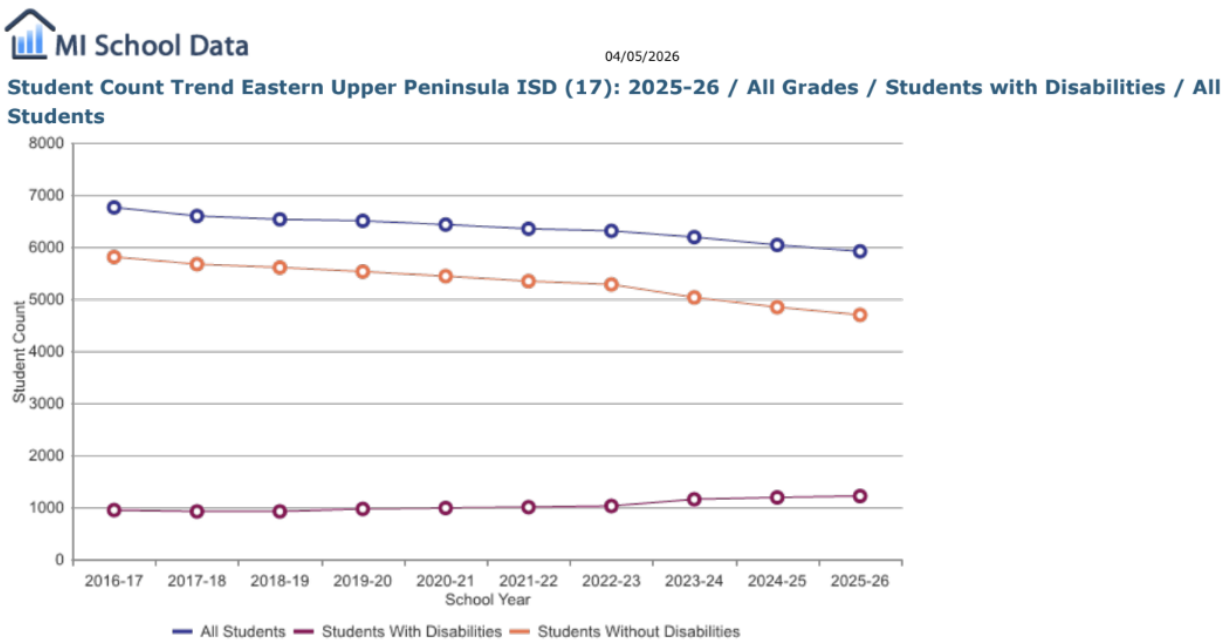

the committee remains focused on meeting student needs in the most cost-effective manner possible while maintaining a strong commitment to high-quality services and support.

Below you will see an example of the type of data being analyzed. The following graph shows that while the total student count has declined in the past 10 years, the number of students eligible for special education has increased.



Services for Students with Visual Impairment

The Teacher Consultant for Visual Impairment (TCVI) and the Orientation and Mobility (O&M) Specialist provide specialized services that enable students who are blind or have low vision to fully access their education and develop independence. The TCVI supports students' access to the general education curriculum through instruction and consultation in areas such as Braille, large print, assistive technology, visual efficiency, and compensatory skills. The TCVI collaborates closely with classroom teachers, special educators, related service providers, and families to adapt materials, recommend accommodations, support evaluations, and develop meaningful IEP goals. These services ensure instructional access while building staff understanding and capacity to meet diverse visual needs.

The O&M Specialist complements this work by teaching students the skills necessary to move safely and independently within the school environment and, when appropriate, the broader community. Instruction focuses on spatial and environmental awareness, orientation skills, safe travel within school buildings and campuses, and the use of mobility tools as needed. O&M services are individualized and goal-driven, supporting student confidence, independence, and participation in all aspects of school life. Together, TCVI and O&M services are essential in reducing barriers, promoting self-determination, and preparing students for long-term success.

Within our district, these services are delivered through a capacity building staffing model as part of the EUPISD Grow Your Own special education teacher apprentice program. We are fortunate to have Pam Celestain, a fully credentialed virtual TCVI, providing oversight, consultation, and program leadership while intentionally building capacity within the area of visual impairment services. Pam works closely with Dawn Benner, our on-site teacher apprentice for Visual Impairment and Orientation & Mobility, who serves as the “boots on the ground,” delivering direct instruction support and student support. Dawn will complete her first special education teaching credential in December and has been accepted into a program to begin her VI and O&M credentials in January. Her impact is already evident, including a recent milestone in which she celebrated with a student who earned his “driver’s license” for independently navigating the entire school building in his wheelchair. This partnership highlights both the success of the Grow Your Own program and the strength of a model that pairs expert oversight with hands-on support to achieve meaningful student outcomes.

Feeding Concerns: The Importance of Teaming and Collaboration

Addressing feeding concerns in infants and toddlers requires a collaborative, multi-disciplinary approach. Feeding difficulties are often complex and can involve medical, developmental, sensory, nutritional, and behavioral factors. Relying on one professional perspective alone may result in an incomplete understanding of the child's needs and less effective intervention strategies.

A coordinated team approach allows professionals to work together to develop a comprehensive understanding of each child and family. Important considerations when supporting infants and toddlers with feeding difficulties include:

1. Underlying medical conditions
2. Oral motor skills
3. Nutritional needs
4. Sensory and behavioral aspects of feeding
5. Family perspectives and routines

To support regional needs and strengthen services for infants and toddlers, the Early On Speech-Language Pathologists, Alyssa Clark, Alyssa Shaw, and Lisa Lewicki along with Occupational Therapist, Laura Gagnon developed a parent and family educational series focused on feeding concerns. The series was piloted during the 2025–2026 program year and received positive feedback from participating families. It will be offered again during the 2026–2027 program year.

Meaningful Mealtimes Training Series

Session 1: Meaningful Mealtimes – Portions and Plates

Parents participated in hands-on activities focused on portion sizes and practical mealtime strategies for young children.

Session 2: Meaningful Mealtimes – Sensory Strategies

This session focused on food chaining techniques, sensory supports, and lunchbox and meal ideas to support successful eating experiences.

Session 3: Meaningful Mealtimes

Parents and educators learned strategies to support choosy eaters, encourage adventurous eating, and create positive mealtime routines and environments.

The continued expansion of family education and collaborative support services strengthens the region's ability to meet the diverse developmental needs of infants and toddlers while empowering families with practical tools and strategies for success.

Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP Live Enrollment Dashboard)

The regional GSRP Live Enrollment Dashboard has officially launched. The dashboard provides families, schools, and community partners with up-to-date information about preschool enrollment and available openings across local Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP) sites.

The purpose of the live dashboard is to make it easier for families to find available preschool opportunities and connect children with programs as quickly as possible. It also helps schools and community partners better understand enrollment trends, identify open seats, and respond more efficiently to community needs throughout the year.

By providing real-time information in one shared location, the dashboard improves communication, supports collaboration among local preschool providers, and helps ensure that eligible children have access to high-quality early learning opportunities.

To reach that goal, the program provides real-life work experience combined with training in employability and independent-living skills to help young people with significant disabilities make successful transitions to productive adult life. The Project SEARCH model involves an extensive period of skills training and career exploration, innovative adaptations, long-term job coaching, and continuous feedback from teachers, skills trainers, and employers. As a result, at the completion of the training program, students with significant intellectual disabilities are employed in nontraditional, complex and rewarding jobs. In addition, the presence of a Project SEARCH program can bring about long-term changes in business culture that have far-reaching positive effects on attitudes about hiring people with disabilities and the range of jobs in which they can be successful.

Benefits of Attending The Project SEARCH National Conference

After reviewing the **conference sessions**, we have identified several sessions which will allow us to gain knowledge and understanding about how we can best serve students and recruit/retain highly qualified staff. 

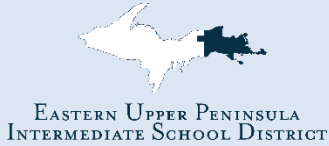

REGIONAL SCHOOL MENTAL HEALTH NURSE

Reports to: **Director of Special Education**

Purpose of Position:

The Regional School Mental Health Nurse will provide coordinated nursing support for mental health across the tri-county region of Chippewa, Luce, and Mackinac counties. The position focuses on suicide prevention, crisis response, trauma-informed systems, and intensive case management for students with the highest mental health needs. This role supports individual student crises through Emergency Student Assistance Teams and school-community trauma response using established crisis response frameworks.

Period of Employment: 7 hours per day, 190 days per year

Minimum Qualifications:

- Current Registered Nurse (RN) licensure approved by the State of Michigan
- Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) required
- Knowledge of and adherence to FERPA, HIPAA (as applicable), and District confidentiality policies
- Experience in school nursing, public health, pediatric, or mental health nursing preferred
- Experience or training in crisis intervention and suicide prevention preferred
- Strong organizational and time management skills, written, oral, and interpersonal communication skills, diligent work habits, and the ability to apply sound judgment to routine decision-making
- Ability to maintain self-control and complete tasks with frequent interruptions in high-stress situations
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively as part of a multidisciplinary team in a fast-paced environment
- Must have regular and reliable attendance
- Ability to carry and move heavy objects and lift 40 lbs
- Ability to travel within the tri-county service area; possess a valid driver's license

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Coordinate and support Emergency Student Assistance Teams (ESATs) for students experiencing mental health emergencies, including suicide risk, across Chippewa, Luce, and Mackinac counties
- Serve as a nursing and mental health consultant to school teams during student crisis identification, response, and follow-up
- Provide coordination and support for the ISD regional school crisis teams responding to building-level or community-wide traumatic events
- Support schools in crisis preparedness, response, and recovery using trauma-informed practices aligned with the NASP PREPaRE model
- Provide intensive case management for students with the highest mental health needs, ensuring continuity and coordination of care
- Facilitate effective communication and collaboration among schools, families, community mental health agencies, and medical providers
- Support transition planning for students returning to school following hospitalization or emergency mental health intervention
- Assist school personnel in navigating referrals, community resources, and coordination of mental health services
- Maintain thorough and accurate documentation related to crisis response, case management, and student services, in accordance with district, state, and professional standards
- Participate in multidisciplinary team meetings and provide consultation to administrators, educators, and support staff
- Upon request, provide professional learning and consultative services to local educational staff
- Exhibit a high level of professionalism with the ability to handle confidential information, use good judgment, plan and maintain a flexible attitude
- As needed for completion of duties, attend meetings outside of normal working hours
- Remain free of substance abuse and/or illegal drug use at all times
- Other duties as may be assigned by the Director of Special Education
