Distinguished Alumni

Mission Statement:

The Kindred Public School District* recognizes and honors Kindred High School alumni who distinguished themselves amongst their peers from grades nine (9) through twelve (12), and/or are holding distinguished titles in their post-graduation careers that are special and of merit.

**It is understood that the Kindred Public School District encompasses the townships of Walcott, Davenport, Kindred, Oxbow, Hickson, and Leonard, North Dakota.*

Committee:

Distinguished Alumni will be vetted through a process that will be headed by a committee made up of the following below. This committee will meet biannually at the behest of the Chairman to determine induction of distinguished alumni.

- The Kindred High School Principal will serve as the Chairman.
- Kindred School District will have three (2) high school staff members and two (2) community members that will comprise the committee. The Superintendent of Kindred Public School District #2 will also be asked to serve on the committee but may choose to accept or decline.
- This committee will be responsible for choosing from the individuals who are nominated by community members, staff members, or others affiliated with Kindred Public School District #2
- **All new inductions must pass with a majority vote of the committee to be recognized.**

Nomination Criteria:

- **Graduation/Time Since:** Prospective candidates must be an alumnus of Kindred High School and will have had to be enrolled in the school district a minimum of two (2) years to be considered.
 - The candidate must be at least 5 years post-graduation.
- **Excellence:** Prospective candidates must have demonstrated excellence(s) at Kindred High School in relative categories determined by committee.
 - The prospective candidate must have made a significant contribution to the specific areas that they were involved in outside the normal parameters and standards of the school.
- **Good Standing:** All prospective candidates should have demonstrated good citizenship in school and out of school during the years of high school participation and extending into post-graduation years and professional life.

- **Candidates cannot nominate themselves.**
- **Nominations can consist of current or past KPS faculty and staff, but they must be recognized for work outside of their job description.**

NOMINEE SECTIONS

- **Academic/Scholarly**
 - Nominee scored a perfect ACT/SAT score while enrolled at Kindred.
 - Nominee was a national merit scholar or obtained other nationally recognized academic awards.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING 2026

This Agreement between Kindred Public School District #1 (“KPSD”), and the Kindred Youth Baseball (“KYB”) is constituted as follows:

WHEREAS, KPSD and KYB are parties to this agreement covering the period January 1, 2026, through December 31, 2026, and will be reviewed annually, and

WHEREAS, the parties have a mutual interest in the Baseball Diamond property owned by KPSD; and

WHEREAS, the KYB has the desire to work with KPSD to ensure longevity of the summer baseball program, which is designed to improve not only baseball skills, but also to develop discipline, understanding, and a love for the great game of baseball; and

WHEREAS, KPSD and KYB are committed to creating a fun and safe environment for those kids within the school district who participate in the program, which includes a commitment to providing a first-class baseball facility at the Kindred Vikings Varsity Diamond; and

WHEREAS, with the increased number of structures and required maintenance on the baseball field, comes a need to increase management of the facility; and

WHEREAS, KPSD does not have a staff member hired with the expertise to run the facility, therefor this agreement becomes important to understand the responsibilities of a shared-use use of the facilities; and

WHEREAS, KYB did donate all structures to KPSD in which KYB uses each summer; and

WHEREAS, this agreement clarifies the obligations and responsibilities of each party with respect to payment of expenses and maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to mutually address the terms and conditions of the School Baseball Diamonds and who is responsible for maintenance of the facility; and

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. BASEBALL PROPERTY

- i. All baseball fields and structures on the fields are owned by KPSD.
- ii. During the years of 2019 and 2020, KYB led a major renovation to the baseball field totaling over \$1.1 Million, including:
 - Grandstand
 - Speaker System
 - Dugouts/Storage/Press box/Meeting Rooms
 - Dugout protection fence and padding
 - Batters Eye structure
 - Baseball Ornament
 - Scheel’s Scoreboard
 - Backstop (netting and pads)
 - Sidewalks / Patio
- iii. KYB may use the following fields:
 - Kindred High School Baseball Field
 - (North) Youth Baseball Diamond – denoted by Twins Baseball donation on the fence
 - Concessions Building and Restrooms
 - Storage Building

2. RESPONSIBILITIES

i. Kindred Public School District

1. Maintenance and repair of infrastructure, structures, batting cages and scoreboard
2. Maintenance and repair of lighting
3. Maintenance and repair of water/sewer including Irrigation System
4. Expenses incurred regarding electricity
5. Expenses incurred regarding water/sewer including Irrigation System
6. Maintain the high school baseball outfield (mow, fertilize and water)
7. Hang blue outfield fence liner

ii. Kindred Youth Baseball

1. Regular maintenance on fields, grounds, and mounds (pitching and bullpen) during the summer baseball season (June 1st – August 31st)
2. Regular Janitorial services required during the summer baseball season
3. As a courtesy, report any tournaments/jamborees where there are numerous teams involved in a day/weekend to the KPSD
4. Maintain the high school baseball infield (Mow, fertilize and water)
5. End Of KYB Season
 - Take down and store batting cages
 - Take down and store blue outfield fence liner
 - Cleaning of Press Box, Dugouts, Concessions and Bathrooms
 - Return microphone and scoreboard console to the Athletic Director
6. KYB will provide proof of insurance yearly to KPSD by June 1.
7. Should there be any activity/event that is not a sponsored use of the field by KYB, KPSD will require a formal rental agreement and proof of insurance for said activity/event.
8. Any renovations/updates to KPSD property will need prior approval from KPSD.

iii. KPSD/KYB Shared Responsibilities

1. Aerate and dethatch infield and outfield on an as needed basis (usually every three years)
2. Dirt and agri lime expenses
3. Setup and takedown of backstop netting and padding

This agreement is made and entered into in the state of North Dakota and will be interpreted, enforced, and governed by the laws and regulations of the state of North Dakota.

This agreement is subject to and contingent upon formal review, approval, and execution by the KPSD School Board.

Technology Planning Process

The development of the Kindred Public School District plan for educational technology involved the review of the 2015 North Dakota Educational Technology Plan. The plan also provides guidance to Kindred Public School educators, school leaders and other stakeholders in planning for educational technology.

The plan will be communicated to the constituents in a variety of methods including, but not limited to: direct communication, electronic mail, district website, staff development opportunities, and the student and staff handbooks. The plan will be approved by the Kindred Public School Board Members.

Content filtering is provided by EduTech and been in place for several years prior to the writing of this educational technology plan. Content is filtered by category and allowed or blocked by individual sites, requested by Kindred Public School staff. In addition, a second layer of content filtering is provided with local resources.

Introduction

Students will be engaged in their learning and benefit from a technology-rich environment. Students will develop abilities and strategies to interact with information resources. This includes analyzing information, appreciating a variety of perspectives, and producing products that communicate ideas effectively. Students will act responsibly with respect to intellectual freedom and intellectual property rights. They will become digital citizens.

It is not enough to simply automate traditional instructional methods; using educational technology, the district must be open to exploring new ways of providing students with the education they need to be successful. Technology should not be used and valued for what it is, but rather for what it does. Technology tools should assist students, teachers, staff, and administration in creating a successful learning environment.

By using educational technology, the district staff will:

1. Provide real world experiences, expanding communication skills, focusing on higher-order (critical) thinking skills, problem solving skills, and engaging students in learning how to learn.
2. Integrate technology within the curriculum to restructure and enrich or enhance the existing curriculum in all subject areas to make it more engaging and challenging.
3. Provide access to relevant materials in a variety of formats to complete student learning activities in the curriculum.
4. Improve literacy and proficiency in the use of educational technology through training opportunities.
5. Explore new ways to access educational technology and learning.

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is being executed by the below listed entities:

1. Cass County Sheriff's Office
2. Kindred School District

The above listed entities work in cooperation with one another, ultimately striving to create and maintain a safe and effective learning environment for our youth.

I. Purpose

This MOU establishes and delineates the mission of Cass County Sheriff's Office School Resource Deputy Program (SRD) as a joint cooperative effort. Additionally, the MOU formalizes relationships between the participating entities in order to foster an efficient and cohesive program that will build a positive relationship between deputy sheriffs and the youth of our community.

II. Mission

The mission of the Cass County Sheriff's Office School Resource Deputy Program is to promote and support the organizational strategies necessary to address the causes and reduce the fear of crime and social disorder through problem-solving tactics and police-community partnerships. Through the SRD Program, the Cass County Sheriff's Office will enhance the services provided to those persons within the Kindred School District and the community with an emphasis in the reduction and prevention of school-related violence and crimes committed by juveniles and young adults. The SRD Program will accomplish this mission by creating and maintaining a safe, secure, and orderly learning environment for students, teachers, and staff.

III. Description of Duties

- A. The SRD will serve in a variety of roles, including law enforcement officer, law-related educator, problem-solver, and community liaison.
 - 1. The SRD will address crime and disorder problems, gangs, and drug activities affecting or occurring in or around the Kindred School District.
 - 2. The SRD will serve as an expert resource in classes, such as crime prevention, substance abuse awareness, and gang resistance.
 - 3. The SRD will train students in conflict resolution, restorative justice, and crime awareness.
 - 4. The SRD will monitor and assist troubled students through mentoring and promote personal and social responsibility by encouraging participation in community service activities.
 - 5. The SRD will continue to build upon the respect and understanding between law enforcement and the school communities.
 - 6. The SRD will identify physical changes in the environment that could reduce crime in and around the Kindred School District.
 - 7. The SRD will help develop school policies that address criminal activity and school safety.
 - 8. The SRD will become a trusted channel of communications with the students, parents, and teachers.
 - 9. The SRD will serve as a positive role model to instill in students high moral standards, good judgment and discretion, respect for other students, and a sincere concern for the school community.
 - 10. The SRD will promote citizen awareness to enable students to become better informed and effective citizens.
 - 11. The SRD will empower students with the knowledge of the law, the obligations regarding enforcement, and the consequences for violations.
 - 12. The SRD will serve as a confidential source of counseling for students and parents in addition to providing information on community resources available to them.

- B. The Kindred School District will allow the SRD the following opportunities and access to the students, parents, facility, and staff which are deemed necessary to the performance of the SRD duties:
 - 1. Opportunity for classroom participation and formal programs conducted by the SRD.
 - 2. Opportunity to address students, parents, facility, and staff about the SRD Program's goals and objectives.
 - 3. Opportunity to provide input regarding criminal justice problems relating to students.
 - 4. Opportunity to address teachers and school administrators about criminal justice problems relating to students.

IV. Parties Financial Responsibilities

- A. The Cass County Sheriff’s Office will provide:
 - 1. The law enforcement related equipment and uniforms necessary for the SRD to fulfill their responsibility as a deputy sheriff.
 - 2. Payment of twenty-five percent (25%) of the cost of salary and benefits during the contact period, which is equivalent to \$26,413.66
 - 3. Payment of costs associated with training, certification, and licensing relating to the SRD's law enforcement duties.
 - 4. Payment of any expenses that are strictly law enforcement related.
 - 5. Cass County Sheriff’s Office will fund a school lunch account for the SRD to purchase lunches at the school’s normal rate unless other arrangements are made with Kindred School District.

- B. The Kindred School District will provide:
 - 1. A current Full-Time SRD contract with a school district is based on a forty (40) hour work week and the school district is responsible for a payment of seventy-five percent (75%) of the cost of salary and benefits during the contract period, which is equivalent to \$79,240.55
 - 2. Payment of overtime requested by the Kindred School District.
 - 3. Payment of costs associated with materials, supplies, office equipment, and other immediate costs associated with the SRD program.
 - 4. Payment of any expenses that are strictly school related.

V. Programmatic Reporting

The Cass County Sheriff’s Office will be responsible for completing and submitting progress reports as required on a periodic basis (December and May of the given school year) or as needed if there is a performance concern. Such reports shall include information relating to officer hiring, training, and school related community policing activities performed by the SRD with input from representatives from the Kindred School District.

VI. Information Sharing

- A. The Kindred School District will share student information with the SRD and other Cass County Sheriff’s Office employees in compliance with 34 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 99 Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

- B. The SRD and other employees of the Cass County Sheriff’s Office shall provide information to the District as required under:
 - 1. North Dakota Century Code (NDCC) 15.1-24-05 Law Enforcement Agencies- Duty to Inform Team relating to violations of law pertaining to alcohol, tobacco, drugs, imitation drugs, drug paraphernalia, driving under the

- influence, and open container of alcohol.
2. NDCC 12.1-32-15 Offenders against Children and sexual offenders.
- C. The SRD and other employees of the Cass County Sheriff's Office may provide information to the District as provided under:
1. NDCC 27-20.2-22 Disclosure of Information Needed to Apprehend the child.
 2. NDCC 27-20.2-23 Law Enforcement and Correctional Facility Records relating to the inspection of files and records of juveniles alleged or found to be delinquent, or in need of services or protection.
 3. NDCC 44-04-18.7 Criminal Intelligence Information relating to active investigations or intelligence gathering.

VII. Supervision Responsibility and Chain of Command for the SRD

- A. The SRD program will consist of a full-time deputy sheriff sworn to duty by the Cass County Sheriff's Office and certified by the North Dakota Peace Officers Standards and Training Board. Further, the SRD shall meet all requirements as set forth by the Cass County Sheriff's Office's Policy Manual.
- B. The day-to-day operation and administrative control of the SRD Program will be the responsibility of the Cass County Sheriff's Office. Responsibility for the conduct of the SRD, both personally and professionally, shall remain with the Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff shall appoint supervisory personnel to oversee the program consistent with the current chain of command.

VIII. Decision –Making Authority


- A. Although the SRD has been placed into a formal educational environment, they are not relieved of the official duties as a law enforcement officer. Decisions to intervene normally will be made when it is necessary to prevent or terminate any criminal act. Citations should be issued, juvenile referrals made, and arrests executed when appropriate and in accordance with department policy.
- B. The SRD Program shall utilize the SRD Triad Concept as set forth by the National Association of School Resource Officers (NASRO). The SRD Triad Concept generally means that the officer assigned to the program is a (1) law enforcement officer, (2) counselor, and (3) teacher. The SRD is first and foremost a law enforcement officer for the Cass County Sheriff's Office.
- C. The SRD shall be responsible for carrying out all the duties and responsibilities of a deputy sheriff and shall remain at all times under the control, through the established chain of command, of the Cass County Sheriff's Office. All acts of

XII. Liability

Now therefore, the Cass County Sheriff's Office and the Kindred School District agree as follows:

- A. Each party to this Agreement will be responsible for its own action in providing services under this agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by the other party.
- B. By entering into this Agreement, the parties do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those set out herein.

- D. SRDs' are to be used as a resource to assist students, faculty, staff, and all persons involved with the school district. SRD's may use teaching to build positive relationships between the students and the staff. SRD's may act as expert resource on a variety of subjects to students and staff ranging from alcohol and drug education to formalized academy classes.

IX. Evaluation of the Program

The goals, objectives, expectations and other details of the School Resource Deputy program shall be reviewed at least annually between the members of the Cass County Sheriff's Office and Kindred School District.

X. Amendments

This Agreement may be amended or modified at any time, but only by the written agreement of both parties.

XI. Term of Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

- A. The term of this Agreement shall be for the 2026-2027 School Year. The MOU may be renewed on an annual basis thereafter upon the consent of all parties, provided that the Agreement fee shall be adjusted annually to reflect merit or cost of living salary adjustments and/or other increased costs.
- B. Any party may cancel this MOU without cause, upon giving a 90-day written notice to each party.
- C. School Resource Deputies will be staffed in the following schools:
 - Kindred School

Whereas, the Kindred Public School District hereinafter referred to as District, has agreed to purchase the services described in the "Scope of Service" (Attachment A); and

Whereas, Fargo Cass Public Health, 1240 25th Street South, Fargo, North Dakota 58103-2367 hereinafter referred to as Provider desires to provide the services described in the "Scope of Services" (Attachment A):

Now, therefore the District and the Provider enter into the following:

I. TERMS OF CONTRACT

The term of this contract shall be for the school year 2026-2027, beginning on July 1, 2026, and ending on June 30, 2027. This contract may be renewed for subsequent school years by written agreement of the parties. Provided that either party may terminate this contract at any time upon thirty (30) days written notice to other party.

II. TERMINATION

In the event the agreement is terminated, the termination shall be without prejudice to any obligations or liabilities of either party for services provided prior to such termination.

III. SCOPE OF SERVICE

The Provider agrees to provide services in accordance with documentation in this contract.

IV. COMPENSATION

1. The District agrees to reimbursement for service in accordance with the agreed upon charges in this contract (Attachment B). The billing will occur monthly, at the previously determined rate of 70 percent for the district and 30 percent for the provider. The hours to be billed will include the scheduled nursing time, any annual or sick leave taken by the nursing personnel and holiday pay as determined by the City of Fargo.
2. The provider will attempt to get substitute nursing coverage, when the regularly scheduled nurse is on extended leave.
3. Kindred Public School District has requested an increase in school nursing hours over the original 30 hours per week agreement. Therefore, Kindred Public School District agrees to pay 100 percent (salary and benefits) of the school nursing hours in excess of 30 hours per week, including any overtime accrued in lieu of this request. The school nurse rate with salary and benefits will be billed at \$49.89. If additional hours are requested outside of the terms of this agreement by the District it will be subject to staffing availability and operational approval by Provider. Provider shall have no obligation to provide additional hours where doing so would result in overtime, staffing shortages, or disruption of other public health services.
4. Fargo Cass Public Health will be reimbursed at a rate of 70 percent for nurses and aides who take time off during non-scheduled school days, up to two weeks, between August 26, 2026, and May 26, 2027.
5. Mileage expense for nursing staff and aides to travel between Fargo Cass Public Health and Kindred Public School shall be reimbursed at the IRS rate, which is currently at .725 cents per mile, up to a maximum of 500 miles per school year.

The Provider may subcontract with qualified providers of services, provided that any subcontract must acknowledge the binding nature of this agreement and incorporate this agreement, together with its attachments. The Provider agrees to be solely responsible for the performance of any subcontractor.

VIII. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

The Provider is performing the duties under this agreement as an independent contractor. No part of this agreement, or the arrangements made by the parties to perform this agreement, shall be construed as creating an employer/employee relationship.

IX. COPYRIGHT

The District reserves the right to copy or reproduce any materials created or produced, by the Provider, in the performance of this agreement except with confidential information.

X. AGREEMENT CONSTITUTES CONTRACT

This agreement shall constitute the entire contract, between the parties, for the performance of the Scope of Service. There are no other agreements, either verbal or written, that alter or affect this agreement.

XI. PROVIDER ASSURANCES

The Provider agrees to comply with the applicable provider Assurances hereto attached, on Attachment C.

XII. INTEGRATION AND MODIFICATION

This contract constitutes the entire agreement between the Provider and the District. No alteration, amendment or modification in the provisions of this agreement shall be effective unless it is reduced to writing signed by the parties and attached hereto.

XIII. COLLATERAL CONTRACTS

Where there exists any inconsistency between this agreement and other provisions of collateral contractual agreements which are made a part of this agreement by reference or otherwise, the provisions of this agreement shall control.

XIV. ACCESS TO RECORDS

Fargo Cass Public Health and the North Dakota State Health Department, and their duly authorized representatives, shall have access to the books, documents, paper and records of the District which are pertinent, as determined by Fargo Cass Public Health, to this contract for the purpose of audits, examinations, excerpts, billings, and transcripts.

The Provider agrees to retain financial and program records. The District is responsible for student records including all electronic health information, if applicable, and will follow their own retention policy.

XVI. CONFIDENTIALITY

The Provider will not, except upon the written consent of the recipient's or their responsible parent, guardian, or custodian, use or cause to be used any information concerning such individual for any purpose not directly connected with the District or the Provider's responsibilities with respect to services purchased hereunder. The District acknowledges their role in abiding by the adherence to FERPA regulations relative to educational records confidentiality in order to protect student privacy. The consequences of failing to comply with FERPA must be borne by the School District and not Fargo Cass Public Health.

XVII. APPLICABLE LAW

This agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of North Dakota.

XVIII. CAPTIONS

The captions or heading in this agreement are for convenience only and in no way define, limit, or describe the scope of intent of any provisions of this agreement.

XIX. EXECUTION AND COUNTERPARTS

This agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original, all of which shall constitute but one of the same instrument.

XX. AMENDMENTS

The terms of this agreement shall not be waived, altered, modified, supplemented, or amended, in any manner whatsoever, except by written instrument signed by the parties.

XXI. NOTICES

All notices, certificates or other communications shall be sufficiently given when delivered or mailed, postage prepaid, to the parties at their respective places of business as set forth in the preamble to this agreement or at a place designated hereafter in writing by the parties.

XXII. SUCCESSORS IN INTEREST

The provisions of this agreement shall be binding upon and shall ensure to the benefit of the parties hereto, and their respective successors and assigns.

XXIII. SEVERABILITY

The parties agree that any term or provision of this contract is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or in conflict with any law, the validity of the remaining terms and provisions shall not be affected, and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be construed and enforced as if the contract did not contain the particular term or provision held to be invalid.

XXIV. WAIVER

The failure of the District to enforce any provisions of this contract shall not constitute a waiver by the District of that or any other provision.

Such waiver, consent, modification or change, if made, shall be effective only in modification or change, if made, shall be effective only the specific instance and for the specific purpose given. There are no understandings, agreements, or representatives, oral or written, not specified herein regarding this agreement. Provider, by the signature below of its authorized representative, hereby acknowledges that the Provider has read this agreement, understands it and agrees to be bound by its terms and conditions.

XXVI. INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS

The District hereby agrees to indemnify and hold the Provider, its officers, agents, employees, and members, harmless from any and all claims, demands and causes of action which may be asserted against the Provider as a result of the rendering of any of the services by the Provider which are described in this Agreement. The obligation of the District under the terms of this provision shall include the duty to provide a legal defense of such claims; provided that this provision shall not be construed to require reimbursement of any legal expenses incurred by the District, without prior written approval of the District.

XXVII. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The Provider shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws and ordinances applicable to the work to be done under this agreement.

XXVIII. NON- DISCRIMINATION

The Provider makes available all services and assistance without regard to race, color, national origin, religion, age, sex, or handicap, and is subject to Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1975 as amended. Persons who contract with or receive funds to provide services for Provider are obligated to abide by the provisions of their federal laws. Neither party shall be liable for delay or failure in performance caused by events beyond its reasonable control, including natural disasters, severe weather, fire, flood, war, terrorism, labor disputes, governmental action, or public health emergencies. The affected party shall give prompt notice and shall resume performance as soon as reasonably practicable.

SCHOOL HEALTH PROGRAM
A COLLABORATIVE PROGRAM BETWEEN
KINDRED PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT AND FARGO CASS PUBLIC HEALTH**

PURPOSE: The purpose of this partnership is to share expertise, time, energy, and economic resources to coordinate and provide a comprehensive health program in our school community.

GOALS: The goal of this program is to provide Public Health School Nurse services and/or Nurse Aide services to all components of the Kindred Public School District health program: education, environment and services.

- A. Improve the student and family access to community health services.
- B. Improve the early identification, referral, and follow-up of students experiencing unresolved health problems.
- C. Determine the current compliance rate for follow-up on health screening results and on immunization requirements.
- D. Improve the students' access to basic health services at school for first aid symptom management and medications.

OBJECTIVES:

The Public Health School Nurse is a liaison between education and health care and will provide a link between the school, home and community. The nurse will:

A. Manage health care in the school health program

The nurse will participate in planning, implementation, and evaluation of the program.

B. Deliver health services

The nurse will deliver health services to the client system using systematic processes to assess needs, plan interventions, and evaluate outcomes so that high-level wellness can be achieved. The nurse will also monitor follow-through related to health referrals. The nurse aide will deliver health services primarily focused on first aid, medication administration or emergencies. The nurse aide will work in conjunction with the nurse assigned to that building and will be supervised by that nurse.

C. Advocate for the health rights of children

The nurse will act as an advocate for the health rights of children and their families both within the school and between the school and community.

D. Provide health consult for individuals and groups

The nurse will provide health counseling and guidance for the client system on an individual basis or within a group setting.

E. Provide health education

The nurse will participate in health education program activities for children, youth, school personnel, and the community.
