Executive Summary

TMCHS opened the school year with 488 students and an overall attendance rate of 92.14% during the first two weeks. Seniors currently have the strongest attendance rate among the grade levels. September priorities include sustaining student attendance, launching expanded after-school opportunities, advancing five grant initiatives, strengthening parent engagement, and continuing the school's leadership in Native language and cultural programming.

Committee Updates:

Welcome to a New School Year

We are excited to welcome our students, families, and staff back for the 2026–2027 school year! The first day of school was Monday, August 17, 2026, and it has been wonderful to see our students return and begin a new year of learning, growth, and school activities.

The beginning of the school year has focused on establishing classroom routines and expectations, building positive relationships, and ensuring that students have the resources and support they need to be successful. Students are completing their beginning-of-year FastBridge

and ND A+ assessments, which will provide teachers with important information to guide instruction and identify students who may need additional support.

We are also continuing to emphasize schoolwide expectations, including our “No Cell Phone – Bell to Bell” policy, regular attendance, positive behavior, and being prepared to learn each day. The school will continue recognizing students through the Perfect Attendance Incentive Program to encourage consistent attendance and participation in learning.

We are looking forward to a successful school year and appreciate the continued support of our families, staff, and Turtle Mountain community.

Student Council:

Student Council elections will be held during the month of September. Students will have the opportunity to run for grade-level representative and officer positions and to participate in the election process.

Student Council provides students with opportunities to develop leadership skills, practice responsibility, share their ideas and concerns, and become more involved in the school community. Additional information regarding candidate nominations and the election date will be shared with students once finalized.

Safety Committee:

The Safety Committee will continue to meet throughout the school year to address building safety, emergency preparedness, security concerns, and other issues that contribute to maintaining a safe learning environment for students and staff.

A major focus for the 2026–2027 school year will be the implementation of the Raptor emergency management system. The system will provide the school with additional tools to support emergency communication, preparedness, and response. Staff will receive training and information on the new system as implementation moves forward.

The committee will also continue monitoring building and playground safety, emergency procedures, evacuation drills, bus safety, security measures, and other safety concerns as they arise. The committee will work with Administration and other departments to address concerns and strengthen safety procedures throughout the school.

The school will also continue providing bottled water for students and staff as part of our ongoing efforts to ensure access to drinking water throughout the school day.

Wellness Committee:

The Wellness Committee will continue supporting the health and well-being of students and staff throughout the school year. The committee will monitor wellness initiatives, student health needs, nutrition practices, and opportunities that promote healthy choices.

Bottled water will continue to be available at school. The committee will also continue to support school nutrition programs and other wellness activities that benefit our students.

The committee will work throughout the year to promote healthy habits, student wellness, and a positive school environment.

PLCs:

Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) will continue to focus on student learning, instructional practices, assessment data, and strategies to meet the needs of all learners.

As teachers complete beginning-of-year FastBridge and ND A+ assessments, PLC teams will use the information to begin identifying student strengths and areas where additional academic support may be needed. Teachers will continue using a variety of instructional approaches, including whole-group instruction, small-group instruction, independent practice, hands-on activities, collaborative learning, and technology-based learning.

PLC discussions will also focus on reviewing student progress, monitoring interventions, sharing effective instructional strategies, and ensuring that instruction is aligned with grade-level standards and curriculum expectations.

As the school year progresses, PLCs will continue using student data to guide instruction and support student growth and achievement.

School Activities and Student Engagement:

The 2026–2027 school year is already underway with several opportunities for students to participate in extracurricular activities and build school spirit. Our seventh- and eighth-grade students are participating in cross country, girls' golf, football, and volleyball.

The school will also celebrate Homecoming September 21–26, providing students and staff with opportunities to participate in school spirit activities and strengthen our sense of school community.

We are excited about the opportunities ahead and look forward to a year of continued learning, leadership, safety, wellness, and student success.

The Chief Financial Officer and Business Manager have the following report:

We worked with Dr. Shane Martin and Dr. Carmelita Lamb on a Suicide Prevention Grant application. The committee is coming back to us and asking for more information. That could be a good sign.

We completed all the claims except one Title IV claim. Once this claim is made, we can do the ND Financial Report on STARS. We are building all the Title budgets.

The Title team has completed the Consolidated application. We have gotten Title IV and II budgets in Webgrants. This means that the Consolidated application is getting accepted and approved. We are waiting for the Title I budget to appear in Webgrants. Then I can put the budgets in.

I have attended the Back-to-School Workshop for the food program. I also got the other cooks in the schools to go to the Back-to-School training and a Nutrition training. This will help our food programs throughout the schools.

I have been building the budgets and had a few meetings with the purchasing agents to help build the budgets. The High School has their budgets sent to BIE for approval. The Special Education Director has sent her budgets to BIE for approval.

Business Manager Report – Construction Areas August 20, 2026:

1. Alternative School Facility (TMHS & TMMS) – Jiran Architects have been hired. TF Powers as Prime and General Contractor; Electrical sub-contractor is BJ Electric and Mechanical sub-contractor is GD Mechanical. Project cost is estimated at \$5 million. Located north of TMMS. Footings and interior floor are poured. The exterior building package (roof and walls) is erected as structural construction continues. The interior framing is complete with electrical, mechanical and plumbing running throughout. Anticipated completion by October 2026 with occupancy to follow shortly afterwards.
2. Bus Barn – Jiran Architects has been retained for project design. Contractors include Industrial Contract Services (ICS) as the General Contractor, Blue Lightning Electric as the Electrical Contractor, and Lunseth Plumbing and Heating as the Mechanical Contractor. The installation of asphalt around the building with drainage valley gutter complete. Total project cost estimated at approximately \$5.3 million remained in budget just under the \$5,287,500 approved for this construction. The structure is now complete with punch list items to be complete the week of August 24 -28, 2026. Occupancy set for August 28, 2026
3. Elementary Playground - The renovation of the Elementary playground began in summer 2024. A new section of playground equipment was installed, and the existing section of playground equipment was updated. In addition, a protective rubberized foam low maintenance base was put down. Installed on the east side was a new canopy along with picnic tables. The basketball court now has a rubberized surface. We are also incorporating additional wooden frame outdoor classroom structures with guidance and vision from Thomas LaClair, who helped in acquiring a grant to further beautify the playground with the trees and other similar components. The west side cedar gazebo will be completed in September. The Turtle Mountain Elementary playground is likely second to none in ND; hope the Elem kiddos enjoy!
4. TM Football Field Parking Lot and Driveway Replacement Project – The Turtle Mountain Community School football field parking lot and driveway replacement project received approval from the ND DPI on June 3, 2026. The project will replace the existing parking lot and access drive, last renovated in 1991, which has experienced significant deterioration due to age, heavy use, and recurring frost boils that have created safety hazards, drainage issues, and increased maintenance costs.

The project was bid in July 2026; however, the bids received exceeded the available budget allocation from both the Belcourt School District and the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa Indians. As a result, the project will not proceed under the current bid.

The District and Tribe plan to rebid the project in fall 2026 with the goal of completing the work in spring 2027. To improve competitiveness and better manage project costs, the revised bid package will consider separating the work into two components: (1) concrete curb and sidewalk work, and (2) removal of the existing asphalt, dirt work and subgrade preparation, gravel base installation, and new asphalt installation. The District and Tribe will continue to evaluate the most cost-effective approach while maintaining the necessary improvements to safety, drainage, access, and parking.

5. East TMHS and New Bus Garage Paving Project – The North Dakota Department of Public Instruction approved the Belcourt School District #7 paving project on June 3, 2026, and the School Board subsequently awarded the contract to Flickertail Paving. The project includes asphalt paving improvements at two locations: the new school bus garage site and an area east of Belcourt High School. Construction was complete August 20, 2026.

6. Two Court Gymnasium Project on South Side of TMHS – Current facility uses shows that the TMHS gymnasium no longer meets the needs of the school’s academic and extracurricular programs. The district began plans to construct a new gymnasium. LSE Architects of Minneapolis, MN were selected by the school board on May 12, 2026, contingent upon ND DPI approval of project. ND DPI approved the project at a tentative budget of \$7.6 million; \$3 million from construction reserve, \$4 million from issuance of certificates of indebtedness and \$600k from TMHS Grant. Schematic design and planning began July 11, 2026, and was complete as of August 6, 2026; the project has now entered into design specification with anticipated completion by September 30 and bid advertising on October 5, 2026.

Business Manager Report – School Program Areas August 20, 2026

1. Zonar School Bus Tracking System Installed and Running - We want staff to know that Zonar tracking has now been installed on our school buses. The system allows the district to monitor the location of buses in real time, helping us know where buses are during their routes and providing better visibility into transportation operations.

Zonar will also allow the district to monitor bus speeds and driving activity, helping us identify potential safety concerns and promote safe driving practices. The system will improve communication when delays or route issues occur and provide additional information to help ensure the safety and efficient operation of our transportation services.

2. August 17 Tribal State Meeting – Tribal Council, DPI State Superintendent and BSD#7 Administration – Levi Bachmeir, ND State Superintendent of Public Instruction provided consultation with the TM Band Tribal Government. BSD#7 was allowed to discuss items of concern which included the following:

a. Clarification of NDCC Chapter 54-40.2 — Tribal/Public School Agreements – The TM Band of Chippewa and Belcourt School District #7 have informally requested NDDPI support to narrow clarification of NDCC Chapter 54-40.2 during the next North Dakota Legislative Assembly in 2027 to expressly authorize federally recognized tribes operating BIE-funded tribal grant schools to enter educational agreements with North Dakota public school districts. The clarification would provide legal certainty for TMHS’s nearly 50-year Turtle Mountain–Belcourt School partnership without transferring public school authority, changing funding, or diminishing tribal sovereignty. The proposed change would preserve the independent legal authority of both governments.

b. Status of 2027–2028 Title I Allocation Method Changes - North Dakota changed its Title I funding formula beginning in School Year 2025–26, moving from the state’s alternative formula to calculations based primarily on Census poverty data. As a result, BSD#7 experienced an estimated \$1.7 million reduction (48.5%) from its prior Title I allocation of \$3.5 million.

NDDPI established a Title I Task Force to review the impact of the new formula and recommend changes. The Task Force has recommended a hybrid formula using 50% Census poverty data and 50% current Free and Reduced-Price Meal (FRPM) data, along with changes intended to better account for student mobility and ensure funding more closely follows students to the district

where they are enrolled and receiving services. NDDPI is acting on these recommendations and is submitting proposed changes to the U.S. Department of Education for approval, with potential implementation beginning in School Year 2027–28. If approved, BSD#7 will have to go back to acquiring lunch applications to acquire data to help determine poverty levels of our student.

The financial impact on BSD#7, if approved, is not yet known and will depend on the final state proposal, public input, federal approval, and the resulting allocation formula. We are optimistic that most or some of the funding reductions will be restored if approval is met. Through FY2026–27, the district has been able to use available state funding to maintain Title I services & retain current staff; therefore, no Title I-related staff reductions yet.

What if the Funding Is Not Restored? Approximately 80% of BSD#7's Title I funding supports teachers and student support personnel. If the full \$1.7 million reduction becomes permanent, the district's general fund does not have sufficient capacity to permanently replace this level of Title I funding. The district would therefore need to reduce some instructional and student support positions or services to bring the Title I program into balance.

What if the Funding Is Partially Restored? If only a portion of the lost Title I funding is restored, the district still faces a funding gap. The size of that gap would determine the level of staffing or student-support reductions necessary to balance the Title I budget, with the district's goal being to preserve essential instructional services and minimize the impact on students and staff.

At this time, no staffing reductions are planned for FY2027 as a result of the Title I reduction. The district will continue to advocate for a funding formula that more accurately reflects poverty and needs of the students served and directs funding to schools actually educating those students.

c. Free School Student Meals - BSD#7 continues to advocate for providing every North Dakota student with access to a free breakfast and lunch at school, regardless of family income. If ND November State Election Measure 2 is approved, the State should provide sufficient funding to ensure schools do not have to divert educational resources to cover meal costs and not fully reimbursed through federal programs. BSD#7 advocated for clear implementation guidance that protects existing federal meal reimbursements and ensures that providing nutritious meals does not come at the expense of classroom and student services.

d. Career and Technical Education - BSD#7 strongly advocated for continued and increased investment in Career and Technical Education, regional CTE centers, and state funding for CTE facility construction and expansion. CTE provides students with hands-on learning, industry credentials, work-based learning, and pathways to postsecondary education and high-demand careers, with particularly strong graduation outcomes among Native American CTE students. BSD#7 encouraged equitable access for rural and Tribal communities, continued investment in modern facilities and equipment, and development of Tribal-specific reporting on CTE enrollment, completion, credentials, and graduation outcomes.

e. School Construction Assistance for Property-Poor Districts - BSD#7 advocated for expanding North Dakota's school construction financing program to provide dedicated (current 2%) low-interest assistance for property-poor districts that lack sufficient local tax capacity to fund needed construction, renovation, and modernization. Tribal and rural districts can face significant inequities because their facility needs may be substantial while their local property-tax base is limited. Eligibility should consider taxable valuation, property-tax capacity, enrollment, Tribal student populations, and demonstrated facility needs so students in property-poor communities can have safe, modern, and equitable learning environments.

f. Statewide Tribal Student Data and Reports - BSD#7 advocated that NDDPI work with Tribal governments to develop a secure system providing aggregate student performance data by specific Tribal affiliation, without student names or other personally identifying information. Tribal-specific reporting would help governments and schools evaluate outcomes such as graduation, attendance, achievement, CTE participation, special education, discipline, and postsecondary success while complying with FERPA and other privacy requirements. BSD#7 suggests such access to information will improve resource allocation and help identify opportunities to improve outcomes for Native students.

g. Support and Resources for Integration of Navvy Data - BSD#7 advocated for better support to help schools better implement Navvy classroom assessments with ND A+ interim and summative assessments but emphasizes that the value of the system depends on timely action, not simply connecting assessment data. NDDPI was asked to ensure that schools receive meaningful support, including professional development, instructional assistance, intervention resources, and culturally responsive strategies when assessment data identifies student or school needs.

h. Dual Credit and Postsecondary Access - The BSD#7 advocated for continued expansion of dual-credit opportunities and increased state investment in postsecondary access, particularly for students in Native-serving and rural schools. Dual credit can reduce the cost of college for students, optimizes student's educational time, strengthens academic preparation, and provides students with earlier connections to postsecondary education and career pathways. BSD#7 encourages NDDPI to work with Tribal governments, schools, higher education institutions, and communities to address barriers such as cost, transportation, geographic distance, course availability, advising, technology, and access to qualified instructors.
