What is LINK CREW?

- Link Crew is a high school transition program that welcomes 9th graders and makes them feel comfortable throughout the first year of their high school experience.
- 11th and 12th graders are selected and choose to be Link Crew Leaders.

Highlights

 - Two days of Link Leader planning
 - About 80 Freshmen attended

 - Small Group Activities with Link Leaders

- 2-3 Link Leaders assigned to each 9th Grade Homeroom
- Link Crew course - learning, leadership and service
- As positive role models, Link Crew Leaders are mentors and student leaders who guide the 9th graders to discover what it takes to be successful during the transition to high school and help facilitate 9th grade success.

Bear Creek Student Store-Introduction

- Building-wide, student run store
- Students earn and spend “Bear Bucks” on items/activities of their choosing (PBIS aligned)
- Students complete inventory, order filling, order deliveries, and recirculation of Bear Bucks
 - Inventory: Organizing and keeping track of materials, creating passes, and collecting ideas for future purchases.
 - Order Filling: Counting money and filling the orders.
 - Order Deliveries: Personally delivering to homerooms.
 - Bear Bucks: Recycling the money back to the staff to hand out.

Bear Creek Student Store-Highlights

- Students placed and filled over 1,200 orders.
- All students with individualized behavior plans that involved earning Bear Bucks, all met their goal by the end of the 2025-2026 school year.
- Students came together as a building to earn new recess equipment for all grades and students came together as a class to earn rewards to use together.
- Students who ran the store increased their basic math computation scores to 90% proficiency or higher.
- Students who participated in running the school store developed a stronger sense of community within the building.
- Students were motivated to meet *all staff* expectations to earn Bear Bucks, which led to increased positive behaviors throughout the school year.

Bear Creek Student Store-Student Experience

- Weston L and Adeline K
- Talk about how they earned Bear Bucks (include all possible ways: Special Areas, classroom teachers, aides, cafeteria, recess, Gears, bus, behavior plans, attendance, growth in goal areas, and any other areas of need that arose).
- Talk about how it felt to run the store.
- Talk about how it motivated them to meet their individual goals. (get to car rider on time, appropriate hallway behaviors, increased math computation skills)

Bear Creek Student Store-Looking Ahead

- The school store will continue this year in a slightly different fashion.
- Students will still help run the store during BEAR time, continuing to practice math and social skills.
- Prizes will include more free experiences, such as games with the principal, lunch with a teacher, extra recess for my class, sit in a executive chair for the day, etc.
- Last year, this model extended to “Bus Bucks” where drivers could reward kids for positive bus behaviors too- this will continue this year.

School Is Underway

It's great to have our students back and the 2026-2027 school year underway. We opened the year with 3,291 students across the District: 179 at Bainbridge, 452 at East High Street, 717 at Bear Creek, 781 at the Middle School, and 1,162 at the High School.

We also saw a strong start with attendance, with approximately 98 percent District-wide attendance during our first four days of school.

After months of preparation over the summer, it has been great to see our buildings filled with students again and learning underway across EASD.

I want to thank our faculty, staff, administrators, and operations teams for the tremendous amount of work that went into getting our schools ready and helping us get the year off to such a positive start.

Welcoming Families Back

And now that students are back, we're also beginning to welcome families into our schools for our annual Parent Nights.

Bear Creek got us started on September 3 with its fourth- and fifth-grade families. Coming up, we have the

High School on September 9, Middle School on September 10, Bear Creek Grade 3 on September 15, East High Street on September 16, and Bainbridge on September 17.

These evenings give families an opportunity to meet teachers, learn more about what their students will experience this year, and continue building those important connections between home and school. We encourage our families to join us.

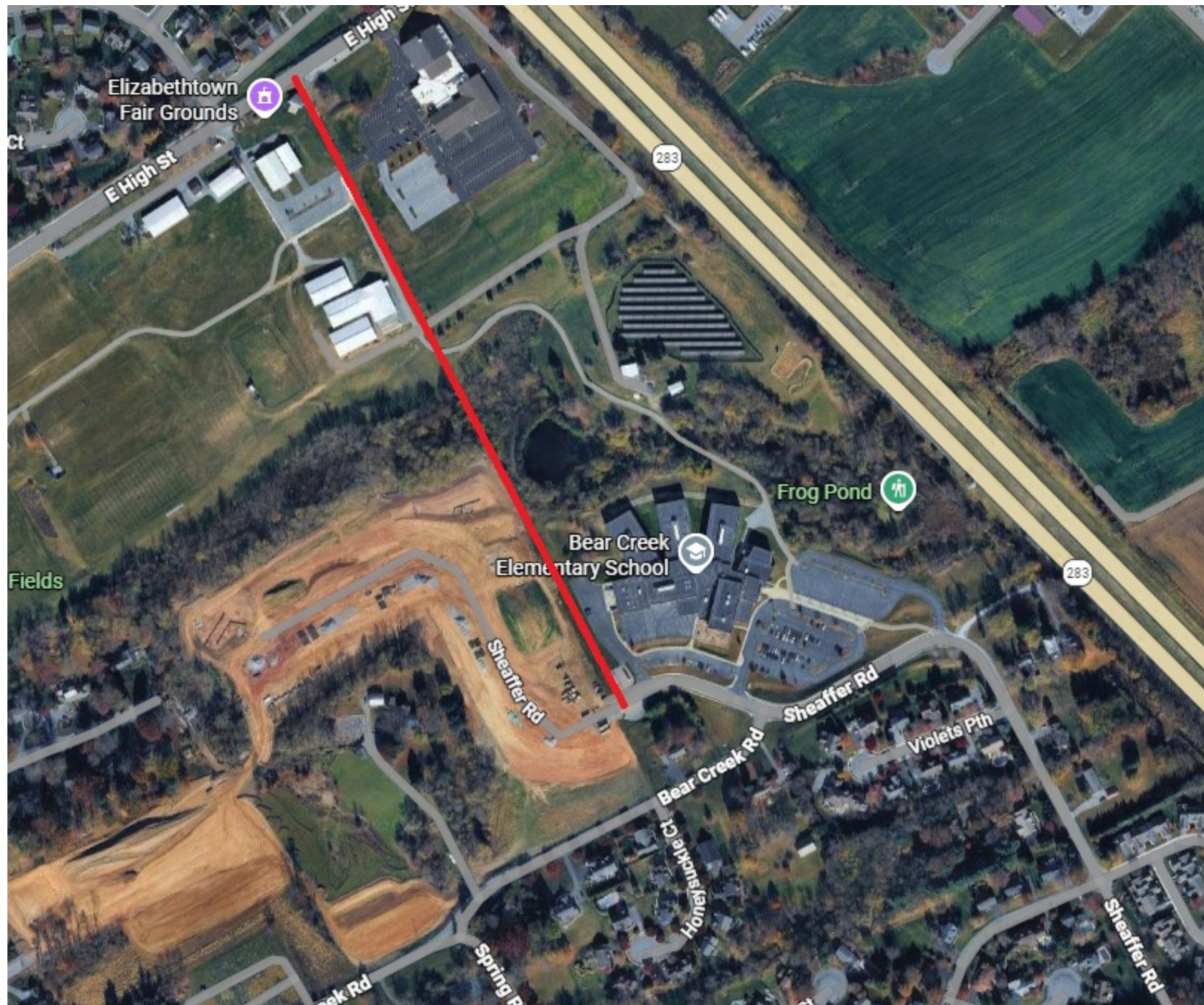
Cafeteria Update

I want to briefly address an incident that occurred earlier today in our shared Middle School/High School cafeteria. During lunch, a bat was observed flying in the cafeteria. Staff safely captured the bat, and the District consulted directly with the Pennsylvania Department of Health, Game Commission, and Department of Agriculture regarding our response.

The agencies shared that several other schools have recently reported similar incidents, providing some broader context for what occurred today.

While the agencies did not recommend closing the cafeteria or disposing of food, the District chose to take additional precautions, closing the cafeteria for the remainder of the day for a thorough cleaning and discarding exposed food.

The cafeteria is expected to reopen for normal use tomorrow, and Middle School and High School families received a detailed communication this afternoon outlining the incident and our response.
