Principal's Note

Principal's Note:

As we begin the 2026–2027 school year, our focus remains on accelerating student growth and sustaining a high-performing learning culture. Building on the academic momentum and percentile growth achieved in previous assessments, we have established three targeted priorities for this school year: strengthening **Student and Staff Accountability**, fully implementing **The Collins Writing Program**, and maximizing the **Effectiveness of Math and ELA Intervention Programs**.

Key Strategic Goals

Goal 1: Student & Staff Accountability

- **Student Accountability:** Establish clear expectations for student work ethic, classroom etiquette, and academic stamina across all grade levels. Empower students to take direct ownership of their learning and hold them accountable to academic and behavioral standards.
- **Staff Accountability:** Maintain high professional standards, consistent communication, and fidelity to district-wide instructional strategies and disciplinary protocols. Support Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) in maintaining structured agendas, collaborating on student data, and taking shared responsibility for student outcomes.
- **Positive Culture & Consistency:** Enforce consistent routines and clear restorative support frameworks across all classrooms to minimize disruptions and support learning environments.

Goal 2: Implementation of the Collins Writing Program

- **Cross-Curricular Writing:** Integrate the research-based Collins Writing Program across all subject areas to ensure consistent writing routines throughout the curriculum.
- **Skill Development:** Utilize structured writing tasks to strengthen both written and typed communication, critical thinking, analytical reasoning, and problem-solving skills.

- **Post-Secondary Preparation:** Embed writing-to-learn strategies that increase content retention and prepare students for long-term success in high school, post-secondary education, and future careers.

Goal 3: Increased Effectiveness of Math & ELA Intervention Programs

- **Targeted Math Support:** Utilize dedicated math intervention personnel and supplemental scheduling (such as Essentials courses and computer-assisted skill programs like IXL) to close foundational math gaps without removing students from core instruction.
- **Targeted ELA Support:** Provide structured tier-two and tier-three reading interventions through specialized reading intervention personnel, utilizing targeted programs like REWARDS to accelerate reading proficiency.
- **Data-Driven Progress Monitoring:** Regularly review diagnostic data (including NWEA and IXL scores) every nine weeks to evaluate student growth.
- **Refined Entrance and Exit Protocols:** Streamline intervention placement and exit protocols so that high-need students receive timely, individualized support and transition back to core instruction as goals are met.

By keeping our focus on clear accountability, effective cross-curricular writing, and targeted interventions, we are confident in our ability to support every learner toward full academic potential throughout the 2026–2027 school year. 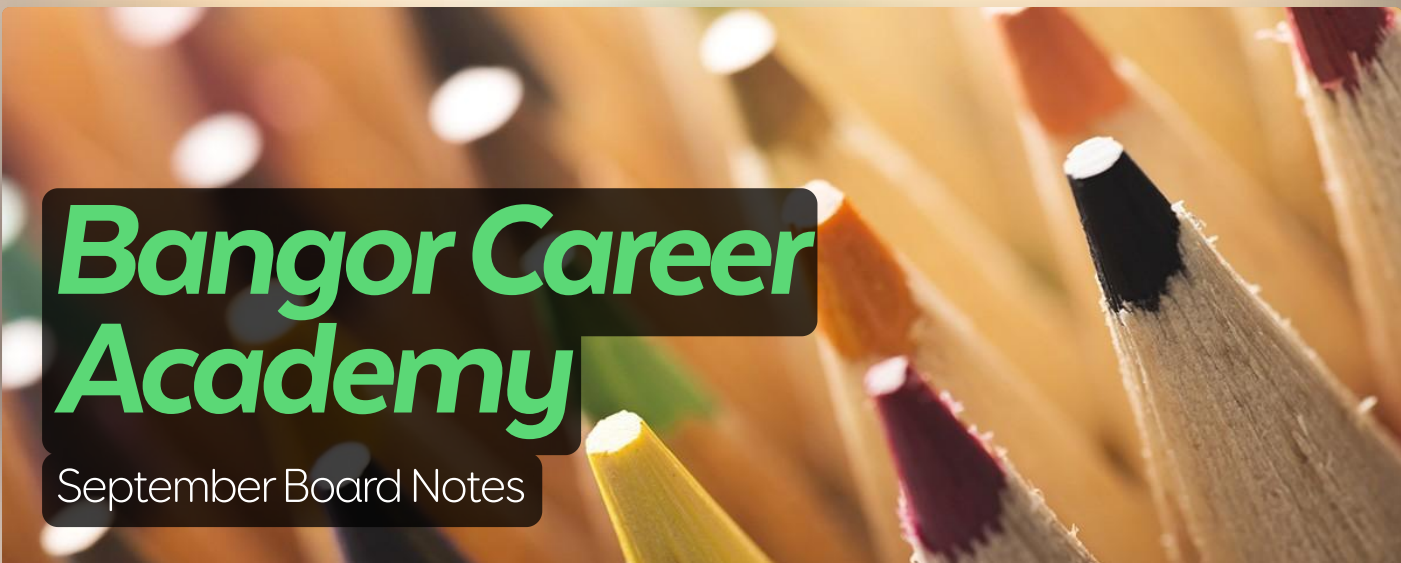

Enrollment

Alternative Education Enrollment

BCA currently has 83 students enrolled:

- 71 Diploma Track
- 12 GED

Four students are currently considered no-shows and are scheduled to be dropped on September 18 if they do not reengage. Based on current enrollment, we are forecasting approximately 79 students for Fall Count Day.

Adult Education Enrollment

Adult Education currently has 66 students enrolled in PowerSchool, with 22 students actively participating. Staff is continuing outreach and enrollment reconciliation to identify students who intend to remain active in the program.

Staffing and Program Changes

BCA began the 2026–2027 school year with staff reductions that eliminated both Success Coach positions. Ms. Bodtke was transferred to South Walnut, and Mr. Funke assumed the Alternative Education Coordinator responsibilities previously covered by Mr. Johnson.

Success Coaching will continue through a virtual model provided through the Edmentum curriculum platform. BCA will monitor student engagement, academic pace, course completion, and the effectiveness of this transition throughout the school year.

Joanna Liveratos has returned as the GED Program Coordinator, Darla McCrumb has returned as the Adult Education Program Coordinator, and Juanita Oviedo has returned as the BCA Secretary.

Expansion of BCA Virtual Programming

BCA now supports five of the high school's Online Learning Lab periods each school day, with those classes conducted in the Annex.

This places most of Bangor Public Schools' virtual programming, except ESL, under the BCA umbrella. The consolidation allows for better coordination of Edmentum enrollment, curriculum, student support, academic monitoring, troubleshooting, and communication with our Edmentum partners.

Annex Changes

The ESL offices were relocated from the Annex to the former Athletic Director's office in the middle school.

Robotics was relocated from the Annex to the Gone Boarding Shop at the high school.

The former Robotics classroom is currently being converted into the Viking Forge, a STEM learning and manufacturing lab. The Viking Forge will provide hands-on learning, career exploration, project-based activities, and PBIS incentives while complementing students' existing coursework. Participation in the Viking Forge will not add additional academic requirements for graduation.

Student Accountability and Academic Progress

BCA continues to emphasize regular student contact, academic pacing, communication with BCA and Edmentum teachers, course completion, and participation in required testing and Count Day activities.

Students who begin falling behind will receive progressively increased intervention and support.

The goal is to identify problems early enough to improve course completion and credit attainment rather than waiting until the end of a semester.

2026-2027 Priorities

BCA's priorities for the school year include stabilizing enrollment through Count Day, increasing student engagement and course completion, maintaining strong student accountability, successfully transitioning Success Coaching to the virtual model, continuing to centralize district virtual programming, addressing CSI school-improvement goals, and developing the Viking Forge as an additional career and STEM opportunity for students.

The overall goal is to continue developing Bangor Career Academy as a centralized resource for Alternative Education, virtual learning, GED, Adult Education, credit recovery, and career exploration while operating with a reduced staffing footprint.
