Summary

The Department of Social Emotional Learning and Comprehensive Health will conduct a public hearing to provide information about health services in FBISD and gain input from members of the community through public comment.

Background

Per Texas Education Code (TEC) Chapter 38 and Board Policy FFA (Legal), when changing or expanding health care services in the district, a public hearing must be held prior to Board approval.

- The District is proposing the following health services for Board approval:
 - Expansion of Mental Health services across the district including VOCA supported services
 - Implementation of Dental services at the Ridgemont Family Clinic

Pursuant to TEC Chapter 38 and Policy FFA (Legal), the public hearing will outline the locations of the services, as well as detail the following:

- All health-care services to be provided,
- Whether federal law permits or requires any health-care service provided to be kept confidential from parents,
- Whether a child’s medical records will be accessible to the parent,
- Information concerning grant funds to be used,
- The titles of persons who will have access to the medical records of a student, and
- The security measures that will be used to protect the privacy of students’ medical records.


Following the public hearing, Board approval of the expansion or change of health services by a record vote is required.





Multi-Tiered Systems of Support






Tier I: Profile of a Graduate/SEL Lessons

Tier III: Community Resource Referrals


Counseling Interactions with Students by Month




