1. BJCF(LOCAL): Engaging or assigning DEI duties, as well as instructional activities prohibited by law, were included in the list of reasons the superintendent's contract may be non-renewed.
2. BT(LEGAL): Provides that except as explicitly required by state or federal law, the District shall not assign DEI duties to any person and must proactively prohibit independent contractors from engaging in such activities.
3. CJ(LEGAL) and (LOCAL): These policies govern contracted services and provide that a District contract is subject to termination if a contractor or vendor intentionally or knowingly engages in DEI duties or assigns such duties to another individual. It further establishes the appeal process through which an affected contractor may appeal an adverse contract action.
4. DF(LEGAL): Providing for the appropriate discipline, including termination, of a District employee or contractor who intentionally or knowingly engages in or assigns to another person prohibited diversity, equity, and inclusion duties.
5. DFBB(LOCAL): Engaging or assigning DEI duties, as well as instructional activities prohibited by law, were included in the list of reasons a term contract employee may be nonrenewed.
6. DH(LOCAL): Sections on Prohibited Classroom Instruction or Activities and Prohibited Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Duties were added.

Employees were notified of these changes via email to all district staff on August 14, 2026. Hard copies were made available in each director's office and each campus office. All district vendors and contractors were emailed the attached notice on August 27, 2026 and hard copies of the notification were included in all mailed payments to all eligible service providers in September and October.

1. BJA(LEGAL): Requiring the Superintendent to certify to the Commissioner of Education the District's compliance with TEC Sections 39.008, 11.005 and 28.0022.
2. BT(LEGAL): Provides that except as explicitly required by state or federal law, the District shall not assign DEI duties to any person and must proactively prohibit independent contractors from engaging in such activities.
3. CDC(LEGAL): A district may not accept private funding for the purpose of developing a curriculum, purchasing or selecting curriculum materials, or providing teacher training or professional development related to a concept listed in Education Code 28.0022(a)(4)(A).
4. CJ(LEGAL) and (LOCAL): These policies govern contracted services and provide that a District contract is subject to termination if a contractor or vendor intentionally or knowingly engages in DEI duties or assigns such duties to another individual. It further establishes the appeal process through which an affected contractor may appeal an adverse contract action.
5. CMD(LEGAL): In providing instructional materials for each subject in the required curriculum and each grade level, the district protects students from obscene or harmful content as necessary for compliance with Education Code 28.0022.
6. CQA(LEGAL): The list of required website postings was updated to reflect that a district must post notice at least seven days before the date on which a meeting is held to discuss the certification of compliance with Education Code 11.005 and 28.0022.
7. DG(LEGAL): Teachers may not be compelled to discuss a widely debated and currently controversial issue of public policy or social affairs and may not be subject to discipline for an allegation that they did so if they are using SBOE-approved instructional materials and teaching with fidelity.
8. EMB(LEGAL): The legal framework at this code was updated with the information from Education Code 28.0022.
9. FOA(LEGAL): A teacher may not remove a student from class based on a single incident of behavior if the student is reasonably discussing certain debated and controversial topics subject to Education Code 28.0022.

In addition, the FISD Employee Handbook was updated to include a Prohibition on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, including policy references and local considerations. The Employee Handbook was also updated to include Prohibited Classroom Instruction, including policy references and local considerations.

All of the attached policies were altered to conform to the requirements of S.B. 12 by prohibiting District employees, contractors, vendors, and service providers from performing, carrying out, or assigning certain responsibilities or job duties that involve the consideration of race, sex, color, or ethnicity in District operations and decision-making; by prohibiting teachers from inculcating certain prohibited themes in course materials; by prohibiting the requirement that teachers address controversial topics; by providing penalties for violation of

these policy mandates; and by providing access to due process for employees or contracts that are terminated for violation of these policies.

Screens, Focus & Learning

An IEI Position on Screens and AI in K-12 Schools

The Institute for Education Innovation stands in support of good educational technology, used intentionally. Our community of district-leader members shares one goal: schools where students can focus, connect, and learn. We support distraction-free schools, and we believe smartphones used for non-educational activities, including consumer social media, have no place in the instructional day. We stand with the educators and families working to restore focus, connection, and joy in the classroom. Technology that works against these goals should be removed from our classrooms.

The 2026 U.S. Surgeon General's advisory on youth screen use, bell-to-bell phone restrictions now in roughly 40 states, and a measurable decline in students' sustained reading and attention all point to a real problem. But the harm is concentrated in a particular kind of screen use: passive, consumer, algorithm-driven content built to capture attention rather than build it. This kind of technology must be removed from the classroom.

The goal should not be more technology or less technology. It should be the right technology, for the right purpose, at the right time, under the guidance of an effective teacher. The question is not screens versus no screens. It is consumer technology versus purpose-built educational technology; passive use versus active learning; tools imposed on teachers versus tools that serve them. Purpose-built tools designed with student well-being at the center, evaluated on evidence, and used with teacher judgment are how districts prepare students for their futures. For many students, school is the only place they will gain that experience.

We oppose a one-size-fits-all answer. Blanket statewide screen bans, however well-intentioned, can override the educators and leaders who know their students, staff, and communities best. Decisions about when and how technology is used belong close to students, guided by local judgment rather than a single mandate.

To that end, we commit to:

- Distinguishing our work with edtech clearly from consumer platforms and the attention economy.
- Supporting local control and district transparency about which tools are used, and why.
- Matching technology to age and purpose: teacher-led and foundational for our youngest learners, and responsible, real-world use for older students preparing for college and career.
- Preparing students for the careers of the future by ensuring they develop fluency with digital and AI tools.

- Honoring family opt-outs and age-appropriate limits, and strengthening the home–school connection.
- Protecting student data privacy and building educator data literacy — taking care with high-stakes data decisions and rigorously monitoring the information that flows to and from tech platforms, to ensure compliance with federal and state law.
- Working to close the digital divide, not widen it. Blanket bans will disproportionately and negatively affect students from less wealthy families, who are less likely to have access to educational technology.
- Holding ourselves to evidence of learning impact, not engagement metrics, and committing to deploy tools that lighten the load on teachers rather than adding one more thing.

This is a position grounded in curiosity, connection, courage, and human interaction — taken by a group of leaders who believe all students deserve an education that opens up every possible opportunity for them.
