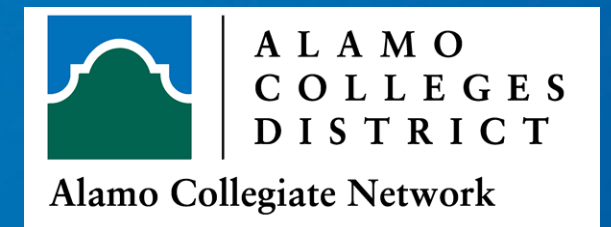

- Implementation of Tiered funding for Title 1, Part A, Emergent Bilingual, Economically Disadvantaged, Special Education will result in decreased funding to support these program

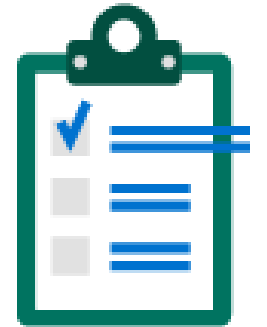

- Potential decrease of 7 teacher allocations across ACN
- Potential decrease of 4 non-instructional FTE's across ACN
- Potential decrease of \$188,862 in total local funding
- Potential decrease of \$67,075 in Title 1, Part A funding
- Potential decrease of \$9,960 in Economically Disadvantaged funding
- Potential decrease of \$26,650 in Emergent Bilingual funding
- Decrease in instructional supports across all programs in SAISD

These scholars have demonstrated a 100% commitment to higher education, every member of this cohort is set to transfer to a university to continue their trajectory as future leaders in the technology industry.



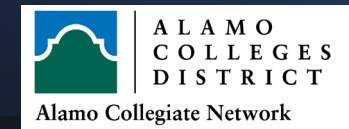

Senate Bill 1882 Partnership

- Original partnership agreement signed in 2020 between ACD and SAISD with a term of 5 years creating the Alamo Collegiate Network (ACN)
- 2024-2025 was the evaluation year for the ACN and SAISD recommended continued partnership
- August 2025, a 1-year contract extension was approved that will expire in June 2026
- Contract negotiations have continued since June 2025
- April 2026, a 1-year contract extension was approved by SAISD for the 2026-2027 academic year without ACD requests, draft with ACD stipulations returned to SAISD in May for review.



Senate Bill 1882 Partnership

- SAISD's budget continues to remain unstable
- Annual budget cuts at ACN campuses continue to reduce staffing, student supports, and programming
- SAISD is projecting significant budget cuts again for the 2027-2028 school year creating challenges in developing a multi-year contract



Senate Bill 1882 Partnership Recommendations

- Recommend extended current contract term for 1 year, until June 30, 2027, with the following exceptions:
 - Move from a 50/50 financial split to a 60/40 financial split of 1882 funding
 - 60% funds to campuses – 40% funds to ACD
 - SAISD to provide an Above Allocation Request to secure 1 additional teaching position to support the AAT program at Travis
 - 2.274% administrative fees withheld by SAISD from 1882 funds as stipulated in the original contract



Requested Board Action

- Requesting ACN board authorize ACN leadership to pursue and finalize an agreement for a 1-year extension of the partnership under terms that support successful operation of campuses
- This action allows ACN team to finalize agreement to be presented to ACD Board of Trustees for approval

Discussion and Possible Action on Approval to Extend the In-District Charter Partnership Agreement with the San Antonio Independent School District

Presented to the Alamo Collegiate Network Board of Trustees on May 11, 2026

MINUTE ORDER:

“The Alamo Collegiate Network Board hereby recommends that the Alamo Colleges District approve an extension of the In-District Charter Partnership Agreement with the San Antonio Independent School District, with terms defined by Alamo Collegiate Network leadership.”

PURPOSE:

To extend the agreement for a term which allows thoughtful consideration and negotiation upon the next renewal period.

BACKGROUND:

The governing board for the Alamo Collegiate Network (“ACN”) was created pursuant to the In-District Charter Partnership Agreement with the San Antonio Independent School District (“SAISD”). Pursuant to the agreement, ACN operates as in-district (SAISD) charters SAISD’s Fox Tech High School, St. Philip’s Early College High School and Travis Early College High School. The agreement expires June 30, 2026. SAISD continues to cut funding and staffing allocations at the ACN campuses inhibiting the ability to operate the models at a consistent level of programming and performance.

SAISD has proposed a multi-year contract with uncertain program and financial commitments. A 1 year extension will allow for continued conversations and negotiations with SAISD as to their ability to fund and staff campuses in a manner suitable to the ECHS/PTECH models the partnership requires. Negotiations for the extension will include 3 requests for amendments to the current contract including a funding change to 60/40 model, an additional staffing allocation at Travis ECHS, and a refusal to include SAISD withholding a 5.5% management fee, agreeing to enforcement of the 2.274% management fee in the original contract never withheld. The recommendation to pursue another 1 year extension allows ACN to continue to support program growth and success while negotiating improved terms for an extended contract period.
