### Executive Summary

Financial Highlights: In the general fund, the district has collected 69% of budgeted revenues and spent 55% of budgeted expenses. In February 2025, the district collected 64% of actual revenue and spent 58% of actual expenses. The district is a little ahead in revenue collections due to earlier collection of state aid. In the food service fund, the district has collected 69% of budgeted revenues and spent 54% of budgeted expenses. In February 2025, the district collected 69% of actual revenue and spent 65% of budgeted expenses. The debt service fund has collected 99% of budgeted revenue 95% is from local tax collections. In February 2025 we collected 71% of local collections. Debt payments will be reflected in February and August of 2026.

### **Background Information**

- Prior to the 2023 legislative year, the state of Texas issued an adoption cycle for the choice of instructional materials for use in Texas schools. In the 2023 legislative year, HB 1605 was passed, which abolished the adoption cycle and instituted the Instructional Materials Review and Approval (IMRA) process. This process was meant to approve high-quality instructional materials (HQIM) for use in Texas Schools. Additionally, HB 1605 established an additional funding source called the SBOE-Approved Instructional Materials Entitlement.
- Materials must be selected by the Board of Trustees in an open meeting as required by 19 TAC 66.104(a) (Board Policy EFAA (legal))
- Medina Valley ISD has engaged in a single year pilot with STEMscopes by Accelerate Learning in grade K-5. STEMscopes has been approved by SBOE as HQIM in both English and Spanish. STEMscopes covers 100% of the state mandated TEKS which must be taught to students in grade K-5
- Medina Valley ISD is currently evaluating the following SBOE approved instructional materials for grades 6-12. Teams will select the materials they will implement in 2026-2027. Due to time constraints, we would like to approve all of the HQIM materials listed below so that orders can be placed as soon as the decision is made.

### **Administrative Consideration**

Funding will be allocated from the state provided grants in the Instructional Materials and Technology Allotment and the SBOE-Approved Instructional Materials Entitlement. This purchase will not be from the district's general budget and it supports district goals related to academic achievement, curriculum alignment, and teacher effectiveness.

### **Recommendation**

Administration recommends approval of the math curriculum to be used in grades K-12 in all Medina Valley schools.

**Background Information:** In 2025, the Safety office revisited with Diamond Communication, a TASB company, regarding the need for enhanced communication capabilities. Diamond Communication presented new information on a cellular tower option and the degraded cellular signal across the school district using a 2023 and 2025 comparison map. With the large increase in residential build-up, the signal has deteriorated to a level that a new tower would be considered a viable option and would have an increased chance of bringing a cellular carrier on as a partnering entity.

Diamond Communications conducted a site selection for cell tower placement at Potranco Elementary campus. This placement would require a 2500 square foot area which is located behind the exiting bus loop gate fencing. The lease option offers the ISD a 30% revenue from the first and second cellular carrier who sign onto the agreement and 40% from a third or any subsequent cellular carriers.

The land lease is a cost-free option for MVIDS as is the construction of the tower. The only output required from MVIDS is the 2500 square foot area selected for placement of the cellular tower.

If approved, the work would begin upon Diamond Communication awarding a cellular company contractual rights to use of the cellular tower. If a cellular company is not found and brought on as a carrier, the contract can be canceled by either party.

**Administrative Consideration:** This is an administrative agreement with a zero-cost basis attached.

**Supporting Documents:** Contractual land lease agreement.

**Recommendation:** Approve moving forward with the Diamond Communication land lease agreement.

### **Memorandum of Option and Ground Lease Agreement**

This Memorandum of Option and Ground Lease Agreement (“Memorandum”) evidences that a lease (“Lease”) was made and entered into by written Option and Ground Lease Agreement dated \_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_, between Medina Valley Independent School District, a Political Subdivision of the State of Texas (“Lessor”) and DIAMOND TOWERS V LLC, a Delaware limited liability company (“Lessee”), the terms and conditions of which are incorporated herein by reference.

Such Lease provides, in part, that Lessor leases to Lessee a 2,500 square foot parcel (“Site”) on the parent tract described in Exhibit “A” attached hereto and located at 190 CR 381 South San Antonio, TX 78253, Parcel ID: 64884. The Site is described in Exhibit “B” attached hereto. The Lessor also grants easements (“Easements”) for unrestricted rights of ingress and egress to and from the Site and to electric and telephone facilities, which are described in Exhibit “C” attached hereto. The term of the Lease and the Easements are for ten (10) years commencing on the Commencement Date, as defined in the Lease, which term is subject to four (4) additional five (5) year extension periods by the Lessee.

This Memorandum is not intended to amend or modify, and shall not be deemed or construed as amending or modifying, any of the terms, conditions or provisions of the Lease, all of which are hereby ratified and affirmed. In the event of a conflict between the provisions of this Memorandum and the provisions of the Lease, the provisions of the Lease shall control.

## OPTION AND GROUND LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS OPTION AND GROUND LEASE AGREEMENT (“Agreement”) is made this \_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 202\_\_, by and between Medina Valley Independent School District, a Political Subdivision of the State of Texas (“Optionor”) and DIAMOND TOWERS V LLC, a Delaware limited liability company (“Optionee”).

### I. OPTION TO LEASE

1. Grant of Option. For good and valuable consideration and the mutual promises herein set forth, Optionor hereby gives and grants unto Optionee and its assigns, an exclusive and irrevocable option (“Option”) to lease a certain parcel of real property, located at 190 CR 381 South San Antonio, TX 78253, Parcel ID: 64884, more particularly described on Exhibit “A”, and survey or site plan shown on Exhibit “A-1”, attached hereto (“Leased Premises”); together with an easement, or easements, for ingress, egress and utilities for the duration of the lease on the property which is more particularly described on Exhibit “B” attached hereto (“Easement”). Optionor agrees and acknowledges the Optionee may, at Optionee’s sole cost and expense, have a metes and bounds survey prepared of the Leased Premises and the Easement, and that the legal description of the Leased Premises and the Easement, as shown on the survey, shall thereafter become the legal description of the Leased Premises and the Easement.

2. Option Initial Term. The initial term of this Option shall be for twenty-four (24) months from the Effective Date (“Option Initial Term”).

3. Consideration for Option. Consideration for the Initial Term of the Option granted hereunder shall be Two Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$2,000.00) (“Option Consideration”).

4. Extension of Option. This Option can be extended at the discretion of Optionee for two (2) additional periods of twelve (12) months (“Option Renewal Terms”) by Optionee paying to Optionor the additional consideration of One Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000.00) prior to the expiration of the Option Initial Term or any Option Renewal Term. No more than two (2) total Optional Renewal Terms will be allowed hereunder unless agreed to by Entity in writing. The Option Initial Term and all Option Renewal Terms shall hereinafter be referred to collectively as the “Option Term.”

5. Optionor’s Representations and Warranties. As an inducement for Optionee to enter into and be bound by the terms of this Option, Optionor represents and warrants to Optionee and Optionee’s successors and assigns that, as of the date of this Agreement:

(a) To the knowledge of Optionor, without duty of inquiry or conducting a title search, Optionor has good title to the Leased Premises and the Easement;

(b) To the knowledge of Optionor, Optionor has the authority to enter into and be bound by the terms of this Option;

(c) To the knowledge of Optionor, there are no pending or threatened administrative actions, including bankruptcy or insolvency proceedings under state or federal law, suits, claims or causes of action against Optionor or which may otherwise affect the Leased Premises; and

(d) To the knowledge of Optionor, the Leased Premises are not presently subject to an option, lease or other contract which may adversely affect Optionor's ability to fulfill its obligations under this Option, subject to Optionors retention of its authority to manage and control its governmental owned property and use the Leased Premises when required for Optionor's public purposes during the Option Term, and Optionor covenants that it shall not grant an option or enter into any contract which will affect the Leased Premises or the Easement until this Option expires or is terminated by Optionee.

These representations and warranties of Optionor shall survive the exercise of the Option and the closing anticipated by the exercise of this Option.

6. Inspections and Investigations. Optionor hereby grants to Optionee, its officers, agents, employees and independent contractors the right and privilege to enter upon the Leased Premises and the Easement at any time after the Effective Date, upon at least seventy two (72) hours prior written notice to Optionor, to perform, or cause to be performed, test borings of the soil, environmental audits, engineering studies and to conduct a survey of the Leased Premises and the Easement. Optionor shall provide Optionee with any necessary keys or access codes to the Leased Premises if needed for ingress and egress. Optionee shall not unreasonably interfere with Optionor's use of the Leased Premises or the Easement in conducting these activities, and shall comply with all Optionor safety, security, and access protocols and requirements. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary contained in this Agreement, Optionee shall not have the right to undertake any subsurface environmental testing on the Leased Premises without the prior written consent of Optionor, which consent may be withheld in the sole discretion of Optionor. Optionee shall have the right, at its cost and expense, to have the Leased Premises and the Easement surveyed and to obtain a title report or commitment for a leasehold title policy covering the Leased Premises and the Easement from the title insurance company of its choice. Optionor shall, at its option, remove any survey or title defects, which will adversely affect Optionee's leasehold title or its ability to insure or mortgage the leasehold interest or, if Optionee will not accept any survey or title defects, Optionee may declare this Option to be void and of no further effect in which case there shall be no further liability on the part of Optionee to Optionor.

7. Further Acts. Optionor shall cooperate with Optionee's reasonable requests in executing documents as may be necessary to establish Optionee's rights under this Option or Optionee's use of the Leased Premises and the Easement and to take such action as may reasonably be required to effect the intent of this Option, at the sole cost and expense of Optionee. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Optionee shall have no obligation to pay Optionor's legal fees associated with such actions. Optionee shall be responsible for the filing of any applications with federal, state and local governmental authorities which applications relate to Optionee's Intended Use of the Leased Premises including but not limited to land use and zoning applications. To the extent applications may require Optionor approval, inclusion, or submission, Optionee shall

provide such applications to Optionor for review and approval with reasonable and sufficient time (which shall be no less than ten (10) Optionor business days) to review.

8. Assignment of Option. This Option may be sold, assigned or transferred at any time by Optionee upon the written consent of Optionor, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned, or delayed, with respect to any assignment of this Agreement by Optionee. Upon written approval of Optionor to such sale, assignment or transfer, and the completion of such sale, assignment, or transfer, Optionee shall be released from any and all liability under this Agreement, including the payment of any rental or other sums due, without any further action. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Optionee may assign this Option to an Affiliate, as hereinafter defined, of Optionee without Optionor's consent. Optionee shall provide written notice to Optionor of such Affiliate assignment.

9. Change in Status or Property. If during the Option Term, or during the Term, if the Option is exercised, Optionor/Lessor decides to subdivide, sell, or change the status of the zoning of the Premises, the Property or any of Lessor's contiguous, adjoining or surrounding property (the "Surrounding Property"), or in the event of a threatened foreclosure on any of the foregoing, Optionor/Lessor shall immediately notify Optionee/Lessee in writing. Optionor/Lessor agrees that during the Option Term, or during the Term if the Option is exercised, Optionor/Lessor shall not initiate or consent to any change in the zoning of the Premises which would adversely impact the zoning status of the Tower, the property or the Surrounding Property or impose or consent to any other use or restriction that would prevent or limit Optionee/Lessee from using the Premises for the Intended Use, as further defined herein, unless such change is determined, in Optionor's sole discretion, to be necessary for its own use of property for its governmental/public purposes. Any and all terms and conditions of the Agreement that by sense or context are intended to be applicable during the Option Term shall be so applicable.

## II. GROUND LEASE AGREEMENT

10. Exercise of Option. Upon the tender of written notice of Optionee's intent to exercise the Option, the following lease provisions ("Lease") shall govern the relationship of the parties, and Optionor shall thereafter be referred to as Lessor, and Optionee shall thereafter be referred to as Lessee. The date of the written notice to exercise the Option shall constitute the commencement date of the Lease ("Commencement Date").

11. Use. The Leased Premises may be used by Lessee for the transmission and receipt of wireless communication signals in any and all frequencies and the construction, maintenance, operation, repair, replacement and upgrade of communications fixtures and related equipment, cables, accessories and improvements, which may include a suitable support structure or towers, associated antennas, equipment shelters or cabinets, buildings, fencing and related facilities and activities ("Intended Use"). Lessor agrees to reasonably cooperate with Lessee in obtaining, at Lessee's expense, all licenses and permits required for Lessee's Intended Use of the Leased Premises (the "Governmental Approval"). Lessee shall prepare, execute and file all required applications to obtain Governmental Approval for the Intended Use. Lessor agrees to reasonably assist Lessee with such applications and with obtaining and maintaining Government Approvals. Lessee may construct additional improvements, demolish and reconstruct improvements, or

restore, replace and reconfigure improvements at any time during the Initial Term or any Renewal Term of this Lease. In the event Lessee desires to modify or upgrade the Tower Facilities, as further defined herein, in a manner that requires an additional portion of the property (the "Additional Premises") for such modification or upgrade, Lessee shall notify Lessor such that the parties may seek to negotiate a Lease for Additional Premises, as may be available and appropriate, upon the same terms and conditions set forth herein, except that Rent, as further defined herein, shall increase, in conjunction with the lease of the Additional Premises by the amount equivalent to the then current per square foot rental rate charge by Lessor to Lessee times the square footage of the Additional Premises. Nothing herein shall be deemed to require Lessor to lease Additional Premises or to guaranty the availability of any property not within the Leased Premises for lease.

12. Legal Compliance. Lessee will comply with and abide by all federal, state, and local laws and regulations in its performance under this Lease and its use and activities on the Leased Premises, Easement, or other Lessor property, including, but not limited to, obtaining, at its sole expense, all licenses, permits, or regulatory or governmental approvals that may be required. Lessee shall further require the same compliance by its contractors, licensees, or sublessees in all agreements. Lessee shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Lessor for any claims, suits, actions, liability, loss, or damage arising out of any noncompliance by Lessee, its employees, agents, contractors, licensees and sublicensees.

13. Initial Term. The term of this Lease shall be ten (10) years commencing on the Commencement Date, as that term is defined in Section 10 above, and terminating on the tenth (10th) anniversary of the Commencement Date ("Initial Term").

14. Renewal Terms. Lessee shall have the right to extend this Lease for four (4) additional five (5) year terms (each a "Renewal Term"). Each Renewal Term shall be on the same terms and conditions as set forth in this Lease. This Lease shall automatically be renewed for each successive Renewal Term unless Lessee notifies Lessor of Lessee's intention not to renew the Lease at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of the Initial Term or the Renewal Term which is then in effect. If Lessee remains in possession of the Leased Premises after the termination of this Agreement, then Lessee shall be deemed to be occupying the Leased Premises on a month to month basis ("Holdover Term"), subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement. Hereinafter, the Initial Term, any Renewal Term and any Holdover Term may be collectively referred to as the "Term."

15. Rent. Commencing on the first day of the calendar month following the date that Lessee commences construction on the Leased Premises ("Rent Commencement Date"), during the Initial Term and each Renewal Term of this Lease, Lessee shall pay to Lessor the amount of rent ("Rent") provided in the Rent Schedule attached hereto as Exhibit "C", which shall be deemed to include any applicable state, county or local sales or use tax from which Lessor is not exempt. It shall be the sole responsibility of the Lessor to remit payment of any applicable state, county or local sales or use tax related to the Rent from which Lessor is not exempt to the appropriate taxing authority. Nothing herein shall be deemed to impose on Lessor the obligation to pay taxes from which it is exempt. Rent shall be payable in advance on or before the fifteenth (15th) day of each calendar month, and shall be remitted to the address shown for Lessor in this Lease, or such other address as Lessor may direct by notice in writing to Lessee. If the Commencement Date, or the

date of termination (the “Termination Date”), of this Lease is other than the first (1st) day of a calendar month, Rent shall be prorated. In the event of termination for any reason, other than nonpayment of Rent, all advance Rent paid to Lessor with respect to the period after the Termination Date shall be refunded to Lessee.

16. Lessor's Representations and Warranties. Lessor further represents and warrants that, to its actual knowledge as of the date of this Agreement and without duty of inquiry, there are no easements, licenses, rights of use or other encumbrances on the Leased Premises which will materially interfere with or constructively prohibit Lessee's Intended Use of the Leased Premises. Lessor further represents and warrants that, to its actual knowledge as of the date of this Agreement, the execution of this Lease by Lessor will not cause a breach or an event of default of any other agreement to which Lessor is a party.

17. Conditions Subsequent. Lessee represents that it has exercised due diligence in its review of the Leased Premises to determine that its Intended Use is not actually or constructively prohibited by any laws, rules, or regulations. In the event that, despite Lessee’s exercise of due diligence, Lessee's Intended Use of the Leased Premises becomes actually or constructively prohibited through no fault of Lessee or the Leased Premises becomes, in Lessee's commercially reasonable opinion, unacceptable to Lessee, then Lessee shall have the right to terminate this Lease. In the event that Lessee terminates solely due to its opinion that the Leased Premises are unacceptable, but the Intended Use is not actually or constructively prohibited, Lessee shall pay Lessor a termination fee of two (2) months’ Rent.

18. Interference Lessee represents that, prior to entering into this Agreement, it has exercised due diligence in reviewing the Leased Premises and existing use of property adjacent to the Leased Premises to reasonably determine that it is appropriate for the Intended Use without interference. In the event a subsequent change of use by Lessor, its lessees, licensees, invitees, or agents to any portion of adjacent real property owned by Lessor materially interferes with the wireless communications operation of Lessee, any such interference extending for more than forty-eight (48) hours may be deemed a material breach of this Lease by Lessor and Lessor shall have the responsibility to take commercially reasonable action , to the extent permitted by law, to terminate said interference. Prior to Lessee exercising any rights under this Agreement regarding interference, Lessee agrees to notify Lessor of the interference and work with Lessor in good faith to promptly determine the source of interference and reasonable options to rectify the interference. Further, upon Lessor providing Lessee advanced notice of any anticipated or potential changes on Lessor’s adjacent property, Lessee agrees to work with Lessor in good faith to determine in advance any potential areas of interference. In the event any such interference does not cease or is not promptly rectified, Lessor acknowledges that continuing interference will cause irreparable injury to Lessee, and Lessee shall have the right, in addition to any other rights that it may have at law or in equity, to bring action to enjoin such interference or to terminate this Lease immediately upon notice to Lessor. Except where may be required for Lessor’s necessary governmental operations, compliance with law, or to address an emergency or critical situation, Lessor will not grant after the Effective Date, a lease, license or any other right to any third party, if it reasonably believes that the exercise of such grant may materially and adversely affect or interfere with the Tower Facilities, the operations of Lessee or the rights of Lessee under this Agreement. Lessor will notify Lessee in writing prior to granting any third party the right to install and operate wireless

cellular communications equipment within one (1) mile of the Leased Premises. For the purposes of this Agreement, “interference” may include, but is not limited to, any use on the property or Surrounding Property that causes material electronic or physical obstruction with, or degradation of, the communication signals from the Tower Facilities.

19. Improvements; Utilities, Access and Landscaping.

(a) Lessee shall have the right at Lessee's sole cost and expense, to erect and maintain on the Leased Premises improvements, personal property and facilities, including without limitation, tower(s), a structural tower base(s), radio transmitting and receiving antennas, communications equipment, equipment cabinet(s) and/or shelter(s) and related facilities (collectively the “Tower Facilities”). The Tower Facilities shall remain the exclusive property of the Lessee throughout the Term and shall be fully removed, and the property restored, by Lessee upon termination of this Lease at Lessee’s sole expense. Lessor shall have the right to require a decommissioning bond in favor of Lessor as security for Lessee’s obligation to remove the Tower Facilities, in form and substance reasonably satisfactory to Lessor, if (i) the Lease is assigned to an entity with a net worth of less than five-million dollars (\$5,000,000) and (ii) a bond is not already required in the jurisdiction where the Leased Premises are located. Lessor grants Lessee the right, to the extent permitted by law, regulations, and local ordinance, to clear all trees, undergrowth, or other obstructions and to trim, cut, and keep trimmed and cut all tree limbs to the extent necessary to prevent interference with or falling upon Lessee's tower or Lessee's other improvements, communications equipment or Easement rights. Lessor grants Lessee the Easement in Exhibit “B” and may, as necessary, grant additional, non-exclusive easements as agreed to by the Parties in writing in, over, across and through other real property owned by Lessor as reasonably required for construction, installation, maintenance, and operation of the Tower Facilities. In the event that the tower to be constructed by Lessee on the Leased Premises is a guyed tower, Lessor also grants Lessee an easement over Lessor's real property during the Initial Term and any Renewal Term of this Lease for any guy wires and guy wire anchors. If Lessee elects to utilize a small Unmanned Aircraft System (“UAS”) in connection with the installation, construction, monitoring, site audits, inspections, maintenance, repair, modification, or alteration activities at the Property or Leased Premises, Lessor hereby grants Lessee, or any small UAS operator acting on Lessee’s behalf, express permission to fly over the applicable Property and Leased Premises, and consents to the use of audio and video navigation and recording in connection with the use of the small UAS. Lessee must coordinate all small UAS operations with Lessor in advance and shall ensure all such operations shall only be performed by persons with a valid FAA remote pilot in command certification, or other certification or license legally required for such operations, and shall ensure safe operation and use all necessary and reasonable efforts to limit audio and video recording to the Leased Premises, and avoid any audio or video recording of students or private property.

(b) Lessee shall have the right to install utilities, at Lessee's expense, and to improve present utilities on the Leased Premises (including but not limited to the installation of emergency power generators). Lessee shall have the right to permanently place utilities on (or to bring utilities across or under) the Easement to service the Leased Premises and the Tower Facilities. In the event that utilities necessary to serve the equipment of Lessee or the equipment of Lessee's licensee(s) or sublessee(s) cannot be located within the Easement for ingress and

gress, Lessor agrees to cooperate with Lessee and to act reasonably in allowing the location of utilities on other real property owned by Lessor without requiring additional compensation (other than compensation of direct costs, if any) from Lessee or Lessee's licensee(s) or sublessee(s). Lessor may, as appropriate, execute a separate written easement to the Lessee or to the utility company providing the service, in a form which may be filed of record evidencing this right.

(c) Lessor represents and warrants to Lessee that Lessee shall, at all times during this Lease, enjoy ingress, egress, and access from the Leased Premises to an open and improved public road which presently exists, and which Easement shall be adequate to service the Leased Premises and the Tower Facilities. If no such public road exists, or ceases to exist in the future, Lessor and Lessee shall work to determine an appropriate easement agreeable to the Parties for Lessee, Lessee's sublessees and assigns so that Lessee may, at its own expense, construct a suitable private access drive to the Leased Premises and the Tower Facilities. To the degree such access is across other property owned by Lessor, Lessor shall, as appropriate, execute an easement evidencing this right and Lessor shall use reasonable efforts to maintain access to the Easement in a free and open condition so that no material interference is caused to Lessee, by other lessees, licensees, invitees or agents of the Lessor which may utilize the Easement. Lessor shall provide such access to the Leased Premises via the approved Easements to allow Lessee, or its sublessees, to use, maintain and repair the improvements located on the Leased Premises. Such access shall be provided twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week. Lessee shall provide Lessor twenty four (24) hours notice prior to accessing the Leased Premises, email acceptable. Notice shall not be required in the event of an emergency. If Lessor willfully and intentionally obstructs access granted by this Lease for reason other than casualty or compliance with law, such obstruction shall be deemed a default under the Lease and in connection with such default, in addition to any other rights or remedies available to Lessee under this Lease or at law or equity, Lessor shall pay Lessee, as liquidated damages, and not as a penalty, Two Hundred Fifty and 00/100 Dollars (\$250.00) per day in consideration of Lessee's damages until Lessor cures such default. Lessor and Lessee agree that Lessee's damages in the event of a denial of access are difficult, if not impossible, to ascertain, and the liquidated damages set forth are a reasonable approximation of such damages.

(d) In the event a Governmental Approval necessary for the construction operation and/or maintenance of the Tower Facilities requires landscaping around the Tower Facilities and such required landscaping cannot be located within the Leased Premises following Lessee making all reasonable efforts and attempts to modify the Tower Facilities design to allow such required landscaping, Lessee shall notify Lessor and the Parties shall work together in good faith to determine if it is possible for Lessor to provide an easement for property outside of the Leased Premises to satisfy any such Governmental Approval with respect to landscaping without requiring additional compensation from Lessee or Lessee's licensee(s), sublessee(s) or such similar parties. Nothing herein shall require Lessor to approve or provide an easement that interferes with Lessor's use of its property. Lessee shall be responsible for the installation and maintenance of any such landscaping contemplated by this Section.

(e) For any equipment installed or maintained by Lessee, Lessee shall install such equipment and perform all other work at the Leased Premises (collectively, the "Work") (i) in a good and workmanlike manner and in compliance with applicable Federal Communications

Commission tower safety standards; (ii) using only licensed, qualified, and reputable contractors or mechanics; and (iii) beginning the Work only after it has obtained all required permits and delivered copies to Lessor.

(f) Before installation, Lessee shall obtain certification from a licensed engineer that the structural and loading capacity of Lessee's tower within the Premises is sufficient for Lessee's equipment and that Lessee's installation of Lessee's equipment in accordance with the approved plans and specifications will comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and standards. Lessee shall be solely responsible for the safe and proper design, construction, and installation of the Work.

(g) Lessee shall repair or replace any property of Lessor, or any property of any other tenant of the property adjacent to the Leased Premises, that is damaged by Lessee during the installation, maintenance, use, or removal by Lessee of Lessee's equipment. Any repairs to the Lessor's equipment, or to the property of any other tenant of the property adjacent to the Leased Premises, required due to damage caused by the installation, maintenance, use, or removal by Lessee of Lessee's equipment will, at Lessor's reasonable option, be performed by or on behalf of Lessor at Lessee's sole expense.

(h) Lessee shall comply with all requirements of Texas Government Code §2252.909 (Required Lease Terms for Lease of Public Property), or any successor statute. Lessee shall:

(i) Include in each contract for the construction, alteration, or repair of an improvement on the Leased Premises a condition that the contractor (A) execute a payment bond that conforms to Subchapter I, Chapter 53, of the Texas Property Code; and (B) execute a performance bond in an amount equal to the amount of the contract for the protection of Lessor and conditioned on the faithful performance of contractor's work in accordance with the plans, specifications, and contract documents; and

(ii) Provide Lessor a notice of commencement, as set forth herein, at least 90 days before the date the construction, alteration, or repair of any improvement to the Leased Premises begins. The notice of commencement under this subsection must (A) identify the public property where the work will be performed; (B) describe the work to be performed; (C) state the total cost of the work to be performed; (D) include copies of the performance and payment bonds required under subsection (e)(i); and (E) include a written acknowledgement signed by the contractor stating that copies of the required performance and payment bonds will be provided to all subcontractors not later than the fifth day after the date a subcontract is executed.

(iii) On or before the 10<sup>th</sup> day after Lessor receives a notice of commencement for the construction, alteration, or repair of an improvement to leased property required under subsection (e)(ii), Lessor may notify Lessee that the construction, alteration, or repair may not proceed.

(iv) Lessee acknowledges that, pursuant to Texas Government Code §2252.909(e), a person commits an offense (Class A misdemeanor) if the person materially misrepresents information in a notice of commencement.

20. Termination. Except as otherwise provided herein, this Lease may be terminated without any penalty or further liability upon written notice as follows:

(a) By either party upon a default of any material covenant or term hereof by the other party, which default is not cured within sixty (60) school business (defined as days on which the Lessor's central office is open) days of receipt of written notice of default (without however, limiting any other rights available to the parties pursuant to any other provisions hereof); provided, that if the defaulting party commences and continues efforts to cure the default within such period, the non-defaulting party shall have reasonable, additional time (not to exceed forty-five (45) days) to cure the default;

(b) Upon thirty (30) days' written notice by Lessee to Lessor, if Lessee is unable to obtain or maintain through no fault of Lessee, any license, permit or other Governmental Approval necessary for the construction and operation of the Tower Facilities or Lessee's business;

(c) By Lessee for any reason upon sixty (60) day's advance written notice from Lessee to Lessor, and upon payment of a termination fee to Lessor in the amount of twelve (12) months of the then current Rent due hereunder; or

(d) By Lessor as set forth in this Section 20(d). As a governmental entity, Lessee acknowledges that, by entering into this Lease, Lessor is not relinquishing, and may not relinquish, the authority of its governing body to control the property's use or allow the Lease to interfere with the property's public purpose. After the Initial Term, to the extent Lessor's governing body determines that the Lease will no longer serve a public purpose or that the Leased Premises is required for other purposes, Lessor may, upon at least one hundred eighty (180) days' written notice to Lessee, terminate the Lease at the end of its then current term. Such notice shall include a detailed reason and/or justification for the termination. Further, in the event a need arises on the part of Lessor to use the Leased Premises for the governmental entity's own purposes after the Initial Term, Lessee agrees to work with Lessor to modify the Lease to accommodate such use or, if such accommodation is not possible, Lessor may terminate the Lease upon at least one hundred eighty (180) days' written notice or shorter notice if required by law or public emergency. Regardless of whether during or after the Initial Term, nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to prohibit Lessor's right and ability, as a governmental entity, to use the Leased Premises or take any action, regardless of the potential for interference with the Leased Premises, to the extent required in a declared public emergency or when otherwise required by law. However, Lessor shall use all commercially reasonable efforts to avoid and minimize the duration and effect of any such interference.

Prior to any termination by Lessor, Lessor and Lessee shall use best efforts to find a mutually agreeable location on the Property or other property owned or controlled by Lessor for Lessee to relocate the Tower Facilities to or build a new tower. In the event the parties find a mutually agreeable location on the Property for the relocation of the Tower Facilities, the parties shall enter

into a lease agreement on identical terms to this Agreement. During the negotiation of a mutually agreeable location, and prior to execution of the new lease agreement, Lessee shall provide Lessor with an estimate of the cost for relocating the Tower Facilities and related carrier equipment to the proposed new location(s) (“**Estimated Relocation Cost**”) for the Entity’s understanding and consideration as to how collection of rent might be impacted, and Lessee shall be entitled to an abatement of rent under the new agreement in an amount equal to the actual cost Lessee to relocate the Tower Facilities and related carrier equipment up to the Estimated Relocation Cost.

21. Sublessee's Improvements. Lessee's licensee(s) and sublessee(s) shall be entitled to modify the Tower and to erect additional improvements on the Leased Premises, including, but not limited to antennas, dishes, cabling, additional storage buildings or equipment shelters on the Leased Premises as are reasonably required for the operation and maintenance of the communications equipment to be installed on the Leased Premises by said licensee(s) and sublessee(s), together with rights of ingress and egress to the Leased Premises and the right to install utilities on the Leased Premises as if said licensee or sublessee were the Lessee under this Lease. Lessee shall, in its agreements with such licensee(s) and sublicensee(s), ensure that the licensee(s) and sublicensee(s) are subject to all requirements under this Agreement that apply to Lessee, including regarding improvements, use of property, and access to property.

22. Taxes.

(a) Lessor, a governmental entity, is generally exempt from taxation and shall not be required under this Agreement to pay any taxes for which it is exempt. Lessee shall be responsible for (i) any taxes and assessments attributable to and levied upon Lessee’s leasehold improvements on the Leased Premises and as set forth in this Section and (ii) all sales, use, license, value added, documentary, stamp, gross receipts, registration, real estate transfer, conveyance, excise, recording and other similar taxes and fees imposed in connection with an assignment of this Agreement or sublease by Lessee.

(b) In the event Lessor receives a notice of assessment with respect to which taxes or assessments are imposed on Lessee’s leasehold improvements on the Leased Premises, Lessor shall provide Lessee with copies of each such notice promptly upon receipt, but in no event later than 30 days after the date of such notice of assessment. Lessee shall reimburse Lessor for the tax and assessments identified on the notice of assessment on Lessee’s leasehold improvements, which are paid by the Lessor. If Lessor seeks reimbursement from Lessee, Lessor shall, no later than 30 days after Lessor’s payment of the taxes or assessments for the assessed tax year, provide Lessee with written notice including evidence that Lessor has timely paid same, and Lessor shall provide to Lessee any other documentation reasonably requested by Lessee to allow Lessee to evaluate the payment and reimburse Lessor.

(c) For any tax amount which Lessee is responsible for under this Lease and Agreement, Lessee shall have the right to contest, in good faith, the validity or the amount thereof using such administrative, appellate or other proceedings as may be appropriate in the jurisdiction, and may defer payment of such obligations, pay same under protest, or take such other steps as permitted by law. This right shall include the ability to institute any legal, regulatory or informal action with respect to the valuation of the Leased Premises. Lessor shall reasonably cooperate with

respect to the commencement and prosecution of any such proceedings. The expense of any such proceedings shall be borne by Lessee and any refunds or rebates secured as a result of Lessee's action shall belong to Lessee, to the extent the amounts were originally paid by Lessee. In the event Lessee notifies Lessor by the due date for the assessment of Lessee's intent to contest the assessment, Lessor shall not pay the assessment pending conclusion of the contest, unless required by applicable law.

(d) Lessor shall provide prior written notice to Lessee of any split by Lessor or action by Lessor to cause the tax parcel on which the Leased Premises are located to be split, bifurcated, separated or divided.

(e) Any tax related notices shall be sent to Lessee in the manner set forth in Section 30, (Notices). Promptly after the Commencement Date, upon written request of Lessee, Lessor shall provide the address requested by Lessee to the taxing authority for the authority's use in the event the authority needs to communicate with Lessee. In the event that Lessee's tax address changes by notice to Lessor, Lessee shall provide notice to the taxing authority. If the taxing authority requires additional notice from the property owner, Lessee shall notify Lessor, and Lessor shall reasonably assist in providing Lessee's new tax address to the taxing authority or authorities.

(f) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Section, Lessee shall have no obligation to additionally reimburse Lessor for any tax or assessment for which the Lessee is separately reimbursed or rebated by a third party.

(g) Lessor hereby represents and warrants that, to the best of its knowledge as of the date of this Agreement, Lessor's property on which the Leased Premises and Easement are located is not subject to any "Conservation Use Covenant", "Greenbelt Covenant" or any conservation use program which restricts or limits development of Lessor's property.

23. Destruction of Premises. If the Leased Premises or the Tower Facilities are destroyed or damaged, so as to materially hinder the effective use of the Tower Facilities in Lessee's reasonable judgment, Lessee may elect within thirty (30) days of such damage/destruction to terminate this Lease as of the date of the damage or destruction by so notifying the Lessor in writing. In such event, all rights and obligations of Lessee to Lessor shall cease as of the date of completion of the removal of the Tower Facilities by Lessee as required by this Agreement, and Lessee shall be entitled to reimbursement of any Rent prepaid by the Lessee for the period beyond that date.

24. Condemnation. If a condemning authority takes all of the Leased Premises, or a portion sufficient in Lessee's determination to render the Leased Premises, in the reasonable opinion of Lessee, unsuitable for the use which Lessee was then making of the Leased Premises, this Lease shall terminate as of the date the title vests in the condemning authority. Lessee shall be entitled to file its own claims against the condemning authority for the value of its Tower Facilities, moving expenses, prepaid rent and business dislocation expenses. A sale of all or part of the Leased Premises to a purchaser with the power of eminent domain, in the face of the exercise of eminent domain power, shall be treated as taking by condemnation for the purpose of this Section.

25. Casualty. Each Party shall provide notice to the other Party of any casualty or other harm affecting the property within twenty-four (24) hours of discovery or notice of the casualty or other harm. If any part of the Tower Facilities or the property is materially damaged by casualty or other harm, through no fault of Lessee, as to render the Leased Premises unsuitable, in Lessee's reasonable determination, then Lessee may elect within thirty (30) days of the date of the casualty or other harm to terminate the Lease and Agreement by providing written notice to Lessor, which termination will be effective as of the date of the notice. Lessor agrees to permit Lessee to place reasonable temporary transmission and reception facilities on the property, but only until such time as Lessee is able to activate a replacement transmission facility at another location and only to the extent permitted by law and only to the extent such temporary facilities do not impede or interfere with Lessor any more than the Tower Facilities. Notwithstanding the termination of this Lease and Agreement, such temporary facilities will be governed by all of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, including Rent. Lessee shall be fully responsible, including obtaining insurance coverage, for its own protection from losses for any damages to Tower Facilities, and Lessor shall not directly or through insurance be liable for any loss to Tower Facilities unless caused by willful act or gross negligence of Lessor and, in such event, only to the extent permitted by law. If Lessor or Lessee undertakes to rebuild or restore the Leased Premises and/or the Tower Facilities, as applicable, Lessor agrees to permit Lessee to place reasonable temporary transmission and reception facilities which do not impede or interfere with Lessor any more than the Tower Facilities on the property at no additional Rent until the reconstruction of the Leased Premises and/or the Tower Facilities is completed. If Lessor determines not to rebuild or restore the property, Lessor will notify Lessee of such determination within sixty (60) days after discovery or notice of the casualty or other harm. Lessor agrees that the Rent shall be abated until the property and/or the Leased Premises are rebuilt or restored, unless Lessee places temporary transmission and reception facilities on the property.

26. Insurance. Lessee shall purchase and maintain in full force and effect, throughout the Initial Term and any Renewal Term, commercial general liability insurance with a combined single limit of at least One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) in the aggregate, which insurance shall include Lessor as an additional insured. Lessee shall require all of its contractors and subcontractors to maintain General Liability Insurance coverage in an amount equal to that specified herein.

27. Indemnification. **IN ADDITION TO, AND WITHOUT LIMITING, ANY OTHER INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATIONS IN THIS AGREEMENT, LESSEE WILL DEFEND, INDEMNIFY, AND HOLD HARMLESS LESSOR AND ITS OFFICERS, BOARD MEMBERS, EMPLOYEES, AND AGENTS FROM AND AGAINST ALL CLAIMS, SUITS, ACTIONS, LIABILITY, LIENS, LOSS, AND DAMAGE OF ANY CHARACTER, TYPE, OR DESCRIPTION, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION ALL EXPENSES OF LITIGATION, COURT COSTS, AND ATTORNEYS' FEES, ARISING OUT OF OR RELATED TO: (A) INJURY OR DEATH TO ANY PERSON OR DAMAGE TO PROPERTY RELATED TO THE ACTS OF LESSEE OR ITS AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, CONTRACTORS, INVITEES, LICENSEES, OR SUBLESSEES ON LESSOR'S PROPERTY; AND (B) LESSEE'S NEGLIGENCE, MISCONDUCT, BREACH OF CONTRACT, OR OTHER FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH ITS OBLIGATIONS**

**UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, OR INFRINGEMENT OR VIOLATION OF A THIRD-PARTY'S INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY OR PRIVACY RIGHT WHETHER OR NOT SUCH CLAIM, DAMAGE, LOSS, OR EXPENSE IS CAUSED IN PART BY THE LESSOR, PROVIDED THAT IF THE LESSOR'S NEGLIGENCE IS A CONCURRENT CAUSE OF THE INJURY, DEATH, OR DAMAGE, LESSEE'S OBLIGATION TO INDEMNIFY IS LIMITED TO THE AMOUNT NECESSARY TO CAUSE THE RELATIVE LIABILITY OF LESSOR AND LESSEE TO REFLECT THE COMPARATIVE NEGLIGENCE FINDINGS OF THE TRIER OF FACT (JUDGE OR JURY) OR AS AGREED IN A SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT TO WHICH LESSOR AND LESSEE ARE BOTH PARTIES.**

28. Lessee's Environmental Covenants and Indemnity. As used in this Lease, the term "Hazardous Materials" shall mean any hazardous or toxic substance, material or waste which is, or becomes designated as such in the future or is regulated by any agency of the United States Government or by any local governmental authority having jurisdiction, including, without limitation, any substance, material or waste that is defined or designated as a hazardous substance pursuant to the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act or the Clean Water Act. During the Term of this Lease, Lessee shall not cause or authorize the presence, use, storage and/or disposal of any Hazardous Material, on or under the Leased Premises by Lessee, its agents, employees, business invitees, contractors, licensees, or sublessees. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Lessee, and its licensees, sublicensee, sublessees, and/or subtenants shall have the right to install backup generators on the Leased Premises and such installation shall not be a violation of this Section. Lessee shall comply, and require all agents, employees, business invitees, contractors, licenses, and sublessees to be in compliance with all applicable laws, rules, regulations and orders. Lessee shall not install or permit the installation of any underground storage tanks on the Leased Premises. Lessee shall defend, indemnify, protect and hold Lessor harmless from and against all claims, costs, fines, judgments and liabilities, including attorney's fees and costs, arising out of or in connection with the presence, storage, use or disposal of Hazardous Materials on or under the Leased Premises caused by the acts, omissions or negligence of Lessee, its agents, employees, business invitees, contractors, licensees, or sublessees. The foregoing indemnity shall survive any termination of this Lease.

29. Lessor's Environmental Representation. Lessor represents and warrants, to its knowledge, without duty of inquiry, that no Hazardous Materials have been generated, stored, disposed of or are present on or under the Leased Premises prior to the Commencement Date of this Lease. Lessor shall immediately notify Lessee in writing of (i) any release or threatened release of Hazardous Materials in, on, under, from or migrating towards the Leased Premises; (ii) any non-compliance with any environmental laws related in any way to the Leased Premises; (iii) any actual or potential environmental lien; (iv) any required or proposed remediation of environmental conditions relating to the Leased Premises; and (v) any written or oral notice or other communication relating in any way to Hazardous Materials on the Leased Premises. The foregoing representations shall survive any termination of this Lease.

30. Notices. All notices, requests, demands and other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed given if sent by a nationally recognized courier, or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the following address:

31. Title and Quiet Enjoyment. Lessor represents, to its knowledge and without duty of inquiry, that (i) it has good fee simple title to the Leased Premises and the Easement; and (ii) the Leased Premises constitutes a legal lot that may be leased without the need for any subdivision or platting approval. Lessor covenants that Lessee shall have the quiet enjoyment of the Leased Premises during the term of the Lease. This Lease shall be an estate for years and not a usufruct. Lessor shall not knowingly use, nor shall Lessor knowingly permit its lessees, licensees, invitees, or agents to use any adjacent property owned or controlled by Lessor in any way which materially interferes with operations of Lessee. Such interference may be deemed a material breach by Lessor, and Lessee shall have the right, in addition to any other rights that it may have in law or equity, to enjoin such interference or to terminate this Lease.

32. Subordination and Non-Disturbance. To the extent applicable, this Lease shall be subject to and subordinate to any mortgage or deed to secure debt (collectively referred to as a "Mortgage") made by Lessor which may now or hereafter encumber the Leased Premises, provided that no such subordination shall be effective unless the holder of every such Mortgage shall in a separate agreement with Lessee agree that in the event of a foreclosure, or conveyance in lieu of foreclosure of Lessor's interest in the Leased Premises, such holder shall recognize and confirm the validity and existence of this Lease and that Lessee shall have the right to continue its use and occupancy of the Leased Premises in accordance with the provisions of this Lease as long as Lessee is not in default of this Lease beyond applicable notice and cure periods. Lessee shall execute in timely fashion such instruments as may reasonably be requested to evidence the provisions of this Section. In the event the Leased Premises are encumbered by a Mortgage on or after the Commencement Date, Lessor, no later than ten (10) days after the Option has been exercised, shall use commercially reasonable efforts to obtain and furnish Lessee with a non-disturbance agreement in recordable form from the holder of each Mortgage.

33. Condition of Leased Premises. Lessee acknowledges that it has independently and personally inspected the Premises and that it has entered into this Agreement based upon such examination and inspection. Lessee accepts the Premises in their present condition, "AS IS, WITH ALL FAULTS, IF ANY. AND WITHOUT ANY WARRANTY WHATSOEVER, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED," other than the warranty of quiet enjoyment, specifically without limiting the generality

of the foregoing, Lessee accepts the Premises without any warranty of (a) the nature or quality of any construction, structural design or engineering of any improvements currently located at or constituting a portion of the Premises, (b) the quality of the labor and materials included in any such improvements, or (c) the suitability of the Premises for any particular purpose or developmental potential.

34. WAIVER OF CONSUMER RIGHTS UNDER DTPA. AS A MATERIAL CONSIDERATION FOR LESSOR'S ENTERING INTO THIS AGREEMENT, LESSEE HEREBY WAIVES ANY RIGHT IT MAY HAVE UNDER THE DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICES-CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT, SECTION 17.41 ET SEQ., TEXAS BUSINESS & COMMERCE CODE, A LAW THAT GIVES CONSUMERS SPECIAL RIGHTS AND PROTECTIONS. AFTER CONSULTATION WITH AN ATTORNEY OF ITS OWN SELECTION, LESSEE VOLUNTARILY CONSENTS TO THIS WAIVER.

35. Assignments and Subleases. Except as provided in this Section, Lessee may not sell, transfer, assign, sublease, or convey any portion of its interest in this Lease or the Leased Premises. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if an event of default has not occurred and is continuing, Lessee may, upon written notice to Lessor, (i) sublease space on the Tower Facilities and within the Leased Premises to third parties, (ii) assign its interest in the Agreement to any party who (a) has a proven history of operating communication towers, (b) has a net worth of at least Fifteen Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$15,000,000.00) and (c) assumes in writing the obligations of Lessee under this Agreement, (iii) mortgage its interest in this Agreement and the leasehold interest created hereby to third party lenders in bona fide loan transactions, which mortgage shall not be deemed a lean or mortgage on Lessor's property and any records filing regarding the mortgage shall clearly state that fact, and (iv) assign its interest in this Agreement and the leasehold interest created hereby to Affiliates, as hereinafter defined. For purposes hereof, "Affiliates" shall mean, as to any party to this Lease, any individual, partnership, corporation, business trust, joint stock company, trust, unincorporated association, joint venture, or other entity of whatever nature, which, directly or indirectly, is in control of, is controlled by, or is under common control with, such party. For purposes of this definition, "control" of an entity means the power, directly or indirectly, either to (i) vote 10% or more of the securities having ordinary voting power for the election of directors of such entity, or (ii) direct or cause the direction of the management and policies of such entity whether by contract or otherwise. Except as provided above, any attempt by Lessee to sell, transfer, encumber, assign or convey its leasehold estate or any interest in the estate without the prior, written consent of Lessor shall be null and void.

36. Successors and Assigns. This Lease shall run with the Leased Premises described on Exhibit "A" and shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties, their respective heirs, successors, personal representatives and assigns.

37. Waiver of Lessor's Lien. To the extent permitted by law, Lessor hereby waives any and all lien rights it may have, statutory or otherwise, in and to the Tower Facilities or any portion thereof, regardless of whether or not same is deemed real or personal property under applicable laws. Lessor consents to Lessee's right to remove all or any portion of the Tower Facilities from time to time in Lessee's sole discretion and without Lessor's consent.

38. Waiver of Incidental and Consequential Damages. To the full extent such may be disclaimed by law, neither Party will assert any claim whatsoever against the other for loss of anticipatory profits or any other indirect, special, incidental or consequential damages.

39. Lessee's Exclusivity. To the extent permitted by law and without relinquishing Lessor's right to control use of its properties as may be required for its own and public purposes as further delineated herein, Lessor agrees not to lease any of Lessor's property within a radius of three (3) miles, or such other distance as negotiated by the parties, from the Leased Premises for construction of a tower or for use as a communications facility or for the operation of an antenna site leasing business which competes directly or indirectly with Lessee.

40. Removal of Personal Property. On or after the Termination Date, Lessee shall, at its sole cost and expense, remove the Tower and all other personal property and improvements which Lessee or Lessee's licensees, sublessees, agents, or contractors has installed or otherwise located on the Leased Premises. Lessee shall reasonably restore the Leased Premises to its original condition within sixty (60) days and shall continue to pay Rent as required by this Agreement until removal is completed. If any such property or equipment, including improvements, is not removed from the Leased Premises within the required time, such items shall be deemed abandoned, and Lessor shall be entitled to remove the remaining items and invoice Lessee for all actual costs of doing so and Lessee shall remit payment of such invoice to Lessor within thirty (30) days of receipt.

41. Rental Stream Offer. If at any time after the date this Agreement, Lessor receives and is formally considering acceptance of a bona fide written offer from a third-party seeking assignment or transfer of Rent payments associated with this Agreement ("Rental Stream Offer"), Lessor shall promptly notify Lessee and, subject to any confidentiality requirements in the Rental Stream Offer, furnish Lessee with a copy of the Rental Stream Offer. To the extent permitted by law, Lessee shall be given a twenty (20) day opportunity after it receives such copy to match the Rental Stream Offer and agree in writing to match the terms of the Rental Stream Offer. Such writing shall be in the form of a contract substantially similar to the Rental Stream Offer. Lessor agrees to consider any such offer from Lessee in good faith. However, Lessee acknowledges and agrees that nothing herein shall obligate Lessor to consider or approve any Rental Stream Offer, including that of Lessee, and any contract shall be subject to Lessor's determination of best value, requirements of law, and approval of Lessor's governing body.

42. Estoppels. Either party may request, in writing, that the other party certify information regarding the existence and terms of this Lease to a prospective mortgagee or purchaser. Such certification shall be transmitted within ten (10) business days after receipt of written request and, subject to any specific qualifications or disclaimers stated in the certification, may be relied upon by the party who requested it, and the contents of the certificate shall be binding upon the party executing it. The certificate may include (i) the validity, force and effect of this Lease; (ii) the extent to which this Lease has been supplemented or amended; (iii) the existence of any default; (iv) the existence of any asserted offsets, counter-claims or defenses on the part of the other party to which the certifying party has actual notice; (v) the commencement and expiration dates of the term, (vi) the amount of any prepaid rent; and (vii) any other matter as may reasonably be requested.

43. Memorandum/Short Form. Contemporaneously with the execution of this Agreement, Lessor and Lessee shall execute a recordable Memorandum of Lease (“Memorandum”) substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit “D”. The Memorandum shall set forth a description of the Leased Premises, the Easement, the name and addresses of Lessor and Lessee, the duration of the Initial Term and the Renewal Term(s) of this Lease, and any other provision that either party may request, except for the rental provisions. Lessee may record this Memorandum at any time during the Term, in its absolute discretion.

44. Miscellaneous.

(a) The prevailing party in any litigation or mediation arising hereunder shall be entitled to its reasonable attorney's fees and court costs, including appeals, if any. A Prevailing Party is a Party that recovers at least 55% of its total claims or that is required to pay no more than 45% of the claims made against it or is otherwise declared the prevailing party by the judge or mediator.

In the event that the Lessor or the Lessee shall contend that the other has committed a material breach of this Agreement, the party alleging such breach shall, as a condition precedent to filing any lawsuit, request mediation of the dispute. Request for mediation shall be in writing, and shall request that the mediation commence not less than thirty (30) or more than ninety (90) days following the date of the request, except upon agreement of both parties. In the event the parties are unable to agree to a date for the mediation or to the identity of the mediator or mediators within thirty days following the date of the request for mediation, all conditions precedent in this section shall be deemed to have occurred.

(b) This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding of Lessor and Lessee with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement, and supersedes all offers, negotiations and other agreements. There are no representations or understandings of any kind not set forth herein. Any amendments to said Agreement must be in writing and executed by Lessor and Lessee.

(c) Lessor agrees to cooperate with Lessee in any reasonable request to execute documents necessary to protect Lessee's rights under this Agreement or Lessee's use of the Leased Premises, and to take any further action which may reasonably be required as to effect the intent of this Agreement.

(d) This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for any dispute shall be in the County in which the Lease Premises are situated.

(e) If any term of this Agreement is found to be void or invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining terms of this Agreement, which shall continue in full force and effect.

(f) Whenever under this Agreement the consent or approval of Lessor is required or a determination must be made by Lessor, no such consent or approval shall be

unreasonably withheld, conditioned, or delayed, and all such determinations shall be made on a reasonable basis and in a reasonable manner.

(g) This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, all of which shall be considered one and the same agreement and shall become effective when one or more counterparts have been signed by each of the parties, it being understood that all parties need not sign the same counterpart.

(h) Lessee acknowledges that Lessor is a governmental entity and may disclose any and all information, including the terms of this Agreement, where required under the Texas Public Information Act (“TPIA”) or other applicable law. To the extent Lessee asserts any of its information is confidential or proprietary, Lessee must clearly and conspicuously mark any such information provided to Lessor as “PROPRIETARY AND CONFIDENTIAL.” However, nothing herein or in such marking shall be deemed to prohibit Lessor from disclosing such information to its attorneys, consultants, or other contractors with a need-to-know, to regulating agencies, or as required by law, including, but not limited to, any judicial or administrative order, subpoena, or open records ruling of the Texas Attorney General under the Texas Public Information Act. In the event that Lessor receives a request pursuant to the TPIA that includes information that the LESSEE has clearly marked as confidential and/or proprietary, the Lessor will notify Lessee of such request within ten (10) days of receipt. Except as may be memorialized in public record via a recorded memorandum of this Agreement, the Parties agree and acknowledge that the terms of this Agreement and all documentation exchanged during the course of negotiations is considered PROPRIETARY AND CONFIDENTIAL. Lessee acknowledges that, except as otherwise set forth herein, information not clearly marked as “PROPRIETARY AND CONFIDENTIAL” may be released as part of a TPIA request without notice to Lessee. If Lessee receives notices that Lessor has received a request pursuant to the TPIA that may include information that Lessee has marked as “PROPRIETARY AND CONFIDENTIAL”, Lessee may submit arguments to the Texas Attorney General’s Office on why the information identified as confidential and/or proprietary falls within an exception to public disclosure. Lessor will have no obligation to defend against public disclosure under the TPIA of any information that Lessee has marked “PROPRIETARY AND CONFIDENTIAL”, other than to note that Lessee has so marked those documents.

(i) Authority. By execution and delivery of this Agreement, the undersigned individuals warrant that they have been duly authorized by all requisite administrative action required to enter into and perform the terms of this Agreement.

(j) The time for performance by either party of any term, provision, or covenant of this Agreement shall be deemed extended by time lost due to delays resulting from acts of God, strikes, civil riots, floods, material or labor restrictions by governmental authority, and any other cause not within the control of the Lessor or Lessee, as the case may be.

(k) The Lessor is a political subdivision of the State of Texas and, as such, may enjoy immunities from suit and liability under the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas. No provision of this Agreement shall waive the Lessor’s immunity under the Texas Tort Claims Act,

Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code, Chapter 101 or under any other law, regulation, or constitutional provision.

TYPES OF  
ENROLLMENT

Medina Valley ISD has three types of enrollment; High School Choice, Special Enrollment by Program, and Transfers.

**HIGH SCHOOL CHOICE**

ATTENDANCE ZONE

All students must attend the school in the attendance zone in which the parent/guardian resides, unless high school of choice is granted.

HIGH SCHOOL CHOICE  
DEFINITION

Prior to the start of their ninth-grade year, a student may choose to enroll in any comprehensive MVISD high school campus regardless of the attendance area in which the parent/guardian resides. Once a high school choice is approved, the expectation is that the student will remain at the requested campus until the student has completed high school. If a student chooses to attend a high school that is not in the attendance area in which the parent/guardian resides, then the student's parent/guardian accepts responsibility for the transportation of the student to and from school.

APPROVAL CRITERIA

In order to meet the minimum standard in consideration of a high school choice approval, the following guidelines must be met:

- Projected enrollment for the campus of choice must be below 90% of the capacity of the campus.
  - Campus Capacities:
    - Medina Valley HS: 2,100
    - Creek View HS: 2,400
- Applications will be accepted on a first come first served basis until the campus reaches 90% of its capacity, at which point the campus will be closed.
- A student should have no more than 3 discipline out of placement referrals in any school semester.
- A student should have no more than 6 discipline out of placement referrals for the previous two school semesters.
- A student may not have been assigned to, attended, or otherwise withdrawn from a Discipline Alternative Educational Placement (DAEP) program or Juvenile Justice Alternative Education (JJAEP) Program, during the previous school year, when applying for a student transfer.
- A student should have an attendance rate of 90% or better in any school semester for the previous year.

PROCEDURES

High school choice applications will be accepted during a

designated time frame each year (specific dates determined annually).

Parents or guardians requesting a High School Choice outside of their zoned high school will:

1. Access the application online through Skyward Family Access and submit by the designated date. Falsification of any information shall cause this application for transfer to be denied or revoked.
2. Principal will approve/disapprove.
3. Approval/disapproval communication will be sent by the district by designated date.
4. Approved High School Choice does not require a renewal.

EXTRACURRICULAR  
AND UIL ELIGIBILITY

High School Choice will not impact extracurricular or UIL eligibility.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation is not provided for students attending a school outside of their attendance zone, except as required in certain Special Enrollment by Program situations as approved by the program's department lead.

CLOSED CAMPUSES

A list of closed campuses will be posted on the district's website. If a campus closes to High School Choice requests, students currently enrolled on High School Choice status who remain in good standing may continue attending in subsequent years.

DISTRICT  
REVOCATION

In all cases, MVISD reserves the right to revoke a high school choice approval if circumstances merit reconsideration.

The principal may revoke a high school choice for the following reasons:

- Persistent and documented Student Code of Conduct Infractions
- Violation of the Student Code of Conduct that results in assignment to the district or Juvenile Alternative Education Program
- Documented patterns of absences, truancy, late arrivals, and/or late pick-ups requiring supervision of the child by the school staff
- Student arrest

Except in cases involving student safety concerns, high school

choice status will be reviewed every six weeks and may be revoked at the end of the current semester, if necessary.

When a high school choice is revoked, the student's campus of residence shall be notified.

A student who has their high school choice revoked will be ineligible to apply for transfer for the remainder of their high school tenure.

**APPEALS**

Transfer denials or revocations may be appealed in accordance with FNG(Local) and GF(Local) as appropriate.

**STUDENT REVOKING  
HIGH SCHOOL CHOICE  
BEFORE STARTING  
HIGH SCHOOL**

If a student elects to revoke their High School Choice status prior to the start of their freshman year, the request must be submitted within the district's established timelines. Requests made outside of these designated windows will not be considered.

**STUDENT REQUEST  
TO RETURN TO  
ZONED CAMPUS  
AFTER STARTING  
HIGH SCHOOL**

If a student's High School Choice request has been approved and the student chooses to return to their zoned campus after the school year has begun, a transfer request form must be submitted. These requests will be processed and approved; however, the transfer will result in a 365-day period of ineligibility for participation in all extracurricular activities, including University Interscholastic League (UIL).

**OPENING OF NEW  
HIGH SCHOOL  
CAMPUS**

Due to the opening of a new high school, the district will provide a one-time High School Choice opportunity for eligible students. This allows students who did not have the opportunity to make a selection as 8th graders to choose their preferred high school. This opportunity is limited to this transition period and must be completed within the district's established timelines.

**DISCLAIMER**

The district understands that unique situations may arise. Extenuating circumstances may be considered on a case-by-case basis at the Superintendent's discretion, in accordance with district policy.

**INTRADISTRICT  
TRANSFERS**

**ATTENDANCE ZONE**

All students must attend the school in the attendance zone in which the parent/guardian resides, unless a transfer request is granted.

TRANSFER  
DEFINITION

Transfers allow students to attend a campus outside of the attendance zone in which they reside. Approval is based on the criteria outlined in district policy and this regulation.

Approved transfers are authorized for one scholastic year. A transfer may be revoked during the school year for a documented pattern of the students' failure to meet any of the following criteria of satisfactory attendance, or satisfactory behavior.

APPROVAL CRITERIA

In order to meet the minimum standard in consideration of a student transfer, the following guidelines must be met:

Projected enrollment for the campus must be below 90% of the capacity of the campus.

- Campus Capacities:
  - Castroville Elementary: 750
  - LaCoste Elementary: 850
  - Ladera Elementary: 850
  - Luckey Ranch Elementary: 850
  - Potranco Elementary: 850
  - Silos Elementary: 850
  - Medina Valley Middle School: 1,100
  - Loma Alta Middle School: 1,100
  - Medina Valley High School: 2,100
  - Creek View High School: 2,400
- Applications will be accepted on a first-come first-served basis until the campus reaches 90% of its capacity, at which point the campus will be closed.
- Pre-K students must meet eligibility requirements and enroll through the Pre-K registration process.
- Kindergarten through fourth grade classrooms are open to transfers if they do not exceed a 23:1 class-size ratio.
- Fifth grade classrooms are open to transfers if they do not exceed a 25:1 class size-ratio

In order to meet the minimum standard in consideration of a student transfer, the following guidelines must be met:

- A student should have no more than 3 discipline out of placement referrals in any school semester.
- A student should have no more than 6 discipline out of placement referrals for the previous two school semesters.

SPECIAL  
ENROLLMENT BY  
PROGRAM

Special Enrollment by Program allows students to transfer under a limited-enrollment opportunity. Transfers are approved based upon specific conditions set forth in the limited-enrollment opportunity specific to that program.

PROCEDURES

Student transfer applications will be accepted during a designated time frame each year (specific dates determined annually).

Parents or guardians requesting a transfer will:

1. Access the application online through Skyward Family Access and submit by the designated date. Falsification of any information shall cause this application for transfer to be denied or revoked.
2. Principal will approve/disapprove.
3. Approval/disapproval communication will be sent by the district by designated date.
4. Approved transfers are authorized for one scholastic year. Once a transfer is approved, the expectation is that the student will remain at the requested campus until the student has completed all grades offered at that campus. The student will not be allowed to apply for a transfer to a different campus for the remainder of their elementary, middle or high school tenure. A transfer may be revoked during the school year for a documented pattern of the students' failure to meet any of the following criteria of satisfactory attendance, or satisfactory behavior.

RENEWAL  
REQUESTS

Parents/guardians requesting transfer renewals will:

1. Access the application online at the District website, submit online, and print a copy by the designated date. Falsification of any information shall cause this application for transfer to be denied or revoked.
2. Principal will approve/disapprove.
3. Approval and disapproval communication will be sent from the school by the designated date.
4. Approved transfers are authorized for one scholastic year. Once a transfer is approved, the expectation is that the student will remain at the requested campus until the student has completed all grades offered at that campus. The student will not be allowed to apply for a transfer to a different campus for the remainder of their elementary, middle or high school tenure. A transfer may be

revoked during the school year for a documented pattern of the students' failure to meet any of the following criteria of satisfactory attendance, or satisfactory behavior.

EXTRACURRICULAR  
AND UIL ELIGIBILITY

Students transferring to a middle school or high school should be aware that a transfer will impact their eligibility for participation in all extracurricular activities, including University Interscholastic League (UIL) for 365 days.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation is not provided for students attending a school outside of their attendance zone, except as required in certain Special Enrollment by Program situations as approved by the program's department lead.

CLOSED CAMPUSES

A list of closed campuses will be posted on the district's website. If a campus closes to transfer requests, students currently enrolled on transfer status who remain in good standing may continue attending in subsequent years.

DISTRICT NON-  
RENEWAL OF  
TRANSFER

In all cases, MVISD reserves the right to non-renew a transfer if circumstances merit reconsideration.

The principal may non-renew a transfer at the end of the year for any of the criteria below:

1. Misrepresentation of residence on enrollment documents.
2. Timeliness: the request is submitted outside of the timelines established by the District.
3. Attendance must be satisfactory. Unexcused absences, excessive tardies, as well as excessive absences, will be considered.
4. Overall conduct/behavior must be satisfactory.
5. Punctuality at arrival and dismissal times: it is the responsibility of the parent to ensure students arrive at school and are picked up from school on time.
6. The student has relocated to a residence outside of the District.
7. The student was granted a transfer under provisions for a non-resident employee parent/guardian and the parent/guardian is no longer employed with the District.

A student who has their transfer non-renewed will be ineligible to apply for transfer for the remainder of their elementary, middle, or high school tenure.

DISTRICT  
REVOCATION

In all cases, MVISD reserves the right to revoke a transfer if circumstances merit reconsideration.

The principal may revoke a transfer for the following reasons:

- Persistent and documented Student Code of Conduct Infractions
- Violation of the Student Code of Conduct that results in assignment to the district or Juvenile Alternative Education Program
- Documented patterns of absences, truancy, late arrivals, and/or late pick-ups requiring supervision of the child by the school staff
- Student arrest
- Failure to maintain enrollment in a programmatic transfer

Except in cases involving student safety concerns, transfer status will be reviewed every six weeks and may be revoked at the end of the current semester, if necessary.

When a transfer is revoked, the student's campus of residence shall be notified.

A student who has their transfer revoked will be ineligible to apply for transfer for the remainder of their elementary, middle, or high school tenure.

APPEALS

If a transfer request is denied, non-renewed or revoked, the parent/guardian or person standing in parental relation to the student may appeal the decision in accordance with FNG(Local) and GF(Local) as appropriate.

STUDENT REQUESTS  
TO RETURN TO  
ZONED CAMPUS

Student requests to return to their zoned campus will automatically be approved; however for secondary students, the transfer will result in a 365-day period of ineligibility for participation in all extracurricular activities, including University Interscholastic League (UIL).

SIBLINGS

Siblings of students on transfer may receive preference in attending the same school on transfer status during the same school year in which a sibling is assigned, and where such sibling has previously

attended. However, transfers are not guaranteed for the sibling and criteria must continue to be met and space available.

**CHANGE IN  
RESIDENCE**

If during the school year a student's home zoned residence changes, attendance for the remainder of grades 5, 8, or 12 will be granted. Appropriate intradistrict or interdistrict transfer applications must be submitted and criteria will apply.

If during the school year a student's home zoned residence changes in grades other than 5, 8, or 12, the student will be eligible to apply for an interdistrict transfer. If approved, the considerations for approval outlined in this regulation will apply.

**BULLYING**

Policy FDB (LEGAL) states, "The Board or designee shall verify that a student has been a victim of bullying before transferring a student." If a transfer request lists bullying as a reason for the transfer, the Campus administration will provide documentation that the allegation of bullying has been investigated. The transfer request may be placed on hold until the campus completes a bullying investigation. Allegations of bullying will be addressed in accordance with Board policy FFI. If an investigation reveals that bullying as defined by FFI occurred, the board may transfer a student who engaged in bullying in accordance with Board policies FDB and FFI. If an investigation reveals that bullying as defined by FFI has not occurred, the transfer request will be processed using the considerations for approval outlined in this regulation.

**HARASSMENT**

Allegations of harassment will be addressed in accordance with Board policy FFH.

**DISCLAIMER**

The district understands that unique situations may arise. Extenuating circumstances may be considered on a case-by-case basis at the Superintendent's discretion, in accordance with district policy.

**EMPLOYEE STUDENT  
TRANSFERS**

All district employees are eligible to enroll their children at the campus of their choice, regardless of where they reside.

Children of employees are defined as those who are:

- the biological child to the employee,
- under legal guardianship of the employee by court order, or
- the step-child of the employee residing in the same residence as the employee.

Transfers of children may be non-renewed if the parent is no longer an employee of the district.

Eligible employees requesting a transfer will:

1. Access the application online through Skyward Family Access and submit by the designated date. Falsification of any information shall cause this application for transfer to be denied or revoked.
2. Nonresident employees may apply for a transfer for their pre-K–grade 12 children into the District [see FDA(LOCAL)].
3. The District will grant a transfer request for a student to attend the age-appropriate campus requested by their parent.
4. A transfer may be revoked during the school year for a documented pattern of the students' failure to meet any of the following criteria of satisfactory attendance, or satisfactory behavior.
5. Approval and disapproval communication will be sent from the school by the designated date.

DISTRICT NON-  
RENEWAL OF  
TRANSFER

In all cases, MVISD reserves the right to non-renew a transfer if circumstances merit reconsideration.

The principal may non-renew a transfer at the end of the year for any of the criteria below:

1. Timeliness: the request is submitted outside of the timelines established by the District.
2. Attendance must be satisfactory. Unexcused absences, excessive tardies, as well as excessive absences, will be considered.
3. Overall conduct/behavior must be satisfactory.
4. Punctuality at arrival and dismissal times: it is the responsibility of the parent to ensure students arrive at school and are picked up from school on time.
5. The student was granted a transfer under provisions for a non-resident employee parent/guardian and the parent/guardian is no longer employed with the District.

A student who has their transfer non-renewed will be ineligible to apply for transfer for the remainder of their elementary, middle, or high school tenure.

DISTRICT  
REVOCATION

In all cases, MVISD reserves the right to revoke a transfer if

circumstances merit reconsideration.

The principal may revoke a transfer for the following reasons:

- Persistent and documented Student Code of Conduct Infractions
- Violation of the Student Code of Conduct that results in assignment to the district or Juvenile Alternative Education Program
- Documented patterns of absences, truancy, late arrivals, and/or late pick-ups requiring supervision of the child by the school staff
- Student arrest
- Failure to maintain enrollment in a programmatic transfer

Except in cases involving student safety concerns, transfer status will be reviewed every six weeks and may be revoked at the end of the current semester, if necessary.

When a transfer is revoked, the student's campus of residence shall be notified.

A student who has their transfer revoked will be ineligible to apply for transfer for the remainder of their elementary, middle, or high school tenure.

## APPEALS

If a transfer request is denied, non-renewed or revoked, the parent/guardian or person standing in parental relation to the student may appeal the decision in accordance with FNG(Local) and GF(Local) as appropriate.

## BULLYING

Policy FDB (LEGAL) states, "The Board or designee shall verify that a student has been a victim of bullying before transferring a student." If a transfer request lists bullying as a reason for the transfer, the Campus administration will provide documentation that the allegation of bullying has been investigated. The transfer request may be placed on hold until the campus completes a bullying investigation. Allegations of bullying will be addressed in accordance with Board policy FFI. If an investigation reveals that bullying as defined by FFI occurred, the board may transfer a student who engaged in bullying in accordance with Board policies FDB and FFI. If an investigation reveals that bullying as defined by FFI has not occurred, the transfer request will be processed using the considerations for approval outlined in this regulation.

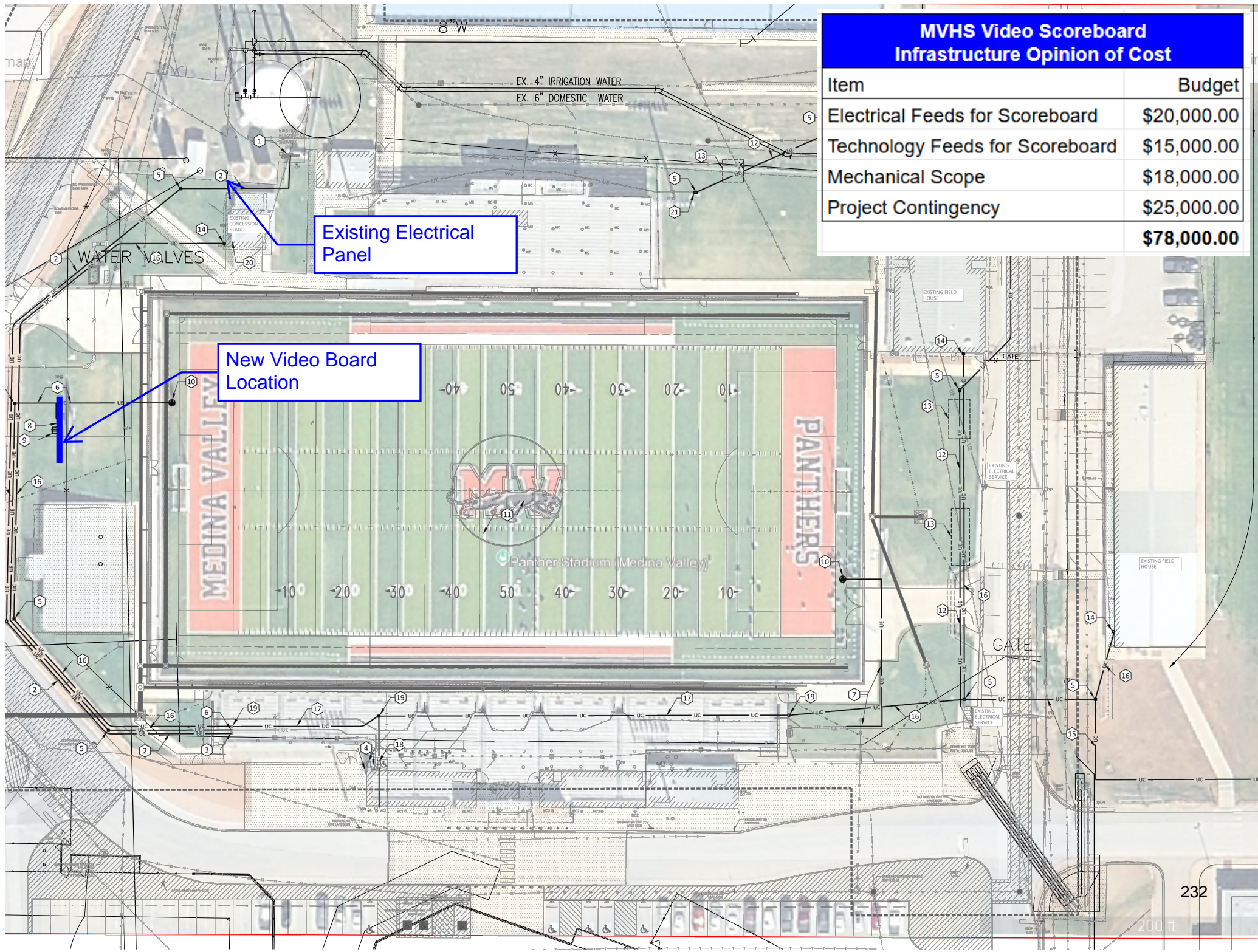

## MEDINA VALLEY INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

### Superintendent's Term Contract

This Contract is entered into between the Board of Trustees (the "Board") of MEDINA VALLEY INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT (the "District") and EMILY LORENZ (the "Superintendent"). The District, the Board, and the Superintendent are also hereinafter referred to collectively as "parties."

#### WITNESSETH:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board and the Superintendent, for and in consideration of the terms hereinafter established and pursuant to Section 11.201 and Chapter 21 of the Texas Education Code, have agreed, and do hereby agree, as follows:

#### I. Term

- 1.1. **Term.** The Board, by and on behalf of the District, does hereby employ the Superintendent, and the Superintendent agrees to serve as the Superintendent for an initial term beginning on June 1, 2026 and ending on July 31, 2029.
- 1.2. **Contract Extension.** The Board may consider an extension of this contract each year during the contract term. Failure to reissue the Contract for an extended term shall not constitute non-renewal under Board policy.
- 1.3. **No Tenure.** The Board has not adopted any policy, rule, regulation, law or practice providing for tenure. No right of tenure is created by this contract. No property interest, express or implied, is created in continued employment beyond the contract.

#### II. Certification

- 2.1. The Superintendent agrees to maintain the required certification throughout the term of employment with the District. If the Superintendent's certification expires, is canceled or revoked, this Contract is void.

#### III. Representations

- 3.1. **Beginning of Contract:** The Superintendent represents that she has disclosed to the Board, in writing, any arrest and any indictment, conviction, nolo contendere (no contest) plea, guilty plea or other adjudication of the Superintendent. The Superintendent understands that a criminal history record acceptable to the Board, at its sole discretion, is a condition precedent to this Contract. The Superintendent agrees to submit to a review of her national criminal history information if required by the District, TEA or SBEC.

- 3.2. **During Contract:** The Superintendent also agrees that, during the term of this Contract, the Superintendent shall notify the Board, in writing, of any arrest or of any indictment, conviction, no contest or guilty plea, or other adjudication of the Superintendent. The Superintendent agrees to provide such notification in writing within seven (7) calendar days of the event or any shorter period specified in Board policy.
- 3.3. **False Statements and Misrepresentations:** The Superintendent represents that any records or information provided in connection with her employment application and documents related thereto are true and correct. Any false statements, misrepresentations, omissions of requested information, or fraud by the Superintendent in or concerning any required records or in the employment application may be grounds for termination or nonrenewal, as applicable.

#### IV. Employment

- 4.1. **Duties:** The Superintendent is the educational leader and chief executive of the District and shall faithfully perform the duties of the Superintendent of Schools for the District, as prescribed in the job description and as may be assigned by action of the Board, and shall comply with all Board directives, state and federal law, district policy, rules and regulations as they exist or may hereafter be amended.
- 4.2. **Authority:** The Superintendent shall perform such duties and have such powers as may be prescribed by the Texas Education Code, federal and state law, and the Board. The Board shall have the right to assign additional duties to the Superintendent and to make changes in responsibilities or work at any time during the contract term. All duties and responsibilities assigned by the Board shall be appropriate to and not inconsistent with the professional role and responsibilities of a Superintendent. In the case of administrative assignment and reassignment, the Superintendent shall inform the members of the Board prior to administrative assignment and/or reassignment.
- 4.3. **Standard:** Except as otherwise permitted by this Contract, the Superintendent agrees to devote her full time and energy to the performance of her duties. The Superintendent shall perform her duties with reasonable care, skill, and diligence. The Superintendent shall comply with all Board directives, state and federal laws and rules, Board policy, and regulations created and/or as they exist or may hereafter be amended.
- 4.4. **Reassignment:** The Superintendent cannot be reassigned from the position of Superintendent to another position without the Superintendent's express written consent.
- 4.5. **Board Meetings:** The Superintendent shall attend all meetings of the Board. The Superintendent will be normally required to attend all executive sessions of the

Board, but this Contract shall not grant the Superintendent a right to attend all executive sessions of the Board. The Board President may excuse the Superintendent from any executive session conducted by the Board at any Board meeting. In the event of illness, or Board President approved absence, the Superintendent's designee shall attend such meetings. The Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee shall attend all Board Committee Meetings, Board-authorized and approved citizen committee meetings, and further, the Superintendent shall provide recommendation(s) and/or information as to each of the items of business considered at each meeting.

- 4.6. **Criticisms, Complaints, and Suggestions:** The Superintendent shall establish an administrative process for addressing informal complaints, criticisms and suggestions reported to her and/or her administrative staff. The Board and/or Board members shall promptly refer criticisms, complaints and suggestions called to the attention of the Board and/or Board members to the Superintendent for study and recommendation and/or appropriate response.

## **V. Compensation and Benefits**

- 5.1. **Salary.** In determining the Superintendent's daily rate, Superintendent's compensation shall be based on a 226-day administrator contract. The District shall pay the Superintendent an annual salary in the sum of TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$250,000.00) per each twelve (12) month period, and all compensation shall be payable in installments of twenty-four (24) checks in a 12-month period (twice per month) for the Superintendent's services in accordance with the schedule of salary payments in effect for other certified employees.
- 5.2. **Salary Adjustments.** At any time during the term of this Contract, the Board may in its discretion, review and adjust the salary of the Superintendent but in no event shall the Superintendent be paid less than the salary set forth pursuant to Subsection 5.1 of this Contract except by mutual Agreement of the parties. Such adjustments, if any, shall be in the form of a written addendum to this Contract or a new contract.
- 5.3. **Leave.** The Superintendent may take, at the Superintendent's choice, the same number of leave days of authorized by policies adopted by the Board for administrators on twelve-month contracts. Leave days taken by the Superintendent will be taken at such time or times as will least interfere with the performance of the Superintendent's duties as set forth in this Contract. The Superintendent shall observe the same legal holidays as provided by Board policies for administrative employees on twelve-month contracts. .
- 5.4. **Benefits.** The Superintendent shall be entitled to all benefits applicable to full-time administrative employees, as are incidental to their employment relationship with the District, including leaves, retirement program, and other applicable

administrative employee benefits. The District shall pay all premiums to enroll and maintain the Superintendent in the same District health insurance plan, including medical, dental and vision plans offered by the District to all District employees. The Board reserves the right, however, to add, amend and/or rescind any of its policies and/or resolutions at any time during the term of this Contract to reduce or increase District benefits, at the Board's sole discretion.

5.4. **Communications.** The District shall provide and pay for a monthly cellular phone service for the Superintendent's usage for District-related business.

5.5. **Civic Activities.** The Board encourages the Superintendent to become a member of and participate in community and civic affairs. The Board concludes that such participation will serve a legitimate purpose related to the educational mission of the District. The Superintendent may hold offices or accept responsibilities in these professional organizations, provided that such responsibilities do not interfere with the performance of her duties as Superintendent. Prior to engaging in these activities, the Superintendent will notify the Board in writing of the activity. The Board will notify the Superintendent if the activity presents a conflict or interferes with the performance of her duties as Superintendent. The District shall reimburse the Superintendent for the costs of membership in all local civic organizations in which the Superintendent participates and related travel outside of the District, subject to advance Board approval.

5.6. **Membership in Professional/Service Organizations.** The Superintendent shall devote the Superintendent's time, attention, and energy to the direction, administration, and supervision of the District. The Board, however, encourages the continued professional growth of the Superintendent through the Superintendent's active attendance and participation in appropriate professional meetings, seminars, conferences, or courses at the local, regional, state, and national level. In its encouragement of the Superintendent to grow professionally, the Board shall permit a reasonable amount of release time for the Superintendent as the Superintendent and the Board deem appropriate to attend such meetings, seminars, conferences, or courses. The District does hereby agree to provide in the District's budget per contract year an amount to be used for registration, travel, meals, lodging, and other related expenses. The District shall pay for the Superintendent's membership dues to the Texas Association of School Administrators and one other professional organization selected by the Superintendent. The District shall pay for other memberships necessary to maintain and improve the Superintendent's professional skills, subject to Board approval and the District's budget. The District shall bear the reasonable cost and expense for registration, travel, meals, lodging, and other related expenses for such attendance and membership subject to the District's budget.

5.7. **Expenses.** The District shall pay or reimburse the Superintendent for reasonable expenses incurred by the Superintendent in the continuing performance of the Superintendent's duties under this Contract. The District agrees to pay the actual

and incidental costs incurred by the Superintendent for travel outside of the District in accordance with Board policy. Such actual or incidental costs may include, but are not limited to, gasoline, hotels and accommodations, meals, rental car, and other expenses incurred in the performance of the business of the District. The Superintendent shall comply with all procedures and documentation requirements in accordance with Board policies.

5.8. **Moving Expenses.** The District shall pay or reimburse the Superintendent for reasonable moving expenses incurred, up to a maximum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) upon establishing residency within the District. This benefit shall be paid one time.

5.9. **Professional Liability/Indemnification.** To the extent it may be permitted to do by applicable law, including, but not limited to Texas Civil Practice & Remedies Code Chapter 102, the District does hereby agree to defend, hold harmless, and indemnify Superintendent from any and all demands, claims, suits, actions, judgments, expenses and attorneys' fees incurred in any legal proceedings brought against Superintendent in the Superintendent's individual or official capacity as an employee and as Superintendent of the District, providing the incident(s), which is (are) the basis of any such demand, claim, suits, actions, judgments, expenses and attorneys' fees, arose or does arise in the future from an act or omission of Superintendent as an employee of the District, acting within the course and scope of Superintendent's employment with the District; excluding, however, matters involving the termination or nonrenewal of the Superintendent's employment, any matters involving criminal charges and/or criminal litigation against the Superintendent, any such demand, claim, suits, actions, judgments, expenses and attorneys' fees for those claims or any causes of action where it is determined that Superintendent committed official misconduct, or committed a willful or wrongful act or omission, or an act or omission constituting gross negligence, or acted in bad faith; and excluding any costs, fees, expenses or damages that would be recoverable or payable under an insurance contract, held either by the District or by Superintendent. In no event shall individual Board members be considered personally liable for defending the Superintendent against any claims. The selection of Superintendent's legal counsel shall be with the mutual agreement of Superintendent and the District if such legal counsel is not also District's legal counsel. A legal defense may be provided through insurance coverage, in which case Superintendent's right to agree to legal counsel provided for her will depend on the terms of the applicable insurance contract. To the extent this Section exceeds the authority provided and limitations imposed by Texas Civil Practice & Remedies Code, Chapter 102, it shall be construed and modified accordingly. The provisions of this Section shall survive the termination of this Contract, and the Superintendent agrees to fully cooperate with the District and its authorized representatives in the handling and defense of such Claims, both during and after the Superintendent's term of employment with the District, as may be required by the District.

All other terms and obligations created by this Contract notwithstanding, the District shall not be required, in any event, to defend, hold harmless and/or pay any costs associated with any proceeding where the Superintendent and the District and/or the Board are named as adversarial parties in such Claims or where the alleged conduct or action of the Superintendent is outside the course and scope of her employment with the District, provided that neither the District, the Board, Board member nor District representative joins the proceeding as a named adverse party in order to avoid providing a defense to the Superintendent.

## **VI. Annual Performance Goals & Review of Performance**

- 6.1 **Development of Goals.** The Superintendent shall, by October 1, of each year of this Contract, submit for the Board's consideration and adoption a preliminary list of goals for the District. The Superintendent and the Board shall then meet, and the Board shall approve or revise the list of goals. The Superintendent shall submit to the Board for its approval a plan to implement the goals. The Superintendent and the Board shall meet biannually to assess the goals and may adjust or review the goals either by action of the Board or upon recommendation of the Superintendent and approval of the Board. The goals approved by the Board shall be reduced to writing and shall be among the criteria on which the Superintendent's performance will be reviewed and evaluated. The Board agrees to work with and support the Superintendent in achieving the District Goals.
- 6.2 **Review of Performance.** The Board shall evaluate and assess the performance of the Superintendent, at least, once a year of this contract. The evaluation and assessment shall be related to the duties of the Superintendent as outlined in the Superintendent's job description and annual goals for the District.
- 6.3 **Confidentiality.** Unless the Superintendent expressly requests otherwise in writing, the evaluation of the Superintendent shall at all times be conducted in executive session and shall be considered confidential to the extent permitted by law and with input of the Superintendent. Nothing herein shall prohibit the Board of the Superintendent from sharing the contents of the Superintendent's evaluation with their respective legal counsel.
- 6.4 **Evaluation Format and Procedure.** The evaluation format and procedure shall be in accordance with the Board's policies and state and federal law. In the event that the Board determines that the performance of the Superintendent is unsatisfactory in any respect, it shall describe in writing, in reasonable detail, specific instances of unsatisfactory performance. The evaluation shall include recommendations as to areas of improvement in all instances where the Board deems performance to be unsatisfactory. A copy of the written evaluation shall be delivered to the Superintendent. The Superintendent shall have the right to make a written response to the evaluation. That response shall become a permanent attachment to the evaluation in the Superintendent's personnel file. Within thirty (30) days of the delivery of the written evaluation to the

Superintendent, the Board shall meet with the Superintendent to discuss the evaluation. The Board shall devote, at a minimum, a portion of, or all of, one executive session annually to a discussion of the working relationship between the Superintendent and Board. It is also agreed that the Superintendent and Board will hold at least a semi-annual evaluation conference with a format agreeable to both sides. In the event the Board deems that the evaluation instrument, format and/or procedure is to be modified by the Board and such modifications would require new or different performance expectations, the Superintendent shall be provided a reasonable period of time to demonstrate such expected performance being evaluated.

## **VII. Professional Growth and Outside Activities**

- 7.1 **Professional Growth and Outside Activities.** The Superintendent shall devote her full- time attention and energy to the administration and supervision of the District. However, within the established, applicable budget, the Board shall allow the continuing professional growth of the Superintendent through his attendance at local, state and national school administrator and/or school board associations; local, state and national conferences, seminars and/or courses offered by public or private institutions , commissions or committees related to education; and informational meetings with persons whose particular skills or backgrounds would serve to improve the capacity of the Superintendent in the performance of his professional responsibilities for the District.

The Board shall permit a reasonable amount of release time for the Superintendent to attend such functions; and the District shall pay for the reasonable and necessary fees for travel and subsistence expenses, in accordance with the District's Travel Reimbursement Settlement Allowances and Procedures in place and as may be amended from time to time.

## **VIII. Residency**

- 8.1 **Residency.** Within the first six (6) months following the start of the Superintendent's employment under this Contract, the Superintendent shall establish their residency within the geographical boundaries of Medina Valley I.S.D. Following, the Superintendent's establishment of residency in the District, the Superintendent shall reside within the geographical boundaries of Medina Valley I.S.D., at all times during her employment with the District.

## **IX. Suspension**

- 9.1 **Suspension.** In accordance with Chapter 21 of the Texas Education Code, the

Board may suspend the Superintendent without pay during the term of this Contract for good cause as determined by the Board.

#### **X. Extension or Nonrenewal**

- 10.1 **Extension/Nonrenewal.** Extension or nonrenewal shall be in accordance with Board policy, Texas Education Code Chapter 21, Subchapter E, and applicable law.

#### **XI. Termination of Employment Contract**

- 11.1 **Mutual Agreement.** This Contract shall be terminated by the mutual agreement of the Superintendent and the Board in writing, upon such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon.

- 11.2 **Retirement or Death.** This Contract shall be terminated upon the retirement or death of the Superintendent.

- 11.3 **Dismissal for Good Cause.** The Board may dismiss the Superintendent during the term of the Contract for good cause. The term "good cause" is defined as follows:

- a. Failure to fulfill duties or responsibilities as set forth under the terms and conditions of this Contract;
- b. Incompetence or inefficiency in the performance of required or assigned duties as documented by evaluations, supplemental memoranda, or other written communication from the Board; provided, however, the terms and conditions of this paragraph shall not justify good cause unless the Board has provided the Superintendent a reasonable opportunity to remediate any incompetency or inefficiency.
- c. Insubordination or failure to comply with lawful written Board directives;
- d. Failure to comply with written Board Policies or District administrativeregulations.;
- e. Neglect of duties;
- f. Drunkenness or excessive use of alcoholic beverages;
- g. Illegal use of drugs, hallucinogens, or other substances regulated by the TexasControlled Substances Act;
- h. Conviction of a felony or crime involving moral turpitude;
- i. Failure to meet the District's standards of professional conduct;
- j. Failure to comply with reasonable District professional development requirements regarding advanced course work or professional development;
- k. Disability, not otherwise protected by law, that substantially

impairs the Superintendent's performance of required duties;

- l. Immorality, which is conduct not in conformity with the accepted moral standards of the community encompassed by the district. Immorality is not confined to sexual matters, but includes conduct inconsistent with rectitude or indicative of corruption, indecency or depravity;
- m. Assault on an employee or student;
- n. Knowingly falsifying records or documents related to the District's activities;
- o. Conscious misrepresentation of material facts to the Board or other District officials in the conduct of the District's business;
- p. Failure to fulfill requirements for superintendent certification;
- q. Failure to fulfill the requirements of a deficiency plan under an Emergency Plan; or,
- r. Any other reason constituting "good cause" as defined by Section 21.211 and 21.212 of the Texas Education Code.

11.4 **Termination Procedure.** In the event the Board proposes the termination of this Contract for "good cause," the Superintendent shall be afforded all the rights as set forth in the Board's policies, and state and federal law.

11.5 **Resignation of Superintendent.** The Superintendent may leave the employment of the District at the end of a school year without penalty by filing a written resignation with the Board. The resignation must be addressed to the Board and filed not later than the 45<sup>th</sup> day before the first day of instruction of the following year. The Superintendent may resign, with the consent of the Board, at any other time.

11.6 **Limitation on Severance.** In the event the Superintendent's employment is terminated by action of the Board prior to the end of the Contract term, including but not limited to nonrenewal, mutual separation, or other Board-initiated separation not involving good cause under Section 11.3, any payment of severance or contract buyout shall be subject to the limitations set forth in Texas Government Code § 180.011. If the Board and Superintendent agree to a separation of employment prior to the expiration of the Contract term, the Board may, in its discretion, provide for payment of compensation and benefits in connection with such separation.

Any such payment shall be limited as follows: (1) the Superintendent shall be entitled to receive all salary and benefits earned through the effective date of separation; (2) the Superintendent may receive, as severance or contract buyout, a payment equal to the lesser of (a) the value of salary and benefits

remaining under the Contract, or (b) the value of twenty (20) weeks of salary and benefits, calculated at the Superintendent's rate of pay in effect on the date of separation; and (3) the Superintendent may receive payment for accrued but unused leave, if applicable, in accordance with this Section 5.3 of this Contract and District policy. The District shall withhold applicable state and federal deductions. Payment of such amounts shall constitute full satisfaction of any and all obligations of the District to the Superintendent for compensation and benefits beyond the effective date of separation.

The Superintendent shall not be entitled to any severance or contract buyout if the Superintendent is terminated for good cause under Section 11.3 or for misconduct as defined by Texas Government Code § 180.011(a)(1). Any such termination shall proceed in accordance with Sections 11.3 and 11.4 and applicable law.

## **XII. General Provisions**

- 12.1 **Controlling Law.** This Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas and shall be performable in Medina County, Texas, unless otherwise provided by law.
- 12.2 **Complete Agreement.** This Contract embodies the entire agreement between the parties hereto and cannot be varied except by written agreement of the undersigned parties, except as expressly provided herein.
- 12.3 **Conflicts.** In the event of any conflict between the terms, conditions and provisions of this Employment Contract and the provisions of the Board's policies, or any permissive state or federal law, then, unless otherwise prohibited by law, the terms of this Contract shall take precedence over the contrary provisions of the Board's policies or any such permissive law during the term of the Contract.
- 12.4 **Savings Clause.** In the event any one or more of the provisions contained in this Contract shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision thereof, and this Contract shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein. All existing agreements and contracts, both verbal and written, between the parties hereto regarding the employment of the Superintendent have been superseded by this Contract, and this Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the parties unless amended pursuant to the terms of this Contract.

- 12.5 **Amendment:** This Contract may not be amended except by written agreement of the Parties.
- 12.6 **Paragraph Headings:** The headings used at the beginning of each numbered paragraph in this Contract are not intended to have any legal effect; the headings do not limit or expand the meaning of the paragraphs that follow them.
- 12.7 **Legal Representation:** Both Parties have been represented by legal counsel of their choice, or have had the opportunity to consult with legal counsel, in the negotiation and execution of this Contract.
- 12.8 **Multiple Originals.** This Agreement is executed in two originals, one for the Board and one for the Superintendent, each of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

**XIII. Notices**

- 13.1 **To Superintendent:** The Superintendent agrees to keep a current address on file with the District's Human Resources Department and the Board President. The Superintendent agrees that the Board may meet any legal obligation it has to give the Superintendent written notice regarding this Contract or the Superintendent's employment by hand-delivery, or by certified mail, regular mail, and/or express delivery service to the Superintendent's address of record.
- 13.2 **To Board:** The Board agrees that the Superintendent may meet any legal obligation to give the Board written notice regarding this Contract or the Superintendent's employment by providing one copy of the notice to the President of the Board and one copy to the Vice-President of the Board. The Superintendent may provide such notices by hand-delivery, or by certified mail, regular mail, and/or express delivery service, to the Board President and Vice-President's addresses of record, as provided to the District.

**Primary Purpose:**

The Superintendent Emeritus shall serve as a senior educational leader for the District and shall faithfully perform duties as assigned by the Board of Trustees, as prescribed by Texas law, Board policy, and this job description. The Superintendent Emeritus shall provide transitional leadership, advisory support, and continuity of operations for the District at the direction of the Board of Trustees and shall comply with all Board directives, state and federal law, District policy, rules, and regulations as they exist or may hereafter be amended.

The Superintendent Emeritus shall serve in a leadership capacity as needed prior to the appointment of a Superintendent of Schools and, following such appointment, shall provide ongoing support, institutional knowledge, and guidance to the Superintendent of Schools and the Board to ensure continuity of District operations and initiatives. The Superintendent Emeritus shall perform assigned duties with reasonable care, diligence, skill, and expertise and shall devote sufficient time, skill, labor, and attention necessary to fulfill the responsibilities of the position.

**Education/Certification:**

Hold a valid certificate required of a superintendent by the State of Texas and issued by the Texas Education Agency or the State Board for Educator Certification, or other certification as may be required by law.

**Special Knowledge/Skills:**

Extensive experience in central office administration required.

SUPERINTENDENT EMERITUS EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT**

THIS SUPERINTENDENT EMERITUS EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT (“Contract”) is made and entered into by and between the Board of Trustees (the “Board”) of Medina Valley Independent School District (the “District”) and Dr. Scott Caloss (“Superintendent Emeritus”).

WHEREAS, Superintendent Emeritus is currently employed as Superintendent of Schools for the District pursuant to an employment contract effective April 28, 2025, with a term ending April 28, 2028; and

WHEREAS, Superintendent Emeritus has informed the Board of his intent to retire effective June 30, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to ensure continuity of leadership and an orderly transition in connection with the appointment of a Superintendent of Schools; and

WHEREAS, the Board and Superintendent Emeritus have agreed that, upon the first date of employment of the new Superintendent of Schools for the District, Dr. Caloss will assume the position of Superintendent Emeritus through June 30, 2026.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. Superintendent Emeritus is currently employed as Superintendent of Schools pursuant to an employment contract effective April 28, 2025. Superintendent Emeritus agrees to resign from the position of Superintendent of Schools effective on the first date of employment of the new Superintendent of Schools, and the Board accepts such resignation without further action by the parties with the exception of the execution of this Agreement by the parties. Upon the execution of this Agreement by the Parties, the prior Superintendent contract shall terminate by mutual agreement of the parties, and neither party shall have any further rights or obligations under that contract except as expressly provided herein.
2. The Board agrees to employ the Superintendent Emeritus beginning the day after the new Superintendent of Schools begins employment with the District through June 30, 2026. The Superintendent Emeritus shall serve at the direction of the Board and shall perform duties as assigned by the Board and needed by the Superintendent. Superintendent Emeritus shall work remotely and be on call for the District as needed. The parties acknowledge that the Superintendent Emeritus may serve in a transitional leadership capacity prior to the appointment of a Superintendent of Schools. Superintendent Emeritus shall continue to be compensated in accordance with his present salary and benefits earned during the 2025-2026 school/work year as Superintendent for the District through June 30, 2026.
3. The Board has not adopted any policy providing for tenure. No right of tenure is created by this Contract, and no property interest is created in continued employment beyond the terms of this Contract.

4. The Board shall provide Superintendent Emeritus with professional liability coverage and indemnification to the extent permitted by law for acts performed within the course and scope of employment.
5. The District shall reimburse Superintendent Emeritus for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of duties under this Contract, in accordance with Board policy and applicable documentation requirements. Such expenses may include authorized travel, lodging, meals, registration fees, and other approved business expenses.
6. This Contract may be terminated at any time by action of the Board, with or without cause, or by written resignation of Superintendent Emeritus. Upon termination, the District shall pay Superintendent Emeritus his normal salary and benefits earned during the 2025-2026 school year as Superintendent of Schools through June 30, 2026.
7. Superintendent Emeritus shall maintain any certification required by state law for the performance of assigned duties. Failure to maintain required certification shall constitute grounds for termination of this Contract.
8. Superintendent Emeritus shall return all District property, records, and materials on or before June 30, 2026.
9. Superintendent Emeritus agrees to reasonably cooperate with the District and its representatives in connection with matters arising during his employment, including providing information and assistance as requested.
10. This Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior agreements relating to employment as Superintendent Emeritus. This Contract may not be amended except by written agreement of the parties.
11. Texas law shall govern this Contract, and venue shall lie in Medina County, Texas.
12. If any provision of this Contract is determined to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions, and this Contract shall be construed as if such provision had not been included.
13. In the event of any conflict between this Contract and District policy, the terms of this Contract shall control to the extent permitted by law.

**Agenda item:** Consider Approval to Authorize the Appointment of specific Personnel as Security Specialists Authorized to carry a Weapon

### **Background Information**

Our legal team has advised the District that the Board should consider authorizing specific Personnel as Security Specialists to carry a weapon in district. With the next TCOLE Marshall Training not taking place until May, we are hiring potential future Marshalls as Security Specialists. The Security Specialists are legally eligible to carry a firearm on campus and will perform the same daily duties as our current marshals. We cannot identify them as marshals until they complete and pass the TCOLE training and certifications.

### **Administrative Consideration**

All facets of this position including pay, job description and expectations are identical to our marshals.

### **Recommendation**

District Administration recommends that the Board of Trustees approve the appointment of specific Personnel as Security Specialists authorized to carry a weapon.
