SUMMARY

The district has received competitive proposals for insurance coverage for the 2025-26 school year. After careful analysis, administration recommends continuing with Texas Political Subdivisions (TPS) through USI broker despite a higher premium of \$15,747 versus the TEE proposal.

Premium Comparison

- TPS (Current Provider): \$836,157 total premium
- TEE (New Proposal): \$820,410 total premium
- Difference: \$15,747 (1.9% higher for TPS)

KEY ANALYSIS POINTS:

Why TPS Remains the Better Choice

Proven Track Record & Stability

- 40+ years serving Texas school districts
- \$17 million member equity for financial stability
- USI ranked #10 nationally among insurance brokers
- TEE founded June 2023 (less than 2 years operational)

TEE Concerns

Limited Experience & Resources

- Only 3 confirmed member districts with Property and Casualty
- Proposal underinsures the district at an amount of \$224 million
- No established claims handling procedures
- No outstanding references
- Unverified crisis management capabilities
- No demonstrated track record for complex school district needs
- Limited financial resources for major claim events

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The \$15,747 premium difference represents 0.006% of our property values (\$254 million) - an insignificant cost to maintain:

- Established vendor relationships
- Superior crisis response capabilities

RECOMMENDATION

Administration recommends approving the TPS proposal through USI broker for 2025-26 coverage at \$836,157.

The modest premium difference is justified by:

- Proven performance over four decades
- Comprehensive protection including crisis management and cyber security
- Financial stability and established claims handling
- Risk mitigation through experienced vendor networks

While TEE offers competitive pricing, their unproven operational history and limited resources present alarming risks for managing \$254 million in property values and serving 8,000+ students.

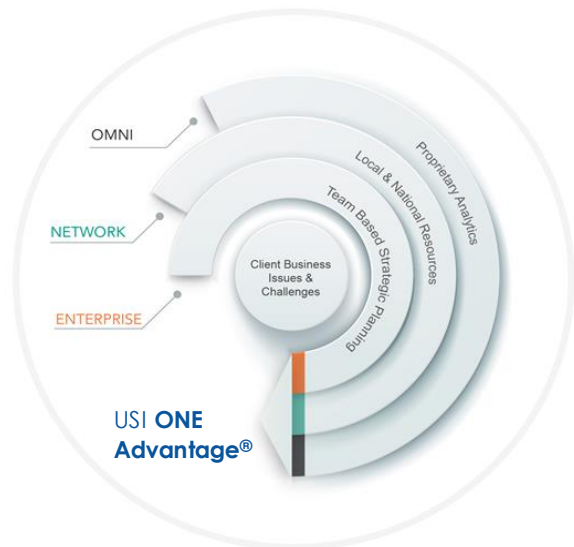

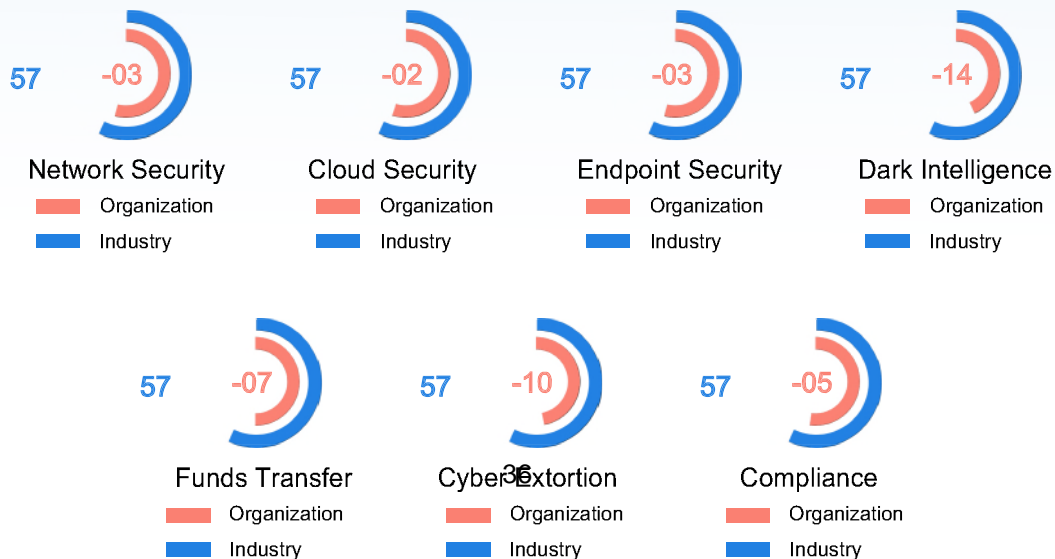

(2) Is directly caused by the actions of an "active assailant" during an "active assailant event" or a "hostage taker" during a "hostage event"; and

b. Reasonable and necessary costs you incur to remove debris of:

(1) Covered Property remaining from an Insured Location and the area immediately adjacent to the Insured Location; and

(2) Uninsured property from the Insured Location;

if Covered Property sustains direct physical loss or damage as a direct result of an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

The cost of removal of debris will not be considered in determination of the valuation of the property covered.

We will not be liable for the expense of removing contaminated or polluted uninsured property, nor the "pollutant" or contaminant therein or thereon, whether or not the pollution or contamination results from insured physical loss or damage.

2. Covered Property means the real and personal property declared to us as shown in the Declarations.

3. Covered Property does not include:

a. Land or land values;

b. Power transmission lines, feeder lines, or pipelines beyond 1,000 feet of the Insured Location;

c. Any building or structure, or property contained within, while such building or structure is "unoccupied" for more than 30 consecutive days, unless the property is intended to be "unoccupied" in its normal operations;

d. Aircraft, including unmanned aircraft and any other aerial device, or watercraft;

e. Any land conveyance, including vehicles, locomotives, or rolling stock, unless such land conveyance is shown in the Declarations and solely while located at the Insured Location at the time of its damage;

f. Animals, plants, and living things of all types;

- g. Property in transit not on the Insured Location;
- h. Contraband or property in the course of illegal trade;
- i. "Electronic Data"; or
- j. Any property not owned by you or that you have not declared to us.

B. Additional Coverages

Subject to the corresponding Additional Coverage Limits And Limitations shown in the Declarations, we will pay for the following loss you sustain as a direct result of an "active assailant event" or "hostage event":

1. Business Interruption

The actual "income loss" sustained by you during the "period of restoration", directly caused by a covered "active assailant event" or "hostage event" that interrupts your business.

2. Civil Or Military Authority

The actual "income loss" sustained by you directly caused by the prevention of ingress to or egress from an Insured Location or part of an Insured Location by order by a civil or military authority during the policy period for a period not to exceed the Duration shown in the Declarations, due to an "active assailant event" or "hostage event" resulting in direct physical loss or damage to property of the type insured under this Coverage Form within one mile of the affected Insured Location.

3. Extended Period Of Indemnity

The actual amount of the reduction in sales sustained during the Duration shown in the Declarations after the "period of restoration" has ended, but only if resulting from:

- a. Restoration efforts, meaning efforts to physically restore the business to the condition that would have existed had no "active assailant event" or "hostage event" occurred; or
- b. Contract cancellation, meaning cancellation of contracts you entered into prior to the "active assailant event" or "hostage event" for sales that would have been earned during the time period described above.

If you could have minimized the total reduction in sales by:

- (1) A complete or partial resumption of the business operations;
- (2) Making use of merchandise, stock, or other property at the Insured Location or elsewhere; or
- (3) Using or increasing business operations elsewhere;

then we will take such possible reduction of loss into account when calculating the amount of loss we will pay.

4. Ingress/Egress

The actual "income loss" sustained by you directly caused by the prevention of ingress to or egress from an Insured Location or part of an Insured Location during the policy period for a period not to exceed the Duration shown in the Declarations, due to an "active assailant event" or "hostage event" resulting in direct physical loss or damage to property of the type insured under this Coverage Form that occurred within one mile of the affected Insured Location. This Additional Coverage does not apply if the prevention of ingress or egress was by order of a civil or military authority.

5. Extra Expense

The actual "extra expense" incurred by you during the "period of restoration" directly caused by an "active assailant event" or "hostage event" that interrupts your business.

The amount of "extra expense" will be determined based on all expenses that exceed the normal operating expenses that would have been incurred during the "period of restoration" if no "active assailant event" or "hostage event" had occurred. We will deduct from the total of such expenses:

- a. The salvage value that remains of any property bought for temporary use during the "period of restoration", once operations are resumed; and
- b. Any "extra expense" that is paid for by other insurance, except for insurance that is written subject to the same plan, terms, conditions, and provisions as this insurance.

6. Professional Fees

Reasonable and necessary costs you incur with our prior written consent for the fees of your accountants, architects, auditors, or engineers, plus the cost of using your "employees", to produce and certify any particulars or details contained in your books or documents, or such other evidence we require in connection with a claim submitted under this Coverage Form.

We will not pay for any fees and costs of attorneys, public adjusters, or loss appraisers or loss consultants, or anyone retained on their behalf, who provide consultation on insurance coverage or who negotiate claims.

The amount we will pay under this Section I – Property Coverages is limited as described in Section V – Limits Of Insurance, Deductibles, And Waiting Periods. Our obligation to make any payments ends when we have used up the Coverage Form Aggregate Limit Of Insurance or applicable limit shown in the Declarations.

SECTION II – LIABILITY COVERAGES

A. Active Assailant And Hostage Event Liability

1. We will pay those sums that the insured becomes legally obligated to pay as damages because of a claim for "bodily injury" or "property damage" directly caused by an "occurrence". We will also pay "claim expenses" incurred by the insured with our prior written consent.

We may, at our discretion, investigate any "active assailant event" or "hostage event", and will have the right and duty to defend:

- a. Any "suit" against an insured that seeks damages, even if any of the allegations of the "suit" are groundless, false, or fraudulent; or
- b. Any claim in the form of a regulatory proceeding;

arising out of or resulting from an "occurrence".

Defense counsel must be mutually agreed upon between the insured and us. In the absence of such agreement, our decision will be final. We will pay "claim expenses" incurred by us for such defense.

The amount we will pay for damages and "claim expenses" combined is limited as described in Section V – Limits Of Insurance, Deductibles, And Waiting Periods. The limit of insurance available to pay damages under this Paragraph A. Active Assailant And Hostage Event Liability will be reduced and may be completely exhausted by the payment of "claim expenses". Our right and duty to defend ends when we have used up the applicable limit of insurance in the payment of damages or "claim expenses".

2. This insurance applies to "bodily injury" or "property damage" only if you notify us in writing of the "active assailant event" or "hostage event" as soon as practicable and in no event later than 90 days after the coverage afforded under this Coverage Form expires.
3. We will not settle any claim or "suit" without your consent, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld. If you refuse to consent to any settlement or compromise recommended by us and acceptable to the claimant and elect to contest the claim, our liability for any damages, "claim expenses", and any penalties or interest assessed as a result of failing to settle will not exceed:
 - a. The amount for which the claim could have been settled, less the Active Assailant And Hostage Event Liability Each Occurrence Deductible shown in the Declarations, plus "claim expenses" incurred up to the time of such refusal; or
 - b. The applicable limit of insurance;

whichever is less, and we will have the right to withdraw from the further defense by tendering control of such defense to you.

B. Ancillary Support Services

Subject to the corresponding Ancillary Support Services Limits Of Insurance and the Ancillary Support Services Aggregate Limit Of Insurance shown in the Declarations, we will pay the following additional costs sustained as a direct result of an "occurrence":

1. Clean-up Costs

Costs related to the clean-up of an Insured Location after an "active assailant event" or "hostage event". Clean-up costs may include biological cleaning or sanitation.

2. Counseling Costs

Costs incurred for the provision of care by psychiatrists, social workers, or counselors to mitigate the adverse mental, emotional, or psychological effects of an "active assailant event" or "hostage event" for any person physically present at or within 650 feet of an Insured Location during such "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

This coverage applies only to counseling costs incurred within two years after an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

3. Crisis Management Response Services

Costs incurred for the services of a crisis management consultant retained by us to provide you with "crisis management response services" after an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

This coverage applies only to crisis management response service costs incurred within one year after an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

4. Employee Retraining Costs

Job retraining costs for "employees" physically present and physically injured as a result of an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

This coverage applies only to employee retraining costs incurred within 120 days after an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

5. Funeral Costs

Funeral costs for any person killed as a direct result of "bodily injury" sustained during an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

6. Medical And Dental Costs

Medical and dental costs incurred to mitigate the adverse physical effects of "bodily injury" sustained as a result of an "active assailant event" or "hostage event" for any person physically present at or within 650 feet of an Insured Location during such "active assailant event" or "hostage event"; provided, however, that this coverage will only apply to persons who are first seen by a medical or dental practitioner within 30 days of an "active assailant event" or "hostage event" occurring.

Medical and dental costs do not include counseling costs.

This coverage applies only to medical and dental costs incurred within two years after an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

7. Replacement Employee Recruitment Costs

Recruitment costs to replace "employees" physically present and physically injured as a result of an "active assailant event" or "hostage event" and unable to continue working as a result of their injuries.

This coverage applies only to replacement employee recruitment costs incurred within 120 days after an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

8. Rest And Rehabilitation Costs

Reasonable costs related to rest and rehabilitation, including travel, lodging, and meals, for "employees" who suffer "bodily injury" as a result of an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

Rest and rehabilitation costs do not include counseling costs or medical and dental costs.

This coverage applies only to rest and rehabilitation costs incurred within one year after an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

9. Other Costs

Any other costs for which coverage is not otherwise provided in this Section incurred with our prior written consent to mitigate the adverse effects of an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

The amount we will pay under this Section II – Liability Coverages is limited as described in Section V – Limits Of Insurance, Deductibles, And Waiting Periods. Our obligation to make any payments ends when we have used up the Coverage Form Aggregate Limit Of Insurance or applicable limit shown in the Declarations.

C. Who Is An Insured

The word "insured", whether in the singular or plural, means:

1. The Named Insured stated in the Declarations;
2. Any past or current principal, partner, member, manager, officer, director, trustee, shareholder, or "employee" of the Named Insured solely while acting on behalf of the Named Insured and within the scope of their duties as such; and
3. The heirs, executors, administrators, assigns, and legal representatives of each insured in Paragraphs 1. and 2. above in the event of death, incapacity, or bankruptcy of each such insured, but only for each such insured's liability as is otherwise covered herein.

SECTION III – EXCLUSIONS

A. Applicable To All Coverages

We will not pay for loss, damage, increased cost, "bodily injury", "property damage", damages, or "claim expenses", regardless of any other cause or event that contributes concurrently or in any sequence to such loss, damage, increased cost, "bodily injury", "property damage", damages, or "claim expenses":

1. Asbestos

Arising, directly or indirectly, out of asbestos exposure of any kind including, but not limited to, emission, release, discharge, dispersal, or escape of asbestos.

2. Burglary, Home Invasion, Looting, Vandalism, Theft, Armed Robbery, Or Larceny

Arising out of actual or attempted burglary, home invasion, looting, vandalism, theft, armed robbery, or larceny.

3. Chemical Or Biological Agent Or Disease

Arising, directly or indirectly, out of chemical or biological agent or disease exposure of any kind including, but not limited to, use, transmission, emission, release, discharge, dispersal, or escape of any chemical or biological agent or disease.

4. Gang-related Or Organized Crime

Arising out of gang-related or organized crime.

5. Insured's Use Of Firearms

Caused by the carrying (whether or not concealed), use, misuse, or discharge of, or the failure to use or discharge, any "firearm", regardless of whether done so with your consent or knowledge, by any insured, "employee" of an insured, or contractor or employee of any security or similar company hired by an insured.

6. Nuclear Hazard

Arising, directly or indirectly, out of nuclear detonation, nuclear reaction, nuclear radiation, or radioactive contamination, however caused.

7. Pollution

Arising, directly or indirectly, out of the actual, alleged, or threatened discharge, dispersal, release, or escape of "pollutants", including any direction or request to test for, monitor, clean-up, remove, contain, treat, detoxify, or neutralize "pollutants".

8. Ransom Or Extortion Payment

Cash, cryptocurrency, or marketable securities, goods, or services provided by way of ransom or other response to extortion or hostage demands.

9. Refunds Or Rescheduling

Refunds or compensation or any costs relating to event rescheduling or relocation.

10. Road Rage

Arising out of road rage.

11. Sexual Abuse Or Molestation

Arising out of sexual abuse or molestation in any form, whether threatened or actual.

This exclusion applies to all claims, "suits", and causes of action, even if the claim, "suit", or cause of action against the insured alleges:

- a. Negligence or other wrongdoing in the employment, investigation, supervision, training, or retention of any person;
 - b. Improper reporting to the proper authorities or failure to so report;
 - c. Intentional or negligent infliction of emotional distress, pain, or suffering;
 - d. Defamation, libel, or slander; or
 - e. Violations of any statute or ordinance;
- related to sexual abuse or molestation.

12. Strikes or Riots

Arising, directly or indirectly, out of any protest or strike, labor unrest, riot, or civil commotion.

13. Suspension, Cancellation, Or Lapse Of Lease Or Contract

Increase in loss:

- a. Due to suspension, cancellation, or lapse of any lease, contract, license, or orders; or
- b. For penalties of any nature.

14. Threat Or Hoax

As a result of threat or hoax.

15. War

Arising, directly or indirectly, out of war, invasion, or warlike operations (whether war be declared or not), hostile acts of sovereign or local government entities, civil war, rebellion, revolution, insurrection, martial law, usurpation of power, or civil commotion assuming the proportions of or amounting to an uprising.

B. Applicable To Section I – Property Coverages Only

We will not pay for any:

1. Consequential Loss

- a. Loss of use, loss of income, or increased cost of working, except for any "income loss" covered under Paragraph **B. Additional Coverages of Section I – Property Coverages**;
- b. Delay or loss of markets, depreciation, or reduction in functionality; or
- c. Consequential or indirect loss or damage, except as specifically provided by this Coverage Form.

2. Cyber Incident And Electronic Data

- a. Loss, damage, cost, or expense caused, directly or indirectly, by any of the following:
 - (1) A "cyber incident";
 - (2) Theft or the transfer of property arising out of a "cyber incident";

- (3) Any action taken in controlling, preventing, suppressing, or remediating a "cyber incident"; or
 - (4) Any partial or total unavailability or failure, or series of related partial failures, to access, process, use, or operate any "computer system".
- b. Loss, loss of use, damage, destruction, distortion, erasure, corruption, reduction in functionality, repair, replacement, restoration, or reproduction of "electronic data" arising out of a "cyber incident".

This exclusion applies regardless of any other cause or event that contributes concurrently or in any sequence to the loss. This exclusion applies regardless of:

- (1) Any provision or endorsement to the contrary and supersedes any conflicting language in this Coverage Form;
- (2) Actual, imminent, or suspected loss or damage;
- (3) "Electronic data" or "computer systems" owned, leased, or operated by an insured or any other party;
- (4) Amounts pertaining to the value of "electronic data";
- (5) Acts, costs, or expenses to sue, labor and travel for, in, and about, the defense, safeguarding, and recovery of property, including "computer systems" or "electronic data"; or
- (6) Legal costs, expenses, or fees.

This exclusion does not apply to loss arising from the use of any "computer system" in the launch, guidance system, or firing mechanism of any weapon or missile when used in an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

3. Loss During Idle Period

Loss during any idle period including, but not limited to, when production, operation, service, or delivery or receipt of goods would cease, would not have taken place, or would have been prevented due to:

- a. Planned or rescheduled shutdown; or
- b. Strikes or other work stoppage.

4. Loss Of Market Or Attraction

Loss arising out of loss of market or loss of attraction.

5. Ordinance Or Law

Loss or damage caused, directly or indirectly, by the enforcement of or compliance with any ordinance or law:

- a. Regulating the construction, use, or repair of any property; or
- b. Requiring the tearing down of any property.

This exclusion applies whether the loss results from:

- (1) An ordinance or law that is enforced even if the property has not been damaged; or
- (2) The increased costs incurred to comply with an ordinance or law in the course of construction, repair, renovation, remodeling, or demolition of property, or removal of its debris, following a physical loss to that property.

6. Organic Pathogen

Arising, directly or indirectly, out of the presence, growth, proliferation, spread, or any activity of "organic pathogens".

This exclusion applies regardless of whether there is any:

- a. Direct physical loss of or damage to Covered Property;
- b. Loss of use, occupancy, functionality, or decreased valuation of Covered Property or "income loss", "extra expense", or action of civil authority; or
- c. Action required including, but not limited to, testing, repair, replacement, removal, clean-up, abatement, disposal, relocation, or actions taken to address medical or legal concerns.

7. Remote Utility Event

Loss under any Additional Coverage caused by an "active assailant event" or "hostage event" at a facility supplying gas, electric, water, or telephone facilities to an Insured Location unless caused by an event within 650 feet of an Insured Location.

8. Utility Services

Loss or damage caused by factors including, but not limited to, cessation, fluctuation or variation in, or insufficiency of, water, gas, or electricity supplies, telecommunications, or any type of utility service.

C. Applicable To Section II – Liability Coverages Only

This insurance does not apply to:

1. Breach Of Contract

Any increase in damages or "claim expenses" due to fines or damages for breach of contract or for late or non-completion of orders, or penalties of any nature.

2. Contractual Liability

Any "bodily injury" or "property damage" for which the insured is obligated to pay damages by reason of the assumption of liability in a contract or agreement. This exclusion does not apply to liability for damages that the insured would have in the absence of the contract or agreement.

3. Cyber Incident, Data Compromise, And Violation Of Statutes Related To Personal Data

Damages caused by, arising out of, or in any way involving, directly or indirectly:

a. The loss of, loss of use of, corruption of, inability to access, or reduction in functionality of a "computer system", including, but not limited to:

- (1) Damage to or loss of data occurring on a "computer system";
- (2) Unauthorized access of a "computer system";
- (3) Computer malware on a "computer system";
- (4) Human error affecting a "computer system";
- (5) System failure occurring on a "computer system";
- (6) A defect of a "computer system";
- (7) Social engineering, including, but not limited to, any phishing, pretexting, spoofing, or other fraudulent, manipulative, or deceptive communication; or
- (8) Cyber extortion;

b. Any:

- (1) Access to or disclosure of (whether such access or disclosure is authorized or unauthorized); or
- (2) Theft, alteration, or corruption of;

any person's or organization's confidential, intellectual, or proprietary information or data, including, but not limited to, "personal data", patents, trade secrets, processing methods, customer lists, or any other type of nonpublic information; or

c. Any action or omission that violates or is alleged to violate any federal, state, or local statute, law, rule, ordinance, or regulation that addresses, prohibits, regulates, or limits the printing, interception, dissemination, disposal, collecting, recording, sending, transmitting, communicating, distribution, sharing, sale, storage, retaining, receiving, or protection of "personal data", including, but not limited to:

- (1) The Illinois Biometric Information Privacy Act (BIPA);
- (2) The California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA);
- (3) The California Invasion Of Privacy Act (CIPA);
- (4) The New York Stop Hacks and Improve Electronic Data Security Act (SHIELD Act);

- (5) The European Union General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR); or
- (6) Any similar or related federal, state, or local statute, law, rule, ordinance, or regulation; including any amendments thereto.

This exclusion applies even if damages are claimed for notification costs, credit monitoring or repair expenses, forensic expenses, public relation expenses, costs associated with the replacement or reissuance of payment cards, fines, penalties, loss of use of property that has not been physically damaged, or any other loss, cost, or expense incurred by you or others arising out of that which is excluded above.

However, this exclusion does not apply to:

- a. Liability for damages because of "bodily injury" or physical damage to tangible property of others. For the purpose of this exclusion, "electronic data" is not tangible property; and
- b. Loss arising from the use of any "computer system" in the launch, guidance system, or firing mechanism of any weapon or missile when used in an "active assailant event" or "hostage event".

The insurance afforded by this exception is excess over any other valid and collectible insurance available to the insured, whether primary, excess, contingent, or issued on any other basis.

4. Employer's Liability

- a. "Bodily injury" to:
 - (1) An "employee" arising out of and in the course of:
 - (a) Employment; or
 - (b) Performing duties related to the conduct of your business; or
 - (2) The spouse, child, parent, brother, or sister of that "employee" as a consequence of Paragraph a. above.
- b. Medical and dental costs or counseling costs for an "employee" of any insured, if such costs are payable or must be provided under any employer's liability coverage.

This exclusion applies whether the insured may be liable as an employer or in any other capacity and to any obligation to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages because of the injury.

5. Mental Anguish

Damages or "claim expenses" arising out of claims for mental injury, anguish, or shock where no "bodily injury" has occurred, except as covered under 2. Counseling Costs of Paragraph B. Ancillary Support Services of Section II – Liability Coverages in the form of counseling costs.

6. Organic Pathogen

- a. "Bodily injury" or "property damage" which would not have occurred, in whole or in part, but for the actual, alleged, or threatened inhalation of, ingestion of, contact with, exposure to, existence of, or presence of, any "organic pathogen" on or within a building or structure, including its contents, regardless of whether any other cause, event, material, or product contributed concurrently or in any sequence to such injury or damage.
- b. Any loss, cost, or expense arising out of the abating, testing for, monitoring, cleaning up, removing, containing, treating, detoxifying, neutralizing, remediating or disposing of, or in any way responding to, or assessing the effects of, "organic pathogens" by any insured or by any other person or entity.
- c. Costs and expenses to investigate or defend any claim or "suit" or payment of any fine or penalty for the exclusions in Paragraphs a. or b. above.

This exclusion applies:

- (1) To any obligations to share damages with or repay someone else who must pay damages; and
- (2) To any "organic pathogen" emanating from or moving anywhere indoors or outdoors.

7. Perpetrator Expenses

Any damages, "claim expenses", or medical, dental, counseling, or funeral costs for an "active assailant" or "hostage taker".

8. Punitive Or Exemplary Damages

- a. Punitive or exemplary damages or the multiplied portions of multiplied damages, including the trebling of damages;
- b. Fines, penalties, or sanctions imposed by law; or
- c. "Claim expenses" related to any of the above.

9. Workers' Compensation And Similar Laws

- a. Any obligation of the insured under workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, social security, or disability laws, statutes, or regulations; or
- b. Medical and dental costs or counseling costs for a person, whether or not an "employee" of any insured, if such costs are payable or must be provided under any workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, or disability laws, statutes, or regulations.

SECTION IV – CONDITIONS

A. Applicable To All Coverages

1. Joint Insureds

Our total liability for any loss, damage, cost, "claim expenses", or expense of any nature sustained by any one or more of the insureds under this Coverage Form will not exceed the applicable limits of insurance shown in the Declarations. We will have no liability in excess of the limits of insurance, regardless of the number of insureds that sustain loss.

2. Legal Action Against Us

No one may bring a legal action against us unless:

- a. There has been full compliance by the insured with all of the terms of this Coverage Form; and
- b. The action is brought within two years after the expiration or cancellation of the insurance afforded under this Coverage Form.

3. Misrepresentation Or Fraud

This Coverage Form is void in any case of fraud by you as it relates to this Coverage Form at any time. It is also void if you or any other insured, at any time, intentionally conceal or misrepresent a material fact concerning:

- a. This Coverage Form;
- b. The insured property;
- c. Your interest in the Covered Property; or
- d. A claim under this Coverage Form.

4. Policy Period, Coverage Territory

Under this Coverage Form:

- a. We cover loss or damage commencing:
 - (1) During the policy period shown in the Declarations; and
 - (2) Within the coverage territory.
- b. The coverage territory is the United States of America (including its territories and possessions), Puerto Rico, and Canada.

B. Applicable To Section I – Property Coverages Only

1. Loss Conditions

a. Abandonment

There can be no abandonment of any property to us.

b. Appraisal

If we and you fail to agree on the value of property or the amount of loss, either party may make written demand for an appraisal of the loss. In this event, each party will select a competent and impartial appraiser. The two appraisers will select a competent and impartial umpire. If the two arbitrators cannot agree on the umpire, either may request that selection be made by a judge of a court having jurisdiction.

The appraisers together will state separately the value of the property and amount of loss. If the appraisers fail to agree, they will submit their differences to the umpire. A decision agreed to by any two will be binding. Each party will:

- (1) Pay its chosen appraiser; and
- (2) Bear the other expenses of the appraisal and umpire equally.

If there is an appraisal, we still retain our right to deny the claim.

c. Duties In The Event Of Loss Or Damage

(1) You must see that the following are done in the event of loss of or damage to Covered Property:

- (a) Notify the police if a law may have been broken.
- (b) Give us prompt written notice of the loss or damage. Include a description of the property involved.
- (c) As soon as possible, give us a description of how, when, and where the loss or damage occurred.
- (d) Take all reasonable steps to protect the Covered Property from further damage and keep a record of your expenses necessary to protect the Covered Property for consideration in the settlement of the claim. This will not increase the limit of insurance. However, we will not pay for any subsequent loss or damage resulting from a cause of loss that is not an "active assailant event" or "hostage event". Also, if feasible, set the damaged property aside and in the best possible order for examination.
- (e) At our request, give us complete inventories of the damaged and undamaged property. Include quantities, costs, values, and amount of loss claimed.
- (f) As often as may be reasonably required, permit us to inspect the property proving the loss or damage and examine your books and records.

Also, permit us to take samples of damaged and undamaged property for inspection, testing, and analysis, and permit us to make copies from your books and records.
- (g) Send us a signed, sworn proof of loss containing the information we request to investigate the claim. You must do this within 60 days after our request. We will supply you with the necessary forms. If no such proof of loss has been received by us within two years of the expiration date of this policy, we will be discharged from all liability under this coverage form.
- (h) Cooperate with us in the investigation or settlement of the claim.

(2) We may examine any insured under oath, while not in the presence of any other insured and at such times as may be reasonably required, about any matter relating to this insurance or the claim, including the insured's books and records. In the event of an examination, the insured's answers must be signed.

d. Salvage And Recoveries

If either you or we recover any property after loss settlement, that party must give the other prompt notice. At your option, the property will be returned to you. You must then return to us the amount we paid to you for the property. We will pay recovery expenses and the expenses to repair the recovered property, subject to the limits of insurance.

e. Subrogation

(1) Any release from liability entered into in writing by you prior to loss or damage covered herein will not affect this Coverage Form or your right to recover hereunder. The right of subrogation against any of your subsidiaries or affiliated companies or any other companies associated with you through ownership or management is waived.

In the event of any payment under this Coverage Form, we will be subrogated to the extent of such payment to all your rights of recovery. You must:

- (a) Execute all papers required;
- (b) Cooperate with us and upon our request, attend hearings and trials;
- (c) Assist in the conduct of suits, effecting settlements, securing and giving evidence, and attaining the attendance of witnesses; and
- (d) Do anything that may be necessary to secure such right.

We will act in concert with all other interests concerned (including you) in the exercise of such rights of recovery.

- (2) If any amount is recovered through subrogation, such amount will be distributed in the following priorities:
 - (a) First, any party (including you) suffering loss or damage of the type covered by this Coverage Form and in excess of the coverage under this Coverage Form will be reimbursed up to the amount of such loss or damage (excluding the amount of the Deductible under this Coverage Form);
 - (b) Second, we will be reimbursed to the extent of our payment under this Coverage Form;
 - (c) Third, you will be reimbursed for any Deductible payment under this Coverage Form; and
 - (d) Fourth, you or any insurer providing insurance primary to this Coverage Form, with respect to the amount of such primary insurance, self-insured retention, or loss or damage of a type not covered by this Coverage Form.
- (3) The expense of all proceedings necessary to the recovery of any such amount will be apportioned between the interests concerned, including that of the insured, in the ratio of their respective recoveries as finally settled. If there is no recovery and proceedings are instituted solely on our initiative, the expense thereof will be borne by us.

f. Valuation

(1) Covered Property

In the event of loss of or damage to Covered Property, settlement will be based upon the cost of repairing, replacing, or restoring (whichever is the least) property on the same site, or nearest available site (whichever incurs the least cost) with material of like kind and quality without deduction for depreciation, subject to the following provisions:

- (a) The repairs, replacement, or restoration must be executed with due diligence and dispatch.
- (b) Until repairs, replacement, or restoration has been made, the amount of loss or damage will be limited to the actual cash value of the Covered Property at the time of loss or damage.
- (c) If repair, replacement, or restoration with material of like kind and quality is restricted or prohibited by any by-laws, ordinance, or law, then any increased cost of repair, replacement, or restoration due will not be covered by this Coverage Form.
- (d) Subject to the limits of insurance, the amount we will pay for loss or damage under this Coverage Form will not exceed the least of the following amounts:
 - (i) The total declared value applicable to the destroyed or damaged property.
 - (ii) The repair, replacement, or restoration cost of the property or any part thereof that was intended for the same occupancy and use, as calculated at the time of the loss or damage.
 - (iii) The amount actually and necessarily expended in repairing, replacing, or restoring the property or any part thereof.
- (e) We will normally expect you to carry out repairs, replacement, or restoration of the Covered Property, but if you and we agree that it is not practicable or reasonable to do this, we will pay you an amount, subject to the limits of insurance, based on the repair, replacement, or restoration costs, less an allowance for fees and associated costs that are not otherwise incurred.

If the Agreed Values declared in the Declarations are less than the insured values as determined above, then any recovery otherwise due will be reduced in the same proportion that the values declared bear to the values that should have been declared, and you will coinsure for the balance.

(2) Business Interruption

(a) In calculating "income loss", we will take into consideration:

- (i)** The actual earnings at the Insured Location during the 12 months immediately preceding the date of the "occurrence"; and
- (ii)** The trend of your business and variations before and after the "occurrence" so that allowances are made for any material variations or changed circumstances, whether relating to market conditions or otherwise.

When fully adjusted, the "income loss" payable will represent as nearly as possible the earnings you would have realized during the "period of restoration" had the "occurrence" not happened.

(b) If you could have reduced the total "income loss" resulting from the interruption of business by:

- (i)** A complete or partial resumption of the business operations;
- (ii)** Making use of merchandise, stock, or other property at the Insured Location or elsewhere; or
- (iii)** Using or increasing business operations elsewhere;

we will take such possible reduction of loss into account when calculating the amount of loss we will pay.

2. General Conditions

a. Control Of Property

Any act or neglect of any person other than you beyond your direction or control will not affect this insurance.

The breach of any condition of this Coverage Form at any one or more Insured Locations will not affect coverage at any Insured Location where, at the time of loss or damage, the breach of condition does not exist.

b. Other Insurance

You may have other insurance subject to the same plan, terms, conditions, and provisions as the insurance under this Coverage Form. If you do, we will pay our share of the covered loss or damage. Our share is the proportion that the applicable Limit of Insurance under this Coverage Form bears to the limits of insurance of all insurance covering on the same basis.

c. Protection Maintenance

As a condition of this insurance, any protection provided for the safety of the property insured must be maintained in good order throughout the policy period and must be in use at all times, and such protection must not be withdrawn or varied to the detriment of our interests without our consent.

C. Applicable To Section II - Liability Coverages Only

1. Duties In The Event Of Occurrence, Claim Or Suit

- a.** Immediately call the vendor identified in the What To Do In A Crisis policyholder notice to access Crisis Management Response Services.
- b.** You must see to it that we are notified in writing as soon as practicable of an "active assailant event" or "hostage event" that may result in a claim. To the extent possible, notice should include:
 - (1)** How, when, and where the "active assailant event" or "hostage event" took place;
 - (2)** The names and addresses of any injured persons and witnesses; and
 - (3)** The nature and location of any injury or damage arising out of the "active assailant event" or "hostage event".
- c.** If a claim is made or "suit" is brought against any insured, you must:
 - (1)** Immediately record the specifics of the claim or "suit" and the date received; and
 - (2)** Notify us as soon as practicable.

You must see to it that we receive written notice of the claim or "suit" as soon as practicable.

- d.** You and any other involved insured must:

- (1) Immediately send us copies of any demands, notices, summonses, or legal papers received in connection with the claim or "suit";
 - (2) Authorize us to obtain records and other information;
 - (3) Cooperate with us in the investigation or settlement of the claim;
 - (4) Cooperate with us in the defense against the "suit"; and
 - (5) Assist us, upon our request, in the enforcement of any right against any person or organization that may be liable to the insured because of injury or damage to which this insurance may also apply.
- e. No insured will, except at that insured's own cost, voluntarily make a payment, assume any obligation, or incur any expense, other than for first aid, without our consent.

2. Primary Insurance

This insurance is primary to and will not seek contribution from any other insurance under which you are a named insured. The amount of our liability will not be reduced by the existence of other insurance of the same risk.

This condition does not apply to any workers' compensation or other form of wage replacement or medical benefit insurance.

3. Transfer Of Rights Of Recovery Against Others To Us

If the insured has rights to recover all or part of any payment we have made under this Coverage Form, those rights are transferred to us. The insured must do nothing after loss to impair them. At our request, the insured will bring "suit" or transfer those rights to us and help us enforce them.

SECTION V – LIMITS OF INSURANCE, DEDUCTIBLES, AND WAITING PERIODS

A. Limits Of Insurance

1. Section I – Property Coverages

a. Each Occurrence Limit Of Insurance

Subject to Paragraph 3. below, the most we will pay for all physical loss of or damage to all Covered Property arising out of any one "occurrence" is the Damage To Covered Property Each Occurrence Limit Of Insurance shown in the Declarations.

b. Additional Coverages Limits Of Insurance

Subject to Paragraph 3. below, the most we will pay under any Additional Coverage for any one "occurrence" during the policy period is the corresponding Limit Of Insurance shown in the Declarations.

2. Section II – Liability Coverages

- a. The Liability Coverages Limits of Insurance shown in the Declarations and the rules below fix the most we will pay regardless of the number of:

- (1) Insureds;
- (2) Claims made or "suits" brought; or
- (3) Persons or organizations making claims or bringing "suits".

b. Each Occurrence Limit Of Insurance

Subject to Paragraph 3. below, the most we will pay for all damages and "claim expenses" because of "bodily injury" and "property damage" arising out of any one "occurrence" is the Active Assailant And Hostage Event Liability Each Occurrence Limit Of Insurance shown in the Declarations.

c. Ancillary Support Services Limits Of Insurance

Subject to Paragraph 3. below, the most we will pay under any Ancillary Support Services coverage is the corresponding Limit of Insurance shown in the Declarations.

d. Ancillary Support Services Aggregate Limit Of Insurance

Subject to Paragraph 3. below, the most we will pay for the sum of all payments under all Ancillary Support Services coverages arising out of all "occurrences" is the Ancillary Support Services Aggregate Limit Of

Insurance shown in the Declarations. The Ancillary Support Services Aggregate Limit Of Insurance is part of, not in addition to, the Coverage Form Aggregate Limit Of Insurance shown in the Declarations.

3. Coverage Form Aggregate Limit Of Insurance

The Coverage Form Aggregate Limit Of Insurance shown in the Declarations is the most we will pay for the sum of:

- a. All physical loss of or damage to all Covered Property;
 - b. All damages and "claim expenses" because of all claims for "bodily injury" or "property damage"; and
 - c. All payments under all Additional Coverages and all Ancillary Support Services;
- arising out of all "occurrences" during the policy period.

All coverage limits and sublimits are part of, not in addition to, the Coverage Form Aggregate Limit Of Insurance shown in the Declarations.

B. Deductible And Waiting Period

1. Deductible

a. Section I – Property Coverages

We will not pay for physical loss of or damage to Covered Property in any one "occurrence" until the amount of loss or damage exceeds the Deductible shown in the Declarations. We will then pay the amount of loss or damage in excess of the deductible up to the applicable limit of insurance.

b. Section II – Liability Coverages

With respect to the coverage provided under Paragraph **A. Active Assailant And Hostage Event Liability**:

- (1) Our obligation to pay damages applies only to the amount of damages in excess of the Active Assailant And Hostage Event Liability Each Occurrence Deductible shown in the Declarations.
- (2) The deductible applies to all damages because of "bodily injury" or "property damage" as the result of any one "occurrence", regardless of the number of persons or organizations who sustain damages because of that "occurrence".
- (3) The terms of this insurance, including those with respect to:
 - (a) Our right and duty to defend the insured against any "suits" seeking those damages; and
 - (b) The insured's duties in the event of an "occurrence", claim, or "suit";apply irrespective of the application of the deductible.
- (4) We may pay any part or all of the deductible to effect settlement of any claim or "suit" and, upon notification of the action taken, you must promptly reimburse us for such part of the deductible amount as has been paid by us.

2. Waiting Period

Coverage for the following Additional Coverages is subject to a Waiting Period:

- a. Business Interruption;
- b. Civil Or Military Authority; and
- c. Ingress/Egress.

Under such Additional Coverages, we will pay "income loss" only if the interruption to your business continues for a period greater than the Waiting Period shown in the Declarations, in which case we will pay for "income loss" sustained from the date and time the interruption first began, and ending the earlier of when the "period of restoration" ends or within the Duration shown in the Declarations, if applicable.

SECTION VI – DEFINITIONS

- A. "Active assailant" means a person or group of persons actively engaged in killing or attempting to cause serious "bodily injury" by the use of a vehicle, explosive device, or any "handheld weapon".

- B.** "Active assailant event" means a premeditated attack by an "active assailant" located at an Insured Location causing:
1. Direct physical loss of or damage to Covered Property;
 2. "Bodily injury" to any person, other than the "active assailant", at or within 650 feet of an Insured Location; or
 3. "Property damage" to the property of any person, other than the "active assailant", at or within 650 feet of an Insured Location.

With respect only to the Civil Or Military Authority and Ingress/Egress Additional Coverages under Section I – Property Coverages, "active assailant event" means a premeditated attack by an "active assailant" at a location other than an Insured Location.

- C.** "Bodily injury" means any physical injury to a person including death, sickness, disease, or disability and all mental injury, anguish, or shock to such person resulting from the physical injury.
- D.** "Claim expenses" means all reasonable and necessary fees, costs, and expenses resulting from the investigation, adjustment, appraisal, defense, or appeal of a "suit" or claim by a third party seeking damages because of "bodily injury" or "property damage" to which this Coverage Form applies. "Claim expenses" does not include the salaries, expenses, overhead, or other charges by any insured for any time spent in cooperating in the defense, settlement, and investigation of any claim or "suit".
- E.** "Computer system" means any information technology or operational technology, including computers, any software and code residing on such computers, network equipment, hardware, firmware, mainframes, servers, electronic products or components, peripheral devices, data storage devices, and any associated devices or equipment (including computers, hardware, software, and input and output devices which are part of an industrial control system, including a supervisory control and data acquisition (SCADA) system) owned or operated by the insured or any other party.
- F.** "Crisis management response services" means the provision to you of assistance and guidance from the vendor identified in the What To Do In A Crisis policyholder notice during or immediately following an "active assailant event" or "hostage event". The vendor's services may include, but are not limited to:
1. On-the-ground expert crisis response;
 2. Emergency services liaison;
 3. Family liaison;
 4. Press and media management;
 5. Stakeholder communications; and
 6. Business continuity support.
- G.** "Cyber incident" means:
1. The unauthorized access or use of a "computer system" or "electronic data" by any means including, but not limited to, malicious code, virus, malware, or ransomware, regardless of time and place;
 2. A threat or hoax, or a series of connected threats involving access to, processing of, use of, or operation of any "computer system"; or
 3. Any error or omission or series of related errors or omissions involving access to, processing of, use of, or operation of any "computer system".
- H.** "Electronic data" means facts, concepts, and information converted to a form usable for communications, interpretation, or processing by electronic and electromechanical data processing, or electronically controlled equipment, and includes programs, software, and other coded instructions for the processing and manipulation of data, or the direction and manipulation of such equipment.
- I.** "Employee" means a person who is employed by you or engaged by you and under your control in connection with your business. "Employee" includes a person who is:
1. Under a contract of service or apprenticeship with you;
 2. Supplied to, hired, or borrowed by you; or
 3. Your intern or volunteer.

- J. "Extra expense" means the reasonable and necessary expenses you incur that are over and above the costs that normally would have been incurred in conducting the business as nearly normal as practicable during the same period had no "active assailant event" or "hostage event" occurred.
- K. "Firearm" means any pistol, rifle, shotgun, or other device that uses gunpowder to launch projectiles.
- L. "Fungus" means any type or form of fungus, including mold or mildew, and any mycotoxins, spores, scents, or by-products produced or released by fungi.
- M. "Handheld weapon" means any instrument in the possession of an "active assailant" or "hostage taker" that could be used to harm, maim, or kill, including acid.
- N. "Hostage taker" means a person or group of persons, in possession of an explosive device or any "handheld weapon", holding one or more persons under duress.
- O. "Hostage event" means a premeditated incident by a "hostage taker" located at an Insured Location that involves one or more persons within an Insured Location and that lasts for one or more consecutive hours.

With respect only to the Civil Or Military Authority and Ingress/Egress Additional Coverages under Section I – Property Coverages, "hostage event" means a premeditated incident by a "hostage taker" at a location other than an Insured Location that involves one or more persons and that lasts for one or more consecutive hours

- P. "Income loss" means the sum of the following:
 1. The net income (net profit or loss before income taxes) you would have earned had no "active assailant event" or "hostage event" occurred;
 2. Continuing normal operating expenses you incur, including ordinary payroll; and
 3. Reasonable and necessary costs and expenses you actually incur to reduce the interruption to your business operations, but in no event will the amount of recoverable expenses exceed the amount by which the loss has been reduced during the "period of restoration".
- Q. "Occurrence" means an "active assailant event" or "hostage event" that commences during the policy period. An "active assailant event" or "hostage event" carried out by a group of persons acting together or in concert, or a series of "active assailant events" or "hostage events" that arise out of the same purpose or cause that are carried out by the same person or a group of persons, will be deemed to be one "occurrence".

If an "occurrence" commences during the policy period and extends beyond the end of the policy period, the "occurrence" in its entirety will be considered to have taken place during the policy period.

If an "occurrence" commences prior to the policy period, no coverage will apply under this policy, even if such event extends into the policy period.

- R. "Organic pathogen" means:
 1. Any organic irritant or contaminant including, but not limited to, "fungus", wet or dry rot, bacteria, virus, or other microorganisms of any type, and their by-products such as spores or mycotoxins; or
 2. Any disease-causing agent as classified by the Environmental Protection Agency.
- S. "Period of restoration" means:

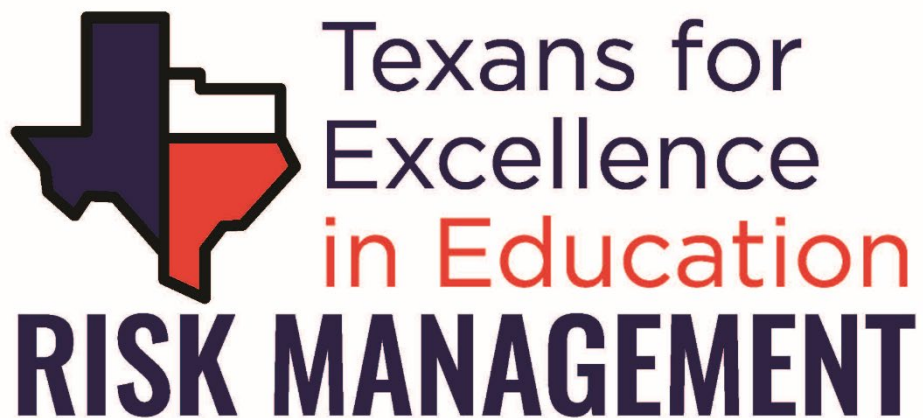
The time period beginning on the date and time of the initial interruption of your business and ending on the date and time the interruption ends or could have ended had you acted with due diligence and dispatch. In no event will the "period of restoration" exceed 365 calendar days.

- T. "Personal data" means information that identifies, relates to, describes, is capable of being associated with, or could reasonably be linked to a particular person or household, including, but not limited to:
 1. Identifiers such as a real name, alias, postal address, unique personal identifier, online identifier, Internet Protocol address, email address, password, account name, social security number, driver's license or state identification card number, passport number, telephone number, insurance policy number, employment, employment history, bank account number, credit card number, debit card number, or any other financial information, medical information, or health insurance information, or other similar identifiers, characteristics, or descriptors;
 2. Commercial information, including records of personal property, products, or services purchased, obtained, or considered, transactions occurring over a peer-to-peer electronic cash system, or other purchasing or consuming histories or tendencies;

3. Biometric data or information (such as a fingerprint, voice print, retina or iris image, or other unique physical representation or digital representation of biometric data);
 4. Internet or other electronic network activity information, including, but not limited to, browsing history, search history, and information regarding a person's or household's interaction with an Internet website, application, or advertisement;
 5. Geolocation data;
 6. Audio, electronic, visual, thermal, olfactory, or similar information;
 7. Professional or employment-related information that is not publicly available;
 8. Education information, defined as information that is not publicly available personally identifiable information as defined in the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. section 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99) including any amendments thereto;
 9. Identifiers under any state or federal consumer protection or privacy statute or law including, but not limited to, the identifiers shown in Paragraphs 1. through 8. above; or
 10. Inferences drawn from any of the identifiers shown in Paragraphs 1. through 9. above to create a profile about a person or household reflecting such person's or household's preferences, characteristics, psychological trends, predispositions, behavior, attitudes, intelligence, abilities, or aptitudes.
- U.** "Pollutants" means any solid, liquid, gaseous, or thermal irritant or contaminant, including smoke, vapor, asbestos, silica, dust, nanoparticles, fibers, soot, ash, fumes, acids, alkalis, chemicals, and waste. Waste includes, but is not limited to, materials to be recycled, reconditioned, or reclaimed. However, smoke, soot, ash, or fumes from a fire caused by an "active assailant event" or a "hostage event" are not "pollutants".
- V.** "Property damage" means:
1. Physical injury to tangible property, including all resulting loss of use of that property. All such loss of use will be deemed to occur at the time of the physical injury that caused it; or
 2. Loss of use of tangible property that is not physically injured. All such loss of use will be deemed to occur at the time of the "occurrence" that caused it.
- For the purposes of this insurance, "electronic data" is not tangible property.
- W.** "Suit" means a civil proceeding in which damages because of "bodily injury" or "property damage" directly caused by an "occurrence" are alleged. "Suit" includes:
1. An arbitration proceeding in which such damages are claimed and to which the insured must submit or does submit with our consent; or
 2. Any other alternative dispute resolution proceeding in which such damages are claimed and to which the insured submits with our consent.
- X.** "Unoccupied" means that the customary activities or operations at an Insured Location are suspended, but business personal property has not been removed. The building or structure will be considered vacant and not unoccupied when the occupants have moved, leaving the building or structure empty or containing only limited business personal property. Buildings or structures under construction are not considered vacant or unoccupied.

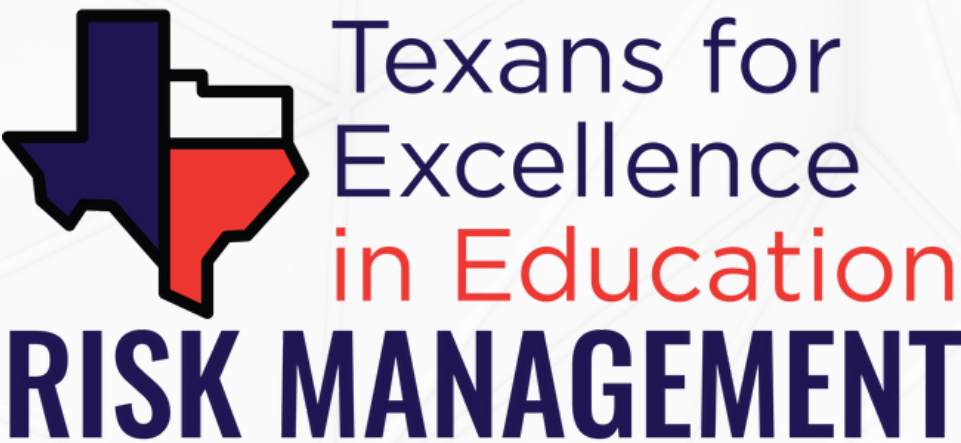

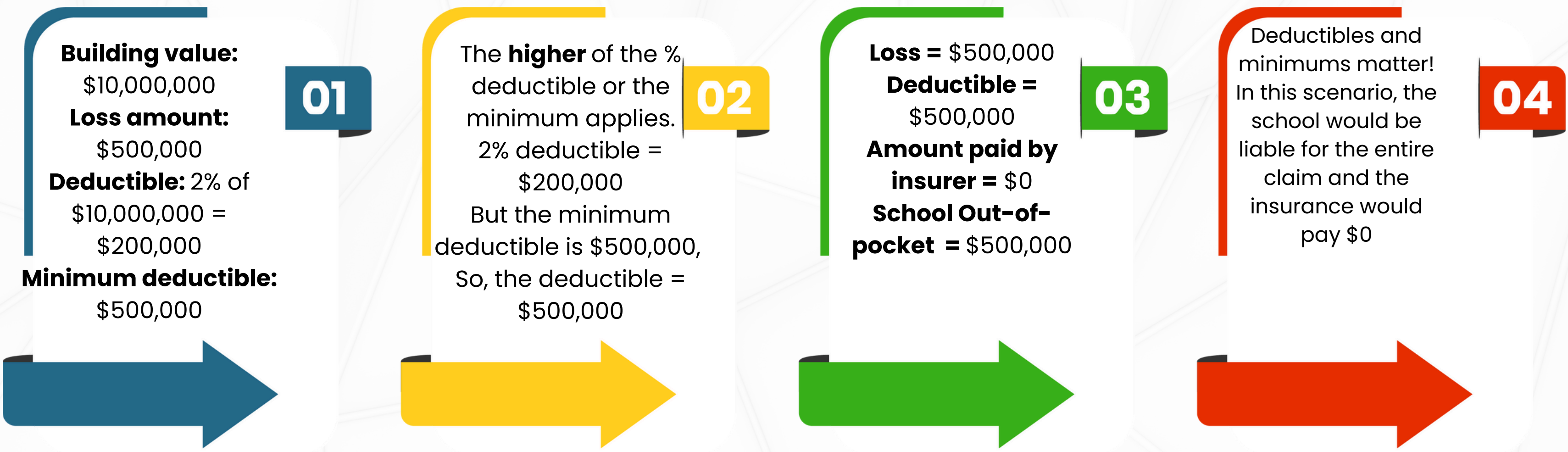

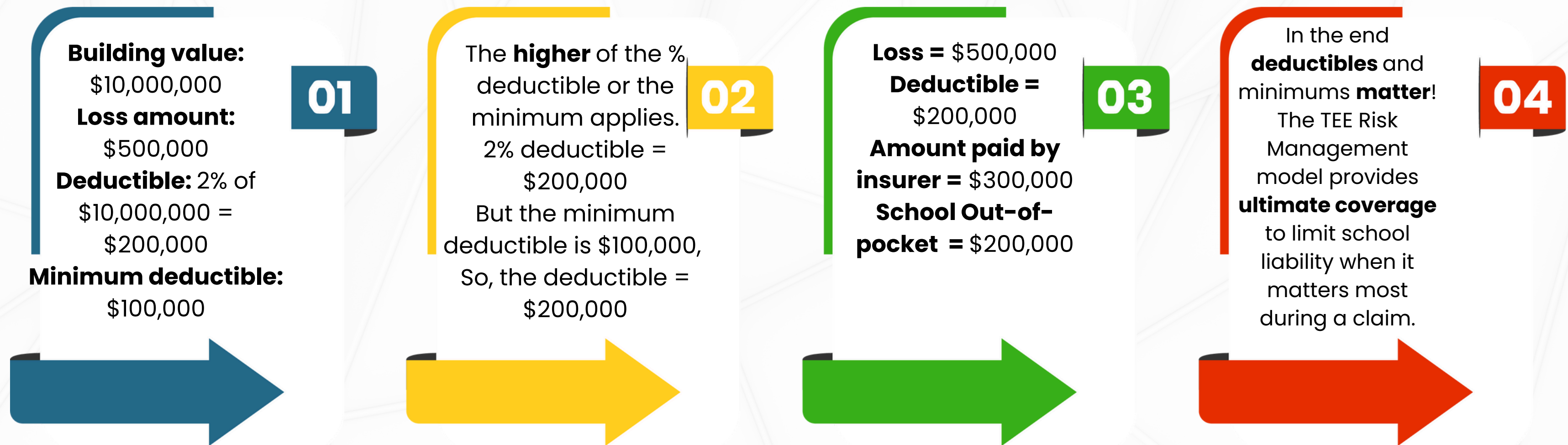
