## **RESOLUTION No. 7053**

### Resolution to Recognize Classified and Non-Represented Employee Appreciation Week March 4-7, 2025



## Rising Costs

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

# PRIORITIES



The CBSE staff collaboratively developed a community coalition strategy aligned with the CBSE vision. This collaborative effort involved extensive engagement and deliberation over several months.

To personalize student outcomes, a series of collective community conversations were facilitated, and will continue to be facilitated, with Principals from Harriet Tubman Middle School and Boise Eliot-Humboldt Elementary. These discussions aimed to understand the unique needs and aspirations of students within each school community.

The development of multi-sector partnerships was guided by principles of academic research, innovation, and liberatory design. This approach prioritized the expansion of capacity, power, and resources within the community to collectively implement strategies that advance educational equity especially for Black students within the PPS district.







It was noted that the list of services available for use from the Multnomah Education Service District (MESD) are options available to Portland Public Schools (PPS) and that the district may not choose to utilize all the services available. There was discussion regarding outdoor school being scheduled in the current year during religious and cultural holidays, which is in violation of the Religious and Cultural Observances Policy 2.30.010-P. The MESD representative highlighted the complexities in the scheduling of outdoor school, noting that principal's have the option to request dates and indicates dates that don't work for them. The Superintendent and MESD affirmed they would work together to minimize scheduling conflicts with religious and cultural holidays. ### **Vision for Special Education Services in Portland Public Schools**

Chief of Student Supports - Jey Buno

Staff presented an overview of PPS's Vision for Special Education, including strategic goals such as integration into neighborhood schools, student representation in Special Education, academic data, and Special Education funding. Staff noted that while academic achievement data is not where they want it to be, PPS is performing better than the state average. Key priorities include reengaging families, professional learning for educators, and strengthening core programming. Board members asked questions throughout the presentation. Board Chair Eddie Wang called the meeting to order at 6:32 pm.

### **Resolution to Adopt a Framework to Build High Quality-High Schools in a Cost-Efficient Manner (Resolution 7051)**

Staff: Dan Jung - Chief Operating Officer

Time: 6:33 pm

Chair Wang provided a high-level introduction to the topic. Director Brim-Edwards provided an overview of the proposed framework, including areas of the framework. It was noted that the Framework calls for cost reductions in the remaining high school modernizations while also establishing a requirement that the modernizations meet educational specifications and are similar to the previously modernized high schools. Additionally, it was noted that the Resolution directs staff to reconvene all planning committees and begin moving forward on the projects.

An amendment was offered to add the word "current" to the sentence that directs the superintendent to provide recommendations related to *current* and future contracting methods. There was no Board discussion on the amendment. The amendment was accepted by a consensus of the Board.

Board members provided comments on the amended resolution, including noting that they want to continue to be good fiscal managers of public funds, while building state-of-the-art high schools that don't reduce the education specifications. The Board provided appreciation for staff for thorough responses to Board questions. The variety of differences in the Beaverton modernization project and the PPS projects were highlighted, including the number of students being built for, and the amount of existing land to build on. In addition, Beaverton's building does not include a kitchen and continues to use fossil fuels. It was noted that there was also an error in the report which resulted in calculation of escalation being off by 45 million dollars. Staff shared that, based on the framework, they estimate that they may be able to reduce costs by approximately 20-40 million, which could then be put into elementary and middle School infrastructure. Student Representative Kunsevi requested that staff engage students more in bond planning.

Public Comment: None

Actions:

Director Julia Brim-Edwards moved and Director Gary Hollands seconded the motion to adopt Resolution 7051, Resolution to Adopt a Framework to Build High Quality-High Schools in a Cost-Efficient Manner, as amended. The motion was put to a voice vote and passed (7 yes – 0 no).

Resolution to Adopt a Framework to Build High Quality-High Schools in a Cost-Efficient Manner

The Portland Public Schools Board of Education hereby adopts the attached Framework for Delivering Modernized High Schools (Attachment A) in order to reduce costs so additional investments can be made in critical improvements and repairs in the District's aging elementary and middle schools.

**PPS Board of Education Framework for  
Delivering Modernized High Schools with Cost Reductions**

The district must be responsible stewards of public dollars and targeted cost reductions in the high school projects will allow the school district to optimize bond funds to support critical improvements and repairs in the school district’s aging elementary and middle schools.

The Board has received the PPS High School Cost Comparison report completed by Cornerstone Management Group and also received additional information from the Office of School Modernization regarding the projected costs of the three high school modernizations.

The Board provides the following direction in two sections (i) General Contractor Cost Reductions; and (ii) Modernization Cost Reductions.

**General Contractor Cost Reductions:**

The Board directs the Superintendent to provide potential near-term cost reduction options, and associated tradeoffs, regarding cost items such as pre-construction services, general conditions, contractor fee, and more. In addition, in the mid-term, the Board directs the Superintendent to provide recommendations related to current and future contracting method utilization and efficiencies related to Office of School Modernizations project management.

**Modernizations Cost Reductions:**

The Board establishes “Guidelines” for the 2025 Bond High School Modernizations and directs the Superintendent to use the guidelines to provide potential cost reduction options, and associated tradeoffs, regarding “hard” construction costs including building square footage, building systems and material, etc.

<b>Guidelines</b>
<p>Each project will reduce total building area to approximately 295,000 square feet (based on Franklin and Lincoln HS approximate area).</p> <p>Each project will aim to meet PPS’s Comprehensive High School Education Specifications “area program” minimum requirements for number and size of spaces.*</p> <p>The Board acknowledges that no previous Modernization project meets 100% of all minimum Ed Spec requirements. All projects have exceeded minimum Ed Spec requirements in some areas, and exceeded preferred Ed Specs in others; deviations from Ed Specs were noted in project Comprehensive Plans and approved by the Board. Features or designs that exceed the preferred Ed Specs are subject to approval of the Board as part of the Comprehensive Plan review.</p>
<p>Projects will only include a Health Center if there is a commitment from a health provider to provide services.</p>

<p>Projects will only include a Teen Parent Child Center if there is a demonstrated need at each school.</p>
<p>All projects will conform to PPS’s Climate Policy requirement for all electric infrastructure.</p>
<p>All projects will continue to conform to PPS’s Equity in Contracting Policy and Administrative Directives.</p>
<p>PPS’s Ed Specs do not include exterior athletic facilities and PPS high schools have widely varying athletic facilities; the project teams will not propose material reductions to exterior athletic spaces and facilities included in each project’s Comprehensive Plan. Excessive cost items that are not in service to student-athletes and athletic teams should be reduced or eliminated.</p>
<p>Implementation of the PPS’s Climate Crisis Response Policy drives long term energy savings, waste and carbon emissions reductions, and for near term projects increases construction costs. Staff will present options other than LEED Gold Certification that can fully or partially meet the PPS Climate Crisis Response, Climate Justice and Sustainable Practices Policy goals. Staff will evaluate structural material choices such as mass timber versus steel, weighing factors such as embodied carbon, durability and cost.</p>
<p>Staff will provide options, and tradeoffs, to reduce or eliminate basement construction.</p>
<p>Staff will provide additional options, and associated trade offs, to reduce costs, example of reduction options include less expensive building materials, building systems, specialized spaces not in the ed specs, etc. These costs reductions have a \$10M per project target, which are in addition to the general contractor cost reductions and any of the other school-based cost reductions outlined above.</p>

The Board has stated that time is of the essence and requests to receive Modernization Cost Reduction information as soon as possible from the Project Teams who have been working on cost reduction strategies. The Board will schedule time on meeting agendas to review additional Modernization Cost Reduction information based on the February 11 discussion, and future meetings to discuss General Contractor Cost Reductions.

The high school Design Advisory Groups should reconvene as soon as possible to commence this work with the Project Teams.

Restorative Justice Coordinators

This Letter of Agreement (LOA is entered into between Portland Public Schools and the Portland Association of Teachers. The terms and conditions of the PAT Collective Bargaining Agreement dated July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2026 apply unless specifically modified below and are retro to July 1, 2024:

Article 10: Academic Freedom and Instruction

Article 11: School Improvement Councils

Article 12: Compensation: see compensation proposal

Article 13: Insurance Protection: Follows enrollment schedule (ex. Open enrollment in August/September, benefits effective Oct 1)

**RJ Coordinators Wage Proposal - PPS**

February 18, 2024

The parties agree that the following provisions replace the provisions of Article 12 for RJ Coordinators, except for Article 12.4 which will remain.

**Placement on Salary Scale**

A. Effective upon ratification by the parties, RJ Coordinators employed on the date of ratification of this amended agreement will be placed on the PAT Salary Scale in Appendix A-2 "Salary Schedule for July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025 - for employees who work 193 Days", as follows:

1. Each RJ Coordinator will be placed in the BA+15 column on the step that is closest to, but not less than, the RJ Coordinator's current annual salary, to a maximum of Step H.
2. RJ Coordinators who submit proof of a Masters' Degree will move one additional step on the BA+15 column, to a maximum of Step H. RJ Coordinators will not be placed on the MA (or beyond BA+15) scale of Appendix A. If Salary adjustment is indicated, the effective date will be the first pay period following approval.
3. Because RJ Coordinators are not actively working in a licensed professional educator position, they are not eligible for the doctorate stipend or national board certificate stipends.

B. RJ Coordinators hired after ratification of this amended agreement, RJ Coordinators will be placed on the PAT Salary Scale in Appendix A-2 "Salary Schedule for July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025 - for employees who work 193 Days", as follows:

- a. (1) An RJ Coordinator with a Bachelors' Degree will be given credit for one salary step for each two (2) years of experience beyond the minimum two (2) years required for the position.  
(2) An RJ Coordinator with an Associates' Degree will be given credit for one salary step for each two (2) years of experience beyond the minimum four (4) years required for the position.  
(3) An RJ Coordinator with a High School Degree will be given credit for one salary step for each two (2) years of experience beyond the minimum six (6) years required for the position.
- b. No RJ Coordinator will receive credit for more than ten (10) years of experience beyond the minimum applicable to their educational status, as outlined above.
- c. Eight (8) complete months of full-time direct experience in a 12-month period shall be considered to be one (1) year of experience.
- d. To meet the qualifications for the job and to advance on the salary scale, experience must be directly related and relevant to the position.
- e. Because RJ Coordinators are not actively working in a licensed professional educator position, they are not eligible for the doctorate stipend or national board certificate stipends.

**Advancement Through Scale**

Beginning in the 2025-26 school year, if an RJ Coordinator has worked 135 days of the previous school year and is not already at the top step (H), the RJ Coordinator will receive one step

increase on the PAT Salary Scale in Appendix A-2 "Salary Schedule for July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025 - for employees who work 193 Days", to a maximum of Step H.






