- ROW acquisition activities underway through CRRMA interlocal agreement

# N. Darrington Reconstruction – ROW Acquisition

- Updated design allows for installation of storm drainage pipe under Darrington street/pavement – reduces need for Temporary Construction Easements (TCEs)
- Surveys completed for fee simple acquisitions required for proposed pond
- Letters of introduction sent to property owners
  - Unable to reach 2 property owners owning 4 parcels.
  - International addresses
- Finalizing appraisals and review appraisals

- **S. Darrington Safety Lighting** from Alberton to LTV Rd. – FY 2023
- **Project start – mid-2023**
- **N. Kenazo Safety Lighting** from Eastlake to Horizon Blvd. – FY 2022

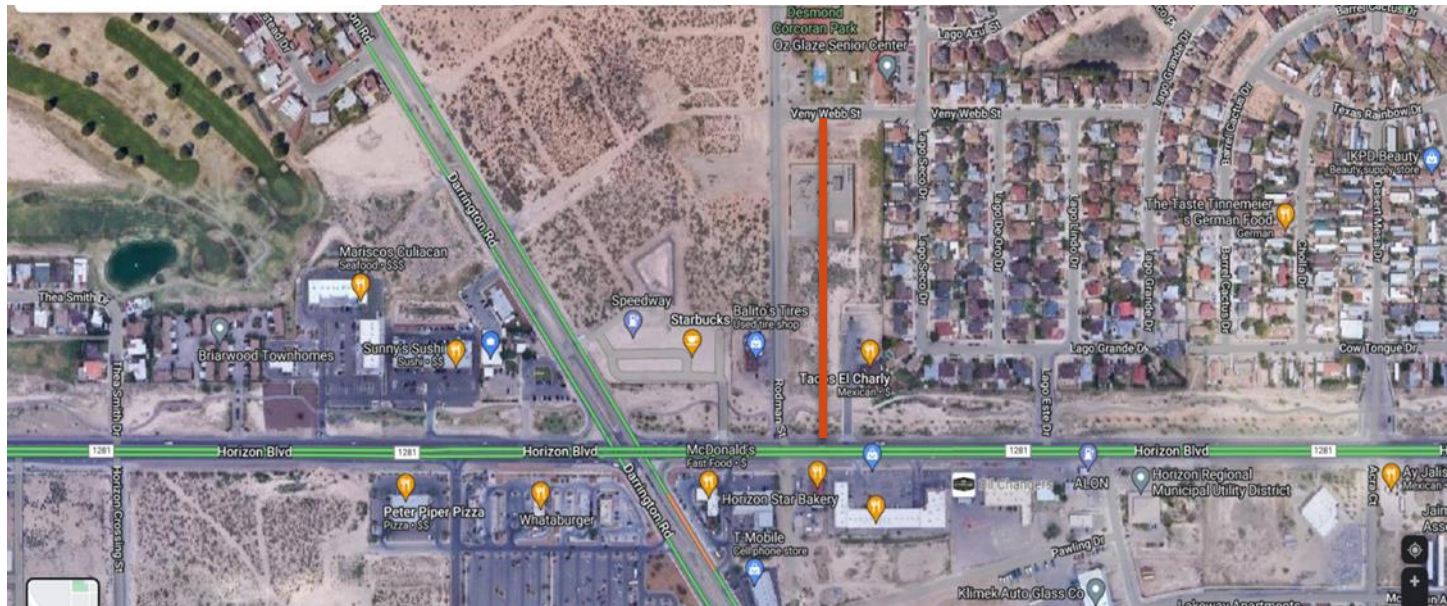

ORDINANCE NO. 102, AMENDMENT NO. 036

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE TOWN OF HORIZON CITY, TEXAS, CHAPTER 14 (ZONING), EXHIBIT A (ZONING ORDINANCE), TO REVISE AND AMEND THE FOLLOWING: CHAPTER 6 (GENERAL COMMERCIAL DISTRICTS), SECTION 602.2 (BULK STANDARDS) SUBSECTION 602.2.2 (SETBACK REQUIREMENTS), AMENDING TABLE IN C-1 (GENERAL COMMERCIAL) AND C-2 (HEAVY COMMERCIAL) ZONING DISTRICTS, FRONT WITH PARKING AND SIDE ABUTTING STREET WITH PARKING SETBACK AND CHAPTER 7 (INDUSTRIAL DISTRICTS), SECTION 702.3 (HEIGHT AND BULK STANDARDS), SUBSECTION 702.3.1 (MINIMUM SETBACK STANDARDS) IN M-1 (LIGHT INDUSTRIAL) AND M-2 (HEAVY INDUSTRIAL) ZONING DISTRICTS FRONT AND SIDE WITH PARKING ADDING TABLES; AND PROVIDING FOR THE FOLLOWING: FINDINGS OF FACT; ENACTMENT; REPEALER; SEVERABILITY; CODIFICATION; PROPER NOTICE AND HEARING; AND EFFECTIVE DATE; THE PENALTY BEING AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 810 OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE (NO. 0102) OF THE TOWN OF HORIZON CITY, TEXAS, CREATING A MISDEMEANOR PUNISHABLE BY A FINE NOT TO EXCEED \$2,000.

WHEREAS, a proposal was brought forward by staff to and considered by the Town of Horizon City Planning and Zoning Commission to amend portions of Ordinance No. 0102 relating to Setback Requirements in the C-1, C-2 and M-1 Zoning Districts; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission considered the staff's proposals at its November 21, 2022, regular meetings and voted to recommend approval of the change to the ordinance; and

WHEREAS, public hearings have been held by the Town Council as required by law; and

WHEREAS, all written and oral protests (if any) submitted against the proposed ordinance change have been reviewed and considered; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 211 of the Texas Local Government Code, the City has the authority to zone and rezone property; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Local Government Code section 51.001, the town has general authority to adopt an ordinance that is for the good government, peace or order of

the Town and is necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the Town; and

**WHEREAS,** the City Council finds that it is necessary and proper for the good government, peace and order and that our physical environment has a direct impact on the chances for happy, prosperous lives for the residents of the Town of Horizon City to adopt this Ordinance and technical code; and

**WHEREAS,** the Texas Local Government Code Section 211.005(b) requires “that zoning regulations be uniform for each class or kind of building in a district”, furthermore, “regulations shall be adopted with reasonable consideration, among other things, for the character of each district and its particular suitability for particular uses, with a view of conserving the value of buildings, maximizing the best use of property, and encouraging the most appropriate use of land in the municipality”.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HORIZON CITY, TEXAS:**

**I. ENACTMENT OF AMENDMENTS**

Pursuant to Sections 51.001 and 51.012 of the Texas Local Government Code, the City Council of the Town of Horizon City hereby enacts and adopts this amendment no. 036 to Ordinance no.0102, which regulates zoning within the territorial limits of the Town of Horizon City and related matters, to amend Sections 602.2 and 702.3 as follows:

**ORDINANCE NO. 102, AMENDMENT NO. 036**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE TOWN OF HORIZON CITY, TEXAS, CHAPTER 14 (ZONING), EXHIBIT A (ZONING ORDINANCE), TO REVISE AND AMEND THE FOLLOWING: CHAPTER 6 (GENERAL COMMERCIAL DISTRICTS), SECTION 602.2 (BULK STANDARDS) SUBSECTION 602.2.2 (SETBACK REQUIREMENTS), AMENDING TABLE IN C-1 (GENERAL COMMERCIAL) AND C-2 (HEAVY COMMERCIAL) ZONING DISTRICTS, FRONT WITH PARKING AND SIDE ABUTTING STREET WITH PARKING SETBACK AND CHAPTER 7 (INDUSTRIAL DISTRICTS), SECTION 702.3 (HEIGHT AND BULK STANDARDS), SUBSECTION 702.3.1 (MINIMUM SETBACK STANDARDS) IN M-1 (LIGHT INDUSTRIAL) AND M-2 (HEAVY INDUSTRIAL) ZONING DISTRICTS FRONT AND SIDE WITH PARKING ADDING TABLES; AND PROVIDING FOR THE FOLLOWING: FINDINGS OF FACT; ENACTMENT; REPEALER; SEVERABILITY; CODIFICATION; PROPER NOTICE AND HEARING; AND EFFECTIVE DATE; THE PENALTY BEING AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 810 OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE (NO. 0102) OF THE TOWN OF HORIZON CITY, TEXAS, CREATING A MISDEMEANOR PUNISHABLE BY A FINE NOT TO EXCEED \$2,000.**

**WHEREAS,** a proposal was brought forward by staff and considered by the Town of Horizon City Planning and Zoning Commission to amend portions of Ordinance No. 0102 relating to Setback Requirements in the C-1, C-2 and M-1 Zoning Districts; and

**WHEREAS,** the Planning and Zoning Commission considered the staff's proposals at its November 21, 2022, regular meetings and voted to recommend approval of the change to the ordinance; and

**WHEREAS,** public hearings have been held by the Town Council as required by law; and

**WHEREAS,** all written and oral protests (if any) submitted against the proposed ordinance change have been reviewed and considered; and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to Chapter 211 of the Texas Local Government Code, the City has the authority to zone and rezone property; and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to Texas Local Government Code section 51.001, the town has general authority to adopt an ordinance that is for the good government, peace or order of the Town and is necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the Town; and

**WHEREAS,** the City Council finds that it is necessary and proper for the good government, peace and order and that our physical environment has a direct impact on the chances for happy, prosperous lives for the residents of the Town of Horizon City to adopt this Ordinance and technical code; and

**WHEREAS,** the Texas Local Government Code Section 211.005(b) requires “that zoning regulations be uniform for each class or kind of building in a district”, furthermore, “regulations shall be adopted with reasonable consideration, among other things, for the character of each district and its particular suitability for particular uses, with a view of conserving the value of buildings, maximizing the best use of property, and encouraging the most appropriate use of land in the municipality”.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HORIZON CITY, TEXAS:**

**I. ENACTMENT OF AMENDMENTS**

Pursuant to Sections 51.001 and 51.012 of the Texas Local Government Code, the City Council of the Town of Horizon City hereby enacts and adopts this amendment no. 036 to Ordinance no.0102, which regulates zoning within the territorial limits of the Town of Horizon City and related matters, to amend Sections 602.2 and 702.3 as follows:

All ordinances, resolutions, or parts thereof, that are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the effect of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matters regulated, herein.

**IV. SEVERABILITY**

Should any of the clauses, sentences, paragraphs, sections or parts of this ordinance be deemed invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable by a court of law or administrative agency with jurisdiction over the matter, such action shall not be construed to affect any other valid portion of this Ordinance.

**V. PROPER NOTICE AND MEETING**

It is officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public, and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 551. Notice was also provided as required by Chapter 52, Texas Local Government Code and the Charter of the Town of Horizon City, Texas.

**SUBJECT:** Discussion regarding pending capital projects and financing options

---

City staff continues developing the listing of high priority CIP projects and financing options. These projects are part of the adopted 2023-2025 CIP and are at various stages of development. Design is underway or complete for some projects such as the Police Headquarters and N. Darrington Reconstruction. Other projects will require additional development and are short-term needs and priorities.

The attached updated listing identifies the projects under development and current estimates as available. The goal is to provide Council with an order of magnitude of the projects that could become part of the next funding cycle and to allow staff to continue their due diligence in developing a capital improvement program that meets the community's short-term needs.

**RESOLUTION**

**WHEREAS**, the **Town of Horizon City (the “City”)** and **El Paso MHMR D/B/A Emergence Health Network (“EHN”)** desire to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) for the purpose of partnering in the Clinician-Officer Remote Evaluation (“CORE”) Program; and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of the CORE Program is to assist officers in the field with effectively responding to mental health crisis calls by securely connecting the officers with an EHN mental health professional; and

**WHEREAS**, EHN agrees to coordinate with the Town of Horizon City Police Department as needed to accomplish the purposes of the CORE program.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HORIZON CITY AS FOLLOWS:**

1. **No Cost to City.** EHN will provide supportive services and technology to the Town of Horizon City Police Department at no cost to the City.
2. **Insurance.** The City will cause EHN to be named as an additional named insured on any insurance policy maintained by the City that will provide coverage for matters arising from the Memorandum of Understanding.
3. **Authority.** The Mayor is authorized to sign the MOU attached to this Resolution, and the Police Chief is authorized to implement the CORE Program and the training necessary to properly utilize the program properly.

**CLINICIAN-OFFICER REMOTE EVALUATION (“CORE”) PROGRAM  
MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING  
BETWEEN  
EL PASO MHMR D/B/A EMERGENCE HEALTH NETWORK

This Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) is made on November 1, 2022 by and between EL PASO MHMR D/B/A EMERGENCE HEALTH NETWORK (“EHN”), a Community Center and local governmental entity under Chapter 534 of the Texas Health and Safety Code, located at 201 E. Main, Suite 600, El Paso, TX 79901, and the Town of Horizon City (“City”) a Texas home rule municipality located at 14999 Darrington Rd, Horizon City, TX 79928 for the purpose of partnering for the Clinician-Officer Remote Evaluation (“CORE”) Program with the Horizon City Police Department (Department).

**I. PURPOSE**

This MOU is entered into between the parties for the purpose of working collaboratively to:

- A. Assist Department officers in the field with effectively responding to mental health crisis calls by securely connecting the officers with an EHN mental health professional (“MHP”) via a tablet/iPad using a HIPAA-approved technology platform;
- B. Reduce the risk of incarceration or unnecessary hospitalization for individuals in crisis;
- C. Enhance public safety; and
- D. Provide systemic benefits, including improving the impact of field triage, crisis intervention, mental health assessment, and disposition recommendation.

**II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF EHN**

- A. EHN agrees to coordinate with the Department, as needed, to accomplish the purposes of the CORE Program.
- B. EHN further agrees to make an EHN MHP remotely available, via a tablet/iPad using a HIPAA-approved technology platform, to Department officers in the field, for the purpose of conducting an assessment in the event of a low acuity mental health encounter.
- C. Upon request by a Department officer, the EHN MHP will complete a brief video mental health assessment of the individual in crisis, and provide mental health intervention information to the officer.

**III. RESPONSIBILITIES OF DEPARTMENT**

- A. Department agrees to coordinate with EHN and EHN MHPs, as needed, to accomplish the purposes of the CORE Program.
- B. Department further agrees to complete and return to EHN the CORE Program Property Checkout Form, prior to taking possession of any CORE Program equipment.
- C. Department further agrees to abide by the terms and conditions provided on the CORE Program Property Checkout Form, herein incorporated into this MOU by reference.

#### IV. TERM AND TERMINATION

- A. **Effective Date.** This MOU shall become effective on the date of execution of the last signatory to the MOU and shall remain valid until a written notice of termination is given by either party.
- B. **Termination.** Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause by giving the other party thirty (30) days written notice. Parties may immediately terminate this Agreement for cause pursuant to breach of any term of this Agreement.
- C. **Effect of Termination.** Except as otherwise provided herein, all duties obligations or undertakings as are set forth of the Department and EHN shall cease upon termination of this MOU; provided, however, that all CORE Program equipment distributed to the Department and/or its officers will be returned to EHN within 7 days after termination of the MOU.

#### V. MISCELLANEOUS

- A. **Notice.** Unless otherwise provided herein, all notices or other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if delivered personally in hand or sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid and addressed to the appropriate party at the following address or to any other person at any other address as may be designated in writing by the Parties. Notices are effective upon receipt. Parties may change their notice information in the same manner.

- B. **Tort Liability Limit.** EHN and the City are both political subdivisions of the State of Texas. As such, both are governed by the Texas Tort Claims Act, Chapter 101, Civil Practice and Remedies Code. The parties acknowledge and agree that both EHN and the City are limited to money damages in a maximum amount of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) for each person and three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000.00) for each single occurrence for bodily injury or death.
- C. **Insurance.** To the degree that either party maintains liability insurance, both agree to cause the other to be named as an additional named insured with regard to matters arising from this agreement.
- D. **Public Information Act.** EHN and the City are both political subdivisions of the State of Texas and are governed by the Texas Public Information Act, Chapter 552, Texas Government Code. The Parties acknowledge and agree that both EHN and the City shall only be obligated to perform its duties under this section and this Agreement in compliance with the Texas Public Information Act. To the extent to which some duties hereunder are not in conformity with the requirements of the Texas Public Information Act, EHN and the City shall be relieved of said duties without penalty or further liability. In the event either party receives a request under the Texas Public Information Act for Confidential Information it shall immediately notify the other party and confer on whether disclosure should be opposed. It is expressly agreed that either or both EHN and the City may request a determination from the Attorney General of the State of Texas in regard to the application of the Texas Public Information Act to the requested information and whether the information is to be made available to the public. It is further agreed that EHN and their respective officers and employees shall have the right to rely on the determinations of the Texas Attorney General, and that EHN, the City, and their respective officers and employees shall have no liability to the other for disclosure to the public in reliance on a decision by the Attorney General. Nothing in this agreement shall require either EHN or the City to violate the terms of the Texas Public Information Act.
- E. **Dispute Resolution.** Any proposed alternative dispute resolution process can only be entered into upon the mutual agreement of both parties.
- F. **Partial Invalidity.** If any provision of this Agreement shall be construed to be illegal or invalid, it shall not affect the legality or validity of any other provisions hereof, and the illegal or invalid provision shall be deemed stricken and deleted here from to the same extent and effect as if never incorporated herein, but all other provisions shall continue to the extent that they substantially reflect the Agreement contemplated by the parties.
- G. **Signature Authority.** All signatories to this Agreement warrant their authority to execute this document.
- H. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement constitutes and expresses the entire Agreement between the parties regarding the subject matter addressed and shall not be amended or modified except by written instrument signed by all parties.

- I. **Choice of Law and Venue; Statute of Limitations.** For the purpose of determining the place of agreement and the law governing same, this Agreement, including this Addendum, is entered into in the County of El Paso, State of Texas and shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. The laws of the State of Texas shall govern in determining any evidentiary privileges claimed by the parties. Venue for all causes of action arising from or in connection with this Agreement, including this Addendum, shall be in El Paso County, Texas. The parties agree that the statute of limitations as prescribed under Texas law, including but not limited to Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code chapter 16 (herein, the “Statute of Limitations”), shall govern. Any language prescribing a period less than the Statute of Limitations shall be of no effect.
- J. **No Assignment.** Neither party shall have the right to assign or otherwise transfer any rights, interests, or obligations under this Agreement without prior written consent of the other party. Such consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- K. **Force Majeure.** Neither party shall be responsible for any delay, damage, failure, or inability to perform resulting from causes not within the control of the party and which the party is unable to prevent through reasonable diligence.
- L. **No Waiver.** Except as otherwise provided, no term or condition of this Agreement shall be waived except by written waiver of the waiving party. The forbearance or indulgence by a party in any regard whatsoever shall not constitute a waiver of the term or condition to be performed by the other party, and until complete performance by the other party of such term or condition, the forbearing party shall be entitled to invoke any remedy available under this Agreement or by law despite such forbearance or indulgence. The waiver by a party of any breach of any term or condition of this Agreement shall apply to and be limited to the specific instance involved and shall not be deemed to apply to any other instance or to any subsequent breach of the same or any other term or condition of the Agreement.

**A RESOLUTION ORDERING AN ELECTION BY THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE TOWN OF HORIZON CITY, TEXAS ON SATURDAY, MAY 6, 2023 FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING A MAYOR AND THREE COUNCIL MEMBERS FOR PLACES 3, 5, AND 7 FOR FOUR-YEAR TERMS.**

**WHEREAS,** the Charter of the Town of Horizon City provides that the general election date for Mayor and Council Members holding Places 3, 5, and 7 with terms ending in May 2027 shall be the May uniform election date in 2023; and

**WHEREAS,** the general election date established by this Resolution for the Mayor and City Council members, Places 3, 5, and 7 is the general election date in May 2023, which date is Saturday, May 6, 2023; and

**WHEREAS,** upon election, the terms of office will be established for four (4) years as provided by the Charter.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HORIZON CITY:**

**SECTION I.**

That in compliance and accordance with the laws and constitution of the State of Texas, an election shall be and the same is hereby called and ordered for Saturday, May 6, 2023, for the purpose of electing the Mayor and three (3) Council Members for a term of office of four (4) years each.

**SECTION II.**

The City Clerk, together with the El Paso County Elections Administrator, shall cause the official ballot to be prepared to be used in said election, and the Places for the Council members shall be designated on the official ballot as Mayor and Members of Council, Places 3, 5, and 7, respectively.

**SECTION III.**

That no person's name shall be placed upon the official ballot as a candidate for the position of Mayor or Member of the City Council unless such person has filed his sworn application, in compliance with and as provided by the laws of Texas, no sooner than January 18, 2023 nor after February 17, 2023 at 5:00 p.m., and designation of Mayor or the number of the Place on the City Council that said candidate is seeking must appear on the face of said application.

#### **SECTION IV.**

That the polls shall be kept open from 7:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election, and at such election, all qualified voters in the Town are authorized to vote for his or her choice of candidate for each place and shall vote for one candidate only for each place, with the due return being made to the Council showing the number of votes cast for each candidate for each of the positions of Council Members.

#### **SECTION V.**

That Lisa Wise, County Elections Administrator, shall be the early voting clerk for said election. The County Courthouse, 500 E. San Antonio, El Paso, Texas, is hereby designated as the main early voting polling place for said election. In addition, early voting may also occur at such branch early voting polling places as are designed herein or otherwise designated by the El Paso County Elections Administrator and for which notice is given, and early voting on Saturday and Sunday is ordered. The City Clerk is authorized to revise or add exhibits to this Resolution and to the Order of Election designating these early voting locations and times for voting as are established or revised by the El Paso County Elections Administrator.

Applications for ballot by mail shall be submitted to the Early Voting Clerk: 500 E. San Antonio, Lower Level, Ste. L115, El Paso, TX 79901, no later than the close of regular business in the Early Voting Clerk's office, or 12 noon, whichever is later on the **11th day** before the date of the Election or as may otherwise be required by law.

#### **SECTION VI.**

That a candidate who receives a majority of all of the votes cast for the office for which he or she is a candidate shall be elected for such office. In the event of a tie, the provisions of Section 2.002 of the Texas Election Code, or other applicable state statute dealing with a "Tie Vote", shall be followed. If a runoff election is required to elect an officer by a majority vote, it shall be held on a date as permitted by the Texas Election Code. Such election, if any, shall be called by the City Council. Early voting dates and sites will be identified if such runoff election shall be held.

#### **SECTION VII.**

That electronic voting machines, as certified for use by the El Paso County Elections Administrator, shall be used for voting at the regular polling places in such election, and for the casting of early ballots by persons voting early by personal appearance.

**SECTION VIII.**

That this Resolution, signed by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk, shall constitute the proclamation of the Mayor calling and ordering said election, and that the City Clerk is directed to prepare the appropriate notice of election containing the directives of this Resolution and the Order of Election, as required by the Texas Election Code. The City Clerk shall give notice of such election in English and Spanish by posting such notice at the Town Hall and by publishing a copy of such notice in a newspaper as required by law.

**SECTION IX.**

The City Clerk shall deliver notice of this election to the County Clerk and Voter Registrar of El Paso County as required by law, not later than Tuesday, March 7, 2023.

**SECTION X.**

That the polling places for this election, except as they may be changed by the City Council of Horizon City, Texas, shall be as follows:

This is a **CONTRACT FOR ELECTION SERVICES (“Contract”)** pursuant to Texas Election Code Sec. 31.091 et seq. This Contract is made this \_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 2023 by and between the **Town of Horizon City, TEXAS (“Town of Horizon City”)** and **El Paso County Texas, (“the County”)** by and through the County Elections Administrator.

1.       **RECITALS.** **Town of Horizon City** is a political subdivision situated partly or wholly within El Paso County, Texas. **Town of Horizon City** has scheduled an Election for **MAY 6, 2023** and has requested the County perform election services as provided by Election Code Sec. 31.091 et seq. The **County** and **Town of Horizon City** have determined it is in the public interest that the **County** and **Town of Horizon City** provide such services. Therefore, this **Contract for Election Services** is made and entered into for the purpose of the County Election Administrator to conduct the election and any resulting runoff election for **Town of Horizon City**.

2.       **DUTIES AND SERVICES OF CONTRACTING OFFICER.**

Any services to be performed by the **County** may be delegated to the County Elections Administrator. The Elections Administrator shall serve as Early Voting Clerk. The **County** shall perform the duties and furnish the services and equipment listed below. The **County** shall:

- (a)       Furnish certain election services and equipment needed by **Town of Horizon City** in connection with holding an election on **MAY 6, 2023**;
- (b)       Provide training of judges, alternate judges, and clerks, including deputy early voting clerks;
- (c)       Prepare lists and submit names of persons suggested for appointment as presiding election judges, alternate judges, and judge of the central counting station;
- (d)       Prepare lists and submit names of persons suggested for appointment as deputy early voting clerks;

- (e) Serve as manager of the central counting station or appoint a substitute manager;
- (f) Arrange for the use of polling places in the election and runoff election if necessary;
- (g) Program or arrange to have the ballot programmed;
- (h) Procure and distribute necessary election supplies, and distribution of ballots;
- (i) Assemble and edit lists of registered voters to be used in conducting the election, in conformity with the boundaries of **Town of Horizon City** and the election precincts established for the election;
- (j) Procure, prepare, and distribute election equipment, transport equipment to and from the polling places for early voting and election day, and issue election supplies to the precinct judges.
- (k) Supervise the conduct of early voting;
- (l) Conduct one or more election schools and notify the election judges and clerks of the time, date, and location of the schools;
- (m) Arrange for use of a central counting station and for the tabulating personnel and equipment needed at the counting station and assist in preparing the programs and test materials for tabulation of the ballots to be used with electronic voting equipment;
- (n) Arrange to publish legal notice of the date, time and place of the testing of the electronic tabulating equipment, and conduct the testing in accordance with Texas Election Code chapters 127.001 et seq. and chapter 129.001 et seq. and in accordance with Texas Secretary of State advisories;
- (o) Supervise the handling and disposition of election returns, voted ballots, and tabulate unofficial returns and assist in preparing the tabulation for the official canvass;
- (p) Provide general information services for voters and election officers;
- (q) Assist in providing general overall supervision of the election;
- (r) Provide for the storage of election records as provided by law;
- (s) Provide **Town of Horizon City** with a precinct by precinct roll of registered voters in a mutually agreed upon format;
- (t) If requested by **Town of Horizon City**, prepare the unofficial tabulation of precinct results on election night;

- (u) Submit election night returns to the Secretary of State , in a format to be described by the Texas Secretary of State and in accordance with Election Code Chapter 68, if applicable; and
- (v) Certify that a criminal background check on all employees, including temporary employees, that may program, test, perform maintenance, transport equipment, or perform technical support on the voting system equipment for **Town of Horizon City** has been performed.
- (w) The **County** shall provide the requested services by and through its County Elections Administrator (the “Contracting Officer”).

3. **DUTIES AND SERVICES OF Town of Horizon City.**

**Town of Horizon City** shall:

- (a) Adopt an order appointing the County Elections Administrator as Early Voting Clerk;
- (b) Prepare appropriate documents for establishing the precinct and polling places;
- (c) Prepare all election orders, resolutions, notices, and other pertinent documents for adoption for execution by the appropriate **Town of Horizon City** officer or body, and take all actions necessary under law and in accordance with this Contract for calling the election, appointing the presiding judges, alternate judges, judge of the central counting station, and other election officers, establishing precincts and polling places, handling contests, canvassing the returns and declaring the results;
- (d) Approve the tabulating supervisor and assistants and central counting station manager, recommended by the Elections Administrator;
- (e) Prepare and publish required election notices as required by law;
- (f) Deliver and certify to the Elections Administrator as soon as possible but not later than **sixty (60) days** before the election, the names, issues, or referenda which are to be printed on the ballot or ballot labels with the exact spelling that is to be used;
- (g) Provide the services necessary to translate any election documents into Spanish as required;
- (h) Pay any additional costs incurred by the Elections Administrator if a recount for the election is required, or the election is contested in any manner;
- (i) Return all surplus election supplies to the Elections Administrator;
- (j) Prepare any submission on voting changes which may be required to be submitted to the US. Department of Justice under the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended;

- (k) Pay **75%** of Elections Administrator's estimated costs no later than ten **(10)** days before Election Day;
- (l) Pay the balance of conducting the election and additional costs, within thirty (30) days from the receipt of an invoice from the Elections Administrator.

4. COST OF SERVICES.

**Town of Horizon City** shall pay for the above services, supplies and equipment in accordance with the estimated cost schedule attached to this Contract (EXHIBIT A) which is mutually agreed upon.

5. CANCELLATION OF ELECTION OR SERVICES

In the event that **Town of Horizon City** cancels the election pursuant to section 2.081 of The Texas Election Code, or for any other reason, **Town of Horizon City** will pay the **County** for all direct and actual expenses such as payroll and election expenses, including the administrative fee, the **County** incurred in relation to providing the services for this election up until the time of cancellation, and for any other direct and actual expenses the **County** incurs as a result of the cancellation. **Town of Horizon City** will send payment to the **County** within thirty (30) days from receipt of an invoice from the Elections Administrator.

6. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

- (a) A total of Six (6) precincts plus Twenty Five (25) permanent early voting stations, and Ninety Five (95) polling locations will be used for conducting the election.
- (b) **Town of Horizon City** acknowledges that the **County** may enter into a similar Contract for Election Services with other political subdivisions in the same county for the same election date. During early voting a voter will be eligible to vote at any one of the early voting locations and mobile voting locations, if any. **Town of Horizon City** agrees to share common polling places with the other political subdivision(s) as determined by the **County** and in accordance with the costs as allocated by the **County**.
- (c) Nothing in this Contract shall authorize or permit a change in the officer with whom the place at which any document is to be filed, the place at which a function is to be carried out, or other nontransferable functions as specified by the Election Code.
- (d) The Elections Administrator shall file copies of this contract with the County Judge and the County Auditor of El Paso County.
- (e) Neither party may assign, in whole or in part, any interest they may have in the agreement.

- (f) Nothing in this agreement imposes any duty on the **County** to maintain or repair the facilities or cure any premise defects of the property on which polling locations are located.
- (g) Neither **Town of Horizon City** nor any employee of **Town of Horizon City** is an agent, or employee of the Elections Administrator and neither Elections Administrator nor any employee thereof is an agent or employee of **Town of Horizon City**. This agreement does not and shall not be construed to entitle either party or any of their respective employees, if applicable, to any benefit, privilege, or other amenities of employment by the other party.
- (h) **Town of Horizon City** and the **County**, reserve and do not waive, their rights of sovereign immunity and similar rights, immunities and rights of their officials and employees, and their employees/officials' rights under the Texas Tort Claims Act.
- (i) Venue is in El Paso County Texas.
