## Huron ISD General Education Report: June 2026

### General Ed News

- We have multiple updates on staffing within the Gen Ed Department, and by the time our Board meeting occurs we may have some candidates recommended to be officially hired:
  - Katie Parker was our lone internal applicant for the new Early Math Consultant position, and she has been notified that she will be filling that role for SY26-27.
  - With Katie Parker shifting out of an Early Literacy Coaching position, we have two vacancies to fill there. As of this report's submission (June 1), we have had five applications and we have two scheduled interviews for the afternoon of June 2.
  - We also have two interviews on the morning of June 2 for our Early Childhood Specialist role.
  - Not yet scheduled as of this report are interviews for the open DAIT position, but my hope is to schedule some for early-mid June and have a candidate to present to the Board at our July meeting. We do have multiple applications to review for this position.
- Our Opening Week PD schedule (Aug. 17-20) is largely set. I appreciate the work of Jackie Callender to coordinate multiple Capturing Kids' Hearts trainings, both here at HISD as well as in some local districts. I also appreciate Amanda Sulkowski and her organizational skills, as she has been instrumental in helping to coordinate all the logistical considerations. Our full HISD Admin Team will look over this schedule at an upcoming Admin Workday, looking to put some final touches on the schedule. The most notable piece remaining to figure out is the time/place for each department to receive their 2-hour I Love You Guys training.
- Alongside several other HISD colleagues, I participated in the Future of Learning Council's Annual Summit on May 13. This event had several hundred participants from across the state, with multiple breakout sessions on how to create more meaningful and engaging opportunities for our students. Next year, HISD will again participate in this series of meetings, alongside 1-2 local district teams and dozens of teams from schools/ISDs across the state.
- We will be continuing our AI Integration series next year, still in coordination with our TISD/SISD partners, who will once again share costs with us. Sanilac ISD has offered to host next year's six sessions, but I will remain in a lead role coordinating the series with Aaron Baughman, who will return as our facilitator. The focus for next year will be to build up local district leaders (teachers and/or admin) to more formally take the training they are receiving and sharing widely with their own staffs.

### Coming Events

- I will be in Lansing on June 9-10 for administrator mentor/coach training with MASSP.
- The final Principal Meeting of the year will be held on June 16. This will be a joint meeting, after holding separate meetings for elementary/secondary leaders throughout the year.
- The final session of this year's AI Integration Series will be held on June 18.
- I will close out June with a pair of conferences: MASSP's EdCon conference is in Traverse City from June 22-24 and then will be in Orlando from June 27-July for the ASCD-ISTE conference. At both conferences, I will be presenting a breakout session on how HISD is using an AI tool to enhance educator feedback in a safe and responsible manner.

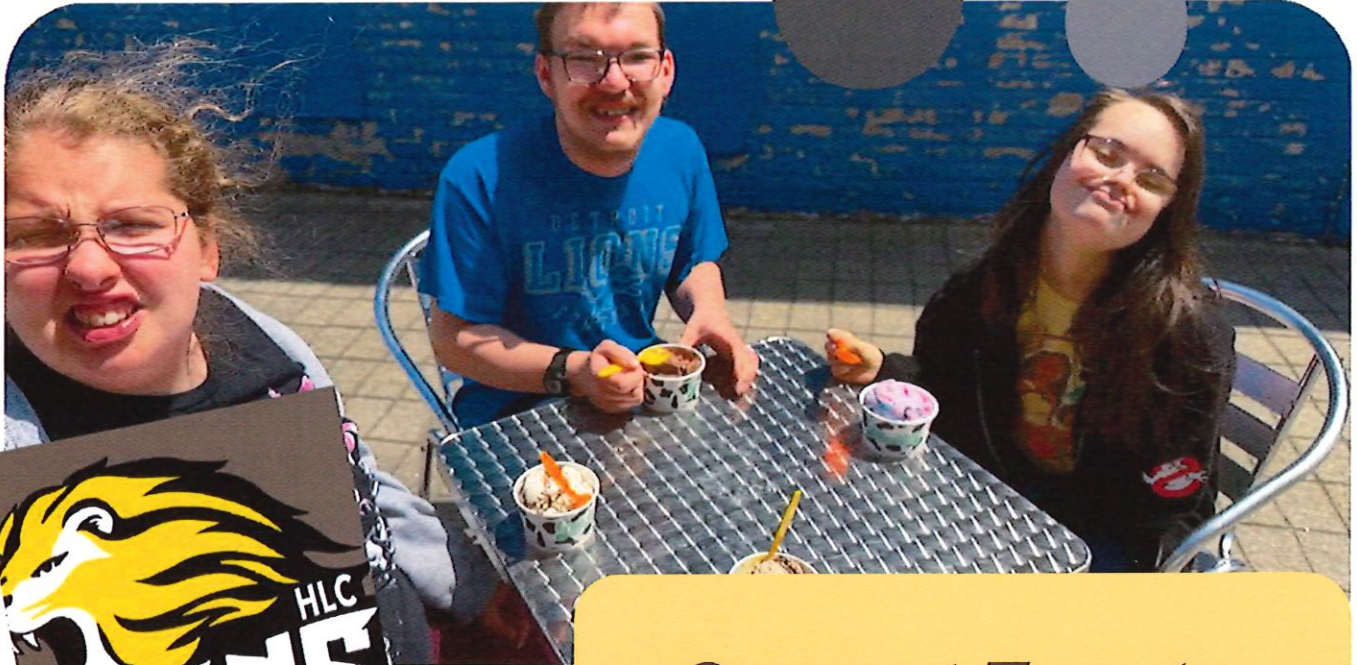
We continue to work to fill our vacancies in the special education department. Currently we have the following positions open.

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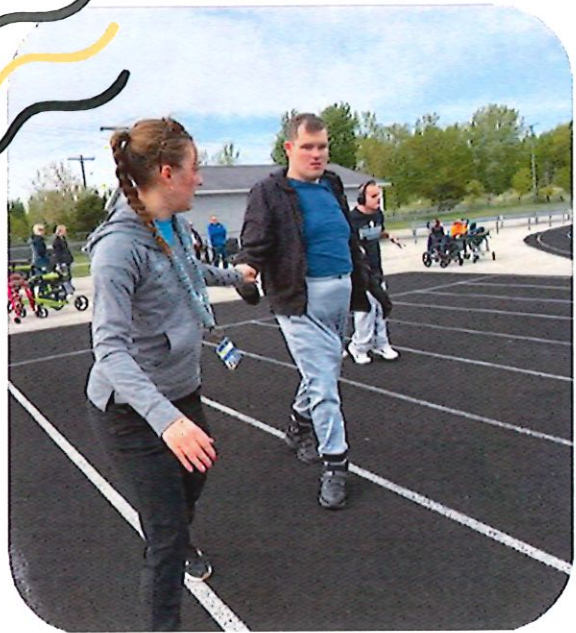
### *Current Events*

- On May 27, Rebecca Schumacher participated in the AI Task Force Training series.

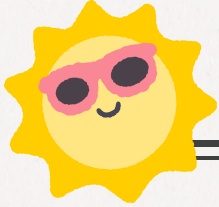


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## Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports

## FINANCE DEPARTMENT REPORT

### 2027 Michigan PA 152 Hard Cap Rates

The State of Michigan has announced a 3.0% increase in the public employer health insurance hard cap rates for 2027. These rates represent the maximum amount a school district may contribute toward employee health insurance premiums under Michigan law. These updated limits apply to medical benefit plan coverage years beginning on or after January 1, 2027. The annual hard cap limits increased as follows:

Coverage Type	2026 Hard Cap	2027 Hard Cap	Increase
Single Coverage	\$7,942.09	\$8,108.35	\$166.26
Two-Person Coverage	\$16,609.38	\$17,107.66	\$498.28
Family Coverage	\$21,660.30	\$22,310.11	\$649.81

### Open Enrollment Update

Open enrollment has been completed for Non-Union Support Staff, HISSA members, and Administrative Staff. Human Resources and Payroll are now implementing the new insurance and ancillary rates, optional benefit selections, and any coverage changes resulting from the enrollment process. All updates will be completed prior to the first payroll in June. In addition, Payroll is working to process special year-end payouts outlined in professional contracts to ensure they are included in the first payroll in June.

### Did you know?

The Huron ISD Finance Team continues to provide accurate, efficient, and responsive financial services in support of the district's operations. During the 2025-2026 fiscal year, the team successfully completed:

- 4,562 payroll checks processed.
- 1,414 cash receipts recorded.
- 5,468 payments processed.
- 198 bank reconciliations completed.
- Budget management for 4,951 account numbers.
- 300 invoices issued.
