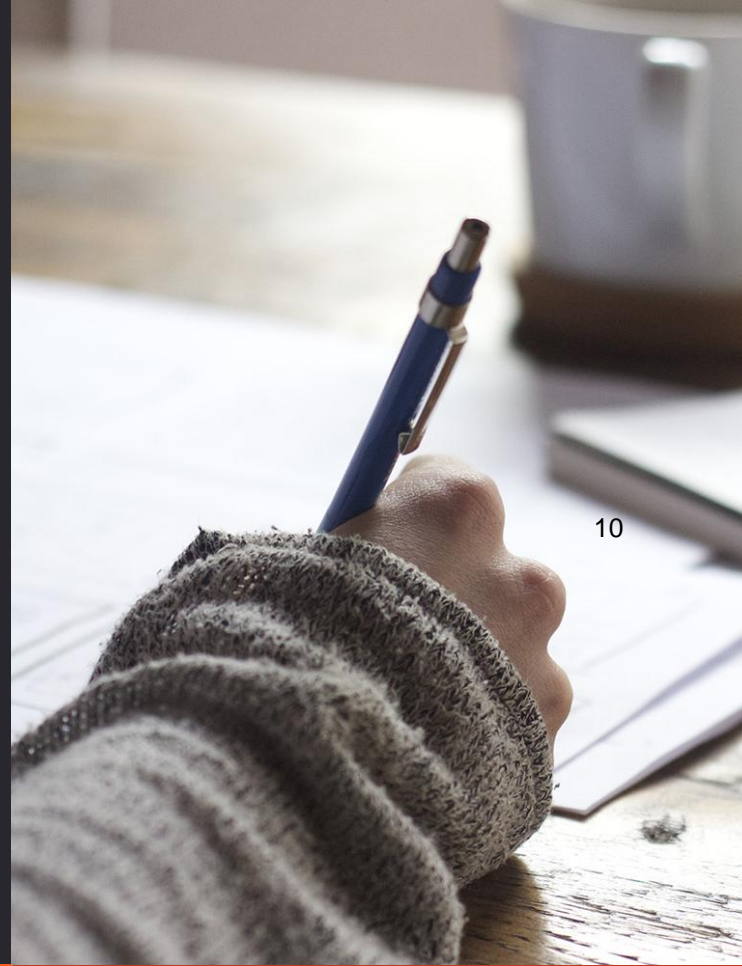

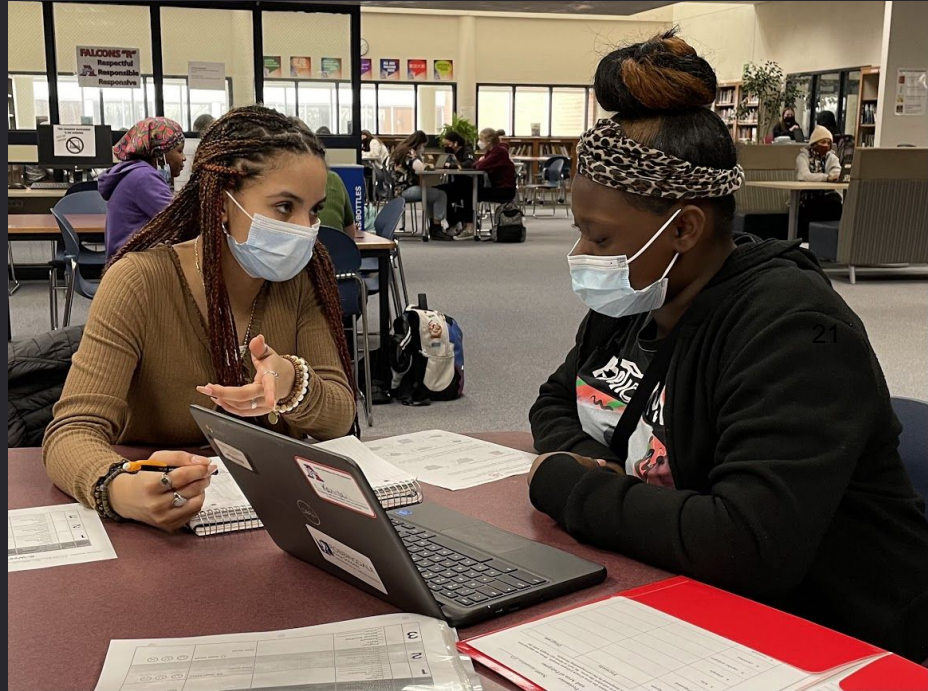

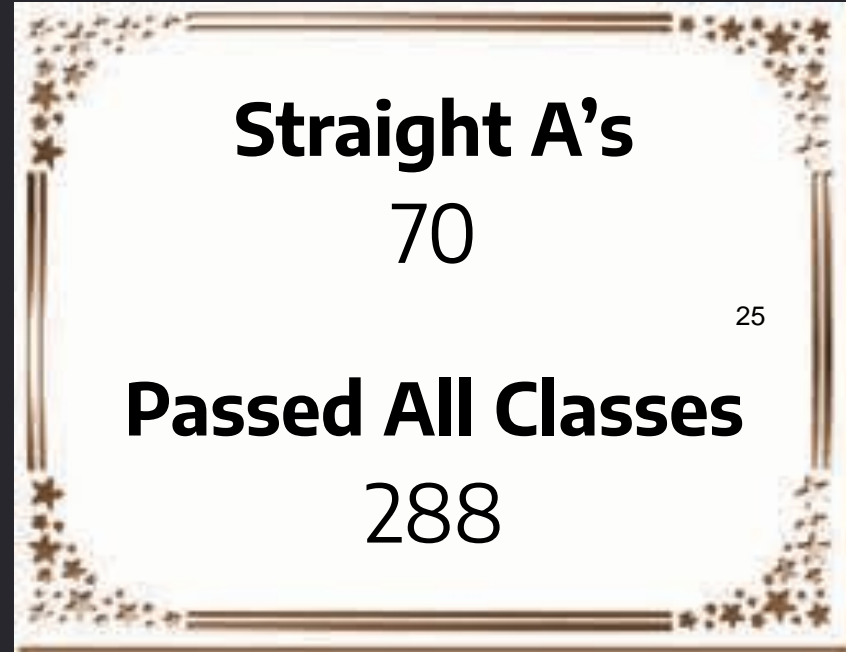

TIMELINE



1. School Board adopt the resolution establishing the School District's primary election system by April 15, 2022. (March 28, 2022 or April 5, 2022 School Board Meeting)
2. School Board adopt the resolution establishing dates for filing affidavits of candidacy so that publication and posting can occur in a timely manner. (April 5 or April 19, 2022 School Board Meeting)
3. Publish the Notice of Filing Dates in the official newspaper at least two (2) weeks prior to the first day to file affidavits of candidacy (no later than **May 3, 2022**). (April 28, 2022 Sun Post publication)
4. Post the Notice of Filing Dates in the administrative offices of the School District at least ten (10) days prior to the first day to file affidavits of candidacy (no later than **May 7, 2022**). Please note that as this falls on a Saturday, we recommend that the notice instead be posted on **Friday, May 6, 2022**.
5. If a primary election is required, have the board adopt the resolution calling the primary election at least seventy-four (74) days prior thereto (no later than **May 27, 2022**). This is addressed in the contingent resolution calling the primary election. Minnesota Statute requires a 74 day notice to Hennepin County, but candidate affidavits are accepted until May 31, 2022 with the option to withdraw by 5:00 p.m. on June 2, 2022. The School Board will need to adopt the resolution prior to the filing deadline. The provisions of this resolution shall only be effective if, as a result of filings, a primary election is required by law. (May 23, 2022 School Board meeting).

Following is the timeline to conduct a primary election on August 9, 2022, provided by our attorney:

TIMELINE

1. Have the School Board adopt the resolution establishing the School District's primary election system by April 15, 2022. (March 28, 2022 or April 5, 2022 School Board Meeting)
2. Have the School Board adopt the resolution establishing dates for filing affidavits of candidacy so that publication and posting can occur in a timely manner. (April 5 or April 19, 2022 School Board Meeting)
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5. 5. If a primary election is required, have the board adopt the resolution calling the primary election at least seventy-four (74) days prior thereto (no later than **May 27, 2022**). This is addressed in the contingent resolution calling the primary election. Minnesota Statute requires a 74 day notice to Hennepin County, but candidate affidavits are accepted until May 31, 2022 with the option to withdraw by 5:00 p.m. on June 2, 2022. The School Board will need to adopt the resolution prior to the filing deadline. The provisions of this resolution shall only be effective if, as a result of filings, a primary election is required by law. (May 23, 2022 School Board meeting).

If the School Board adopts this resolution, the District will be required to conduct primary elections in future election cycles unless the School Board adopts a resolution opting out of the primary election process.



Attached is the history of school district elections from 1993. If the School District would have run primary elections in the past, they would have been run in 1996, 1999, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2009 and 2020. There were more than two filings per open position for these elections. The last Primary conducted in the School District was in 2005, that was mandated by MN Statute. In 2006 the MN Statute changed to allow the decision to conduct primary elections at the School Board level. All school districts were opted out unless the district opted in by resolution.

The filing period for a Primary Election is May 17, 2022-May 31, 2022. If more than 9 or more candidates file, then we would conduct the Primary Election on August 9, 2022 to reduce the candidates down to 8. If 8 or fewer file, then the Primary date in August would be N/A and will proceed to the November 8, 2022 General Election.

The filing period for the General Election is August 2, 2022-August 16, 2022. The General Election is November 8, 2022.

The estimated cost of an even year election is approximately \$8,000-\$10,000 depending on the number of ballots the City Clerks order. This includes legal publications, attorney fees, equipment programming and cost of ballots. We are charged for the space we consume on the ballot directly from Hennepin County.

Attached is the Resolution Establishing School District Primary Election System for your review. As indicated above, this resolution would need to be adopted by the School Board no later than the April 5, 2022 School Board meeting.

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING SCHOOL DISTRICT
PRIMARY ELECTION SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the School Board wishes elections in Independent School District No. 281 to be subject to the primary election system;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of Independent School District No. 281, State of Minnesota, as follows:

1. The school board hereby determines that nominees for school board office at the 2022 general election and thereafter shall be chosen by primary election.

2. The school district primary election shall be held on the date specified by law for school district primary elections. The filing periods shall be as specified by law.

3. If in any year there are more than two candidates for a specified school board position or there are more than twice as many school board candidates as there are at-large

school board positions available, a primary election must be held that year.

4. The school district primary elections shall be conducted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.03, as amended, and the Minnesota election laws generally. The school district clerk is authorized and directed to take such actions as necessary to be prepared to conduct primary elections.

5. This resolution is effective for all ensuing elections of school board members unless it is revoked.

With the resolution up for review this evening, rather than accentuate the negative, which has been widely reported upon, regarding the unacceptable incident involving our girls’ basketball team, I will give my attention to the positive. So, our “Silver Linings Playbook” begins with:

Appreciation of our coaching staff, on the ground who rose to protect our students, during a critical time of social and emotional need, and who met that moment with honor.

Appreciation of our girls’ basketball team, who responded to a potentially humiliating situation; and, acquitted themselves well. Even-though they lost a game, they triumphed in grace, character and class.

Appreciation of our Superintendent and senior administration, who immediately publicly backed our staff and students - with belief in their first person accounts.

Appreciation of the citizens of New Prague, whom I observed attending their own school board meeting and speaking decisively against the reported behavior, thus allowing me, and perhaps others to be uplifted by their protests against such behavior and their demands for positive action, focused upon their own community.

Appreciation of neighboring school districts, such as Hopkins, Intermediate District 287, St. Louis Park, and supportive colleagues state-wide who reached out to us in support. Each expressing a stand against all manner and form of harassment and hate speech.

And finally, appreciation of our school board stance, which we hope to demonstrate through resolute action, our collective voice on the matter. Taken together we find the silver lining in each of these actions.

Member _____ introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION CONDEMNING RACIST WORDS AND ACTIONS

WHEREAS, all persons deserve to be treated with dignity and respect, and to be free from discriminatory and/or harassing behavior in all areas of their lives; and

WHEREAS, school should be a safe space for all students and staff, and that sense of safety should extend to every classroom, building, court, field, rink, track, pool, course, stage and auditorium; and

WHEREAS, racist behavior or the perpetuation of racism in any form is damaging to the social-emotional and mental well being of our students, staff, volunteers and community; and

WHEREAS, several events have occurred in Minnesota schools, where racial slurs or harmful actions involving students have occurred, including incidents where student-athletes and/or adult fans of one team using racial slurs against the members of another team; and

WHEREAS, racism must be combatted and unequivocally condemned; and

WHEREAS, people should be respected no matter the color of their skin, and our students' ethnic and cultural backgrounds are important and should be honored; and

WHEREAS, society and some schools clearly have a long way to go in achieving the ideal of an equitable playing field for all; and

WHEREAS, we are committed to policies and practices that support the whole child, including their social and emotional health,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Robbinsdale Area Schools Board of Education:

1. Aspires to partner with the Minnesota State High School League, to assess the effectiveness and to promote the enactment of policies to prevent, report, address, enforce against, and to hold MSHSL member associates and institutions accountable for, prohibiting the use of racist words and actions;
2. Condemns all hateful speech and systemic racism directed at Black, Indigenous and all People of Color;
3. Condemns all manifestations or expressions of racism, xenophobia, discrimination, scapegoating, and ethnic or racial intolerance;
4. Supports educating students participating in interscholastic and other extracurricular activities about bullying, racial microaggressions, hazing prevention and efforts promoting positive online interactions and conduct;

5. Supports educating parents of students participating in interscholastic and other extracurricular activities about types of abuse and misconduct in these activities, with guidance on fostering positive and safe experiences for all students; and
6. Supports elevating student voice to be a focal point in professional development opportunities offered in our schools.
7. Asks students to share their experiences and perspectives and will join together to create a better learning environment for everyone.
8. Listens to the perspectives of our students, and resolves to think more carefully about the language we use in our schools and how it affects our young people.



EEOC Settlement Agreement

On Monday, Feb 28, 2022 Robbinsdale Area Schools represented by Martin Law Firm PLLC and me, engaged in mediation with a former employee who had filed a charge of discrimination with the EEOC on December 13, 2021.

Robbinsdale Area Schools settled the charge through the mediation process. In order to limit the expense in time, money, and other resources the district and the charging party agreed to the following:

Payment of \$25,000, with \$15,000 designated as a non-taxable 1099 payment and \$10,000 as taxable income subject to withholding. In exchange, the charging party agrees to release all claims against the district arising out of their employment, withdraw the EEOC charge of discrimination and agree to not disparage the district. Both parties agree that the settlement does not constitute an admission of liability.

We are currently working with the district's insurance company to see if they will make a contribution to the settlement amount.

It was determined that settlement of this case at this amount was in the best approach to resolve this matter. While we are confident that settlement not been reached, our response to the EEOC would have resulted in a finding of "no probable cause". However, the estimated cost for the District to submit a response would have been at least \$10,000.00. Even with that expenditure and the confidence in our position, there is no certainty that our position would have prevailed. Moreover, to prepare a response would have required various staff members who interacted with the charging party to take time away from their job to aid in the preparation of the

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district's response. In summary, this settlement provides certainty that the situation with the charging party is resolved and closed and the work of other staff in the district is not disrupted.

A Work Session of the School Board of Robbinsdale Area Schools was held Monday, March 7, 2022. *Complete agendas, reports, and presentations are available at the office and [on our website](#). **Work session summary minutes are not approved by the School Board.***

Director(s) present: Helen Bassett, David Boone, Sharon Brooks Green, Greta Evans-Becker, Michael Herring, Sam Sant, and John Vento; and David Engstrom, Superintendent. Director(s) absent: None.

Strategic Plan Timeline

Superintendent Engstrom and Martha Greenway, of Greenway Strategy Group, provided a presentation outlining the detailed priorities, outcomes, and timeline in regard to work being initiated to create a new strategic plan for our district. Work is beginning this month, in three phases:

- *Phase 1: Analysis (a diagnosis)*
 - Step 1: Environmental scan
 - Step 2: Organizational assessment
- *Phase 2: Strategy Development (a guiding policy)*
 - Step 3: Define desired future: vision, mission, priority student outcomes
 - Step 4: Develop strategic themes, objectives and measures
 - Step 5: Define strategic initiatives
- *Phase 3: Action Planning (coherent actions)*
 - Step 6: Create action plans
 - Step 7: Develop monitoring and review process

The intent is to have the strategic plan completed this fall, to begin implementation during the 2022-2023 school year.

Teaching and Learning Fidelity Checks and LETRS

Presented by:

- Carla Nolan, Director of Elementary Curriculum and Federal Programs
- Matt Pletcher, Director of Secondary Curriculum and Multilingual Programs
- Bridget Hall, Principal of Lakeview Elementary
- Noelle Nelson, Administrative Intern at Robbinsdale Middle School

Fidelity checks are intended to inform schools and districts about trends of best practice resource and model implementation fidelity across the system, and are a part of School Improvement Plans (SIP). They are brief, non-evaluative classroom visits conducted by district/building administration and staff periodically throughout the school year. After these have been completed district wide, every school administrator will receive slides outlining their building's results - which they will share with their staff. The Board had an opportunity for questions.

The discussion then turned to Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling (LETRS) training, which provides educators and administrators with an understanding of:

- Scientifically based best practices for instructional routines, activities and approaches
- The relationships among language, reading and writing
- The components of comprehensive, integrated language and literacy instruction for given grade, age, and ability levels
- Reliable assessments and theoretical models for interpreting individual differences in student achievement
- How to deliver effective instruction through teacher modeling
- How to directly apply LETRS principles and practices to the classroom

The original implementation plan was an aggressive approach to fast-track the staff training. When the pandemic occurred, it caused restructure to teacher by teacher training, with some utilizing summer training opportunities. While the effects of using LETRS resources and knowledge will not cause a dramatic shift overnight, there is great evidence that it is already helping our students. The Board had an opportunity for questions.

FY 2021-2022 Preliminary Budget Revisions and FY 2022-2023 Budget Assumptions

Ukee Dozier, Executive Director of Finance started with a brief update on the budget phases: Data Gathering - August through December, Preparation - January through February, Presentation and Approvals (including mid-year) - March

through June, and Budget Implementation - June and Beyond. He then provided a mid-year budget revision update for FY 2021-2022, taking questions from the Board. Mr. Dozier provided budget assumptions and recommendations for FY 2022-2023, noting: a 2% increase in per pupil funding, and a projected decrease in enrollment of-318 or 2.87% from current end of year projections. With the following goals: creating an expenditure budget within revenue constraints to help with the targeted \$1.5 million increase to the unassigned fund balance, managing expense increases with a focus on minimizing expenses that affect the general fund balance, maintaining a level of contingency funds to address inflationary costs and investing in resident enrollment. The Board had an opportunity for questions.

Transportation Opt-In Discussion

Jeff Connell, Executive Director of Facilities, Operations, and Transportation recommends moving to an opt-in model beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, which would identify and provide transportation for all students who are eligible (live outside of walk zones) and indicate need for busing by filling out a form. There are a number of safety nets within the opt-in plan:

- Capacity to place any student that needs transportation on a bus
- Any family that changes their mind or has a change in circumstances will be provided busing
- All new enrollments will have a busing choice
- If a family doesn't indicate their busing need via the form, their student(s) will be placed on a bus until their needs can be confirmed
- All students with special needs in which transportation is identified in their IEP will be provided busing

Implementing this program will:

- Decrease the number of routes, increase efficiency and optimized travel time
- Create a "bench" of backup drivers
- Result in fewer canceled routes
- Provide more reliable transportation for students and families
- Reduce traffic congestion at schools due to fewer families driving their students
- Provide more options for additional activity and special circumstance busing
- Reduce: number of vehicles in service, overall mileage maintenance and fuel costs, and lower carbon footprint

Mr. Connell provided elements and timing of the process for converting to the opt-in model, and took questions from the Board.

Board Discussions

A. *Election Primary Resolution*

With four School Board seats being open for election this year, there was a discussion in regard to adopting a resolution establishing a district primary election system. Further discussion on this topic will be brought forth at the March 28 Business meeting.

B. *Other*

No additional topics were presented, meeting was adjourned.
