Two female student athletes - one each from Armstrong and Cooper high schools - have been recognized for their hard work both in the classroom and on the playing field.

Sophia Pung from Armstrong High School and Morgan Stromberg from Cooper High School have been selected as their school's 2022 Athena Award winners. This award is given annually to one senior athlete from each participating school who has distinguished herself in athletics and academics.

### **Sophia Pung**

During her career at AHS, Pung has participated in four sports, most notably Nordic skiing and golf. During her AHS athletic career, she has won a number of section and state awards, earned 12 varsity letters, captained five different Nordic skiing and golf teams. She earned most valuable player awards seven times. In addition to her athletic success, Pung has earned academic honors, and this year was elected by her peers as Student Body President. Pung is still undecided about her post-secondary plans, but intends to ski at an NCAA school or attend an institution with a strong research concentration in nanotechnology.

### **Morgan Stromberg**

Mr. Smith will inform the Board regarding Robbinsdale Area Schools being voted concurrent for the MDE - Office of American Indian Education Annual Compliance for the 2021-2022 school year.



## Annual Compliance Overview

[Minnesota Statutes, section 124D.78](#) requires Minnesota districts, charters, and tribal schools with 10 or more American Indian students to have an American Indian Parent Advisory Committee (AIPAC). Specifically, the statute cites that school boards and American Indian schools must provide for the maximum involvement of parents and children enrolled in education programs, programs for elementary and secondary grades, special education programs, and support services.

To be compliant with this statutory requirement, districts, charters, and tribal schools are required to submit annual compliance documents to the Office of American Indian Education (OAIE) by March 1 of each year. Also known as the vote of concurrence or nonconcurrence, annual compliance is a valuable opportunity for American Indian Parent Advisory Committee members to meet and discuss whether or not they concur with the educational offerings that have been extended by the district to American Indian students.

## The Vote and Resolution

If the AIPAC finds that the district and/or school board have been meeting the needs of American Indian students, they issue a vote and resolution of concurrence. If they find that the district and/or school board have not been meeting the needs of American Indian students, they issue a vote and resolution of nonconcurrence. This vote is formally reflected on the annual compliance documents. Members of the AIPAC must present the vote and resolution to the school board.

If the vote is one of nonconcurrence, the AIPAC must provide written recommendations for improvement to the school board at the time of the presentation. The school board then has 60 days in which to respond in writing to the AIPAC recommendations. A copy of this written response must be provided to the OAIE.

## Completing and Submitting the Documents

***The following items are required when submitting annual compliance:***

- ✓ The annual compliance/vote of concurrence or nonconcurrence document
- ✓ The AIPAC resolution document
- ✓ The AIPAC roster and district employee sign-in sheet (available to download on the OAIE webpage)

***All items are fillable PDF forms. When completing, remember to:***

- Include the district or school name and identifying number.
- Place a check mark next to the applicable vote.
- Include all dates as indicated.
- Add all signatures as required. *\*Digital signatures are accepted.*
- Use the drop-down menu in the roster to select the appropriate committee member options.

***The District or School Does Not Have an AIPAC:***

Districts or schools that do not have an AIPAC are still required to complete this paperwork.

- Place a check mark next to “Does Not Have an AIPAC”.
- Obtain the signature of the superintendent or charter/tribal school director and the school board chair. The resolution page is not required.

**We, the American Indian Parent Advisory Committee**, issue a **Vote of Concurrence**. We attest that the school board and/or district are compliant with Minnesota Statutes and that the school board and/or district are meeting the needs of American Indian students; **or**,

**We, the American Indian Parent Advisory Committee**, issue a **Vote of Nonconcurrence**. We attest that the school board and/or district are not compliant with Minnesota Statutes and that the school board and/or district are not meeting the needs of American Indian students. We have provided written recommendations for improvements to the school board, and we acknowledge that the school board has 60 days from the receipt of these recommendations in which to respond, in writing, to each recommendation.

## 102 EQUAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY

*[Note: School districts are required by statute to have a policy addressing these issues.]*

### I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that equal educational opportunity is provided for all students of the school district.

### II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

- A. The policy of the school district is to provide equal educational opportunity for all students. The school district does not unlawfully discriminate on the basis of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, gender, marital status, parental status, status with regard to public assistance, disability, sexual orientation, or age. The school district also makes reasonable accommodations for ~~disabled~~ students with disabilities.
- B. The school district prohibits ~~the~~ harassment and discrimination of any individual ~~for any of the categories~~ based on any of the protected classifications listed above. For information about the types of conduct that constitute violation of the school district's policy on harassment and violence and the school district's procedures for addressing such complaints, refer to the school district's policy on harassment and violence: (Policy 413).
- C. The school district prohibits discrimination of students with a disability, within the intent of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 ("Section 504"), who need services, accommodations, or programs in order to receive a free appropriate public education. For information as to protections that may apply pursuant to Section 504 and the school district's corresponding procedures for addressing disability discrimination complaints, refer to the school district's policy on student disability nondiscrimination (Policy 521).
- D. The school district prohibits sexual harassment discrimination of any individual on the basis of sex in its education programs or activities. For information as to the protections that apply pursuant to Title IX and school district's corresponding procedures and processes for addressing sexual harassment and discrimination, refer to the school district's policy on Title IX sex nondiscrimination (Policy 522).

- E. This policy applies to all areas of education including academics, coursework, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, or other rights or privileges of enrollment.
- F. Every school district employee shall be responsible for complying with this policy ~~conscientiously~~.
- G. Any student, parent, or guardian having a question regarding this policy should discuss it with the appropriate school district official as provided by policy. In the absence of a specific designee, an inquiry or a complaint should be referred to the superintendent.

## 401 EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

### I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to provide equal employment opportunity for all applicants for school district employment and **for all** school district employees.

### II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

- A. The policy of the school district is to provide equal employment opportunity for all applicants and employees. The school district does not unlawfully discriminate on the basis of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, gender, marital status, status with regard to public assistance, disability, sexual orientation, age, family care leave status, or veteran status. The school district also makes reasonable accommodations for disabled employees.
- B. The school district prohibits the harassment of any individual for any of the categories listed above. For information about the types of conduct that constitute impermissible harassment and the school district's internal procedures for addressing complaints of harassment, please refer to the school district's policy on harassment and violence.
- C. This policy applies to all areas of employment including hiring, discharge, promotion, compensation, facilities, or privileges of employment.
- D. Every school district employee shall be responsible for following this policy.
- E. Any person having a question regarding this policy should contact the Executive Director of Human Resources.

**RESOLUTION ACCEPTING DONATIONS**

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes 123B.02, Subd. 6 provides: “The board may receive, for the benefit of the district, bequests, donations, or gifts for any proper purpose and apply the same to the purpose designated. In that behalf, the board may act as trustee of any trust created for the benefit of the district, or for the benefit of pupils thereof, including trusts created to provide pupils of the district with advanced education after completion of high school, in the advancement of education.”; and



Chair Bassett presented two options provided by the Minnesota School Boards Association (MSBA) in regard to School Board an online self-evaluation tool. Board Directors present agreed the option with the single-page overview of results provided by the MSBA would show how the findings align with the direction of the new strategic plan, as well as to help determine the path of professional development for the Board.

#### **D. School Board Professional Development - presented by Chair Bassett**

It was agreed upon by the Board Directors present that further Board professional development will be determined upon completion and discussion of the Board self-evaluation in June, allowing alignment with the strategic plan that is

currently in the works for the district - as well as the highlighted findings from the evaluation itself.
