Robbinsdale Area Schools is committed to ensuring every student develops their unique potential and graduates career and college ready. To support academic achievement and create a world-class workforce, we urge the Governor and Legislators to act on the following critical issues:

## 2023 Draft Legislative Platform continued

### Fully Fund Education: Provide Students and Staff with the Resources They Need to Succeed.

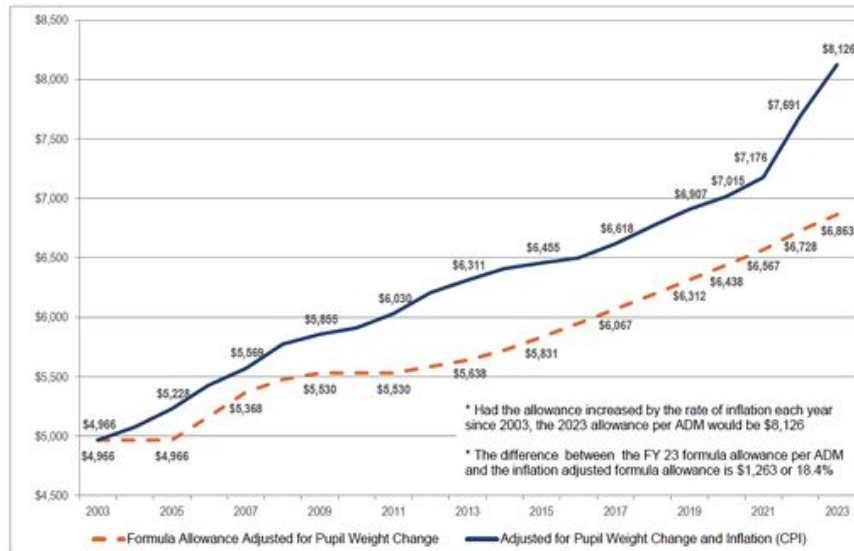
- *Reduce the Special Education cross subsidy* to cover the actual cost of providing services. For the 2022-2023 school year, Robbinsdale Area Schools has budgeted **\$19.4 million** from the general fund to cover unreimbursed Special Education costs.
- *Reduce the English Learning cross subsidy* to fund the cost of providing services for English Learners. For the 2022-2023 school year, Robbinsdale Area Schools has budgeted **\$2.2 million** from the general fund to cover unreimbursed English Learner costs.
- *Link the funding formula to inflation.* The basic education formula is the district's primary source of operating funds and accounts for 45.01% of Robbinsdale Area Schools' general fund revenue. Increases in the basic education formula have not kept up with inflation. In fact, the basic education formula would be **\$1,263** higher per pupil if it had kept up with inflation since 2003. For Robbinsdale this amounts to **\$13.6 million**. Adequate, reliable, and predictable funding is essential to provide programs that ensure every student develops their unique potential and graduates career and college ready. ## 2023 Draft Legislative Platform continued

### Ensure All Kids are Kindergarten Ready

- *Continue funding the Voluntary Pre Kindergarten (VPK) program* to ensure school readiness. The **\$1.8 million** investment for Robbinsdale Area Schools provides children and families with robust PreK programming. Research shows it reduces the achievement gap, and need for special education and remediation, improves health outcomes, and reduces the need for social services, while lowering criminal justice costs and improving self-sufficiency and productivity.

### Stem the Student Mental Health Crisis and Enhance School Safety

- *Increase the Safe Schools Levy.* The Safe Schools levy amount has remained at \$36 per the district's adjusted pupil units since 2014. Times have changed dramatically. Our students deserve the school-based mental health services needed to navigate the effects of COVID and increasing social pressures.
- *Expand the allowable uses of Long-Term Facilities Maintenance Revenue* to allow school districts to make the needed building modifications including purchasing systems and equipment to keep our buildings safe.

## 2023 Draft Legislative Platform continued

### Institute Taxpayer Equity

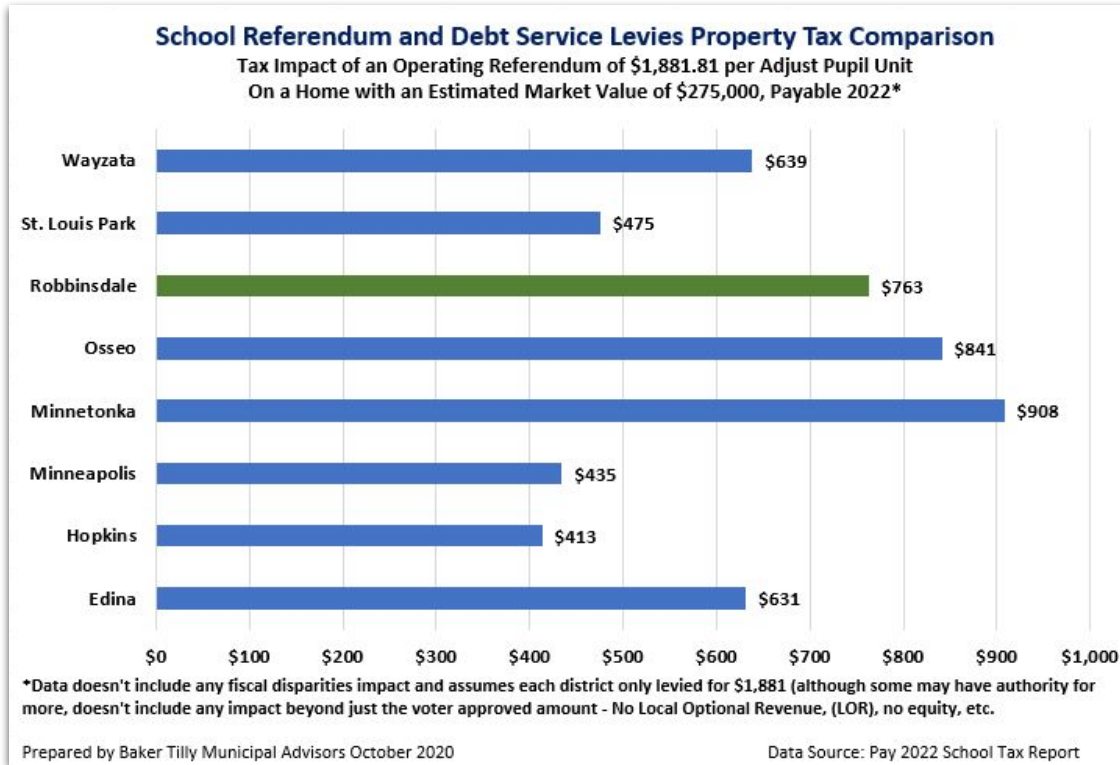
- *Increase equalization for operating referendums and debt service to fund all districts equitably, not according to our zip code.* Property tax levies play a crucial role in funding education programs and facilities. Higher commercial and residential property wealth in a school district impacts the tax rates for referendums and levies. For example, taxes on a home valued at \$314,000 cost homeowners in Robbinsdale Area Schools almost more than twice what homeowners in the commercial and residential property-rich Hopkins School District pay. (Please reference Chart B)

### Allow School Boards to Renew an Existing Operating Referendum for the Same Amount

- *Locally elected school boards should have the authority to renew an existing operating referendum at the same funding level.* Over the past seven years 100% of Minnesota's referendum renewals were approved by voters. Money and time spent on elections should go into the classroom instead.

## Impact

Eliminating the Special Education and ELL cross-subsidies, as well as attaching inflation to the General Education Formula, would have a tremendous impact for Robbinsdale Area Schools. With the additional \$30million, Robbinsdale Area Schools could invest in the following:

- Academic, social-emotional, and mental well-being of students and staff
- Staff hiring, retention, and professional development
- Improved transportation
- Improved technology to support student needs
- Improved facilities and enhanced security
- Eliminate lunch debt for all students
- Expand access to Early Childhood Education
- Expand access to out-of-school time (OST) opportunities
- Expand wraparound supports for students, staff, and families

INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 281

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING COMBINED POLLING PLACES FOR SCHOOL DISTRICT SPECIAL AND GENERAL ELECTIONS NOT HELD ON THE DAY OF A STATEWIDE ELECTION FOR INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 281 FOR 2023 ELECTIONS.

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of Independent School District No. 281 as follows:

1. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the precincts and polling places for school district elections are those precincts or parts of precincts located within the boundaries of the school district which have been established by the cities or town located in whole or in part with the school district. The board hereby confirms those precincts and polling places so established by those municipalities.
2. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the board may establish a combined polling place when no other election is being held in the school district.
3. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.09, the polling places will remain open for voting for school district elections not held on the same day as a statewide election between the hours of 7:00 o'clock a.m. and 8:00 o'clock p.m.
4. The clerk is direct to file a certified copy of this resolution with the county auditors of each of the counties in which the school district is located, in whole or in part, within thirty (30) days after its adoption.
5. As required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 204B.16, Subdivision 1a, the clerk is hereby authorized and directed to give written notice of new polling place locations to each affected household with at least one registered voter in the school district whose school district polling place location has been changed. The notice must be a non-forwardable notice mailed at least twenty-five (25) days before the date of the first election to which it will apply. A notice that is returned as undeliverable must be forwarded immediately to the appropriate county auditor, who shall change the registrant's status to "challenged" in the statewide registration system.

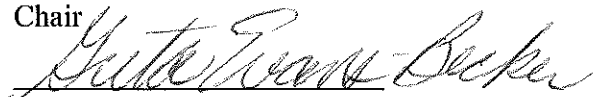

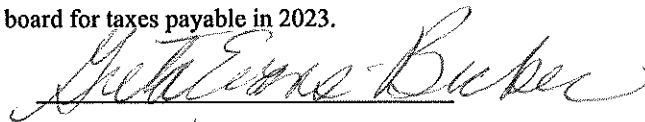

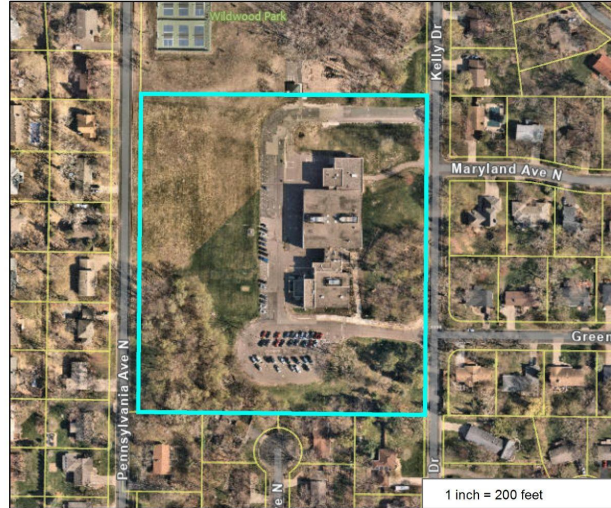

# History of the Need and Project

**Golden Valley received a multi million dollar grant to fix historical flooding in the area just north of the school.**

- The District and The City have been discussing this project since 2020
- Past iterations of the project had the exit road around the building moving closer to the school for expansion of the infiltration basin.
- We objected to that solution as the buses making the turn, idling, and student safety made that option untenable.
- After numerous meetings and a cooperative approach, the parties have decided upon creating a new school district owned playground to meet the needs of the school as well as the community.
- This creates the space needed for additional water treatment and meets the City's flood control project needs.
- The overall deal includes site work and a shade structure by the City and we will fund the new playground and have responsibility for it going forward.
- The existing playground was not designed for the school's needs and is over 10 years old.

THIS EASEMENT GRANT is made and entered into on December 19, 2022, from Independent School District #281, a body politic and corporate under the laws of the State of Minnesota, Grantor, to the CITY OF GOLDEN VALLEY, a Minnesota municipal corporation, situated in Hennepin County, Minnesota, Grantee.

WHEREAS, the Grantee has agreed to perform a flood risk reduction project on and around the Easement Area, as defined below, and the work will be partially funded by a state of Minnesota general obligation bond grant pursuant to the State of Minnesota General Obligation Bond Grant Contract with the City of Golden Valley for a Flood Risk Reduction Project dated October 2, 2018 between the City of Golden Valley and the State of Minnesota, acting through its Commissioner of Natural Resources, (the "Grant Agreement") attached hereto as Exhibit C.

WHEREAS, as part of the flood risk reduction project the Grantee will construct and maintain a flood storage basin, trail, and enhanced vegetation on and around the Easement Area.

NOW THEREFORE, In consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration in hand paid by Grantee, the receipt and sufficiency of which Grantor hereby acknowledges, Grantor hereby grants, conveys and sells to Grantee, its successors and assigns, permanent easements for trail, open space, drainage, utility and access purposes over, under and across the following described property (the "Easement Area"):

That part of Lot 15, Keene, Higbee and Bitzer's Golden Valley Out-Lots as more fully described on Exhibit A and depicted on Exhibit B attached hereto and made a part hereof; together with the right to construct, install, maintain, repair, use, enlarge, modify and service facilities for trail, open space, drainage, utility and access purposes.

Grantor hereby reserves unto itself and its successors and assigns the right to use the Easement Area for other purposes not inconsistent with the rights granted to Grantee under this Easement.

Grantor acknowledges that the Easement Area may be improved with grant funds pursuant to the Grant Agreement. In the event any of the terms, conditions or provisions of the Grant Agreement conflict with the terms of this Easement, the terms of the Grant Agreement shall control.

Grantor shall not create or allow another to create any lien or encumbrance against the Easement Area, whether voluntary or involuntary, that can be satisfied by the payment of monies and which is not being actively contested without the prior written consent of both the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources and the Commissioner of Minnesota Management and Budget.

This Easement may not be transferred or assigned by the Grantee, or modified, restated, amended, changed in any way, or prematurely terminated or cancelled without the prior written consent of both the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources and the Commissioner of Minnesota Management and Budget.

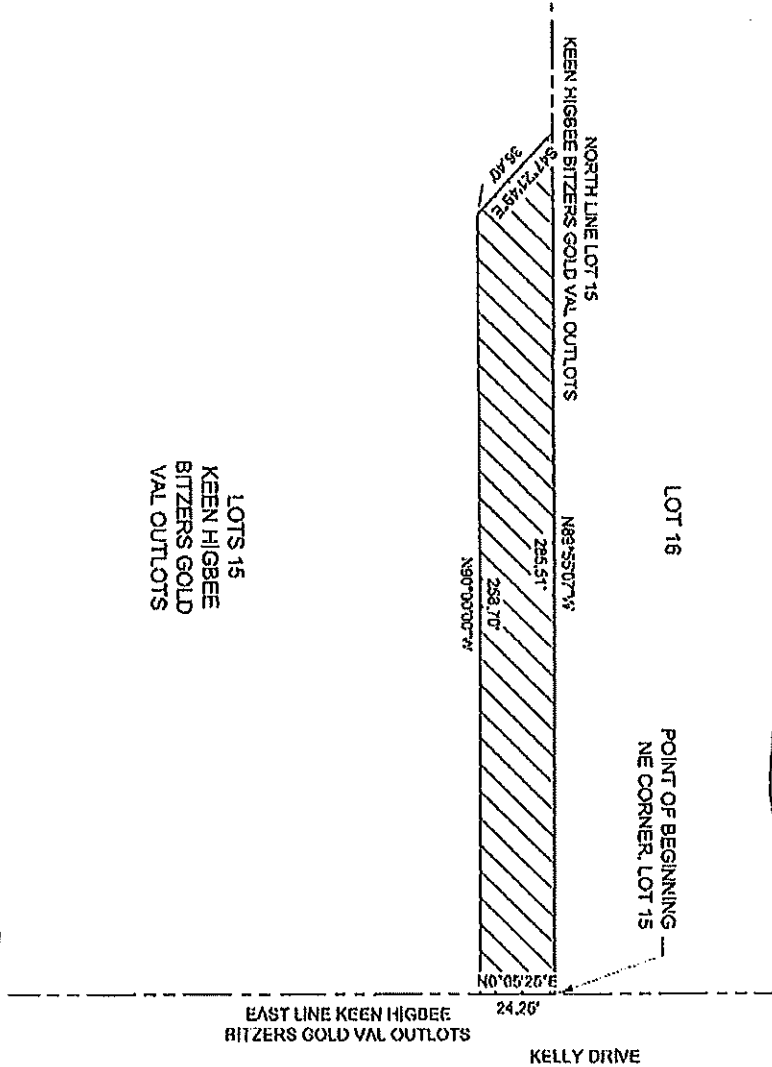

**STATE OF MINNESOTA GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND GRANT CONTRACT  
WITH THE CITY OF GOLDEN VALLEY FOR A FLOOD RISK REDUCTION PROJECT**

This grant contract is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Commissioner of Natural Resources, ("State") and the City of Golden Valley, 7800 Golden Valley Road, Golden Valley, Minnesota, 55427 ("Grantee").

**Recitals**

1. Under Minnesota Statutes, Section 103F.161, Subdivision 1, the State is empowered to enter into this grant agreement.
2. The State agrees that reducing flood damage potential to public and private infrastructure is in the interest of the State.
3. The Grantee represents that it is duly qualified and agrees to perform all services described in this grant contract to the satisfaction of the State. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes §16B.98 Subdivision 1, the Grantee agrees to minimize administrative costs as a condition of this grant contract.
4. The Grantee attests it has the financial capacity to provide any required local match for the project or phase funded under the terms of this grant contract, and agrees to complete the project or phase if the cost of the project or phase exceeds the amount of state funding and required local match.
5. The monies allocated to fund the grant to the Grantee are proceeds of state general obligation (G.O.) bonds authorized to be issued under Article XI, § 5(a) of the Minnesota Constitution; and
6. The Grantee's receipt and use of the G.O. Grant to acquire an ownership interest in and/or improve real property (the "Real Property") and, if applicable, structures situated thereon (the "Facility") will cause the Public Entity's ownership interest in all of such real property and structures to become "state bond financed property", as such term is used in Minn. Stat. § 16A.695 (the "G.O. Compliance Legislation") and in that certain "Fourth-Order Amending Order of the Commissioner of Finance Relating to Use and Sale of State Bond Financed Property" executed by the Commissioner of Minnesota Management and Budget and dated July 30, 2012, as amended (the "Commissioner's Order"), even though such funds may only be a portion of the funds being used to acquire such ownership interest and/or improve such real property and structures and that such funds may be used to only acquire such ownership interest and/or improve a part of such real property and structures.

**Grant Contract**

**1 Term of Grant Contract**

- 1.1 *Effective date:* September 15, 2018, or the date the State obtains all required signatures under Minnesota Statutes §16C.05, subdivision 2, whichever is later.
- 1.2 *Expiration date:* December 31, 2019, or until all obligations have been satisfactorily fulfilled, whichever occurs first.
- 1.3 *Survival of Terms.* The following clauses survive the expiration or cancellation of this grant contract: 8. Liability; 9. State Audits; 10. Government Data Practices and Intellectual Property; 13. Publicity and Endorsement; 14. Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue; and 16. Data Disclosure.

**2 Grantee's Duties**

The Grantee, who is not a state employee, will be responsible for: Engineering, design, acquisition of right-of-way, and construction of a community flood risk reduction project referred to as *De Cola Ponds B and C Expansion & Pennsylvania Woods Flood Mitigation Projects*, as described in the Medicine Lake Road and Whumetka Avenue Area Long-Term Flood Mitigation Plan dated May 31, 2016, and the Grantee's application for state funding assistance dated December 29, 2016. Property acquired or bettered by the Grantee shall remain in permanent public ownership. The Grantee agrees that the land shall be used only for public purposes compatible with open space, recreational, or wetlands or stormwater management practices per adopted State and local floodplain and shoreland management ordinances.

All project expenses not identified as being related to work outlined above, or as subsequently amended in this agreement, must be approved by the State in writing prior to the Grantee incurring said expense.

### 3 Time

The Grantee must comply with all the time requirements described in this grant contract. In the performance of this grant contract, time is of the essence.

### 4 Consideration and Payment

4.1 *Consideration.* The State will reimburse for all eligible services performed by the Grantee under this grant contract as follows:

- (a) *Compensation.* The Grantee will be reimbursed 50% for eligible project expenses, not to exceed \$2,300,000.00. Grantee must provide a match equal to the State's contribution.
- (b) *Travel Expenses.* Reimbursement for eligible project-related travel and subsistence expenses actually and necessarily incurred by the Grantee as a result of this grant contract will be reimbursed in the same manner and in no greater amount than provided in the current "Commissioner's Plan" promulgated by the Commissioner of Minnesota Management and Budget (MMB). The Grantee will not be reimbursed for travel and subsistence expenses incurred outside Minnesota unless it has received the State's prior written approval for out of state travel. Minnesota will be considered the home state for determining whether travel is out of state.
- (c) *Eligible Expenses.* Eligible expenses are those costs directly incurred by the Grantee that are solely related to and necessary for producing the work products described in Provision 2 of this Agreement. Eligible costs may include the following:

advertising costs for bids and proposals; capital expenditures for facilities, equipment and other capital assets as expressly approved by the State; materials and supplies; architectural and engineering services; construction management and inspection services; surveys and soil borings; attorney fees solely related and necessary to accomplish the Project, as determined by the State and actual construction of the Project.

Certain other types of costs may be eligible provided that they are (1) directly incurred by the Grantee; (2) are solely related to, and necessary for, producing the work products described in Provision 2; and (3) have prior written approval of the State. Any cost not defined as an eligible cost or not included in the Project Plan shall not be paid from State funds committed to the Project.

- (d) *Ineligible Expenses.* Non-eligible costs for reimbursement means all costs not defined as eligible costs, including but not limited to the following:

Any costs incurred before the effective date of this Grant; fund raising; taxes, except sales tax on goods and services; insurance, except title insurance; attorney fees not necessary to accomplish the project; loans, grants, or subsidies to persons or entities for development; financing; bad debts or contingency funds; interest; operation and maintenance costs; options for acquisition of real estate; lobbyists; and political contributions.

### 4.2. Payment

*Invoices.* To obtain reimbursement for eligible costs under this Grant, the Grantee shall provide the State with invoices and evidence that the portion of the Project for which payment is requested has been satisfactorily completed. All invoices shall be sent to the person designated in Section 6. Grantee shall submit invoices and evidence that the required contribution toward any required local match are being met. Invoices will be submitted for the amount and should differentiate, when applicable, between the Federal and Non-Federal Project costs, as well as the State and local share of the Project costs. Invoices must be received by the State within thirty (30) days after the completion of the Project or the expiration of this Grant as set forth in Section 1.2, whichever occurs first. Invoices received after that date may not be eligible for reimbursement, at the State's discretion. The State's authorized agent has final authority for

acceptance of Grantee's services, determination as to whether the expenditures are eligible for reimbursement under this Grant, and verification of the total amount requested. The Grantee shall not receive payment for work found by the State to be unsatisfactory, or performed in violation of federal, state or local law, ordinance, rule or regulation. At its discretion, the State may retain 10% of the total grant award until the State has determined that the Grantee has satisfactorily fulfilled all of the terms of this Grant. If requested by the State, the Grantee shall arrange for a tour of the Project area prior to release of the final ten (10) percent of the funds. Invoices must be submitted timely and according to the following schedule:

It is required that invoices be submitted, at a minimum, at the close of each state fiscal year which is July 1 - June 30. If expenses are extensive, reimbursement requests may be submitted monthly or quarterly. Please itemize the eligible expenses by the month of occurrence, not liquidation. If invoices are not received in this format, it could delay receipt of payment.

#### **5 Conditions of Payment**

All services provided by the Grantee under this grant contract must be performed to the State's satisfaction, as determined at the sole discretion of the State's Authorized Representative and in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations. The Grantee will not receive payment for work found by the State to be unsatisfactory or performed in violation of federal, state, or local law.

#### **6 Authorized Representative**

The State's Authorized Representative is Patrick Lynch, Floodplain Hydrologist, Department of Natural Resources, 500 Lafayette Road, St. Paul, Minnesota, 55155, 651-259-5691, [pat.lynch@state.mn.us](mailto:pat.lynch@state.mn.us), or his/her successor, and has the responsibility to monitor the Grantee's performance and the authority to accept or reject the services provided under this grant contract. If the services are satisfactory, the State's Authorized Representative will certify acceptance on each invoice submitted for payment.

The Grantee's Authorized Representative is Jeff Oliver, City Engineer, City of Golden Valley, 7800 Golden Valley Road, Golden Valley, Minnesota 55427, 763-593-8035 [joliver@goldenvalleymn.gov](mailto:joliver@goldenvalleymn.gov). If the Grantee's Authorized Representative changes at any time during this grant contract, the Grantee must immediately notify the State.

#### **7 Assignment, Amendments, Waiver, and Grant Contract Complete**

- 7.1 *Assignment.* The Grantee shall neither assign nor transfer any rights or obligations under this grant contract without the prior written consent of the State, approved by the same parties who executed and approved this grant contract, or their successors in office.
- 7.2 *Amendments.* Any amendments to this grant contract must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original grant contract, or their successors in office.
- 7.3 *Waiver.* If the State fails to enforce any provision of this grant contract, that failure does not waive the provision or the State's right to enforce it.
- 7.4 *Grant Contract Complete.* This grant contract contains all negotiations and agreements between the State and the Grantee. No other understanding regarding this grant contract, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.

#### **8 Liability**

The Grantee must indemnify, save, and hold the State, its agents, and employees harmless from any claims or causes of action, including attorney's fees incurred by the State, arising from the performance of this grant contract by the Grantee or the Grantee's agents or employees. This clause will not be construed to bar any legal remedies the Grantee may have for the State's failure to fulfill its obligations under this grant contract.

**9 State Audits**

Under Minn. Stat. §16B.98, Subd.8, the Grantee's books, records, documents, and accounting procedures and practices of the Grantee or other party relevant to this grant agreement or transaction are subject to examination by the State and/or the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this grant agreement, receipt and approval of all final reports, or the required period of time to satisfy all state and program retention requirements, whichever is later.

**10 Government Data Practices**

The Grantee and State must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minn. Stat. Ch. 13, as it applies to all data provided by the State under this grant contract, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the Grantee under this grant contract. The civil remedies of Minn. Stat. § 13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either the Grantee or the State. If the Grantee receives a request to release the data referred to in this Clause, the Grantee must immediately notify the State. The State will give the Grantee instructions concerning the release of the data to the requesting party before the data is released. The Grantee's response to the request shall comply with applicable law.

**11 Prevailing Wages**

Grantee agrees to comply with all of the applicable provisions contained in Chapter 177 of the Minnesota Statutes, and specifically those provisions contained in Minn. Stat. §§ 177.41 through 177.435, as they may be amended, modified or replaced from time to time with respect to the Project.

**12 Workers' Compensation**

The Grantee certifies that it is in compliance with Minn. Stat. § 176.181, subd. 2, pertaining to workers' compensation insurance coverage. The Grantee's employees and agents will not be considered State employees. Any claims that may arise under the Minnesota Workers' Compensation Act on behalf of these employees and any claims made by any third party as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of these employees are in no way the State's obligation or responsibility.

**13 Publicity and Endorsement**

13.1 *Acknowledgments.* The Grantee agrees to acknowledge the State's financial support for the Project. Any statement, press release, bid, solicitation, or other document issued describing the Project shall provide information reflecting that State funds were used to support the Project and will contain the following language:

*This Project is made possible in part by a grant provided by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources; through an appropriation by the Minnesota State Legislature.*

Any site developed or improved by the Project shall display a sign, in a form approved by the State, stating the same information.

13.2 *Endorsement.* The Grantee must not claim that the State endorses its products or services.

**14 Governing Law, Jurisdiction, and Venue**

Minnesota law, without regard to its choice-of-law provisions, governs this grant contract. Venue for all legal proceedings out of this grant contract, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

**15 Termination**

15.1 *Termination by the State.* The State may immediately terminate this grant contract with or without cause, upon 30 days' written notice to the Grantee. Upon termination, the Grantee will be entitled to payment, determined on a pro rata basis, for services satisfactorily performed.

15.2 *Termination for Cause.* The State may immediately terminate this grant contract if the State finds that there has been a failure to comply with the provisions of this grant contract, that reasonable progress has not been made or that the purposes for which the funds were granted have not been or will not be fulfilled. The State may take action to protect the interests of the State of Minnesota, including the refusal to disburse additional funds and requiring the return of all or part of the funds already disbursed.

**16 Data Disclosure**

Under Minn. Stat. § 270C.65, Subd. 3, and other applicable law, the Grantee consents to disclosure of its social security number, federal employer tax identification number, and/or Minnesota tax identification number, already provided to the State, to federal and state tax agencies and state personnel involved in the payment of state obligations. These identification numbers may be used in the enforcement of federal and state tax laws which could result in action requiring the Grantee to file state tax returns and pay delinquent state tax liabilities, if any.

**17 Preservation of Tax Exempt Status**

In order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the G.O. Bonds, the Grantee agrees as follows:

A. It will not use the Real Property or, if applicable, Facility, or use or invest the G.O. Grant or any other sums treated as "bond proceeds" under Section 148 of the Code including "investment proceeds," "invested sinking funds," and "replacement proceeds," in such a manner as to cause the G.O. Bonds to be classified as "arbitrage bonds" under Section 148 of the Code.

B. It will, upon written request, provide the Commissioner of MMB all information required to satisfy the informational requirements set forth in the Code including, but not limited to, Sections 103 and 148 thereof, with respect to the G.O. Bonds.

C. It will, upon the occurrence of any act or omission by the Grantee or any Counterparty that could cause the interest on the G.O. Bonds to no longer be tax exempt and upon direction from the Commissioner of MMB, take such actions and furnish such documents as the Commissioner of MMB determines to be necessary to ensure that the interest to be paid on the G.O. Bonds is exempt from federal taxation, which such action may include either: (i) compliance with proceedings intended to classify the G.O. Bonds as a "qualified bond" within the meaning of Section 141(e) of the Code, (ii) changing the nature or terms of the Use Contract so that it complies with Revenue Procedure 97-13, 1997-1 CB 632, or (iii) changing the nature of the use of the Real Property or, if applicable, Facility so that none of the net proceeds of the G.O. Bonds will be used, directly or indirectly, in an "unrelated trade or business" or for any "private business use" (within the meaning of Sections 141(b) and 145(a) of the Code), or (iv) compliance with other Code provisions, regulations, or revenue procedures which amend or supersede the foregoing.

D. It will not otherwise use any of the G.O. Grant, including earnings thereon, if any, or take or permit to or cause to be taken any action that would adversely affect the exemption from federal income taxation of the interest on the G.O. Bonds, nor omit to take any action necessary to maintain such tax exempt status, and if it should take, permit, omit to take, or cause to be taken, as appropriate, any such action, it shall take all lawful actions necessary to rescind or correct such actions or omissions promptly upon having knowledge thereof.

**18 Use of State Bond- Financed Property, Deed Restrictions, and Real Estate Declarations**

"State bond- financed property" means property acquired or bettered in whole or in part with the proceeds of state general obligation bonds authorized to be issued under article XI, section 5, clause (u), of the Minnesota Constitution. Use of State bond- financed property must be operated in compliance with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes chapter 16A.695, all state and federal laws, and in a manner that will not cause the interest on the state general obligation bonds to be or become subject to federal income taxation for any reason.

Upon acquisition or betterment of any land and/or structures using these grant funds, Grantee shall record permanent deed restrictions requiring any new or future public structures on the parcels to be in strict conformance with adopted floodplain and shoreline standards.

Grantee shall record a declaration for real estate rights acquired or property bettered under this Agreement. The declaration must acknowledge the property rights or betterments were acquired in whole or in part with State general obligation bond funds and subject to the encumbrance created and requirements imposed by Minnesota Stat. Sec. 16A. Grantee shall submit a copy of the recorded real estate declaration for real estate acquired or bettered under this Grant to the State's Authorized Agent using the form in Attachment A of this Grant or on an alternative form pre- approved by the State.

Proof of recordation of the deed restrictions and declaration for each property acquired or bettered under the terms of this Agreement must be submitted to the State's authorized agent within 60 days of acquisition or betterment, and before final payment is made by the State to the Grantee.

**19 Invasive Species**

The DNR requires active steps to prevent or limit the introduction, establishment, and spread of invasive species during contracted work. The contractor shall take measures to prevent invasive species from entering land or spreading within a project site by cleaning equipment prior to arriving at the project site. If the equipment, vehicles, gear, or clothing arrives at the project site with soil, aggregate material, mulch, vegetation (including seeds) or animals, it shall be cleaned by contractor furnished tool or equipment (brush/broom, compressed air or pressure washer) at the staging area. The contractor shall dispose of material cleaned from equipment and clothing at a location determined by the DNR Contract Administrator. If the material cannot be disposed of onsite, secure material prior to transport (sealed container, covered truck, or wrap with tarp) and legally dispose of offsite.

**20 Jobs Reporting**

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 16A.633, subd. 4, the Grantee shall collect, maintain and, upon completion of the project, provide the information to the State on forms provided by the State.
