





School Bus Seat Belt Requirements - Senate Bill 546

**Background Information:**

In the 89th Legislative Session (2025), Senate Bill 546 was passed, strengthening requirements for seat belts on school buses. As part of the new requirements, school districts must report seat belt information at a public Board meeting and to the TEA by May 29, 2026. That information must include:

1. The number of buses operated by or contracted for use by the district that:
  - a. are not equipped with seat belts;
  - b. are equipped with two-point seat belts;
  - c. are equipped with three-point seat belts; and
  
2. The estimated cost to the district to equip all buses with three-point seat belts.

The new requirements also establish a date of September 1, 2029, that all buses

operated by or contracted for use by a district for the transportation of students must be equipped with a three-point seat belt for each passenger, including the driver.

Staff will provide an update to the Board with the required seat belt information, as well as a recommended replacement/retrofit plan.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES  
OF THE GEORGETOWN INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT  
REGARDING STUDENT AND EMPLOYEE RELIGIOUS EXPRESSION**

WHEREAS, The Georgetown Independent School District respects and honors the rich religious heritage of our nation and community; and

WHEREAS, Georgetown Independent School District has adopted and enforces policies to protect the religious freedom of its students and staff and provide opportunities for voluntary prayer and religious expression, including, but not limited to:

- Policy EMI (Local), which permits the academic study of religious symbols, texts and elements throughout the curriculum;
- Policy FNA (Local), which protects the rights of students to engage in voluntary expression of religious viewpoints at all school events at which a student is permitted to speak, protects the right of students to express religious beliefs in written and oral classroom assignments, and allows students to organize prayer groups, religious clubs, "see you at the pole" gatherings and other religious gatherings before, during, and after school;
- Policy FFH (Local) which protects students from discrimination or harassment on the basis of religion in connection with school activities;
- Policy DIA (Local), which prohibits discrimination, retaliation or harassment against employees on the basis of religion; and

WHEREAS Section 3 of Senate Bill 11 adopted by the 89<sup>th</sup> Regular Session requires this Board to take a record vote regarding adoption of a policy requiring every campus of the District to provide a period of prayer and reading of the Bible or other religious text as provided by Section 25.0823, Education Code:

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordered and resolved by the Board of Trustees of the Georgetown Independent School District that:

1. The Board of Trustees hereby finds that the facts recited above are true and correct;
2. The Board of Trustees hereby finds that this Resolution was considered at a duly called meeting held in conformance with the Texas Open Meetings Act; and
3. The Board of Trustees hereby confirms its commitment to safeguarding student and employee religious freedom and providing opportunities for voluntary student religious expression before, during, and after school, consistent with the District's existing policies, as those policies may be amended from time to time, the Constitution of the United States of America,

and the Texas Constitution.





**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF GEORGETOWN  
INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT CONCERNING PAYMENTS TO DISTRICT  
EMPLOYEES DURING EMERGENCY CLOSURE**

WHEREAS Georgetown High School was closed Wednesday, February 18, 2026 due to an emergency caused by a bomb threat;

WHEREAS the Georgetown ISD Board of Trustees acknowledges that during an emergency closing, most campus employees who are ready and willing to report to work are instructed not to report for work;

WHEREAS some employees worked at the reunifications site during the emergency closing;

WHEREAS some substitute teachers reported to work because they did not receive instructions to not report;

WHEREAS employees who were ready and willing to report to work are instructed not to report to work may suffer a loss of pay unless the workdays are made up at a later date;

WHEREAS a need exists to address wage payments for employees who were ready and willing to report to work but are idled and those who worked due to the emergency;

WHEREAS, the Board determines there is a public purpose served and a benefit to Georgetown ISD to demonstrate support for its employees, enhance employee morale, and support retention of employees; and

WHEREAS, the Board determines that compensating all Georgetown High School employees at their regular rate of pay, according to the duty schedule they otherwise would have worked during the time the campus was closed, and providing additional compensation to employees who worked during the emergency closure serves the public purposes of maintaining morale, reducing turnover, and ensuring continuity of District staffing when schools reopen.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**

1. All the above paragraphs are incorporated into and made a part of this resolution.
2. The Board authorizes the Superintendent or his designee to determine eligibility and pay wage payments to all Georgetown High School employees, who were ready and willing to report to work but who were unable to do so and all employees who voluntarily or were required to work on February 18, 2026, at their regular hourly or daily rate of pay, according to the duty schedule they otherwise would have worked on Wednesday, February 18, 2026, when the campus was closed due to an emergency caused by a bomb threat.
3. The Board also authorizes the Superintendent or his designee to determine eligibility and pay wage payments to substitute teachers who reported to work at their daily or half-day

rate of pay, according to the duty schedule they otherwise would have worked on Wednesday, February 18, 2026.

4. The wage payments authorized in Paragraph 2 above are in addition to any payments for actual hours worked made to non-exempt Georgetown High School employees who were required to work or voluntarily worked during the emergency closures at the campus or at a reunification site, as required by DEA(Local).
5. The above Resolution is passed and adopted on the 30th day of March 2026, by the Board of Trustees.

Consideration and Possible Approval of Updates to the District's Investment Policy CDA(Local)

**Background Information:**

At the Board meeting on February 2, the Board approved Hilltop Securities Asset Management, LLC (HSAM) to provide investment management services to Georgetown ISD. HSAM is recommending 3, red-lined changes to the District's investment policy, CDA(Local) which is attached.

The first change increases the acceptable maximum maturity of commercial paper (CP) from three to nine months. Allowing nine-month maximum maturities on CP purchases allows the District to lock-in favorable yields for longer periods, protecting a portion of current earnings against the potential for more aggressive rate cuts in future. The remaining 2 changes are minor "clean-up" changes.

The administration of District funds and the investment of those funds shall be handled as the highest public trust. Investments shall be made in a manner that shall provide the maximum security of principal with both liquidity and diversification limitations in order to meet the daily cash flow needs of the District.

This investment policy applies to all financial assets of the District.

**Investment Authority**

The chief financial officer and director of budget and finance or other person designated by Board resolution shall serve as the investment officer(s) of the District and shall invest District funds as directed by the Board and in accordance with the District's written investment policy and generally accepted accounting procedures. A registered investment adviser may be contracted to assist in the investment process.

**Investment Strategy**

The strategy for commingled funds shall be to ensure that cash flows are matched with adequate liquidity. This objective may be accomplished by purchasing high credit quality, short-term securities in a laddered structure, and using constant dollar investment pools and other liquid alternatives for liquidity.

The maximum dollar weighted average maturity for the total District portfolio shall be ~~360~~ 365 days. The maximum stated maturity of any specific investment shall not exceed two years, with the exception of capital project funds.

Investments of the following fund categories shall be consistent with this policy and in accordance with the strategies defined below.

Operating Funds

Investment strategies for operating funds (including any commingled pools containing operating funds) shall have as their primary objectives safety, investment liquidity, diversification, and maturities matched to meet anticipated cash flow requirements. A reasonable liquidity buffer shall be maintained for unexpected liabilities.

Custodial Funds

Investment strategies for custodial funds shall have as their primary objectives safety, investment liquidity, diversification, and maturities matched to meet anticipated cash flow requirements.

Debt Service Funds

Investment strategies for debt service funds shall have as their objective sufficient investment liquidity to timely meet debt service payment obligations in accordance with provisions in the bond documents. No future investments may be made until successive debt service payments are funded.

Investment strategies for capital project funds shall be structured to timely meet capital project obligations. If the District has funds from bond proceeds, the funds shall be invested in accordance with provisions in the policy and in the bond documents.

All Other Funds

Investment strategies for all other funds shall have as their primary objectives safety, investment liquidity, diversification and maturities matched to meet anticipated cash flow requirements.

Authorized  
Investments

From those investments authorized by law and described further in the Act and the District's CDA(LEGAL) policy, the Board shall permit investment of District funds, including bond proceeds and pledged revenue to the extent allowed by law, in only the following investment types, consistent with the strategies and maturities defined in this policy:

1. Obligations of, or guaranteed by, the U.S. Government, its agencies and instrumentalities not to exceed two years to stated maturity and excluding mortgage-backed securities. ~~For bond- For capital projects funds, the stated maturities y of these securities shall be matched to specific planned liabilities and not extend in maturity beyond the expenditure schedule of the bond funds invested.~~
2. Fully insured or collateralized certificates of deposit and share certificates with any bank or credit union in Texas under the terms of a written depository agreement, collateralized in accordance with this policy and not to exceed two years to stated maturity.
3. Fully collateralized repurchase agreements as defined by the Act with banks doing business in Texas or primary dealers, not to exceed 90 days to maturity, with 102 percent collateral held by a third party, and under the terms of an executed master repurchase agreement. Flex repurchase agreements may be used for bond proceeds, matched to the expenditure schedule and transacted under an executed Bond Market Master Agreement, not to exceed the expenditure schedule of proceeds.
4. Prime domestic banker's acceptances from a bank with a short-term rating not less than A1/P1 or equivalent, not to exceed six months to maturity.
5. Commercial paper rated no less than A1/P1 or its equivalent by two nationally recognized rating agencies, not to exceed ~~three-nine~~ months to stated maturity.
6. AAA-rated, SEC-registered money market mutual funds, which strive to maintain a \$1 net asset value.

**Commented [SM3]:** Allowing nine-month maximum maturities on CP purchases allows the District to lock in favorable yields for longer periods, protecting a portion of current earnings against the potential for more aggressive rate cuts in future.

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7. A guaranteed investment contract for use as an investment vehicle for bond proceeds, meeting the criteria and eligibility requirements of the Act.
8. ~~AAA-rated, C~~constant-dollar, local government investment pools as defined by the Act.
9. Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC)-brokered certificate of deposit securities from a bank in any state, delivered-versus-payment to the District's safekeeping agent, not to exceed one year to maturity. Before purchase, the investment officer(s) must verify the FDIC status of the bank with the FDIC to ensure coverage.
10. Fully insured or collateralized interest bearing accounts in any bank in Texas.
11. State and local government obligations of any state rated A or above by two nationally recognized rating agencies.

**Commented [SM4]:** For consistency with the AAA money fund rating requirement above. All pools used by the District are AAAM-rated.

The District may enter into a securities lending program with a bank in Texas or a primary dealer as defined by the Federal Reserve.

**Investment Objectives**

The main goal of the investment program is to ensure its safety and maximize financial returns within current market conditions in accordance with this policy. The investment officer(s) or adviser shall monitor financial market indicators, study financial trends, and utilize available educational tools in order to maintain appropriate investment managerial expertise. Investments shall be made in a manner that ensures the preservation of capital in the overall portfolio. No investment transactions shall be undertaken that jeopardize the capital position of the overall portfolio.

**Liquidity**

The District's investment portfolio shall have sufficient liquidity to meet anticipated cash flow requirements and shall adhere to the investment strategy approved annually by the Board.

**Diversification**

The investment portfolio shall be diversified in terms of investment instruments, maturity scheduling, and financial institutions to reduce risk of loss resulting from over-concentration of assets in a specific class of investments, specific maturity, or specific issuer.

**Yield**

The benchmark for the District's portfolio shall be the one-year U.S. Treasury Bill from the comparable period, designated for its comparability to the expected average cash flow pattern and maximum weighted average maturity of the portfolio. The investment program shall seek to augment returns above this threshold consistent with risk limitations identified herein and prudent investment policies.

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**Collateralization**

All cash, collateral, and investments of the District shall be held by an independent third party with whom the District has a current safekeeping/custodial agreement. The District shall retain clearly marked receipts providing proof of the District's ownership.

Time and Demand

Collateralization shall be required on all bank time and demand deposits over the applicable FDIC insurance coverage. All securities pledged to the District for these deposits shall be held by an independent third-party institution outside the holding company of the pledging bank.

In order to anticipate market changes and provide a level of additional security for all funds, the market value of the collateral shall be maintained at 102 percent of total principal and accrued interest for treasury and agency securities or 110 percent for mortgage-backed securities. The depository shall be responsible for monitoring and maintaining the collateral and margins daily. The custodian shall provide monthly reports to the District detailing the collateral.

Collateral shall be pledged under the terms of a written depository agreement executed under the terms of the Financial Institutions Resource and Recovery Enforcement (FIRREA). (If the custodian is the Federal Reserve, the District shall execute as an alternate an FRB Pledgee Agreement of Circular 7 form.) The agreement shall be approved by resolution of the bank's board or loan committee.

Acceptable collateral shall include only obligations of the U.S. Government, its agencies and instrumentalities, including mortgage backed securities passing the bank test and excluding letters of credit, and municipal securities rated A or better by two nationally recognized rating agencies. A monthly report of collateral shall be provided directly from the custodian.

Collateral under a repurchase agreement shall be owned by the District. It shall be held by an independent third-party safekeeping agent approved by the District under an executed Master Repurchase Agreement. Collateral with a market value totaling 102 percent of the principal and accrued interest shall be required, and the counter-party shall be responsible for the monitoring and maintaining of collateral and margins daily.

**Sellers of  
Investments**

Prior to handling investments on behalf of the District, a broker/dealer or a qualified representative of a business organization must submit required written documents in accordance with law. [See Sellers of Investments, CDA(LEGAL)]

Representatives of brokers/dealers and representatives with distributors of investment pools shall be registered with the Texas

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State Securities Board ~~and must have membership in the Securities Investor Protection Corporation (SIPC)~~ and be in good standing with the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (FINRA). Distributors of investment pools shall also be a registrant in good standing with the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (MSRB).

**Commented [SM5]:** I recommend removing the SIPC language because it implies coverage that isn't applicable. The District would never hold securities or cash with a broker/dealer, and if it did, SIPC coverage is minimal, intended for retail customers.

**Authorized Financial Brokers / Dealers and Institutions**

In order to get the best return on its investments, the District may solicit bids in writing, by telephone, or electronically, or by a combination of these methods.

**Internal Controls**

Internal controls shall be established and documented in writing and shall be designed to protect against losses of public funds arising from fraud, employee error, misrepresentation by third parties, unanticipated changes in financial markets, or imprudent actions by employees and officers of the District. Controls shall include:

1. Separation of transaction authority from accounting and recordkeeping and electronic transfer of funds.
2. Avoidance of collusion.
3. Custodial safekeeping.
4. Clear delegation of authority.
5. Written confirmation of all transactions.
6. Documentation of transactions.

These controls shall be reviewed by the District's independent auditing firm.

**Monitoring FDIC Status**

The investment officer(s) shall monitor on no less than a weekly basis, the status and ownership of all banks issuing brokered certificates of deposits owned by the District based on information from the FDIC. If any bank has been acquired or merged with another bank in which brokered certificates of deposits are owned by the District, the investment officer or adviser shall immediately liquidate any brokered certificates of deposits security that place the District above the FDIC insurance level.

**Competitive Transactions**

All investments shall be purchased or sold on a competitive basis with bids or offers from three authorized brokers/dealers for the best yield and maturity. Offers of new issue agencies need not be competitively bid but must be compared to comparable maturity securities on the secondary market.

**Monitoring Credit Ratings**

The investment officer or investment adviser shall monitor, on no less than a monthly basis, the credit rating on all authorized investments in the portfolio based upon independent information from a nationally recognized rating agency. If any security falls below the

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minimum rating required by policy, the investment officer or adviser shall notify the Board of the loss of rating, conditions affecting the rating and possible loss of principal with liquidation options available at the next meeting after the loss of the required rating.

**Delivery Versus  
Payment Settlement**

All security transactions, including collateral for repurchase agreements, shall be conducted on a delivery-versus-payment (DVP) basis. Securities shall be held by an independent third-party custodian designated by the District and evidenced by original safekeeping receipts.

At the February DPC meeting, the committee voted to make two adjustments to the District of Innovation Plan as a response to the 2025 Legislative Session.

House Bill 6 removed a district's ability to exempt from anything in Chapter 37 of the Texas Education Code, which relates to school discipline. Our current DOI plan has two exemptions from Chapter 37 in it: the designation of a campus behavior coordinator and removal of students to DAEP for possession of vapes. The DPC unanimously voted to delete these two pieces of the DOI since they are no longer permitted to be in the plan.

## GEORGETOWN ISD DISTRICT OF INNOVATION PLAN

### COLLECTIVE DISTRICT OF INNOVATION COMMITTEE STATEMENT

As a collective group of community and district stakeholders, we enjoyed the opportunity to engage in this process and explore the designation of District of Innovation (“DOI”). By bringing together a wide range of perspectives in such a collaborative environment, we were able to design a plan that we feel will help us reach the full potential of the Georgetown ISD Learner Profile.

From the beginning, we were given full authority to organically create a plan and engaged in open dialogue, disagreements, deep discussion, consensus building and voting for collective approval for the plan as presented. Although a multitude of exemptions are allowable under such a designation, the committee feels that the plan presented best encompasses exemptions that align with the District’s vision, mission and strategic plan.

Opportunities for school districts to customize teaching, learning and operations are rare, and we felt like it was our moral imperative to pursue it. **Signed by the District of Innovation Committee.**

### STATUTE RECOMMENDED FOR EXEMPTION TEC §25.0811 FIRST DAY OF INSTRUCTION

#### CONNECTION TO STRATEGIC PLAN

Georgetown ISD’s Strategic Plan includes the following Belief Statements that guide our actions and decisions related to this recommended exemption:

- **Developing leaders is vital to our success.** Leadership development at all levels drives our performance as a district, and viability as a thriving community.
- **Instruction should be designed based on the needs of the learners.** Learners require customized, well-designed educational experience that develop their unique interests and talents to create a passion for learning.
- **It is our responsibility to prepare students for their future.** A growth mindset, ongoing evaluation, and adaptation are critical in our evolving and growing society.

#### RATIONALE

Currently, the first day of school may not be held prior to the fourth Monday of August.

**Proposed Changes:** Current statute prevents the District from designing calendars that best meet the needs of students. Having the flexibility to set the start date allows the district to determine locally, on an annual basis, what best meets the needs of the students and our community. This empowers us to personalize and customize learning for all District learners, including teachers and staff through professional development, and allows us to balance the amount of instructional time per semester. In addition, by having flexibility in the start and end of the school year, students will be able to enroll in college courses that start in early June, thereby increasing college and career readiness.

Removing the constraints of the current uniform start date will allow Georgetown ISD to implement a possible short first



week, easing the transition for students entering kindergarten, middle school, and high school, ultimately allowing for more flexible professional development opportunities and preparation time for our staff.

#### PARAMETERS

- The District, through the recommendation of the District Performance Council, shall determine locally, on an annual basis, the upcoming school year calendar.
- The District will design and adopt a calendar with a school start date that begins on or after the second Wednesday of August and ends no later than the first week of June.

**TEC §11.253 CAMPUS PLANNING AND SITE-BASED DECISION-MAKING**

#### CONNECTION TO STRATEGIC PLAN

Georgetown ISD's Strategic Plan is explicit about the desire and expectation to "invite deeper participation and gather input in decision-making through recurring engagement opportunities that connect students, parents, teachers/staff, and community members." The requirements in content and format of the district improvement plan have shifted an otherwise important planning process into a bureaucratic process that detracts from the importance of thoughtful planning and implementation. As a learning organization, Georgetown ISD is committed to deepening clarity and impact of strategic direction by collectively measuring progress, identifying future explorations, and cultivating collaboration and engagement.

#### RATIONALE

GISD has a strong history of involving teachers, administrators, parents, community members and students in the decision-making process. We are committed to maintaining that same level of engagement with our stakeholders. It is our intent to align our District Improvement Plan to the vision, mission, beliefs and goals that these same stakeholders have developed and embraced as the key drivers for our district planning and decision-making structure. The items listed in TEC §11.251 detailing the selection of representatives for the District Improvement Committee will continue to be implemented. However, the items listed in TEC §11.252(a)-(e) and 11.253(a)-(h) of a compliance nature will no longer be implemented and will be replaced by relevant components of the Georgetown ISD Strategic Plan.

#### PARAMETERS

To assure both collaboration and collective ownership while accomplishing alignment between the Georgetown ISD Strategic Plan and District Improvement Plan, we will take the following steps:

- Review district performance data from a wide variety of sources, including but not limited to: state, district, campus and classroom assessments that align to the Learner Profile and High Priority Learning Standards; data that informs the district about the physical, mental and emotional wellness of students; and multiple measures that reflect community engagement, value and perception about the progress of the district.
- Identify strengths and weaknesses in student and programmatic performance.
- Through local sources, including but not limited to the District/Campus Performance Committee, develop annual plans for improvement that align to the district's vision, mission, beliefs, goals, and Learner Profile.
- Report to the Board of Trustees the status of the district's Strategic Plan and future actions to continue our efforts in achieving the district's vision, mission, and beliefs.
- Adapt teaching and programs driven by student needs based on an ongoing review of student performance



data, both academic and behavioral.

- Provide regular reports to the community on the status of the school district and campuses through a Community Based Accountability System.

### STATUTE RECOMMENDED FOR EXEMPTION

#### **TEC §25.092 MINIMUM ATTENDANCE FOR CLASS CREDIT OR FINAL GRADE**

#### **CONNECTION TO STRATEGIC PLAN**

The GISD Strategic Plan emphasizes the importance of instruction designed based on the needs of the learners. One of the overarching goals in the Strategic Plan within the focus area of providing engaging and challenging learning is to implement tools, resources and training that support personalized learning for both students and teachers. GISD is committed to developing a future-ready learning experience that reflects student voice, choice and ownership. Strategies to achieve this goal include designing and activating personalized learning experiences focused on the Learner Profile and High Priority Learning Standards. Having the flexibility to deliver instruction through a combination of time in class and time spent learning online, is one example where exemption from Section 25.092 will likely foster greater innovation to promote active learning and improve student outcomes. As a District, we will need to allocate resources, technology and collaborative spaces that reflect a student’s need for choice and also create opportunities to address physical, mental and emotional wellness. In addition, exemption from this requirement will allow the district not to penalize students who miss class due to legitimate school activities and will promote student engagement, as well as social and emotional development, by encouraging more students to participate in such activities.

#### **RATIONALE**

The Minimum Attendance for Class Credit or Final Grade requirement is also referred to as the “90% rule”. Currently, state law requires students to attend class 90% of the school days the class is offered in order to earn credit. The law requires the District to award class credit to students based on "seat time" and traditional reporting methods, rather than based on mastery of the learning that students may demonstrate in ways that reflect choice, acceleration, and personalized pacing. The GISD DOI Plan would maintain a minimum attendance percentage for traditional classes, while allowing for flexibility in students demonstrating mastery of content through an innovative system and at a more flexible pace. Relief from Section 25.092 does not in any way impact or alter existing compulsory attendance requirements or University Interscholastic League (“UIL”) rules. Moreover, opting out of Section 29.092 in no way limits or modifies a teacher’s right to determine the finality of a grade in accordance with Texas Education Code § 28.0214, nor does it restrict or alter a teacher’s right to assign grades in accordance with Texas Education Code § 28.026. The district will continue to explore the evolving educational needs of our learners and systems in which students can demonstrate mastery, as well as research and examine current institutional constraints that may inhibit this innovation.

#### **PARAMETERS**

- Continue to utilize representative committees, such as the Curriculum Advisory Council, to develop specific systems for innovative approaches to earning course credits.
- Examine different formats and instructional strategies, such as online coursework, blended coursework, dual enrollment, early college, performance tasks, community based learning, independent study, mentorships, and credit recovery for optimum student engagement.
- Examine non-traditional opportunities and assessment mechanisms for students to demonstrate mastery of High Priority Learning Standards at all grade levels as practicable.



- Design and activate personalized learning experiences focused on the Learner Profile and High Priority Learning Standards.
- Explore a Learning Management System that allows teachers to design and customize learning experiences for students.
- Provide appropriate resources to monitor and facilitate appropriate subject-based acceleration and personalized learning, considering learning styles and preferences.
- Deploy a professional learning system that is personalized and cultivates continuous learning.
- Examine and implement multiple measures of assessment to monitor student growth and engagement in learning.

### STATUTE RECOMMENDED FOR EXEMPTION

#### **TEC §21.003 TEACHER CERTIFICATION**

#### **CONNECTION TO STRATEGIC PLAN**

Georgetown ISD's Strategic Plan includes the following Belief Statements that guide our actions and decisions related to this recommended exemption:

- **Instruction should be designed based on the needs of the learners.** Learners require customized, well-designed educational experience that develop their unique interests and talents to create a passion for learning.
- **It is our responsibility to prepare students for their future.** A growth mindset, ongoing evaluation, and adaptation are critical in our evolving and growing society.

#### **RATIONALE**

The district is committed to providing an excellent learning experience for students and validates the need for certified teachers.

The instructional plan and offerings for students can be impacted if a quality candidate cannot be found to teach a course due to lack of certification. The district is pursuing this exemption to provide greater flexibility for hiring individuals who are knowledgeable and equipped to fill positions other than bilingual, special education, or PreK. Flexibility in this area will assist the district in finding quality candidates in order to avoid the disruption of an instructional path for students. The exemption from Texas Education Code 21.003 will enable the district to locally certify teachers through a grow your own program in areas of high demand, to better meet the educational needs of our students today and into the future with a sustained plan of filling our teacher pipeline. In addition, this exemption will afford the District the opportunity to hire professionals in certain trades and vocations to teach the crafts of those trades and vocations (such as fine arts, etc.).

#### **PARAMETERS**

The District will establish its own local qualification requirements in lieu of the requirements set forth in Texas Education Code § 21.003. This exemption will only be exercised in a limited way in specific situations, adhering to all Chapter 22, Subchapter C, Criminal History requirements, including fingerprinting, and all applicable Board policies. Individuals hired under this exemption will be provided with district-identified training, resources and support.



### STATUTE RECOMMENDED FOR EXEMPTION

#### **TEC §37.0012 DESIGNATION OF CAMPUS BEHAVIOR COORDINATOR**

### CONNECTION TO STRATEGIC PLAN

Georgetown ISD's Strategic Plan includes the following Belief Statement that guides our actions and decisions related to this recommended exemption:

- Our actions should be student-centered. All children deserve positive relationships with caring adults who recognize their potential and attend to the needs of the whole child.

### RATIONALE

Implementation of TEC 37.0012 limits the ability of children to develop positive relationships with a variety of adults who have a vested interest in their mental and emotional development and wellness. Current law restricts the ability of campus administrators and educators to focus on each student's needs through a collaborative disciplinary approach.

A collaborative disciplinary approach will be developed at the campus level and may include: educators, counselors, and administrators. The Assistant Principal/Administrator most closely related to the disciplinary situation will contact the responsible adult of the student(s) involved. Each campus will undergo a development plan process that collaboratively creates a chain of communication that best meets the needs of the campus.

### STATUTES RECOMMENDED FOR EXEMPTION

#### **TEC §21.352 TEACHER APPRAISAL SYSTEM**

#### **TEC §21.354 – APPRAISAL FOR ADMINISTRATORS OTHER THAN PRINCIPALS**

#### **TEC §21.3541 – APPRAISAL AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SYSTEM FOR PRINCIPALS**

### CONNECTION TO STRATEGIC PLAN

Georgetown ISD's Strategic Plan includes Strategies and the following Action Plan related to this recommended exemption:

- Develop a teacher evaluation system connected to our mission, vision, beliefs and goals.
- Explore/research leadership behaviors/practices; evaluation process for all district administration teams.

### RATIONALE

A committee of administrators and teachers will have the option to develop a system that includes focus on our local emphasis, such as tenants of the Learner Profile and goals of the Strategic Plan. In order to promote professional development that focuses on individual growth, the District needs to maintain local flexibility to continue its multiple observations, goal setting and tracking, and evaluation measures on teacher and administrator appraisals. This appraisal system would also prohibit the use of standardized test scores from being utilized to evaluate teacher and administrator performance; instead focusing on the overall portfolio of the person being appraised. Having our own appraisal system for all GISD staff will allow us to create individualized learning plans for all district employees.

### PARAMETERS

- We will follow T-TESS and T-PSS until a new system is developed.



- Should we include a student growth measure, it will be a district developed method.
- Georgetown ISD will implement a locally developed teacher and principal evaluation tool.
- The GISD evaluation instrument will be developed collaboratively by district administration, campus administration, and teachers. It will employ staff input, T-TESS, T-PESS, goals from the Strategic Plan, Learner Profile attributes, and other relevant best practices.
- All campus teachers will continue to be formally evaluated within the timelines specified by a district adopted appraisal cycle. Every teacher will receive a minimum of 6 informal walk-throughs per year.
- Principals, Assistant Principals, Campus Administrators, other campus professional staff, and other members of the District Leadership Team will continue to be evaluated on an annual basis through a locally developed instrument.
- Locally developed evaluation instruments and processes should include continuous feedback that reflects individual strengths, growth opportunities, and the pursuit of campus and district goals.

#### STATE RECOMMENDED FOR EXEMPTION

#### TEC §37.006 MANDATORY DISCIPLINARY ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM PLACEMENT FOR E-CIGARETTES

#### CONNECTION TO STRATEGIC PLAN

Georgetown ISD's Strategic Plan includes the following Strategic Priority Areas and Objectives that guide our actions and decisions related to this recommended exemption:

- Student and Staff Wellbeing: In GISD, caring adults advocate for students and help them make safe, healthy choices.
- Student and Staff Wellbeing: GISD students are treated with respect and are respectful to each other and to adults.

#### RATIONALE

Legislation from the 88th Texas Legislative Session (2023) established a requirement for how schools must administer disciplinary consequences concerning e-cigarettes on campus property. The law no longer differentiates between the substance of an e-cigarette (i.e. nicotine or THC) and mandates schools to treat e-cigarette violations the same. Under this legislation, students who are observed possessing, using, selling, giving, or delivering to another person an e-cigarette will be recommended for a mandatory disciplinary alternative education program placement (GAP). This requirement for nicotine e-cigarettes is not in alignment with current law and policy concerning nicotine or tobacco products other than e-cigarettes. By making this offense a mandatory placement to DAEP, it removes the ability of an administrator to consider the whole child and make the best possible placement decision for the student. This exemption provides the flexibility of campus and district administrators to manage student discipline in a way that is consistent with current law and GISD policy regarding tobacco products.

#### PARAMETERS

- Currently, the consequences for other forms of tobacco, such as cigarettes and chewing tobacco, are campus-based disciplinary actions such as In-School Suspension (ISS).
- The offense of a student possessing, using, selling, giving, or delivering to another person an e-cigarette will



result in campus-based disciplinary actions, such as ISS, or a discretionary placement at the GISD disciplinary alternative education program placement (DAEP):

- This approach would align our consequences based on the substance and not the method of delivery.
- In addition, the approach allows our administrators to have discretion in ensuring that students are assigned the most appropriate disciplinary consequences when considering all mitigating factors.
- All marijuana/THC related infractions would continue to result in mandatory DAEP placements

## STATUTE RECOMMENDED FOR EXEMPTION

### **TEC §33.002 SCHOOL COUNSELOR CERTIFICATION**

#### **CONNECTION TO STRATEGIC PLAN**

Georgetown ISD's Strategic Plan includes the following Belief Statements that guide our actions and decisions related to this recommended exemption:

- It is our responsibility to prepare students for their future. A growth mindset, ongoing evaluation, and adaptation are critical in our evolving and growing society.
- It is our responsibility to prioritize student well-being and implement both individual and systemic support so students are psychologically safe and prepared to learn.
- Our actions should be student-centered. All children deserve positive relationships with caring adults who recognize their potential and attend to the needs of the whole child.
- GISD's Strategic plan emphasizes creating opportunities to address physical, mental, and emotional wellness.

#### **RATIONALE**

The district is committed to providing an excellent learning experience for students and recognizes the need to address the whole child in this effort. While all staff members play a role in this effort, the district recognizes the emphasized role and need for the professional and certified school counselor. School counselors are specifically trained to lead this effort by providing a comprehensive school counseling program which aligns to the Texas Model for Comprehensive Counseling. The district is experiencing difficulty in hiring certified school counselors as the need for these positions across the State of Texas has resulted in a shortage of candidates to fill the number of vacancies. The district is pursuing this exemption to provide greater flexibility to fill school counselor positions. The personal/social support for a student can be negatively impacted if a quality candidate cannot be found to fill the role of the professional school counselor. Flexibility in this area will assist the district in finding quality candidates to fill the role of a school counselor in order to prevent students from failing to benefit from the programming offered by the school counselor. The exemption from TEC § 33.002 will enable the district to establish local criteria for hiring quality personnel.

#### **PARAMETERS**

The District will establish its own local qualification requirements for the certified school counselor in lieu of the requirements set forth in TEC § 33.002 .

- Individuals considered for the professional school counselor position will remain mental health professionals with a Master's degree or higher and licensed by the Texas Behavioral Health Council to include licenses in the following:
  - Those licensed through the Texas State Board of Social Works- Licensed Master Social Worker (LMSW), Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), and Licensed Clinical Social Worker- Supervisor (LCSW-S)



- Those licensed through the Texas State Board of Professional Counselors Licensed Professional Counselor, Licensed Professional Counselor Associate, and Licensed Professional Counselor- Supervisor
- All counselors in GISD, including those hired subject to this exception, will align all work to the existing Texas Model for Comprehensive School Counseling. Hired individuals would function solely in the role and assume the same limitations as the professional school counselor, and not perform any additional duties, even if those duties are allowed under their licensure with a Texas Behavioral Health Board.
- This exemption will only be exercised in a limited way in specific situations, adhering to the current policy of contract approval by the Board.
- Individuals hired under this exemption will be provided with district-identified or-developed training, resources and support.

## RESOLUTION DETERMINING NEED

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF GISD, DETERMINING A PUBLIC NECESSITY TO ACQUIRE CERTAIN PROPERTY; GIVING NOTICE OF AN OFFICIAL DETERMINATION TO ACQUIRE PROPERTY FOR THE GISD; AND ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES FOR THE ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY.

WHEREAS, in order to promote public health, safety, and welfare, public convenience and necessity require the acquisition of land in the Northeast quadrant of the district on which to establish and operate educational facilities and other related facilities for the GISD ("GISD") on the sites described herein below;

WHEREAS, in order to establish these educational and other related facilities, it will be necessary and convenient that the Superintendent, his agents, representatives, or employees, acquire fee title to certain properties and exchange fee title to certain properties for the purpose of construction, reconstruction, operation, and maintenance of the educational and other related facilities and appurtenances thereto; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to determine procedures for the establishment and approval of just compensation for the parcel to be acquired for the GISD as well as to undertake all necessary due diligence in the consideration of each such parcel's acceptability for use by the GISD; now, therefore;

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE GISD:

PART I: That the Board of Trustees of GISD hereby officially determines that there is a public necessity for, and the public welfare and convenience will be served by, the acquisition of the property by contract, or by other means including eminent domain proceedings, described as follows:

***Approximately 14.6 acres more or less, in the Northeast quadrant of the District, including all necessary roadway, utility and other easements over, across or on adjacent or nearby property (the "Acquired Property", including any amendments or revisions to the description thereof);***

And it is GISD's intention to acquire the Acquired Property as set out and described hereinabove in the boundaries of GISD for purposes of establishing and operating educational and other related facilities.

PART 2: That the Superintendent, his agents, representatives, or employees are hereby authorized in connection with acquisition of the Acquired Property to:

Determine the exact amount and location of the Acquired Property needed by GISD;

Hire such engineers, surveyors, appraisers, title companies, architects, attorneys and other persons or entities needed to economically effect the laying out and design of the facilities, the establishment and acquisition of fee title to the Acquired Property for the construction of the educational and other related facilities;

Enter into a development agreement with the owner of the Acquired Property for the construction of infrastructure necessary to serve the GISD facilities;

Enter upon any property necessary for the purpose of surveying, conducting studies, establishing the title to the properties, determining adequate compensation for fee titles and other relevant property interests, and to conduct tests;

Negotiate with the owner(s) of any such properties for the purpose thereof, including the owner of the properties;

To purchase fee title to properties necessary for the purposes stated herein and execute all documents necessary to acquire such properties;

To acquire easements on adjacent or nearby property, and to grant easements over the properties, and to enter into development agreements, necessary for the purposes stated herein and execute all documents necessary for such actions;

Take whatever further actions are deemed appropriate to economically effect the establishment of the educational and other related facilities.

PART 3: That the Superintendent and the GISD's real estate agent or other staff appraiser, or independent appraiser, if necessary in the judgment of the Superintendent, shall present relevant information to the Superintendent necessary to establish the value of the Acquired Property. Based upon such examination of said relevant information, the GISD real estate agent, or appraiser, if any, shall make a recommendation to the Superintendent as to the establishment and approval of the amount of just compensation for each property.

PART 4: After review and consideration of all said information or recommendations, and consultation with the Board of Trustees, the Superintendent shall establish and approve the amount to be determined to be just compensation for the acquisition of the Acquired Property.

PART 5: That the Superintendent is hereby authorized to endorse, sign, transfer or enter into agreements for the purchase and consummation of the Acquired Property and to execute and deliver any and all documents necessary for the purchase and development of the Acquired Property, including, but not limited to, a deeds, closing statements, development agreements, and similar documentation necessary for the development of the properties to be used as an educational facility.

PART 6: That this resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.

Approval of Good Cause Exception to Armed Peace Officer and Alternative Standard

**Background Information:**

As you know GISD is required to have an armed peace officer at every school. For school districts who are not able to meet this requirement due to financial and/or hiring constraints, the district can execute a good cause exception AND implement an alternative standard. As you also know, GISD is not able to fund the staffing of a school resource officer at every campus, nor is Georgetown PD able to staff those positions should funding be available. In order to do so would be in excess of \$200,000/officer annually (including equipment and training) and would require that we hire 14 addition police officers. GISD is currently operating on a good cause exception for the above reasons and requests another year of this exception. Additionally, GISD is operating under an alternative standard of placing Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE) commissioned School Marshals. GISD currently staffs 14 School Marshal positions. This resolution establishes the same need for the good cause exception AND explains the alternative standard of school marshals.

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF GEORGETOWN  
INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT CONCERNING A GOOD CAUSE EXCEPTION  
TO ARMED COMMISSIONED PEACE OFFICER REQUIREMENTS AND  
ALTERNATIVE STANDARD**

WHEREAS, beginning September 1, 2023, Section 37.0814 of the Texas Education Code requires the board of trustees of each school district to determine the appropriate number of armed security officers for each district campus;

WHEREAS Section 37.0814 of the Texas Education Code further requires the board to ensure that at least one armed security officer who is a commissioned peace officer (a school district peace officer, a school resource officer, or a commissioned peace officer employed as security personnel) is present during regular school hours at each district campus;

WHEREAS Section 37.0814 of the Texas Education Code provides that if the board of trustees of a school district is unable to comply with this section beginning September 1, 2023, the board may claim a good cause exception if the district's noncompliance is due to the availability of funding or qualified personnel;

WHEREAS Georgetown ISD works closely with the Georgetown Police Department on school safety issues;

WHEREAS Georgetown Police Department currently provides seven (7) school resource officers (SROs) who are commissioned peace officers with the Georgetown including an SRO stationed at six (6) of secondary school campuses and a supervising sergeant of the SRO Unit;

WHEREAS the Georgetown Police Department SROs are stationed at a particular campus, but serve as needed in other areas and/or at other campuses as mutually agreed upon between the Chief of Police and the Superintendent of Schools;

WHEREAS, prior to the legislature's passage of this new requirement, the Georgetown Police Department already had open peace officer positions that it has been unable to fill due to the lack of qualified applicants;

WHEREAS Georgetown ISD's budgeted revenue for the 2025-2026 school year is \$167,932,603;

WHEREAS, prior to the legislature's passage of this new requirement, Georgetown ISD's budgeted expenditures were \$176,782 less than its revenue at \$167,932,603, including \$540,600 for SROs and directly related expenses;

WHEREAS the addition of thirteen (13) SROs for a total of nineteen (19), to be stationed at each of the District's campuses, plus a sergeant and lieutenant, is estimated to cost an additional \$3,098,500 annually.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Trustees of Georgetown Independent School District hereby determines that, due to a lack of available qualified personnel

and a lack of available revenue, the School District is unable to ensure that at least one armed commissioned peace officer, as defined by law, is present during regular school hours at each district campus;

**BE IF FURTHER RESOLVED** that the alternative standard as required by Texas Education Code section 37.0814(d-1) is that all campuses will have at least one armed security officer as defined by Texas Education Code section 37.0814(a) or a school marshal or school employee or contractor as defined by Texas Education Code section 37.0814(d). Specifically, Georgetown ISD will have approximately **fourteen** (14) school marshals.

**FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of Georgetown Independent School Districts directs District administration to continue in its efforts to ensure the safety of each of Georgetown ISD's campuses.



### Instructions for sample order of cancellation:

To cancel an election, the governing body must first receive and accept the Certification of Unopposed Candidates form (or the authority may create its own form) from the authority responsible for preparing the ballot. The cancellation order/ordinance must be adopted in an open meeting. The candidates are not required to be present. Certificates of election should be prepared for each unopposed candidate; however, the certificates of election should not be issued until after Election Day, as follows. Section 2.053 provides that the certificate of election shall be issued "in the same manner and at the same time" as for a candidate elected at an election. Therefore, the candidates, who have been declared "elected" at the meeting ordering the cancellation, must wait until after the official election day (even though no election is held) and no earlier than the prescribed canvassing period (even though no canvass is held) to be sworn in and assume their duties. Candidates may complete the Statement of Elected Officer prior to Election Day. The Statement should be kept locally; it does not need to be sent to the Secretary of State's Office. Copies of this order/ordinance must be posted on Election Day at each polling place that would have been used had the election not been cancelled.

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#### An election\* may be cancelled if:

- 1) The election is one in which a declaration of write-in candidacy is required; and
- 2) No opposed at-large race is on the ballot\* within that election;\*and
- 3) Each candidate whose name is to appear on the ballot\* is unopposed, with some exceptions;

This means:

- In an all at-large election\* (with no single-member districts), if there is one or more opposed at-large races, then all the races go on the ballot within that election.\*
- In an election\* in which any members of the governing body are elected from single-member districts, an election in a particular district may be cancelled if the candidate is unopposed and the election otherwise meets the above requirements (i.e., there is no at-large opposed race on the ballot).

**Note:** A general election (for full terms) or a special election (to fill a vacancy in an unexpired term) is considered a *separate election* with a *separate ballot* for purposes of these tests, even if held on the same election date. See our online Cancellation guide for details.

### Instrucciones para el ejemplo de orden de cancelación:

*Para cancelar una elección, la entidad gobernante primero debe recibir y aceptar, de la autoridad responsable para preparar la boleta, el formulario de Certificación para Candidatos Sin Oposición (o la autoridad puede crear su propio formulario) de la autoridad responsable para preparar la boleta. La orden/ordenanza de cancelación debe ser adoptada en una reunión abierta. No se requiere que los candidatos estén presentes. Se debe preparar un certificado de elección para cada candidato sin oposición; sin embargo, los certificados de elección no se deben emitir hasta el Día de las Elecciones, así como se detalla a continuación. La sección 2.053 indica que el certificado de elección será publicado "en la misma manera y al mismo tiempo" para un candidato elegido en una elección. Por lo tanto, los candidatos que hayan sido declarados "elegido" en la reunión de la cancelación, deben esperar hasta después del día oficial de elecciones (aunque no se hayan llevado una elección) y no antes del período prescrito de la campaña política (aunque no se lleve a cabo la campaña política) a ser jurados y asumir sus deberes. Los candidatos pueden llenar la Declaración de Funcionario Elegido antes del Día de las Elecciones. Este documento se debe mantener en los archivos locales. No es necesario enviarlo a la Oficina del Secretario de Estado. El Día de las Elecciones se debe exhibir una copia de esta orden/ordenanza en todos los sitios de votación que se hubieran utilizado en la elección si no hubiera sido cancelada.*

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#### Una elección\* puede ser cancelada si:

- 1) *la elección es una en la que se requiere una declaración de candidatos por escrito en la boleta de votación; y,*
- 2) *no hay oposición para la carrera por acumulación en la boleta\* de votación dentro de esa elección\* y*
- 3) *Todos los candidatos cuyos nombres deben aparecer en la boleta\* de votación no tienen oposición, con unas excepciones;*

*Esto significa:*

- *En una elección\* por acumulación (sin ningún distrito con miembro único), si se encuentra una o más de una carrera por acumulación con oposición, entonces todas las carreras estarán en la boleta dentro de esa elección\*.*
- *En una elección\* en la que cualquiera de los miembros de la entidad gobernante se eligen de distritos con un solo miembro, se puede cancelar una elección en un distrito específico si hay oposición para el candidato y la elección cumple con los requisitos que anteceden (ej. no hay oposición para la carrera por acumulación en la boleta).*

**Nota:** Una elección general (con términos completos) o una elección especial (para llenar una vacante de un término no vencido) es considerada como una elección distinta con una boleta distinta con los propósitos de estas pruebas, aunque se lleven a cabo en la misma fecha electoral.
