CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE/MOMENT OF SILENCE

Chairman Wilson called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. and asked the audience to stand for the singing of the National Anthem by the Chippens Hill Harmonizers and the Northeast Express Singers under the direction of Mrs. Lomaglio. The audience remained standing for the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was observed for Mary Bachand a Teacher from 1950 to 1985 and Henry Schilling a Custodian at Memorial Boulevard.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

On motion by Commissioner Hintz and seconded by Commissioner Scott it was unanimously

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Operations Committee

Commissioner Hintz reported that the committee met on September 20th and they received an update from Greg Boulanger regarding the Community Eligibility Provision and thus far, breakfast participation has increased significantly at West Bristol, which was one of the goals of this program sustainability. The committee also heard a report from Peter Fusco regarding the state grant we received for renovations at our schools. We are replacing some of the street lights in the parking lots of some of the schools with LED lights which should yield cost savings. Questions followed regarding the timeline for installation.

Policy Committee

Commissioner Taylor reported that the committee has six or seven policy revisions coming up later on the agenda. The regular scheduled meeting was canceled due to Columbus Day, so the next meeting will be held on Monday, October 24th.

Finance Committee

Commissioner Vibert reported that the committee met immediately before this evenings meeting. Dr. Dieter reported on some the Special Education things that are happening in our schools. She also thanked Glenn Klocko who is our interim Business Manager while we conduct the search for a new manager. It was very beneficial to have Mr. Klocko in attendance at the meeting. There is not a lot to report in regards to finance because it is so early in the school year, we are 17-18% into the budget; the Special Education department is a little higher than they should be, however if we look at some of the summer special education expenses, that trend should not continue to go that high.

Student Achievement Committee

Commissioner Dube reported the committee met on September 21st and they received two updates, the first was from Erika Coleman, Supervisor of Elementary Education regarding Full-day Kindergarten. Our first full day kindergarteners are now second graders. There has been a total of 1,673 students throughout the district who have benefitted from full day kindergarten. Students grew in literacy, math skills and socialization. The second

update was from Dr. Dietter who is the Director of Special Education. He discussed how CREC will be reviewing our processes and procedures for special education and we will receive results following any recommendations that they have for us.

Personnel Committee

Commissioner O'Brien reported that they have successfully negotiated tentative agreements with BAPS and Local 2267; commissioners would review in detail in Executive Session. We are awaiting ratification from the unions; in the hopes that for the first time in a numbers of years we will have agreements with all of the employee groups that work for the Board of Education; only Local 818 remains outstanding.

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE REPORT

Dr. Solek introduced Colin Savino as the Student Representative from Bristol Central. Colin is the brother of Nick Savino who was the Student Representative to the Board for the 14-15 school year. Colin is currently the captain of the Varsity Tennis Team, a member of both the cross country and indoor track teams, the Co-President of the Interact Club, and this is his fourth year as class treasurer. Colin's his favorites subjects are Latin and history, his top college choices are Marist, Bryant College, Western New England College, Roger Williams and Southern Connecticut State University; Colin plans to major in Marketing or business law when he graduates this June. This year the role of student representative will be a little different, not only will he be reporting at our meetings, but will be attending numerous Student Achievement Committee meetings where he will be an active participant.

Colin reported that the Rambassadors meet every Monday with their freshman to offer advice and explain the new world of high school. They start working with the students during freshman orientation, where they dress up in different themes and show them their classrooms and conducted ice breaker activities. His group of freshmen has been very receptive so far, and the program is working well. All of his freshmen tell him that their grades will be very good on the upcoming progress report. Today fifteen Rambassadors and thirty teachers went to South Side to read to elementary school students; Rambassadors are a good group of students who make great role models.

The Interact Club is preparing for the 17th Annual Powder Puff football game on November 19th. Last year they generated \$4,000 and donated it to the Make a Wish Foundation, they will do the same again this year. As with most Interact events, this is very heavily run by students. Students volunteer to run the event football players sign up to be the coaches, girls sign up to be players and they both design tee-shirts. As a Co President of Interact Colin conducted a meeting today with the football players who will be coaching the girls in their class and explained their expectations. The seniors will play the sophomores and the juniors will play the freshman; the Class of 2017 hopes to become the 14th senior class in school history to earn a victory in the finals. Lastly, Boys cross country beat Wethersfield 22 to 39 to remain undefeated in the conference, unfortunately the girls lost by only two, but they were working very hard to close the gap and hope to defeat Wethersfield in the conference championship on October 19th. Matt Roy ran the 3.1 mile course in 17 minutes, his fastest time ever.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Chairman Wilson shared information about the Connecticut School Finance Project which has met with the district before, and they have been invited back to a meeting on December 8th. They will be discussing the judge's decision on school finances as well as school finances in general. Also, he has invited the Commissioner of Education to come to Bristol to present her Five Year Strategic Plan to the Board and the Community; we are working on a date for that special meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

Culturally Responsive Education and Social Justice Practices

Dr. Solek discussed the Culturally Responsive Education and Social Justice Practices project and the invitation that she has extended to Mr. Gerald Hairston, Program Manager to meet with the administrative team.

Science Data Report – CMT, CAPT and Grades 5, 8 and 10

Lisa Bernabe and Erika Coleman presented the Science Data from the CMT and CAPT in Grades 5, 8 and 10.

Career and Technical Education Information

Dr. Solek announced that Mrs. Sharon Jacques, our Career and Technical Education department chair and teacher, has been awarded the honor of CT Business Educator of the Year Award. It is a prestigious honor with only one teacher selected from across the state. The district is very proud of Mrs. Jacques and all of the work she has done with our students, our teachers, the business curriculum, and the Bristol community. Carly Fortin, Principal at Bristol Eastern praised and thanked Mrs. Jacques for her work at Bristol Eastern and throughout the district, Mrs. Jacques and her family were present in the audience, she stood to be recognized.

School Performance Updates

Dr. Solek shared the School Performance Updates, with the Board. This week the group visited Northeast Middle School.

Fiscal Task Force

Dr. Solek discussed the establishment of the Fiscal Task Force; they will begin meeting next month.

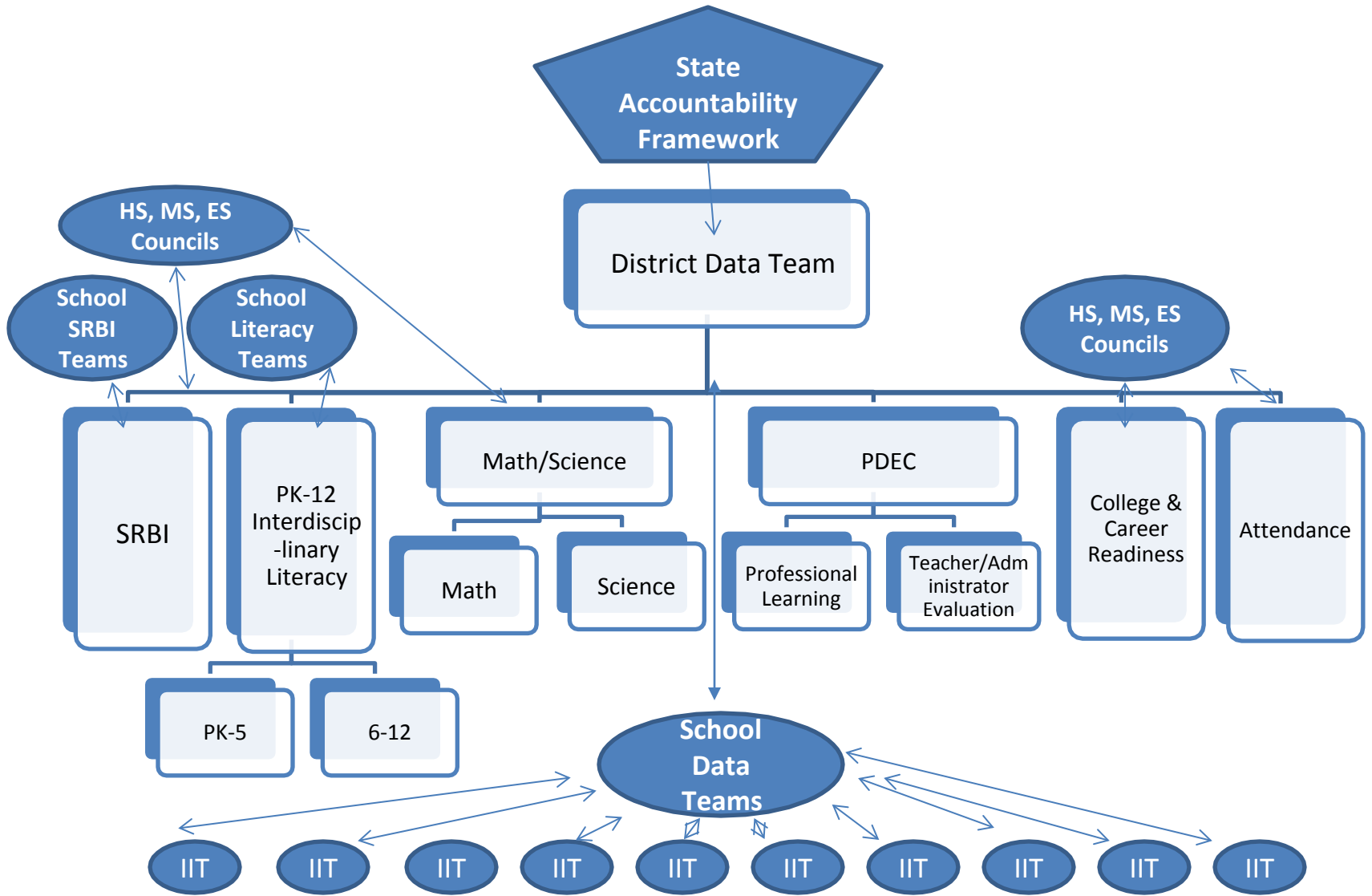

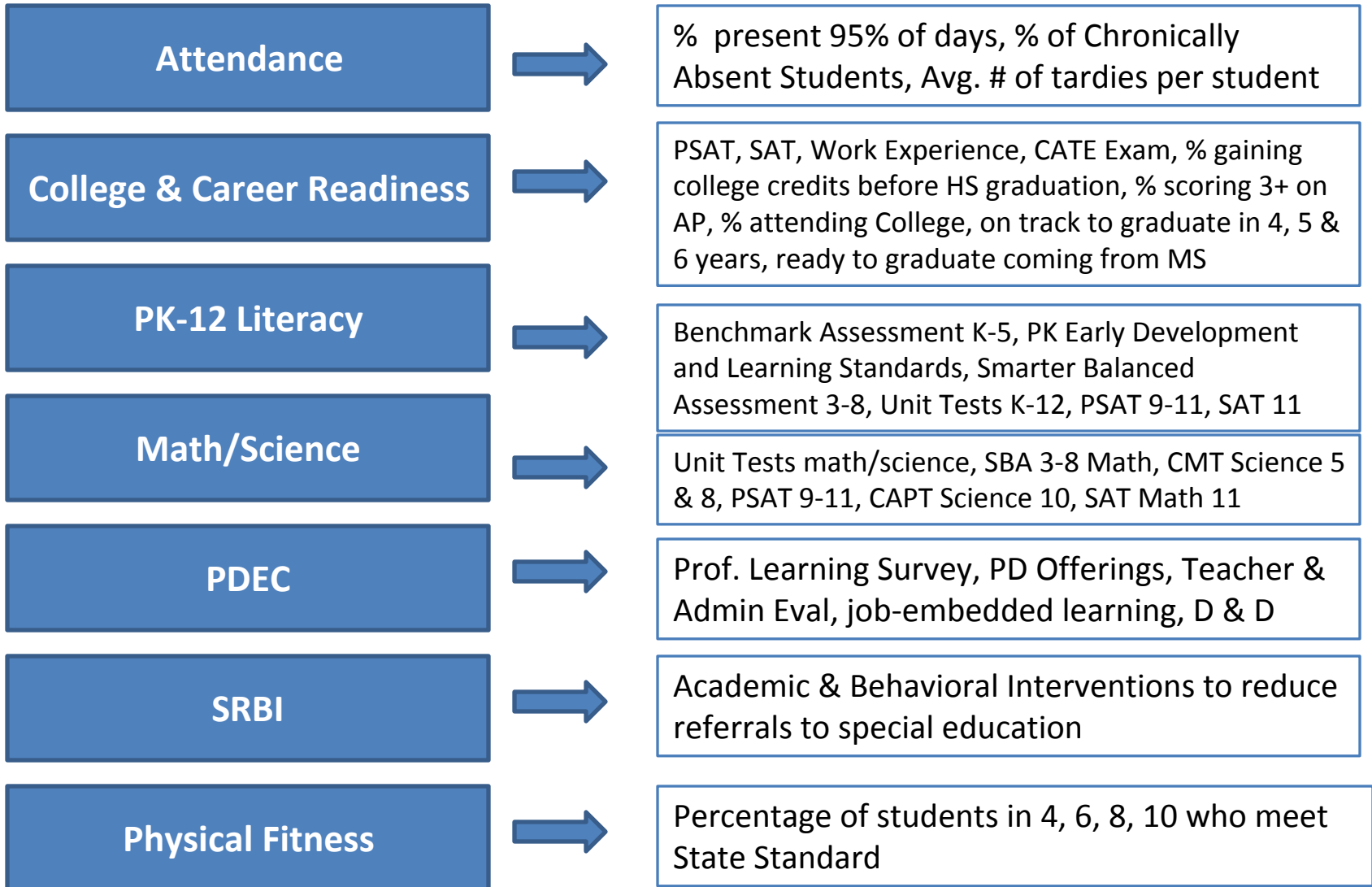
