Policy Committee Meeting Minutes

May 24, 2023

A meeting of the Bristol Board of Education Policy Committee was held on May 24, 2023, at 6:30 p.m. in Room 36 of the Bristol Board of Education and via the Zoom Meeting Platform.

1. Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 6:38 P.M.

2. Approval of Minutes:

On a motion by Commissioner Pons, seconded by Commissioner Tagareillo, the minutes were approved from April 26, 2023.

3. Public Comment:

Russell Anderson voiced concern about Agenda item #5 - Consumption of Alcohol on School Property. He stated he feels there are more cons than pros. He's concerned about the liability and bad PR. He stated that we need to be careful when considering this offering at BAIMS and to be cautious with this decision.

4. Activity Fees - Discussion Item:

Commissioner Giantonio opened the discussion with the committee. There were several suggestions put forward that would offer potential student relief in fees. Specifically in gate fees and wanting to offer a broader relief if offered for BPS students or for parents/guardians of athletes an offering of 2 sporting ticket passes per family. It was suggested to look at one piece of this issue and then it could always be changed. Need to collect more data as to where you want to provide

relief . Collect that data then come back to the committee with a motion. There were suggestions to take a layered approach and at plays use the wording “Suggested Donation”. Other discussion was centered around Students should show their student ID and Bristol Residents and Parents should show ID for free entry into all sporting events. Dr. Carbone reviewed what Gate Fees were used for such as Invitationals, broken equipment, ceremonial items such as flowers, plaques and awards. She also explained that Gate Fees is a subset of Student Activity Fees mainly used in sports. She reviewed an example of a class and what fees would be used for. She is not aware of students at BE or BC being charged for any activity that they are allowed to participate in. The only exception was the class that are now juniors at BC because they weren’t able to fundraise during the pandemic for their senior year. The discussion was then moved to agreeing to put together regulation language that would help move this issue forward with a motion for regulations.

The discussion was closed by Commissioner Giantonio at 7:46 p.m.

5. Consumption of Alcohol on School Property - Discussion Item:

Commissioner Giantonio opened the discussion. Dr. Dietter gave a brief overview of our Current BoE Policies. Board Policy 3515 (Community Use of School Facilities) establishes various rules and regulations for the rental of school facilities. Board Policy 1316 (Conduct on School Property) states that “the Board expects that no person on school property shall... [c]onsume, possess, distribute or be under the influence of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs...” Board Policy 4218.231 (Drug and Alcohol-Free Workplace) Board regulations regarding fundraising and advertising also prohibit alcohol promotion. See Board Regulation 1324 (Fundraising); Board Regulation 1325 (Advertising). Discussion continued around the mutual use agreement at BAIMS. Also, discussed was the rental agreement, liability insurance, parallel process with the City of Bristol, and the information shared from our BoE Atty. suggesting a slow methodical approach to offering alcohol at BAIMS.

The discussion was closed by Commissioner Giantonio at 8:14 p.m.

Policy 3453 School Activity Funds, June 2023

For the purpose of this policy, student activity funds shall fall within the meaning under CGS Chapter 170, Section 10-237, with the exception that no student activity fund shall be set up to include "gate fees" for sporting events or "attendance fees" for other school-sponsored events whereby Bristol residents and Bristol students shall be charged a fee for entrance to the same event. Notwithstanding the preceding exception, or requirements otherwise mandated under state or federal statute, Student Activity Funds may be set up for "gate fees" for sporting events or "attendance fees" for other school-sponsored events wherein those same fees shall be charged to non-Bristol resident adults and children who attend the same event. In addition, schools are prohibited from charging a student activity fee if the student does not choose to participate in an optional athletic or other extracurricular school activity funded by the fee

Restriction of Recess [From CSDE Legislative Summary July, 2022](#)

§ 9 — WITHHOLDING RECESS AS A FORM OF STUDENT DISCIPLINE

Each school year, starting with the 2022-23 school year, the bill requires each local and regional board of education to adopt a policy it deems appropriate concerning the circumstances when, as a form of discipline, a school employee may prevent or otherwise restrict a student from participating in the entire time devoted to physical exercise (i.e., recess) in the regular school day.

Under the bill, the policy must allow school employees to prevent or restrict recess when:

1. ~~a student poses a danger to the health or safety of other students or school personnel; or~~
2. ~~it is limited to the shorter recess period if there are two or more recess periods in the school day, so long as the student is allowed to participate in at least 20 minutes of physical activity during the school day.~~

~~The policy may allow recess prevention or restriction only once during a school week unless the student is a danger to the health or safety of other students or school personnel. Additionally, the policy must not (1) include provisions that are unreasonably restrictive or punitive, as determined by the board, or (2) allow recess prevention or restriction if a student does not complete their work on time or for the student's academic performance.~~

Sec. 6. Section 10-220 of the general statutes is amended by adding subsection (g) as follows (*Effective July 1, 2023*):

(NEW) (g) Each local or regional board of education conducting a regular or special meeting of such board shall make available for public inspection the agenda for the meeting or any associated documents that may be reviewed by members of the board at such meeting and post such agenda and documents on the Internet web site of such board.
