1.	Recommend Approval to Table the English IV: Mystery curriculum map and associated novels <i>In Cold Blood</i> by Truman Capote and <i>The Maltese Falcon</i> by Dashiell Hammett	
a.	District administration recommends approval to table the adoption of a new curriculum map for the senior level English IV: Mystery course. This curriculum map for the course includes five comprehensive units that explore the subgenres associated with mystery. Both <i>In Cold Blood</i> and <i>The Maltese Falcon</i> were selected as cornerstone texts representing the subgenres of true crime and detective fiction. Dr. Tabetha Finchum and Flowing Wells High School English teacher, Ms. Jessica Curley, will provide an overview. Pending Board approval, the resources would be tabled for a sixty-day period for public review and comment.	132
2.	Recommend Approval to Establish Data Sharing Agreement with Youth On Their Own and Chapin Hall Center for Children	
a.	District administration recommends approval to establish a data sharing agreement with Youth On Their Own (YOTO) and Chapin Hall Center for Children. This agreement would entail the release of de-identified student data to the data-sharing partners for the purpose of program evaluation. Specifically, YOTO administers a program that provides monthly stipends to eligible students experiencing housing insecurity as an incentive to remain enrolled and engaged in school. This evaluation would assess the program's effectiveness in improving school participation and graduation for participating youth. Flowing Wells would de-identify the data prior to releasing it, ensuring no private student data is compromised.	141

G. Business and Finance

1. Recommend Approval of Community Schools Fees for FY2026-2027
 - a. District administration recommends approval of Community Schools’ fees effective July 1, 2026, for fiscal year 2026-2027. The attached schedule shows the current year’s rates and proposed new rates, which include an increase of \$0.15/hour for Y.E.S. program participation. Additionally, one new fee has been added, which would establish a tuition rate for preschool students who are not the children or grandchildren of District employees. This community rate would be \$175/week, compared to the employee rate of \$150/week. 149

2. Recommend Approval of Enrollment Guidelines for EMELC Tuition-Based Preschool Programs
 - a. District administration recommends approval of enrollment guidelines for the acceptance and placement of preschool students into our various EMELC classrooms. The guidelines generally reflect our current practices, including a lottery protocol for when registrations exceed classroom capacity. The guidelines also establish new protocols to ensure consistency as we expand our tuition-based programs to include students who are not the children or grandchildren of District employees. 152

3. Recommend Approval to Contract with SummitWest Signs for Digital Marquees
 - a. District administration recommends approval to contract with SummitWest Signs to install new digital marquees at five schools (Sentinel Peak, Richardson, Laguna, Centennial, and Davis) and to upgrade the displays at two schools (Hendricks and FWHS) for the purpose of improving parent and community communication and marketing. The total cost is anticipated to be \$480,481.57, using pricing through Mohave Arizona state contract 231-SUMM-0222. The project would be funded with a combination of 2025 bond proceeds from the first phase of bond sales in May of 2026 (five new marquees) and FY2026 District Additional Assistance (two upgrades). 155

4. Recommend Approval to Contract with Freightliner of Arizona, LLC, to Purchase Three School Buses
 - a. District administration recommends approval to contract with Freightliner of Arizona, LLC, to purchase three school buses: one Thomas 84-passenger bus at \$248,938.74; one Thomas 77-passenger bus at \$192,834.17; and one Thomas 39-passenger special needs bus at \$184,895.64. The total cost is anticipated to be \$626,668.55, using pricing through Mohave Arizona state contract 23D-AZBC-0905. All buses include air conditioning, video systems, and radio communication systems. The purchase would be funded with 2025 bond proceeds from the first phase of bond sales in May of 2026. 170

5. Discussion of Tax Credit Contributions for Calendar Year 2025
 - a. District administration presents for discussion a summary of tax credit contribution details for Calendar Year 2025. The Flowing Wells District received \$250,068 in tax credit contributions in 2025, compared to \$285,679 in 2024. A report summarizing, by school, donations received over the past five years is attached. The Arizona Department of Revenue allows a maximum tax credit of \$400 for married couples filing jointly and \$200 for individuals or couples filing separately. The District is also 174

required to report actual expenditures from tax credit contributions by February 28th of each year per ARS 43-1089.01. These reports also are attached.

6. Recommend Approval to Establish New Contract Addendum for Tuition for Grow-Your-Own School Psychologist Program
a. District administration recommends approval to establish a new contract addendum for up to \$5,000.00 per year of tuition funding for employees selected to participate in a new program to develop a pool of school psychologists among our existing employees. Candidates would be selected through an interview process and would be eligible to receive the funding throughout the duration of their master's degree program and internship, most likely three years. The draft contract addendum is attached for review. 185
7. Recommend Approval of Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) from Chasse Construction for Flowing Wells High School Culinary Arts Expansion
a. District administration recommends approval of the GMP from Chasse Construction for construction of the expanded FWHS Culinary Arts space, including classroom space, dry storage, walk-in refrigerator and freezer, dish-washing area, and commercial restaurant equipment. The GMP is \$2,878,976.00, and would be funded from multiple sources, including carryforward and future funding from the District's annual Pima JTED allocation, 2025 bond funds, and possibly future District Additional Assistance funds. 188

TEACHER EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT 12 MONTH**

This Teacher Employment Contract (“Contract”) is entered into between Flowing Wells Unified School District No. 8 of Pima County (the “District”), by and through its Governing Board (the “Board”), and **First Name Last Name** (the “Teacher”).

The District and the Teacher agree as follows:

1. Commencing on the 1st day of July, 2026, and thereafter for a period of Two Hundred Sixty One (261) paid days as designated by the Board, the Teacher agrees to teach such grade, grades or subjects, and/or perform such administrative functions and other duties, as may be assigned by the Board or its administrative representatives in the locations designated by the Governing Board or its administrative representatives. In this Contract, the term “paid days” means teaching days, non-teaching days during which the Teacher is required to perform duties on behalf of the District, and paid holidays. The Teacher shall at all times comply with (a) state, federal and local laws, (b) Board policies and administrative rules and regulations now in effect and as reasonably modified from time to time, and (c) directives issued by the Board or a District administrator.

In consideration of the Teacher’s performance of the duties described above, the District shall pay the Teacher a base salary (“Base Salary”) of **Salary (\$00,000.00)**

The Teacher’s Base Salary set out above is intended to reflect the Base Salary the Teacher is entitled to receive based on formulas used by the District to calculate teacher base salaries (“Base Salary Formulas”). The District’s Base Salary Formulas calculate a teacher’s base salary using that teacher’s (a) initial base salary, (b) years of experience as a teacher in the District, (c) attainment of professional growth (as defined by the District), (d) FTE status, and (e) receipt of any base salary increase awarded to teachers generally. The Teacher shall notify the District within thirty (30) days if the Teacher knows or suspects that the Teacher’s Base Salary as set out above is not accurate. Any conflict between the Base Salary set out in this paragraph and what the Teacher’s Base Salary would be using the Base Salary Formulas shall be resolved in favor of the Base Salary that would result from using the Base Salary Formulas. The Teacher’s signature on this Contract constitutes the Teacher’s prior written authorization, pursuant to A.R.S. § 23-352, for the District to withhold from the Teacher’s pay any additional Base Salary paid in excess of the accurate Base Salary amount.

2. In addition to Base Salary, the District shall pay the Teacher the additional compensation set forth in any Addendum to this Contract. The additional compensation set forth in any Addendum shall not be considered to be a part of the Teacher’s Base Salary.

3. If the Teacher’s employment pursuant to this Contract is funded by federal or grant funds, or other special funds, then this Contract is expressly contingent upon the District’s receipt of such federal, grant or special funds, and if such funds are not received, this Contract shall be deemed null and void and without further effect.

4. The Teacher will be paid in installments on an annual basis (deferred wages) based on approximately 24 pay periods.

5. The District’s Performance Pay Policy distributes, among District teachers who qualify for such payments, monies received by the District pursuant to, and as a result of, Proposition 301 that are allocated for teacher compensation based on performance (“Performance Pay”). If the Teacher qualifies to be paid Performance Pay pursuant to the District’s Performance Pay Policy, the method and timing of payment of such monies, and the amount of such Performance Pay, shall be as specified in the Performance Pay Policy. Any Performance Pay earned by the Teacher shall be in addition to, and shall not be deemed a part of, the Teacher’s Base Salary.

6. At the present time, it is uncertain whether the Arizona Legislature has made a final determination concerning the District's level of funding for the 2026-2027 fiscal year or if the District will receive additional revenues that can be used for maintenance and operation funds after the date this Contract is approved and issued. By signing this Contract, the Teacher expressly warrants and represents to the Board that the Teacher has a reasonable, good faith belief that, prior to the first duty day of this Contract as specified in paragraph 1 above, he or she will be in compliance with the above-listed conditions. If the Teacher is not in compliance with the above-listed conditions as of the first duty day of this Contract, this Contract shall be deemed null and void and of no further force or effect. In addition, if at any time during the term of this Contract the Teacher fails to remain in compliance with all of the above-listed conditions, such failure shall (a) be considered cause for dismissal and, in appropriate situations, a sufficient reason for nonrenewal, and (b) allow the Board, in its discretion, to place the Teacher on an unpaid leave of absence, whether or not the Board is also pursuing the Teacher's dismissal or nonrenewal.

If (1) the Teacher's Teaching Certificate, (2) any endorsement appropriate for the Teacher's position, or (3) the Teacher's fingerprint clearance card, is scheduled to expire during the term of this Contract, not less than thirty (30) calendar days prior to the scheduled expiration, the Teacher shall renew such certificate, endorsement or fingerprint clearance card and provide evidence of such renewal to the District's human resources office. Failure of the Teacher to do so shall (a) be considered cause for dismissal and, in appropriate situations, a sufficient reason for nonrenewal, and (b) allow the Board, in its discretion, to place the Teacher on an unpaid leave of absence, whether or not the Board is also pursuing the Teacher's dismissal or nonrenewal.

2. This Merit Compensation (Performance Pay) Addendum to Administrator Employment Contract (“Addendum”) is entered into between Flowing Wells Unified School District No. 8 of Pima County (the “District”), by and through its Governing Board (the “Board”), and **First Name Last Name** (the “Employee”).

By this Addendum, the District and the Employee desire to enter into a performance pay agreement that uses the same procedures to determine administrator performance pay as have been used over the past ten years. In accordance therewith, the Board and Employee agree that the Employee’s **Position** Administrator Employment Contract (the “Contract”) shall be modified as follows:

1. **Contingent Merit Compensation Monies.** During the 2026-2027 fiscal year, the District shall set aside Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) as contingent Merit Compensation (Performance Pay) monies (“Monies”) for the Employee. Some or all of the Monies shall be paid to the Employee as additional compensation based on the collective achievement by District administrators, including the Employee and the Superintendent (the “District Administrators”), of agreed-upon performance goals, as detailed in this Addendum below.
2. The agreed-upon performance goals that form the basis for Employee’s conditional receipt of Merit Compensation Monies shall be determined as follows:
 - a. Between July 1, 2026, and August 10, 2026, District Administrators, by and through the Superintendent, shall propose merit compensation performance goals to the Board (the “Proposed Goals”).
 - b. Within a reasonable time after receiving Proposed Goals, the Board will either approve the Proposed Goals, or (ii) direct the Superintendent to propose new or amended goals. This process shall be repeated as necessary until the Board approves a set of no fewer than five (5) and no more than eight (8) agreed-upon Performance Goals for the District Administrators (“Performance Goals”). All parties shall endeavor to have the Performance Goals approved by the Board no later than August 20, 2026.
3. **Board Determination Concerning Achievement of Performance Goals.** At a Governing Board meeting held between May 11, 2027, and June 29, 2027, the Board shall discuss and determine whether and to what extent District Administrators achieved the Performance Goals during the 2026-2027 fiscal year. The Board may discuss the District Administrators’ efforts and achievements in relation to the Performance Goals in one or more personnel executive sessions.

In an Open Meeting held no later than June 29, 2027, each individual Board member will rate, on a scale of 0% to 100%, the District Administrators’ collective success in achieving the Performance Goals. The individual Board member ratings will be averaged and, on or before June 30, 2027, the Employee shall be paid Monies in an amount equal to the resulting average percentage rating multiplied by Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00). For example, if the resulting average rating is 90%, the Employee shall be paid Five Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$5,400.00 (0.90 x \$6,000.00 = \$5,400.00).

Other than as modified by this Addendum, the terms and conditions of the Contract remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

RE: Request 60-Day Table of the English IV Curriculum and Associated New Novels

DATE: February 24, 2026

The District administration recommends a sixty-day table of the English IV: Mystery curriculum map for use with our Flowing Wells High School seniors in our newly approved English IV: Mystery course. This request includes a recommendation to table two new novels, *The Maltese Falcon* by Dashiell Hammett and *In Cold Blood* by Truman Capote. In addition to these two novels, the course will include several other previously adopted novels, listed on the attached curriculum map, and several short stories and poems.

The English Mystery curriculum map was created by Ms. Jessica Curley, Senior English Teacher, with feedback and support from Ms. Jennifer DeFilippis, District Reading Specialist. The course is organized into five distinct units: History’s Mysteries, Detective Fiction, Gothic Mystery, Suspense, and True Crime.

History’s Mysteries is a non-fiction unit focused on unsolved mysteries of the past and present. Students will engage in a research unit, learning how to evaluate resources for legitimacy and how to synthesize information from various sources into a singular summary. The Detective Fiction unit will explore the evolution of the detective story from Poe to the Golden Age of detectives (Holmes, Christie, and Hammett). Students will explore how the detective develops as a character and reflects the culture of the setting, as well as how authors lay out clues for readers to use their own induction skills. The Gothic Mystery unit focuses on Gothic-style literature and ghost stories and why people tell them. It looks at the supernatural being as a character and examines the broader scope of why we tell ghost stories. The Suspense unit examines suspense as created in literary and visual texts. It explores suspense in short stories, short films/clips, and a full-length film directed by Alfred Hitchcock. Lastly, the True Crime unit focuses on the way true crime is portrayed and explores bias in this genre.

As stated above, we also recommend the adoption of two new novels for use in the course. *The Maltese Falcon* is a 1930 detective novel by Dashiell Hammett. It is considered a cornerstone of detective fiction, credited with establishing the hard-boiled genre and shifting the genre from polite English mysteries to gritty American realism. *In Cold Blood* by Truman Capote was selected because it is widely accepted to be the “grandfather” of the true crime genre. It contains two scenes that portray graphic violence and an allusion to sexual violence of a minor. Despite this, we believe this book holds value in this context. If approved, parental consent would be required for any student below age 18 and we would provide an option to skip those sections if requested.

As a reminder, the English IV: Mystery course would take the place of 2–4 sections of standard English IV, depending on student interest. This course has previously been taught in another district where it quickly became highly popular, ultimately becoming the second most requested class within two years. The varied texts and assessments are designed to maintain student engagement while improving literacy and writing throughout the school year.

Staffing for the course will be addressed using current Flowing Wells High School English Department personnel, with the number of sections determined by student enrollment. Anticipated costs related to instructional materials would include the purchase of two new novels.

I will be available along with Frank Thomas, Flowing Wells High School Principal; Allison Embacher, Assistant Principal; and Jessica Curley, English Teacher, to provide additional information and to answer any questions during the regularly scheduled Governing Board Meeting.

Course: English IV Mystery

In this course, students will read traditional mystery literature, as well as other texts and media from some of the most common subgenres of mystery (such as true crime and ghost stories), with attention paid to how stories and characters reflect the time in which they are written. Students will discover what makes a mystery and how suspense is used to hold an audience's attention. Students will create their own stories, analyze character prototypes, and engage in formal and informal writing, speaking, research, and presentation.

Unit 1: History's Mysteries

Essential Question: What are the effects of leaving some things unsolved?

 - Prompt: Write a brief summary of an article on your chosen topic.
- **Annotated bibliography and source evaluation**
 - Prompt: Review two sources on your chosen topic. Write an annotated bibliography for each, delineating how you would use each in your research. Then, write a short paragraph explaining the BEST source to use in your research. Explain your choice using the criteria we have discussed in class. You may use any information, such as the CRAAP test or bias. Just be sure to explain your reasons thoroughly. This is open-notes.
- **Research Project**
 - Prompt: Your task is to choose an unsolved mystery, a “weird phenomenon,” or an interesting legend to discuss in your two-page spread. The topic you choose must have enough information to research, and it should have multiple possible theories, explanations, and/or perspectives. Work will be published in a class “magazine”
 - Students may present their findings to the class.

Unit 2: Detective Fiction

Description: This unit explores the evolution of the detective story from Poe to the Golden Age of detectives (Holmes, Christie, and Hammett). Students will explore how the detective develops as a character and reflects the culture of the time period he/she was written, as well as how authors lay out clues for readers to use their own induction skills. Students will learn what elements authors deliberately use in a detective story, culminating in students creating their own short detective mystery story.

Essential Question: How does a specific character archetype evolve with time and cultural values?

Each group will read a story featuring Sherlock Holmes and present to the class the method Holmes uses as well as the real-life evolution and implications of the featured technique.

 - Prompt: As you read, gather quotes that stand out to you. They can stand out to you for any reason at all. You don’t need to know what they mean yet.

Unit 3: Gothic Mystery

Description: This unit focuses on Gothic-style literature and ghost stories and why people tell them. It looks at the supernatural being as a character and examines the broader scope of why we tell ghost stories (not just to remember who has passed, but also as a cultural/time period touchstone – what is the ghost trying to make us “remember” about the time period/area/culture in which they are written?). The unit culminates in a project/presentation researching a cultural ghost story and its meaning.

Unit 4: Suspense

Description: This unit examines suspense as created in literary and visual texts. It explores suspense in short stories, short films/clips, and a full-length film directed by Alfred Hitchcock. The unit includes a comparative analysis between Hitchcock and other directors.

Essential Question: How do creators build suspense in different mediums?

- **Discussion: Comparison of the same story in print and in visual form**
 - Prompt: Discuss suspense in “The Landlady” by Roald Dahl and in the video. Which held more tension for you? What tools did the author or director use to hold the tension? Take notes as you discuss.
- **Dissection of suspense in a scene**
 - Prompt: In 1-2 pages, analyze Hitchcock’s creation of suspense and tension in the parlor scene in Psycho. Include his use of lighting, mise-en-scène, music, camera angles, and dialogue.
- **Comparative analysis essay (written or visual)**
 - *Rear Window* (1954) is considered one of Alfred Hitchcock’s masterpieces, and it has influenced countless films that came after. Your role is film critic/reviewer. Your task is to defend (or refute) Hitchcock’s title of “Master of Suspense” by analyzing how Hitchcock built suspense and used tension in *Rear Window* and compare that to the suspense and tension to a film or story of your choosing. Which one did it better (the comparison) and HOW (the analysis)?
 - This may be done in a written essay or a video essay.

Unit 5: True Crime

Description: This unit focuses on the WAY true crime is portrayed and explores bias in this genre. (**Note: This unit does not focus on the crimes themselves but rather HOW they are talked about in the true crime genre.**) It asks – and tries to answer – the question of ethics when presenting real life as entertainment. The unit ends with a persuasive argument as to the value of true crime as a genre.

Essential Question: What responsibilities do authors and journalists hold when reporting on/writing about real events, as well as viewers in consuming them?

Unit Texts:

- Various current topics within the genre, such as the origin of true crime; the ethics of true crime; family members impacted by the existence of true crime; true crime as a profitable business
- *In Cold Blood* by Truman Capote (pending board approval; selected because it is widely considered the “grandfather” of true crime.)

- **Discussion Boards**
 - Prompt: Based on what we’ve read and discussed so far, what do you think the 3 or 4 MAIN TENETS of true crime should be. In other words, what should some of the “rules” be when creating true crime? Be thorough in your example and your reasoning. Use data from our discussions and readings. Respond to at least three other students’ comments.
- **Dialectical Journals/Reading Trackers**
 - Prompt: Gather evidence as you read *In Cold Blood* that tells you whether or not Truman Capote is using personal bias in his subject matter.
- **Argumentative Essay**
 - Prompt: Using details from our discussions, short readings, and novel, write an essay either defending or criticising the merits of true crime as a genre. Is it reasonable and ethical as it stands now? Should there be any changes made to it? If so, what? Be sure to support your claims with specific evidence and explanations from our class texts.

District administration recommends approval to establish a data sharing agreement with Youth On Their Own (YOTO) and Chapin Hall Center for Children. This agreement would entail the release of de-identified student data to the data-sharing partners for the purpose of program evaluation. Specifically, YOTO administers a program that provides monthly stipends to eligible students experiencing housing insecurity as an incentive to remain enrolled and engaged in school. This evaluation would assess the program's effectiveness in improving school participation and graduation for participating youth. Flowing Wells would de-identify the data prior to releasing it, ensuring no private student data is compromised.

**DATA SHARING AGREEMENT
CHAPIN HALL RECEIVING DATA**

This Data Sharing Agreement is entered into by and between **Flowing Wells School District** located at 1556 W Prince Rd. (“Data Owner”), **CHAPIN HALL CENTER FOR CHILDREN**, an Illinois not-for-profit corporation, whose address is Chapin Hall, Attn: General Counsel, c/o Impact House, 200 W. Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois 60606 (“Chapin Hall”), and **YOUTH ON THEIR OWN (“YOTO”)**, located at 2525 N. Country Club Road, Tucson, Arizona 85716.

Chapin Hall is an independent policy research center that provides public and private decision-makers with rigorous research and achievable solutions to support them in improving the lives of children, families and communities. Data Owner wishes to share Data through this Data Sharing Agreement with Chapin Hall for the purposes of project.

Data Owner and Chapin Hall agree as follows:

1. AGREEMENT TERMS

2. DATA

- a. **Data Schedule.** Data Owner will provide Chapin Hall as specifically set forth in Schedule 1 (“Data”) in a format and on a schedule to be determined by the Parties for purposes of the Project.
- b. **Ownership and Use of Data.** Chapin Hall agrees that the Data is the sole property of Data Owner and shall be used exclusively for the purposes described herein. Chapin Hall shall obtain Data Owner’s prior written permission to use the Data for any other purpose or project.
- c. **Transfer of Data.** Data shall be transferred either via online methods such as through secure file transfer (SFTP) software and encrypted email or by the use of encrypted magnetic or optical media. Data Owner and Chapin Hall shall determine the transfer method appropriate for the Project. No Data will be transferred by Chapin Hall to any other individual or organization without the prior express written permission of Data Owner, unless for additional storage, processing, or cloud computing services.
- d. **Data Security.** Chapin Hall maintains a Project Data Management Policy that sets forth policies and procedures for the protection of data.

- e. **Return or Destruction of Data.** Upon termination of this Data Sharing Agreement, Chapin Hall must destroy, at Data Owner's direction and expense, the Data received from Data Owner, or created or received by Chapin Hall on behalf of Data Owner, that Chapin Hall still maintains in any form, unless destruction of the Data would conflict with Chapin Hall's record retention requirements or commonly accepted standards for the verification of research findings. If destruction of the Data conflicts with Chapin Hall's record retention requirements or commonly accepted standards for the verification of research findings, Chapin Hall shall retain the Data only for the purpose of complying with those record retention requirements or standards for verification of research findings and no other access, use, or disclosure shall be authorized.
- f. **Reporting Breaches.** Chapin Hall agrees to report to Data Owner, within five (5) calendar days, any use or disclosure of Data not provided for by this Data Sharing Agreement of which it becomes aware and any security incident of which it becomes aware. For reports of incidents constituting a breach, the report shall include, to the extent available, the identification of each individual whose Data has been, or is reasonably believed by Chapin Hall to have been, accessed, acquired, or disclosed during such breach. Security incidents that do not result in any unauthorized access, use, disclosure, modification, destruction of information or interference with system operations may be reported in the aggregate upon written request of Data Owner in a manner and frequency mutually acceptable to the parties. The parties acknowledge that incidents including, but not limited to, ping sweeps or other common network reconnaissance techniques, attempts to log on to a system with an invalid password or username, and denial of service attacks that do not result in a server being taken off-line, may occur from time to time and do not constitute a breach.
- g. **Confidential Information.** Chapin Hall recognizes that Data provided by YOTO to the Data Owner contains personally identifiable information and confidential information. Chapin Hall also recognizes that Data provided by the Data Owner to Chapin Hall will not contain personally identifiable information. Chapin Hall agrees to keep all Data confidential. Chapin Hall agrees that the Data will be used exclusively in connection with Project described in this Agreement and otherwise for the purposes or projects approved by Data Owner. In the case of electronic Data, such Data will be stored on Chapin Hall-maintained and protected servers. All materials produced by Chapin Hall will contain sufficient protections and safeguards to ensure individual anonymity and adhere to the mandates for confidentiality as approved Chapin Hall's Institutional Review Board. No personally identifiable information will be disseminated to the public. If Chapin Hall is required to produce the Data by law, court order, or governmental authority, Chapin Hall must promptly notify Data Owner of such obligation.

3. TERM AND TERMINATION

- a. **Term.** This Data Sharing Agreement is effective as of the Effective Date referenced in Section 1 above and shall terminate on the Termination Date referenced in Section 1 above, unless terminated earlier, or extended, in

accordance with this Data Sharing Agreement. The Term can be extended through written mutual agreement of the Parties.

b. Termination.

- i.** Termination Without Cause. Either Party may terminate this Data Sharing Agreement at any time, without cause, by giving at least thirty (30) calendar days' written notice to the other Party.
- ii.** Termination for Cause. In the event of either Data Owner or Chapin Hall's failure to comply with the terms of this Agreement, the other party will provide notice of breach to the breaching party. If the breach is not cured to the non-breaching party's satisfaction within thirty (30) days after such notice, or within such time as reasonably determined by the non-breaching party and specified in the notice, the non-breaching party may immediately terminate this Agreement by providing written notice.

4. PUBLICATIONS

- a.** Chapin Hall shall have the right, consistent with academic standards, to publish the results of research performed under this Data Sharing Agreement, provided such publication does not disclose any trade secret, proprietary, or Confidential Information of Data Owner. Any publication resulting from the Data must indicate that the Data were provided by Data Owner and must include a disclaimer to the effect that published material does not necessarily reflect the views of Data Owner. Chapin Hall agrees that, prior to submission of a manuscript describing the results for publication, Chapin Hall shall forward to Data Owner a copy of the manuscript to be submitted and shall allow Data Owner thirty (30) days to review for purposes of identifying any proprietary trade secrets or Confidential Information. After thirty (30) days, Chapin Hall shall be free to submit the manuscript and publish results in any manner consistent with academic standards. At the request of Data Owner, Chapin Hall shall redact any trade secret, proprietary, or Confidential Information supplied by Data Owner to Chapin Hall.

5. RIGHT TO AUDIT

- a.** This Data Sharing Agreement and all books, records, and supporting documents related thereto shall be available for review or audit by Data Owner and any state or federal agencies with monitoring authority related to the subject matter of this Agreement. Upon reasonable notice, Chapin Hall shall provide, during normal business hours, full and complete access to Chapin Hall's files related to this Data Sharing Agreement.

6. RETENTION OF RECORDS

- a.** Chapin Hall shall maintain records relating to the performance of this Data Sharing Agreement for a period of seven (7) years from the Termination Date. If an audit, litigation, or other action involving the records begins before the end of the seven (7) year period, the records shall be retained until all issues arising out of the action are resolved.

7. INDEMNIFICATION

- a. Data Owner shall indemnify and hold harmless Chapin Hall (and its directors, officers, employees, affiliates, principals, managers, members, partners, agents and representatives) from all claims, suits, causes of action, damages, costs and expenses, including attorneys' fees, arising out of any use or disclosure of Data by Data Owner permitted by this Data Sharing Agreement.

8. GENERAL TERMS

- a. **Notice.** Any notice, demand, request or other communication shall be given in writing, at the addresses set forth in Section 1 above, and shall be deemed duly given as follows: (a) on the date of personal service; (b) one (1) business day after deposit with an overnight courier; (c) three (3) business days after proper deposit with the United States Postal Service; and (d) on the date of transmission by fax, email, or other electronic transmission.
- b. **Amendment.** This Data Sharing Agreement shall not be amended, supplemented, extended, or modified except in writing signed by authorized representatives of the parties.
- c. **Assignment.** This Data Sharing Agreement shall not be assigned, nor shall the performance of any duties under this Data Sharing Agreement be delegated to another party, without the prior written consent of the Parties. All terms and conditions contained in this Agreement shall extend to and be binding upon all successors and assigns of the parties hereto.
- d. **No Third-Party Rights.** The terms and conditions of this Data Sharing Agreement are intended for the sole benefit of Chapin Hall and Data Owner and do not create any third-party rights. The parties declare that they are independent contractors and not agents of each other.
- e. **No Waiver.** No waiver of any breach of this Data Sharing Agreement shall be deemed a waiver of any other breach, or the same breach on another occasion. The failure of either Party to enforce its rights under this Agreement at any time for any period shall not be construed as a waiver of such rights.
- f. **Electronic Signatures.** Each Party acknowledges and agrees that this Data Sharing Agreement may be executed by electronic signature, which shall be considered as an original signature for all purposes and shall have the same force and effect as an original signature. Without limitation, "electronic signature" shall include digitally created and digitized versions of signatures affixed to this Agreement or electronically scanned and transmitted versions (e.g., via pdf) of an original signature.

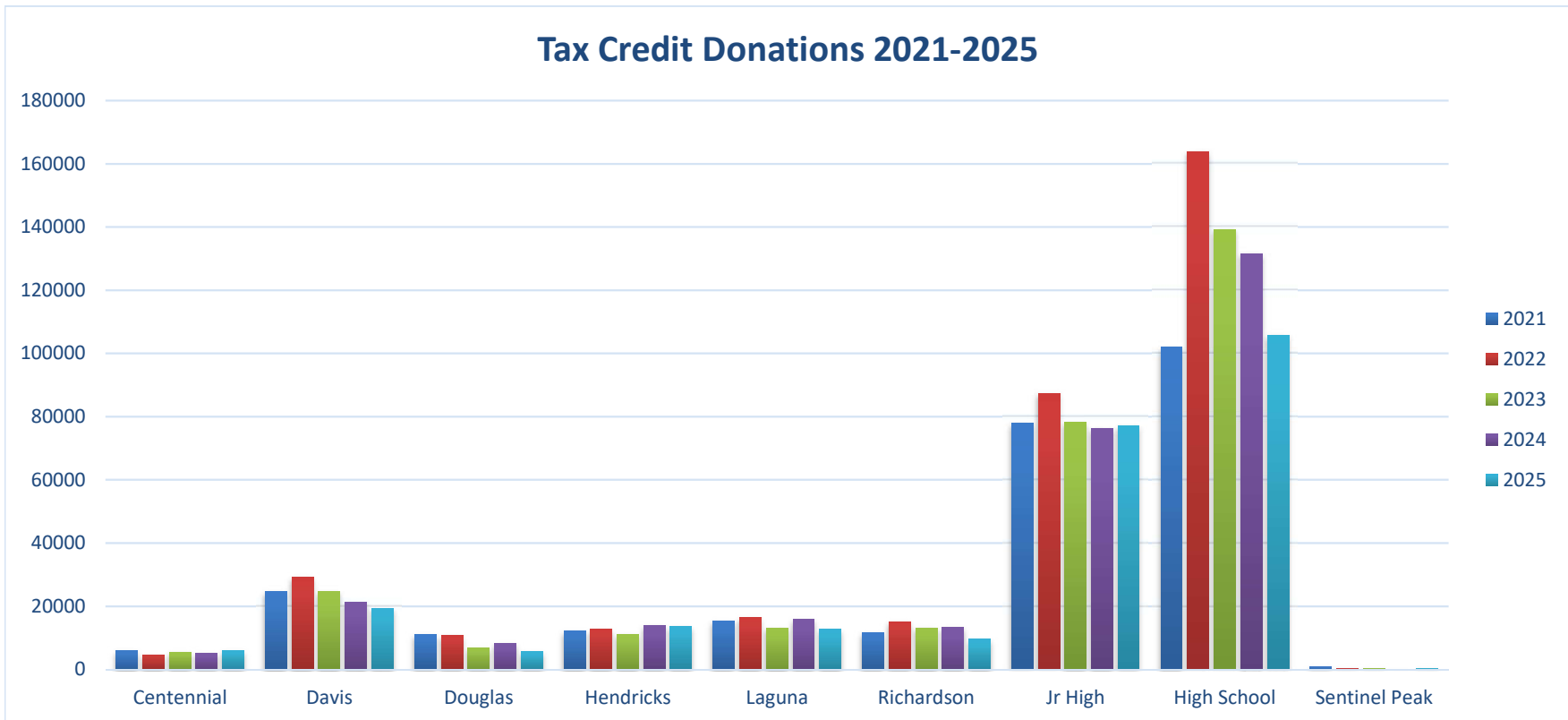

TO EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT**

This Tuition Reimbursement Addendum to Employment Contract (“Addendum”) is entered into between Flowing Wells Unified School District No. 8 of Pima County (the “District”) by and through its Governing Board and **First Name Last Name** (the “Employee”).

The purpose of this Addendum is to encourage employees to participate in the District’s “Grow Your Own” program for School Psychologist positions. The District has experienced a shortage of qualified candidates for School Psychologist positions and the District expects that this shortage will continue into the future. Therefore, it will benefit the District and its students to have current employees become qualified to fill School Psychologist positions.

By this Addendum, the District and the Employee agree that the Employee’s _____ Employment Contract (“Contract”) shall be modified as follows:

1. The Employee shall be eligible for tuition reimbursement of up to \$5,000 if the following criteria are satisfied:
 - a. Employee shall successfully undergo an initial candidate interview process conducted by the District. If approved to participate in the Grow Your Own program during fiscal year ____, Employee shall be eligible for consideration and approval to continue to participate in the program during each fiscal year until Employee becomes a qualified School Psychologist. Such continued participation is subject to the approval of the Governing Board each year.
 - b. If selected to participate, the District shall reimburse tuition costs incurred by the Employee for college or university courses taken and successfully completed (which means obtaining a final course grade of C or better).
 - c. The courses must be in a program of study approved of in writing by the Superintendent.
 - d. Employee acknowledges that upon receipt of any amount of tuition reimbursement under this addendum, Employee must continue employment for a period of at least one subsequent year after receipt of each reimbursement.
 - e. This Addendum shall not obligate the District to offer Employee future employment in any fiscal year or otherwise affect the District’s ability to terminate or non-renew Employee pursuant to Governing Board policy.

2. All other terms and conditions of the Employee's Contract for _____ fiscal year remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
