The regular meeting of the Board of Education was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chairman Devlin in the Mabelle B. Avery Middle School Board of Education meeting room.

3.0 APPROVAL OF MINUTES

3.1. Approval of Draft Minutes from May 8, 2017 BOE Meeting

J. MacLeod of 103 Maple Ridge Dr., L. Miller of 154 Scully Rd., and D. Kaufman of 62 Applewood Dr. addressed the Board regarding their concern of the track's current condition and inquired that the Board consider a capital improvement plan to renovate or create a new athletic complex.

7.1.1. Warrant of May 22, 2017

It was **MOVED** (J. Anderson), **SECONDED** (S. Bollinger) to approve the 5/22/17 bills in the amount of \$194,267.74 as presented. **PASSED 8-0.**

7.2. Retirement of Karen Salomone, Facilitator of Technology and Information Services

9.0 OLD BUSINESS

9.1. Second Warning of DBS Code 5145.4—Americans with Disabilities Act
It was **MOVED (A. Kirkpatrick)**, **SECONDED (M. Marquardt)** to approve DBS Code 5145.4—Americans with Disabilities Act as presented. **PASSED 8-0.**

10.0 ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

It was **MOVED (M. Marquardt)**, **SECONDED (B. Capuano)** to cancel the 6/12/17 BOE meeting due to the 8th grade ceremony that evening and move the Pension Advisory meeting before the 7/10/17 BOE meeting. **PASSED 8-0.**

Dr. Suffredini addressed the Board regarding the track issue. For the past four to five years, Dr. Suffredini has been working with the school and town increasing awareness of the track's condition and ways to fund a program to rebuild the athletic complex. Currently, the BOF and Board of Selectmen are seeking to secure a bond once reviewing the facilities study report. There will be a meeting in the next couple of weeks, and the BOF will make a determination going forward.

10.1. Somers Public Schools Technology Report

Mr. R. Wilson, Director of Technology, updated the Board on SPS technology:

- **Network:** Installed during summer 2014 and relatively stable. New access points were added. In 2017, 204.18 MB were used on average, down from 229.87 MB in 2016.
- **Servers:** Now stored in a ventilated room at SHS. There are not enough resources yet to move things to the cloud.
- **Staff Devices:** Laptops were obtained for MBA and SHS, and the goal is to provide laptops for SES next year. Support staff will be given Chromebooks and/or iPads.

- **Student Devices:** iPads are slowly phasing out and will be replaced with Chromebooks. SHS has been utilizing Chromebooks, and the misuse of devices has significantly dropped.
- **Classroom Technology:** SES Media Center received a major upgrade during the 2015-2016 winter break. They no longer use a laptop cart. MBA Media Center received a major upgrade during the 2015-2016 spring break and utilizes a cart. The SHS Media Center received a major upgrade during the 2015-2016 spring break. The Business/Yearbook room and two Tech Ed rooms received an upgrade during the 2015-16 school year. Projectors are on average 10 years old. There are 18 Mimio devices in the district which are 5-6 years old.
- **Phones:** Phones and voicemail have been “mostly” stable. The main switch is over 10 years old. Interface slots are slowly being upgraded to digital. The SHS Bell System was upgraded.
- **Video Systems:** The video systems will change to a digital content delivery system. Tube TV’s are still utilized in the classrooms. Broken Tube TV’s have been replaced with a flat screen.
- **Digital Content Delivery System:** There are over 1200 videos on the system. Students are able to view lectures at home which enable teachers to work more 1:1 with students in the classroom. Morning announcements are also piped in the system.

2016 Improvement Plan: All 2016 goals have been implemented...

- Chromebooks at SHS
- InfoSnap – Online registration for all students (73% of students were registered online; over 300 athletic registrations were submitted online)
- Café Point-of-Sale – New Electronic Cafeteria System (over 385 families registered; over 635 students had accounts activated; over \$81,000 deposited online for meals)
- After-School PD Expansion – at least two sessions a month (includes individual, small group, off-site and bi-weekly after-school technology training)
- Expand Digital Signage

2017 Improvement Plan: The following are improvement goals...

- Chromebooks at MBA
- New school website
- SHS AV club
- SES Teacher Laptop Upgrades
- Radio Station (WDJW) Independence

In addition, the Administrative Assistant to the Superintendent will receive a \$1,500.00 adjustment in salary, and the Director of Technology and Information Services will receive a tuition reimbursement of \$2,500.00 for two years payable January 2018 and January 2019 as presented. PASSED 8-0.

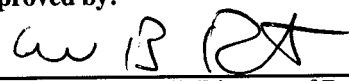

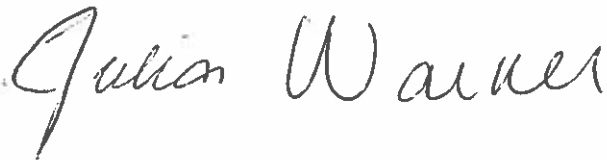

I would like to thank the Somers Board of Education for allowing me to teach at Somers High for the past thirteen years. I have *thoroughly* enjoyed teaching here. However, over the course of the last year, a rare opportunity has opened up. With support from *Mission Aviation Fellowship* an NGO that supports both non-secular and secular interests of people living in remote areas, I have the opportunity to teach social studies on the remote island of Papua, Indonesia. I would be teaching at Hillcrest School in Sentani, Indonesia.

This is a letter requesting a leave of absence without pay for the 2017 - 2018 school year. This opportunity has the potential to benefit the Somers school district in a number of ways:

Somers High School and Mabelle B. Avery:

- I will gain cross cultural exposure in a country that is majority Muslim. I will be able to discuss cross cultural differences with the social studies departments at both MBA and SHS upon return.
- Indonesia has over two hundred million Muslims. More Muslims than any country worldwide. There are a plurality of different beliefs in Indonesia including Catholics, Protestants, Buddhists, & Hindus. Though Islam is the majority religion, there is a relatively peaceful co-existence between religious and ethnic groups. Indonesia is somewhat of a "melting pot" of beliefs and peoples. Observing and discussing these differences could benefit the social studies departments and students of SHS/MBA.
- Cross cultural differences to observe and discuss may also include: similarities and differences in governmental administration, education, immigration, minorities, law enforcement, gender differences, human rights, trafficking, military, religion, ethnicity, media, geography, transportation, economics, response to crisis, etc.
- If the technology is adequate, I would like to Skype with a freshmen World Civilizations class to discuss life in Indonesia.
- My wife is an ESL teacher. Her observations about language instruction/acquisition could be beneficial to language instructors at SHS.

Somers Elementary School:

- If it is possible, I would like to set up international pen pals with a selected Somers Elementary School class and Hillcrest School.
- My wife and children will be moving with me. My children (ages 5, 6, 9, and 11) will help to give me a "kid's eye" view of life and cultural differences in Indonesia. Upon return, I could share their journal entries about life in Indonesia with SES teachers. Topics may include food, going to market, housing, transportation, clothing, money, geography, etc.

District Wide:

- If deemed as desirable, we could contact the local media to promote this experience.

This is an excellent opportunity for professional development and personal growth as an educator. This growth will in turn benefit the Somers School system with a greater understanding about a part of the world that is often not fully understood.

Literacy

- The percentage of students on or above grade level in reading will maintain or increase while students below grade level will increase by more than one year's growth.
 - By May 1, 2017, students in grades K – 5 will reach or exceed the Fountas and Pinnell end-of-year grade level reading expectation.
 - By May 1, 2017, students in Grades K - 1 will increase their scores on the end-of-year MAP for Primary Grades (MPG) reading assessment by one RIT band or more (equivalent of 10 points).
 - By May 1, 2017, students in Grades 2 – 5 will increase their scores on the end-of-year MAP reading assessment by one RIT band or more (equivalent of 10 points).

Literacy Results

- 72% of students in K – 5 reached or exceeded the Fountas and Pinnell end-of-year grade level reading expectation.
- 80% of Grade 1 maintained or increased their scores on the end-of-year MAP for Primary Grades (MPG) reading assessment (at least a 10 point gain)
- 80% of students in Grades 2 – 5 maintained or increased their scores on the end-of-year MAP reading (at least a 10 point gain)

Math

- The percentage of students on or above grade level in math will maintain or increase while students below grade level will increase by more than one year's growth.
- By May 1, 2017, Grade 1 & 2 students will increase their scores by one or more RIT band on the MAP for Primary Grades (MPG) Assessment. (equivalent of 10 points)
- By May 1, 2017, Grade 3 - 5 students will increase their scores by one or more RIT band on the MAP Math Assessment. (equivalent of 10 points)

Math Results

- 80% of students in Grade 1 & 2 maintained or increased their scores on the MAP for Primary Grades (MPG) Assessment. (equivalent of 10 points)
- 80% Grade 3 - 5 students maintained or increased their scores on the MAP Math Assessment. (equivalent of 10 points)

Reading Intervention

- ▣ The percentage of students in reading intervention will maintain or increase while students below grade level will increase by more than one year's growth.
- ▣ Students in Grades 1 & 2 will increase their scores on the end-of-year MAP for Primary Grades (MPG) reading assessment by more than one RIT band (10 points).
- ▣ Students in Grades 3 – 5 will increase their scores on the end-or – year MAP reading assessment by more than one RIT band (10 points).

Reading Intervention Results

- 80% of students in Grades 1 & 2 increased their scores on the end-of-year MAP for Primary Grades (MPG) reading assessment (at least a 10 point gain).
- 80% of students in Grades 3 – 5 increased their scores on the end-or-year MAP reading assessment (at least a 10 point gain).

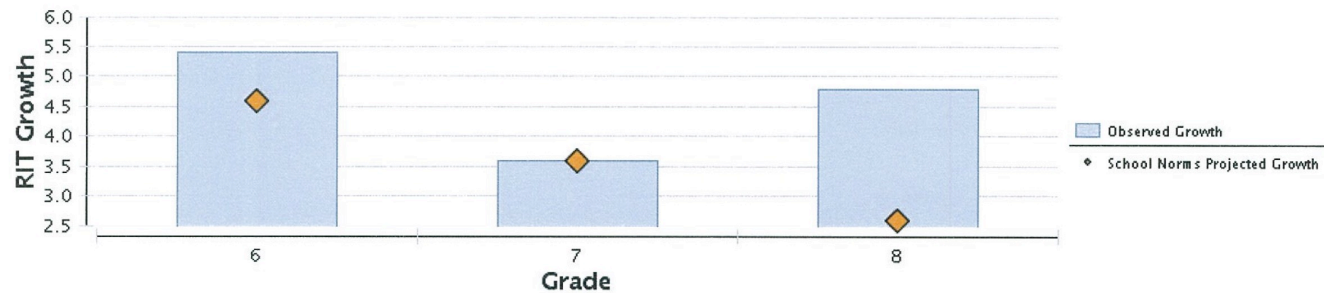

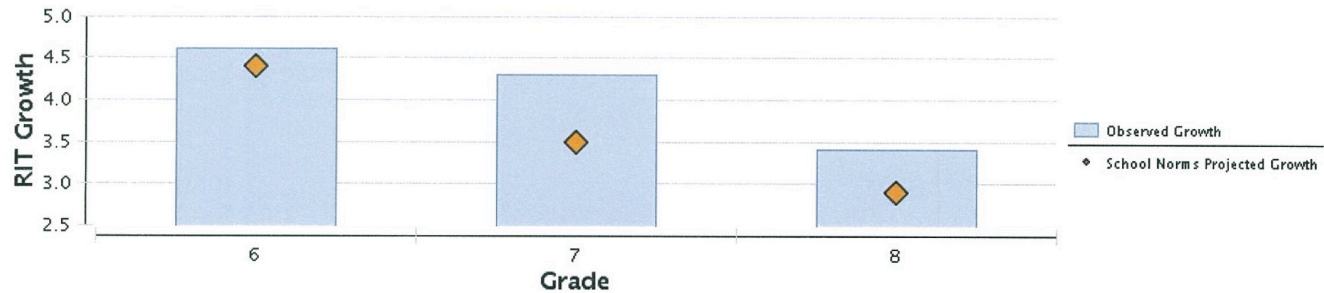

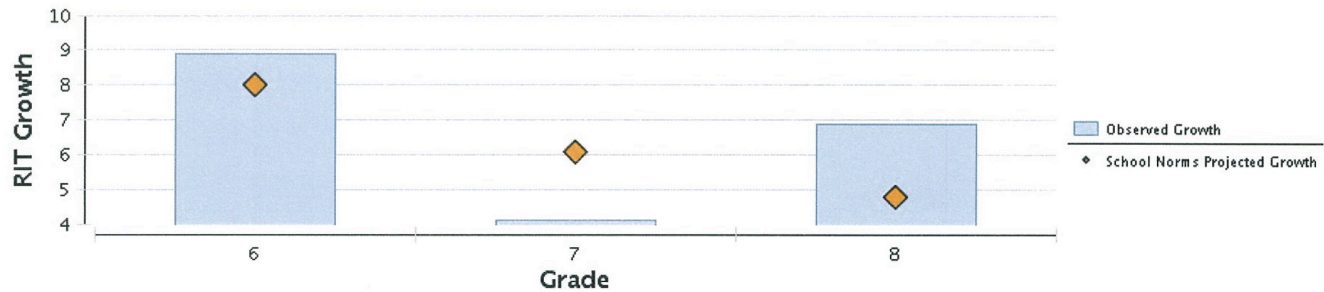

5. Sentence Fluency—the rhythm and flow of the language
6. Conventions—the mechanical correctness
7. Presentation—how the writing actually looks on the page
