-Our DCALS fall fund raising efforts between staff and student contributions totals over \$600. Staff donations used to provide gifts for our at risk students and to restock our student food shelf. -These individuals were chosen by their Superintendent Dr. John Christiansen for the TIES Exceptional Teacher award, which recognizes teachers who use technology to positively impact student learning and model best practices in their classroom.

Paul Landwehr is a construction trades teacher at Dakota County Area Learning School (DCALS). He has worked diligently to incorporate technology and math into his classroom. Paul and his students construct a variety of houses and cabins each school year. He has been working closely with our ALC math teacher Lynn Morris to increase the amount of technology used in his instruction. Last year, he received a Smartboard to help demonstrate safety, design, and building techniques with his students. He worked closely with the Dakota County Technical College Architectural Design program to create a model for his current camper cabin project. Paul continues to increase his knowledge of technology and how it helps to enhance his truly hands-on learning experiences for all his students.

Lynn Morris is a math teacher within DCALS programs, where she teaches students in our Alternative Learning Center as well as co-teaching within our construction trades program, where she teamed with Paul Landwehr to teach a Geometry in Construction class. Lynn teaches Construction Trades projects mathematical concepts across the district. She has helped to integrate the use of technology through the implementation of a Smartboard and computer-based trainings for students in the Construction class. Lynn has made safety training available with the use of her iPad by recording proper equipment use in the classroom and then having that available to students. She uses Smartboard technology daily to show all Geometry concepts through hands-on experiences. Lynn is a lifelong learner who embraces all that technology can do to help show real-life applications of Geometry for her students.

School districts participating in the TIES Exceptional Teacher award program are partners of TIES. TIES, an expert in learning technology, provides training, education, and support for educators.

-Fundamental Chef Training staff and students catered a “Build Your Own Pasta Bar” for the Dakota County Foster Program on Monday December 5th, 2016. A total of 250 people, including foster families, staff, teens, and young children, attended this appreciation party and enjoyed pasta, salad, cookies, and beverages in the atrium at the Apple Valley Service Center. This is the first year that Chef Patty’s program has had the opportunity to prepare the food for this event. Many of the teens wanted to know what type of a class would be able to cater an event like this. Chef Patty shared information about all of the career & technical programs here at ISD # 917.

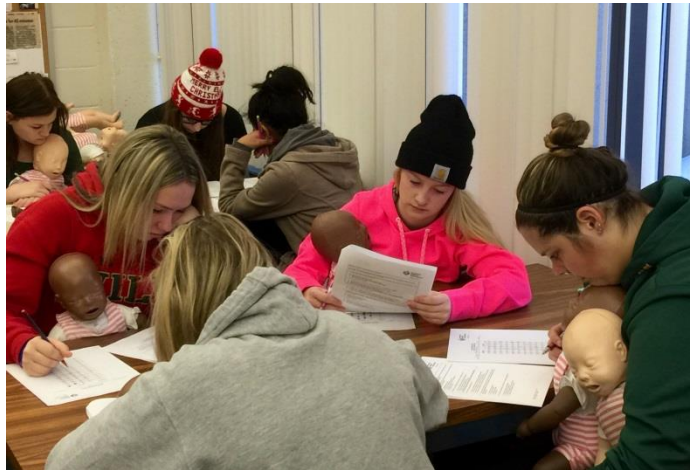

- On November 23, 2016 New Chance hosted their annual Thanksgiving lunch. Students, their families, county staff, and teaching staff all sat down and shared a meal together. This year, the students worked on different activities in each class to help prepare for the meal. In Ms. Helm's and Ms. Boehmer's class, the students made place settings for the tables. In Ms. Cornelius' class the students made paper mache pumpkins. In Ms. Epps' class the students worked on their presentation projects for the guests. Some students wrote essays about what they are thankful for and others wrote about gratitude and how they express gratitude. With the help of county staff, students prepared and served a fantastic feast. It is times like these that we realized how grateful we are to be working with such a wonderful team to help our students achieve their social, emotional, and academic goals.



- Congratulations to **Shelbee Jaeger** for being an ISD 917 recipient of the TIES Exceptional Teacher Award at the December 13, 2016 TIES Conference! Ms. Jaeger, ISD 917 Teacher of Deaf/Hard of Hearing, utilizes very innovative and creative technological strategies to support her learners who are deaf/hard of hearing in a program located in a middle school setting in Lakeville, both in the resource room as well as general education setting. In the resource room she utilizes a variety of Chrome extensions and applications to provide better access and individualized instruction. Some examples include Quizlet, Khan Academy, Nearpod, Splashtop Classroom, etc. Her innovative use of AT allows her learners, who have language delays resulting from the impact of hearing loss, to be able to succeed in very rigorous general education classes taught at language levels significantly higher than their own, learners who otherwise would not be able to participate as fully in that setting. The learners are 'making it,' happy and proud they are making it in such a challenging environment. Ms. Jaeger's creative efforts in the general education setting involve using real-time input via use of a support person doing greatly expanded notetaking during classroom instruction on Google Docs, which the students receive in real-time on their Chromebooks, to be able to provide instantaneous pictures and text elaboration of difficult vocabulary and academic concepts. Ms. Jaeger's creativity has resulted in a wonderful inclusion success story for her students.

- The School Beautification Committee at Lebanon Education Center painted murals above main doors to encourage the students and add some special touches to the building. Shanna Knutson was the brainchild behind the committee. Members include Matt Trainer, Brian Moga, Richelle Gernes, Erin Stevens, Wendi Renken, Shae Elliott, Caitlyn Haring, Bonnie Korman, and Hannah White. Madeline Olson, junior from ISD 271, designed the solar system mural. The committee chose the quotes as well as designing the other murals. The committee came in on a Saturday to paint the murals.



- Staff at Cedar and Lebanon Education Center have been developing "Fun Fridays" for the students. These are building wide activities that are held one Friday afternoon per month to

build a sense of community and create times for students to interact with peers outside their classrooms. Activities have included kickball games, art projects, games, and decorating contests.

- Karey Heim, current member of the Autism Grant Advisory Committee for MN Department of Health and Human Services, has been asked to participate as a trainer and recruiter for a 2-year Department of Health and Human Services Grant funding Dakota and Ramsey County partnership. The purpose of the grant is to identify gaps in services and supports in existing funding, with the goals of increasing access to respite for primary caregivers of individuals with autism, training service and support providers on autism and methods of effective support, and creating a plan to sustain activities beyond funding period outside of Dakota and Ramsey counties for the state of Minnesota.
- The Employment Capacity Building Cohort (EBCB) is a pilot program with MDE, select school districts, Vocational Rehabilitation Services and select counties working together to help students with developmental disabilities achieve competitive and integrated employment prior to or upon graduation from school. Member districts, Inver Grove Heights and South St. Paul, are a part of the EBCB pilot program with 11 students from the two districts attending the TESA and DASH programs as a part of this effort. TESA and DASH are excited to be in partnership in this collaborative effort to work with the cohort to assist these identified students in reaching the goal of the opportunity to work and earn a competitive wage with the appropriate support and services.
- The “5th Annual TESA Holiday Showcase” was held on Wednesday December 21st in the Dakota Room and it was a resounding success. The event gave students the opportunity to display a variety of classroom projects, accomplishments and community service projects, as well as group and individual talents. Many families and alumni were in attendance at this event. Students and families were able to socialize and enjoy holiday treats upon after the successful event.
- On December 15th, students and their family members enjoyed a craft and treat extravaganza, hosted by staff from Ms. Radant’s and Ms. Nohelty’s classrooms. The students and their guests made snowflake picture frames, penguin and polar bear magnets and marshmallow s’mores decorations. They also decorated and enjoyed delicious sugar cookies and had some hot cocoa. We were thrilled to have families come to engage in this wonderful activity and are so thankful to the staff and students in Rooms 105 and 106 for making it happen!

Technology Upgrade Proposal for FY 17**

In an attempt to stay current with industry standards and provide the most efficient use of technology for all our Secondary Programs, I am submitting this proposal to the ISD 917 School Board. We have been able to gradually add some new technology items over the past few years through our individual program budgets. Now that much of our technology items have reached an age well past normal use, we are asking for a larger upgrade. With our increased use of online learning, technology based research, and web/cloud based sharing, it is imperative that we improve our technology. Part of this upgrade will allow for teachers to remain within their classrooms to teach lessons and not have to move to the computer lab. Almost all of our member districts have moved to mobile devices such as Chromebooks or I pads for each student. I am recommending the purchase of Chromebooks due to the ease of use and the global access for students and staff. The cost of Chromebooks are half that of a new desktop. We would like to maintain a traditional lab setting for trainings, testing, and certain projects that function better on a desktop.

The software upgrades for some of our CTE programs will provide for a better industry ready student using modern technology. Our instructors have conferred with the staff of DCTC in their areas of instruction so that the context for the software upgrade reflects best practices. Our Graphics and Computer Network programs are operating with computers that are over seven years old and would need upgrades to function at a basic level. The new computers and software would provide the most current access to industry recognized skills and training.

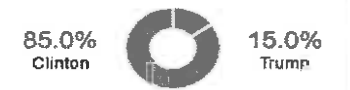

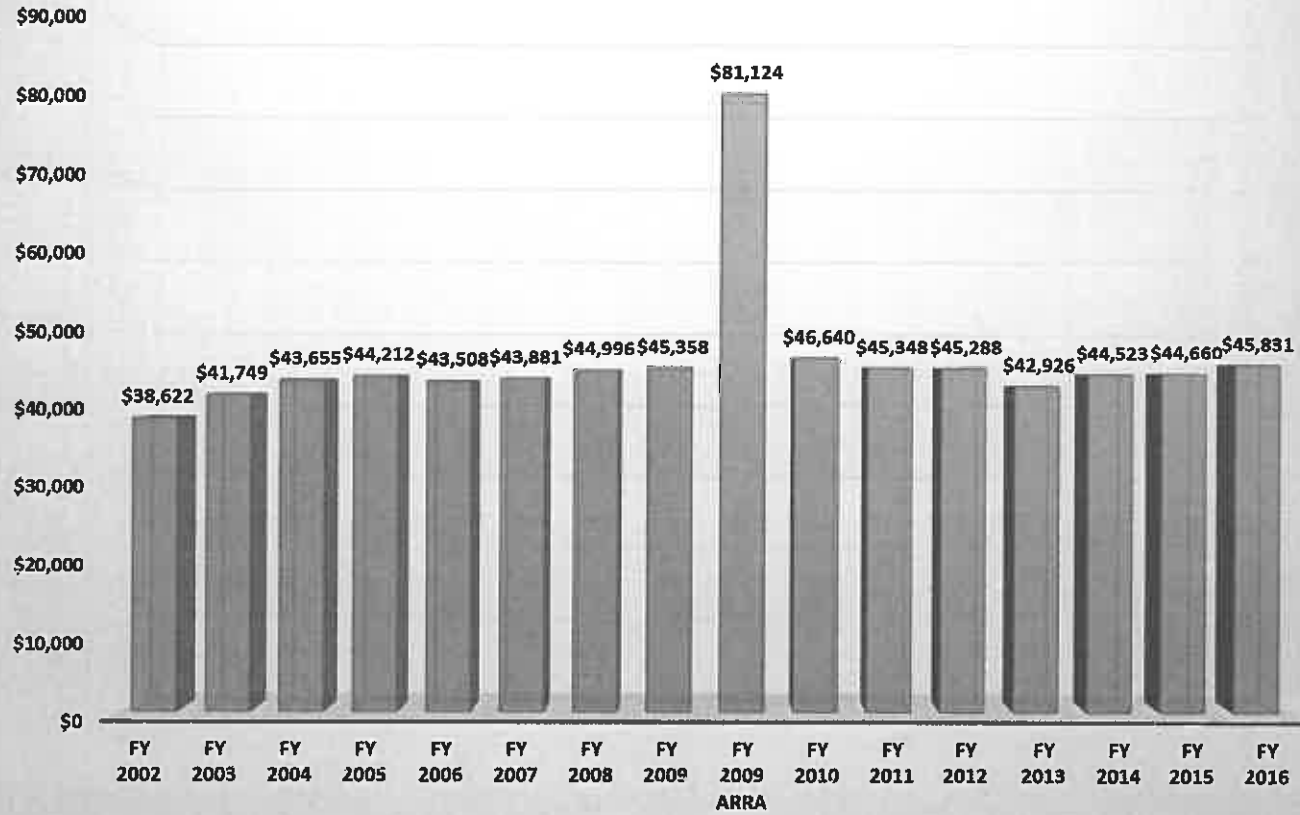

- Title I: Fund at level to meet state set aside and preserve LEA allocations
 - level funded (consolidates \$450 m from SIG into Title I)
 - Coupled with change in hold harmless, results in CUT of \$200m in LEA allocations
- IDEA: Level funding of IDEA puts the federal share at 16%, below the 2005 level, when federal share was 18%
- Title IV: Fund Title IV at a level that supports local formula allocation
 - President funds Title IV at \$500 m (increase from \$353, but well below authorized \$1.6 b); Senate proposed \$300 m; House proposed \$1 b
