The Board of Education Wayzata Public Schools

An Organizational/Regular Board of the Board of Trustees of Wayzata Public Schools was held Monday, January 13, 2014, beginning at 7:00 PM in the Wayzata City Hall, 600 Rice Street, Wayzata.

1. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

The meeting was called to order by Jay Hesby, Acting Board Chair and Ms. Cheryl Polzin, Acting Board Clerk called the roll. The following School Board members were present: Ms. Linda Cohen, Ms. Andrea Cuene, Mr. Jay Hesby, Ms. Sarah Johansen, Mr. Chris McCullough, Ms. Carter Peterson, Ms. Cheryl Polzin and Dr. Chace B. Anderson, Superintendent of Schools and Ex Officio member of the School Board.

2. OATH OF OFFICE TO NEWLY ELECTED/RE-ELECTED SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS

Mr. Hesby read the Oath of Office narrative. Each of the recently elected school board members from the November 5, 2013 school board election, recited the following: "I swear/affirm that I, Andrea Cuene/Chris McCullough/Sarah Johansen will support the Constitution of the United States and of this state, and that I will discharge faithfully the duties of the office of School Board member of Independent School District No. 284 to the best of my judgment and ability."

Through this process, property owners adjacent to the planned roadway expansion were contacted and received offers to compensate them for the required easements that would allow the city to proceed with these planned improvements. Appraisals were performed and the amount of compensation is deemed reasonable for the permanent

The school board facility committee, in conjunction with staff from Wold Architects and Engineers and Kraus Anderson, discussed these agreements at the January 27, 2014 facilities committee meeting and met with Dave Hagen of WSB & Associates, Inc. The District will receive \$48,600 in proceeds from granting these easements. Proceeds will be deposited in the District's operating capital fund. The recommended action was to approve the Temporary and Permanent Easements for Peony Lane Expansion and authorize the Superintendent to sign the agreements.

Student Engagement

If you spend enough time in middle and high school classrooms, you are almost certain to come away with the following observation: Teachers work exceedingly hard to convince their students that the day's lessons are worthy of their attention and effort. Using strategies ranging from length class to overtures, they are forever attempting to motivate their students to achieve and to persuade them to engage in the learning process. Sometimes these techniques work beautifully and the classroom is alive with exploration and discovery; at other times, the techniques fall short and students tune out, disengage, and ultimately fail. Though the reasons for these successes and challenges are widely debated, practitioners, scholars, and policymakers all agree that if students are sufficiently motivated to achieve and adequately engaged in classroom learning, their chances of succeeding academically are greatly enhanced (Tscholar, 2012).

Student learning, persistence, and attainment (at least) are strongly connected with student engagement. The more actively engaged students are—with faculty and staff, with other students, with the subject matter they are studying—the more likely they are to persist in their studies and to achieve at higher levels. This relationship has been documented in educational research starting with a 1984 report sponsored by the National Institute of Education, which found "sociocultural principles about the conditions of educational excellence everywhere."

1. The amount of student learning and personal development associated with any educational program is directly proportional to the quality and quantity of student involvement in that program.
2. The effectiveness of any educational policy or practice is directly related to the capacity of that policy or practice to increase student involvement in learning.

Excerpt from the Committee on College Student Engagement's National Panel through the Task Department of Education

We are motivated by desire, we engage out of a desire to make a life for ourselves, an authentic life capable of meaningful challenges and achieving progress in our everyday world.

Classroom, schools, and teacher-student relationships are influenced by a multitude of factors, to say nothing of peer relationships, social climates, family dynamics, neighborhood conditions, etc. How then can we engage our students in the school setting? Should I try to motivate students by appealing to their individual interests and goals, or would it be better to change outside influences—for example, the way I teach and how I organize my classroom? What appears to me to motivate students the most: rewards and privileges, praise, increased opportunities for discussion with teacher, greater autonomy, or more peer interaction? The best research-based answer is—it depends. It depends on knowing the student well enough to see how the work of creating first steps to engage the student in their learning (Tscholar, 2012).

Some students enter schools that have consistently supported academic achievement, instilled the joy of learning, and enabled the benefits of school success. Such students tend to be ready for whatever teachers offer. We might think of them as being pre-motivated in school. These students may have observed that school works well for people they know and trust, have experienced support and encouragement from parents, teachers, and school officials, but still when attending school sometimes what they learn in class does not mesh with their own beliefs and values, and is not valued by adults and peers at school. More often than not, these students' attitudes, beliefs, and backgrounds are represented in their school's personnel and in its climate, behavioral expectations, and institutional values, which reinforce positive self-image and expand opportunities (Tscholar, 2012).

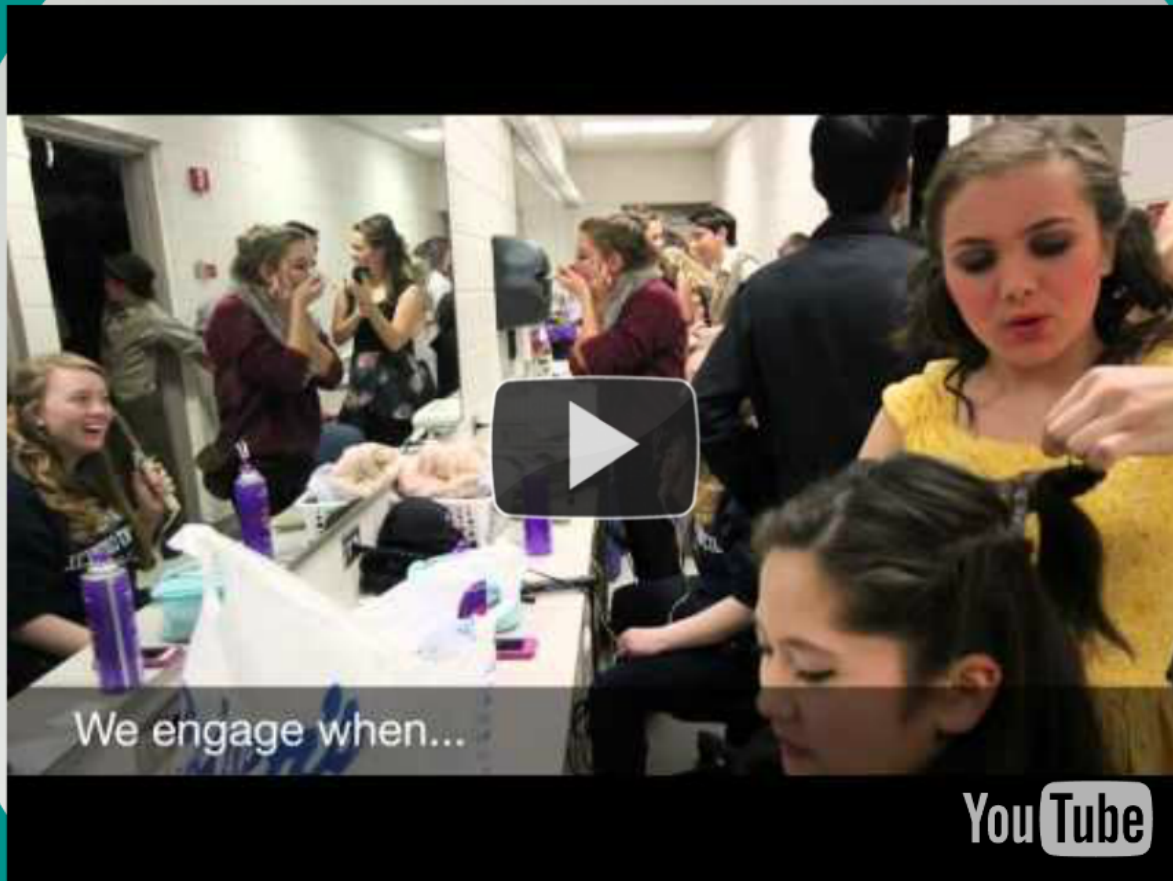

The Wayzata Public Schools Education Foundation was formed in June 2003 by a group of citizens concerned about the serious impact of state and federal budget cuts to education. The group's mission is to maintain educational experiences in Wayzata Public Schools by providing private financial support to the district for academics.

Since 2007, nearly \$120,000 has been awarded in grants to the Wayzata Public Schools and since its inception in 2010, the 'From Excellent to Exceptional' grant program annually funds up to \$10,000 for grant projects that extend the regular curriculum in collaborative and innovative ways.

The goals of the 'From Excellent to Exceptional' grant award program are to:

- Provide exceptional and innovative learning opportunities that have not been possible within the regular Wayzata Public School funding system.
- Support collaborative, educationally sound and curriculum-based projects.
- Give preference to projects that impact the student population and the community at large, and enhance learning for significant number of students.
- Support projects that strive to move the learning environment from "Excellent to Exceptional.
- Support projects with a clearly defined purpose, student performance outcomes, methods and procedures.

The foundation is administered through the Minnesota Community Foundation and qualifies as a public charity under federal and state laws. It is an entity separate from Wayzata Public Schools with its own board of directors and by-laws.

Upon graduation he will have taken six AP courses at WHS.

In addition to academics, Mason is an outside linebacker on the WHS Football Team and runs the 800 meter and 1,600 meter events on the WHS Track and Field Team. He also volunteers at St. Bartholomew Church in Wayzata.

His top three choices for college next year include the University of Minnesota, Northwestern University and Yale. He's interested in majoring in engineering or a math related field.

Zoe Tu took a couple practice tests in the week leading up to her June 2013 exam but "mostly what helped was my regular school work," she said about preparing for the exam.

Zoe is taking five Advanced Placement courses during her senior year, including AP Statistics, AP Biology, AP Physics and AP Psychology. Upon graduation this spring, she will have taken 11 AP classes and 10 AP tests. Outside of academics, she is captain of the 2013-14 WHS State Championship Swim and Dive Team, captain of the WHS Speech Team, captain of the WHS Science Olympiad Team, a member of LINK Crew, and the National Honors Society and is a substitute anchor on the WHS Newsbreak program. Zoe also volunteers at North Memorial Hospital over the summer and tutors classmates at WHS.

Her top three choices for college next year are Harvard, Princeton and the University of Minnesota. She is interested in majoring in chemistry and possibly pursuing a career in pharmaceutical medicine.

William Zeng earned his perfect score the first time on the April 2013 exam and prepared for the test with the ACT prep book and the ACT online course, which he found wasn't as helpful. He said his normal classwork at WHS was beneficial by preparing him for the three portions of the exam through exposure in the related classes.

William is currently enrolled in the Post Secondary Education Options (PSEO) program and spends most of his day at the University of Minnesota where he is currently enrolled in AP Literature, a statistics class, Spanish 3 and a discussion class on the future of a physician. Upon graduation, William will have taken seven AP courses and 13 AP tests.

Outside of academics, William is on the WHS Math Team, Science Olympiad and Science Bowl. He is also a Boy Scout with the rank of Life Scout and very close to earning his Eagle Scout rank. To achieve his Eagle Scout, William is working to install a Chinese library section at Central Middle School that will include books that introduce students to the Chinese language and culture. He is also a member of the National Honor Society and volunteers at North Memorial Hospital.

His top three choices for college next year include Harvard, Yale and Princeton and he is interested in majoring in pre-med or biomedical engineering.

Sruti Paladugu earned her perfect score on her first exam taken last fall. She prepared for the test by using the ACT prep books over the summer, looking for example problems and taking practice tests. She said this helped a lot to show her how to approach problems on the exam under the time constraint.

She said her normal classwork also helped prepare her for the exam. Currently she is enrolled in AP U.S. History, AP Language and Composition, AP Biology and AP Chemistry. Upon graduation Sruti expects she will have taken eight to 10 AP courses.

Outside of academics, Sruti is involved with the WHS Quizbowl Team, Science Olympiad, Science Bowl and WHS Math Team. She also volunteers at the Plymouth Library and North Memorial Hospital. As a junior she hasn't yet identified a list of colleges, but is interested in majoring in a science or engineering field.

Bella Roussanov said she took a couple practice tests, but said her normal curriculum helped prepare her for earning her perfect score on the October 2013 exam.

Bella is currently enrolled in AP U.S. History, AP Biology, AP Chemistry and AP Language and Composition. Upon graduation, she said she will have taken 12 AP classes and 14 AP tests.

Outside of academics, Bella participates on the Science Olympiad, Quizbowl and the Relay for Life Committee. She is also a member of the National Honors Society, plays the piano and volunteers at the Wayzata Public Library.

She is interested in majoring in chemistry, economics or creative writing but hasn't narrowed down a university list yet.
