Curriculum renewal process involves three stages

District 191's plan for curriculum renewal provides a process to the district, schools and teachers to make appropriate changes that positively impact student achievement. During the 2010-11 school year, this process will be reviewed and refined so that the district is purposefully developing and revising curricula, implementing relative instructional resources, and employing effective instructional strategies.

District 191 uses a systematic, cyclical process. This process includes planning and creating a curriculum vision for each discipline area, providing for systematic analysis of the schools' programs of study and instructional practice, and implementing and evaluating curriculum. The district uses three stages to accomplish this cyclical process as each discipline enters into the Curriculum Renewal Cycle.

Stage One: Planning and Creating a Curriculum Vision.

Examine each stage of the curriculum renewal process, along with specific issues related to the district and schools, and develop a specific plan for renewing the curriculum. Analyze new trends, ideas, innovative programs, and standards to develop a vision for the curriculum of the future. Inform the Instruction and Curriculum Advisory Committee (ICAC) and the Board of Education of this plan and ask for their input.

Strategies: Review stages, begin program analysis, find materials and resources, and create a tentative plan. Analyze readings, use consultants, examine district programs, review national programs, examine regulations and frameworks, and explore integration with other subjects.

Stage Two: Analyze the Curriculum in Practice and Develop a Plan for Action. Collect data to describe the current curriculum in practice – its goals, units of study, instructional time, materials and programs in use, curriculum guides, assessment strategies, etc. Determine the perceived needs of current teachers. Compare the ideal and the actual program in practice. Develop recommendations for change and plans for action.

Strategies: Conduct surveys, map curriculum, review assessment data, conduct program evaluations and audits, evaluate curriculum, examine integration, and synthesize data. Conduct activities to examine gaps between an ideal curriculum and current curriculum in practice.

Stage Three: Redesign, Implement and Evaluate the Curriculum. Redesign and restructure the curriculum according to

the plan of action, with emphasis on building a standards-based program, revising the curriculum guide, reviewing materials and instructional practices, and incorporating various forms of assessment. Offer appropriate professional development. Monitor the redesigned program as it is implemented. Evaluate and revise if appropriate. Seek input of the Curriculum Renewal Plan from ICAC and approval from the Board of Education.

Strategies: Revise philosophy and goals, determine standards, redesign scope and sequence, revise instructional strategies, select resources, devise new assessment procedures, develop curriculum blueprint, revise specific courses and units. Institute new curriculum, communicate with parents and community, pilot programs, initiate appropriate professional development, implement new assessments, evaluate and monitor programs.

SUMMARY

Improving the learning of all students is the ultimate goal of a quality curriculum renewal process. To achieve the high expectations articulated in standards, all pieces of the curriculum renewal process must work in concert.

By analyzing what changes are needed, setting a clear time line, and clearly defining roles and responsibilities as outlined in this Curriculum Renewal Plan, the climate exists for all students to master essential concepts and skills.

Three K-12 content areas will begin the curriculum review process in 2010-11: Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science.

The Burnsville-Eagan-Savage School District supports active community participation in phases of planning and improving instruction and curriculum affecting the state's graduation standards.

As a result, the Board of Education established an Instruction and Curriculum Advisory Committee (ICAC) to ensure active community participation in all phases of planning and improving instruction and curriculum. The committee's charge is to make recommendations on issues related to the development, review and implementation of curriculum at the elementary and secondary levels.

Recent topics for the committee have included district student development data, the professional development plan, Burnsville High School registration guide, cultural competency and literacy, the district's magnet programs and curriculum adoption recommendations.

Students in several grades take required state tests

During the period of April 12 through May 21, 2010, the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments - Series II (MCA-II) were given to students in grades 3 through 8, 10 and 11 in Burnsville-Eagan-Savage School District 191.

MCA-II assessments serve as part of the federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) accountability framework used in Minnesota as required by state law.

Reading and mathematics tests are used to determine

whether schools and districts have made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) toward the NCLB goal of all students reaching proficiency by 2014.

Students in grades 3 through 8 participated in the MCA-II reading and mathematics tests.

Students in grade 10 took the MCA-II/GRAD reading test and students in grade 11 took the MCA-II/GRAD mathematics test.

Students score above state average on math tests

The districtwide proficiency rate of District 191 students on the MCA-II math test exceeds the state-wide average slightly; however the 2009-10 district proficiency rate is slightly lower than the 2008-09 proficiency rate.

Elementary sites increased on average nearly 2% over the 2009 MCA-II test. The elementary grades ranged in score proficiency by a 3% decrease to 8% increase over the previous year.

Elementary sites also exceeded state-wide performance by nearly 4.5% on average. Elementary proficiency in comparison to statewide proficiency ranges from grade 3 above the state by 1.6% to grade 6 above the state by 9%.

Junior high proficiency rates decreased over the previous year and remain nearly 5% behind the state aver-

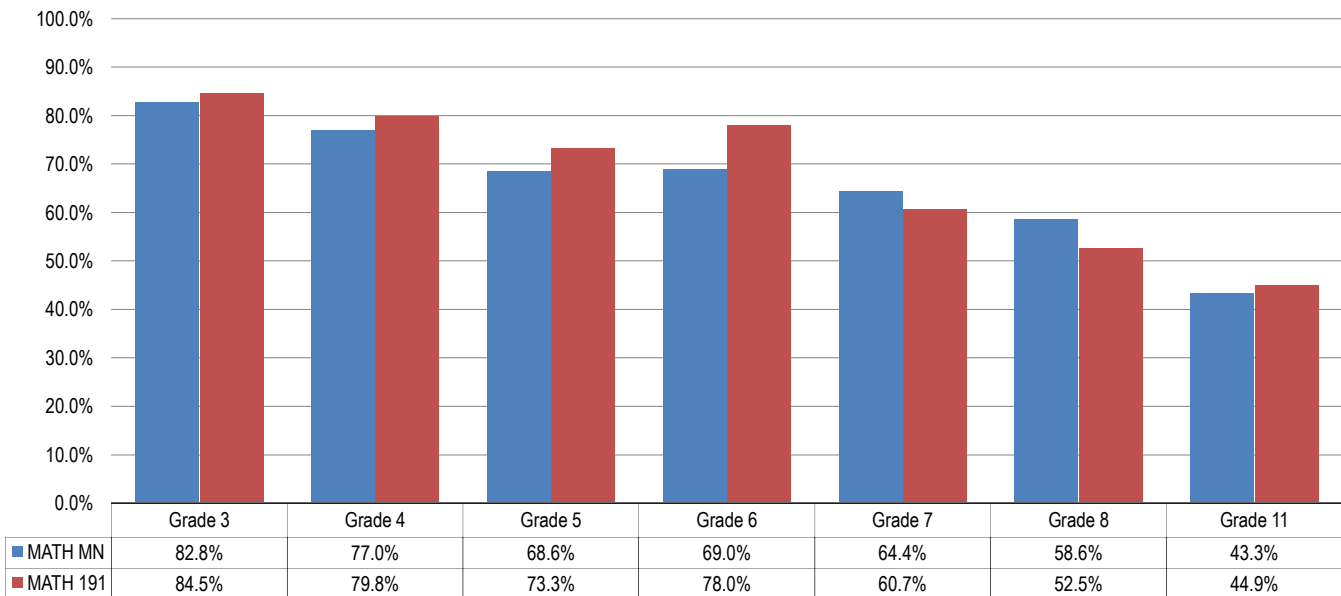
age. High school proficiency levels decreased 1.5% from the 2009 MCA-II and exceed the state-wide proficiency levels by nearly 1%.

District 191 subgroup performance decreased in mathematics proficiency rates with the exception of students receiving special education services who saw an increase of nearly 1%.

While most subgroup performance rates decreased, statewide subgroup proficiency rates decreased in larger numbers resulting in comparison score gains.

Proficiency rates for District 191 limited English students increased to nearly 15% above the state-wide rates; however this can be attributed to the number of limited English students taking an optional state math test for limited English students.

Most reading scores increase; but junior high scores decline

The districtwide ISD 191 student proficiency rates in reading are nearly identical to state-wide proficiency rates.

This represents nearly a 1% increase in reading on the MCA-II proficiency district-wide from the 2008-09 school year.

Overall elementary proficiency rates increased nearly 1.5% over the 2009 MCA-II test, however some grade levels decreased as much as 3% while others increased as much as 3%.

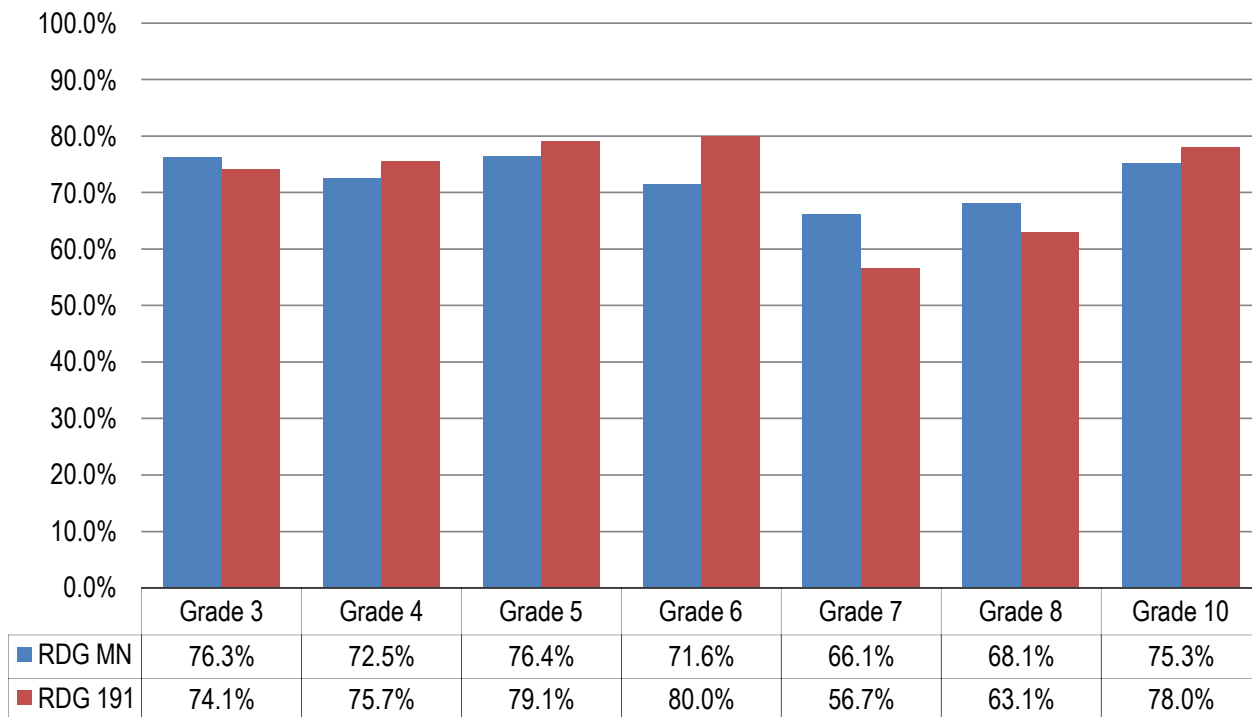
Elementary proficiency rates exceeded state proficiency rates by just over 3% with some grade levels

performing above the state average and others performing below.

The junior high proficiency rates decreased by approximately 1.4% over the previous year and continue to lag behind state-wide proficiency rates. The high school proficiency rates increased slightly from the 2009 MCA-II and continue to exceed state-wide performance by approximately 3%.

Subgroup performance increased in reading proficiency rates across nearly all groups from the 2009 MCA-II. Compared to state-wide proficiency rates, ISD 191 subgroups range from approximately 3% below the state average to 13% above the state average.

STATE TEST RESULTS

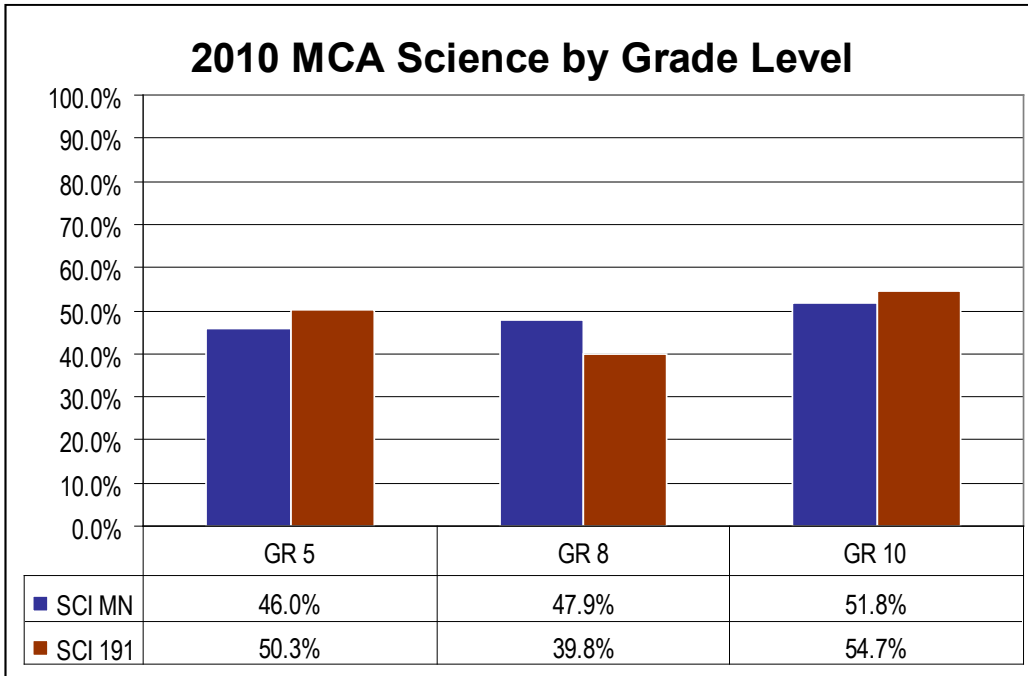
Science score remain close to state averages

District 191 student proficiency rates on the MCA-II science tests remain close to the statewide proficiency rates. Districtwide proficiency rates decreased nearly 1% from the 2008-09 school year.

The District 191 proficiency rate for grade 5 was approximately 4% above the state average, grade 8 scored approximately 8% below the state average, and

grade 10 scored approximately 3% above the state average.

Subgroup performance decreased in science proficiency across nearly all groups from the 2009 MCA-II. Compared to statewide proficiency rates, District 191 subgroups range from approximately 5% below the state average to 5% above the state average.





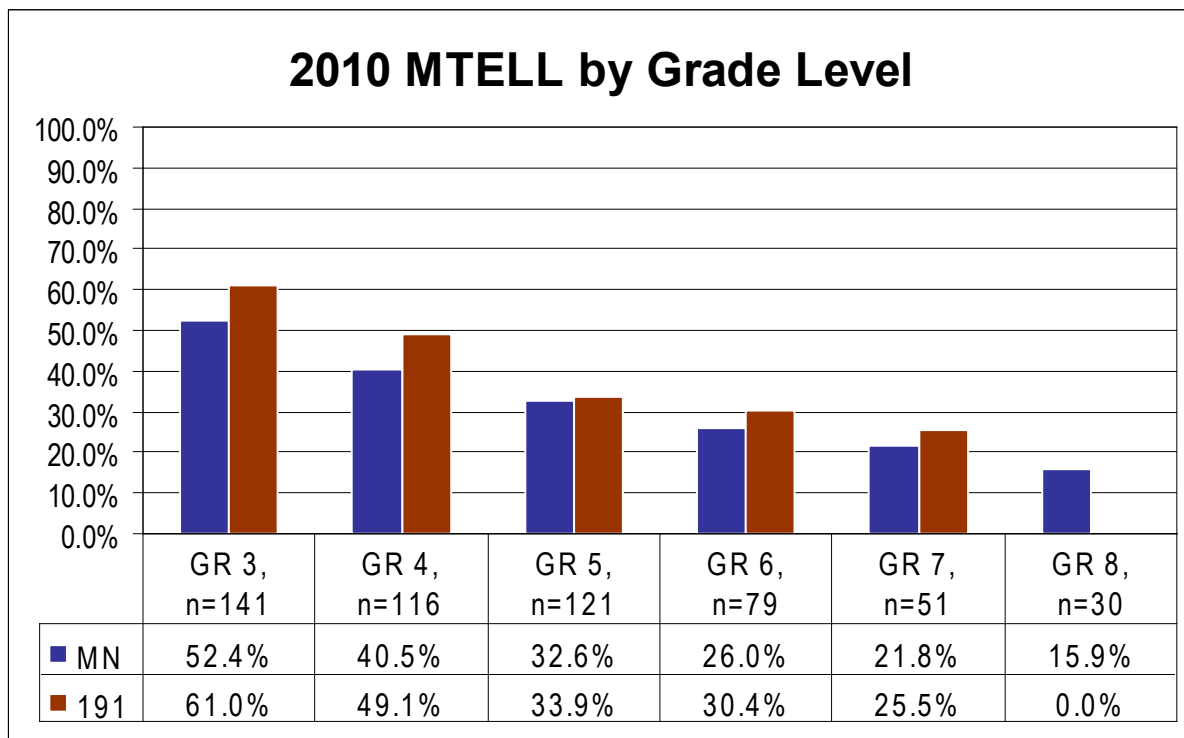
English Language Learners take state test

The Minnesota Test for English Language Learners (MTELL) is a computer-delivered mathematics test in grades 3-8 and 11 for students who are learning the English language.

Students may listen to test items as well as read them, and pictures/diagrams help students understand the language in the test items. The MTELL assesses the same grade level academic standards as the MCA-IIs.

District 191 students in grades 3-8 who participated in the MTELL test had a proficiency rate nearly 8% higher than the state-wide average and nearly a 9% increase from the 2008-09 school year.

The grade 3 student proficiency rate was approximately 9% higher than the state, the grade 4 proficiency rate was 9% higher than the state, and the grade 8 proficiency rate was nearly 16% lower than the state.





GRADUATION ASSESSMENT

Each spring students in grades 9-11 take the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment, Series II (MCA-II) with the Graduation Required Assessment for Diploma (GRAD) test embedded with in it.

These tests serve as part of the federal No Child Left Behind accountability framework used in Minnesota. The GRAD tests fulfill Minnesota’s high school graduation requirements.

Beginning with the class of 2010, students in Minnesota are required to score proficiently on the GRAD in order to receive a diploma from a public high school.

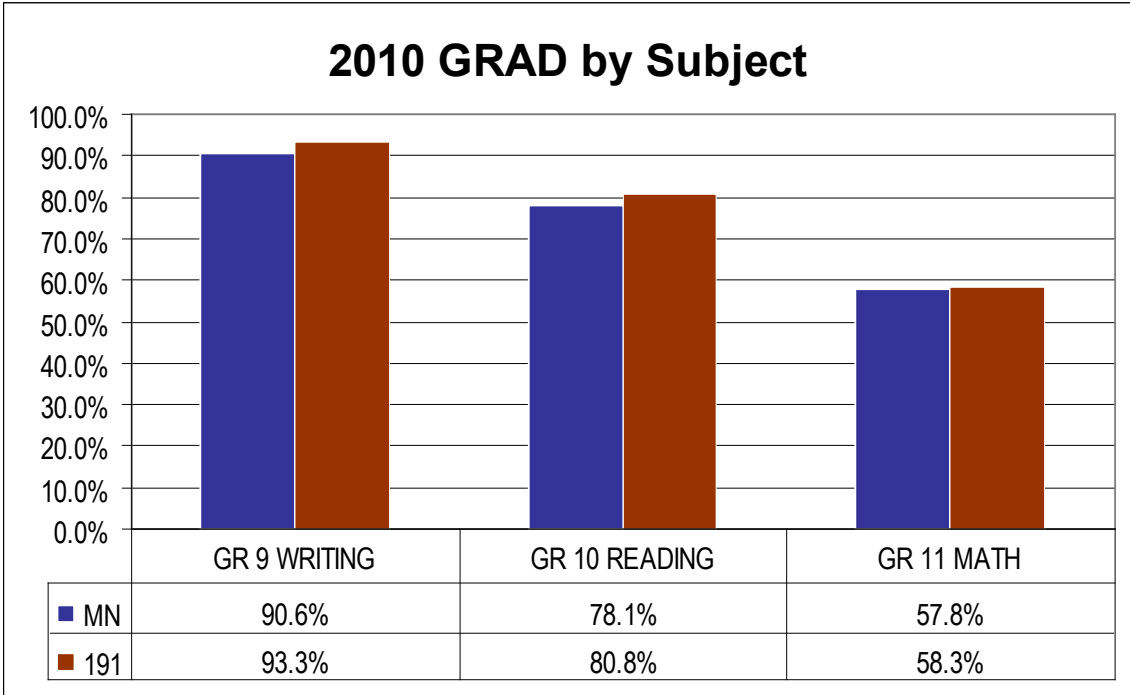
District 191 students earning a proficient score on

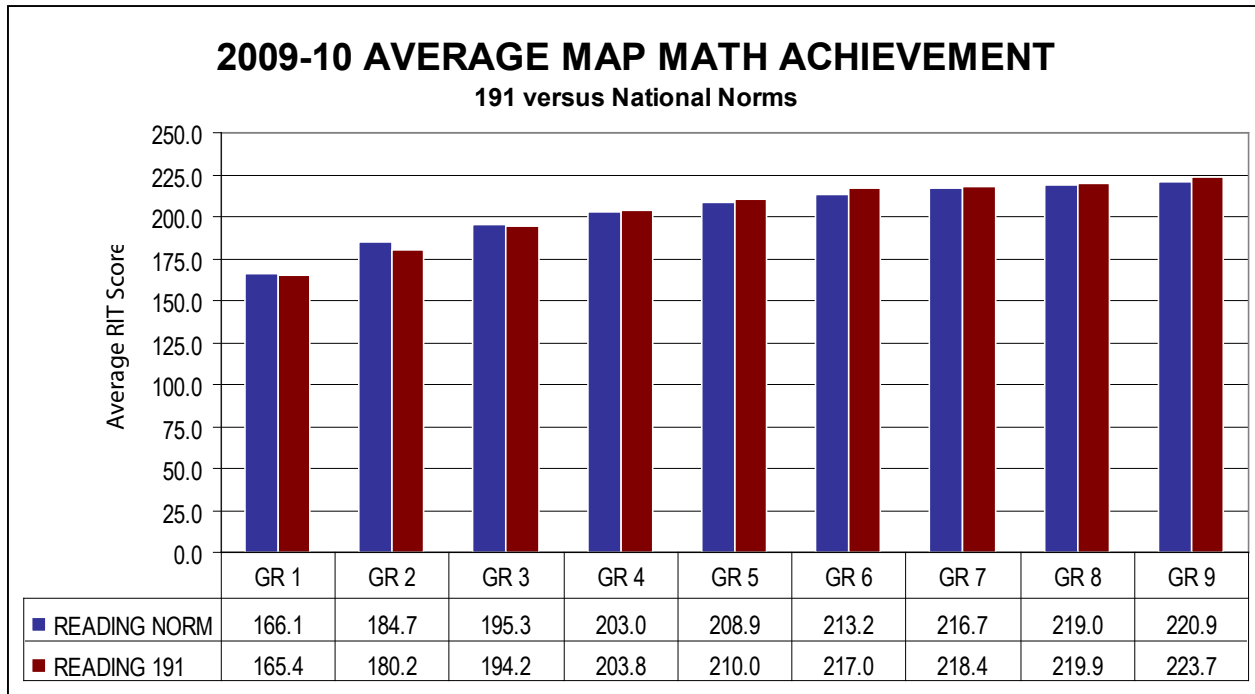
the MN GRAD (Graduation Required Assessment for Diploma) tests continue to out-pace the statewide average proficiency rates.

The GRAD Writing test proficiency rate for 9th graders was nearly 3% above the state average and nearly a 1% increase from the 2008-09 school year.

The GRAD Reading test proficiency rate for 10th graders was nearly 3% above the state average and slightly lower than the 2008-09 school year.

The GRAD Math test proficiency rate for 11th graders was nearly 1% above the state average representing a decrease of almost 4% from the 2008-09 school year.





MAP tests measure academic growth of students

Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) tests are computer driven assessments that reflect the instructional level of each student and measure growth over time. They are aligned to Minnesota State Academic Standards and provide accurate results for teachers to enhance their ability to:

- Monitor academic growth over time.
 - More accurately place students into instructional programming.
 - Identify specific skills individual students have solidified.
 - More accurately make decisions about student groupings.
- Make data-rich decisions at the classroom, school and system level.

Student scores are expressed in terms of RIT scores which stands for Rasch UnIT. The RIT measurement is on an equal-interval scale developed to simplify test

score interpretation. It will measure students' academic growth over time; much like a ruler will measure physical growth in feet and inches. The RIT scores range from approximately 150 to 300. RIT scores allow school districts to follow a student's academic growth from year to year.

District 191 students in grades 1 through 7 take the MAP test in the fall and spring. Those in grades 8 and 9 take the MAP test in the fall only.

In math, district students scored above the national norm throughout all grades with the exception of grade 1. Scores ranged an average of 3 points above the national norms.

Greatest achievement occurred in grade 6 at approximately 4 RIT points above the national norm and in grade 9 at approximately 3 RIT points above the national norm.

MAP TEST READING

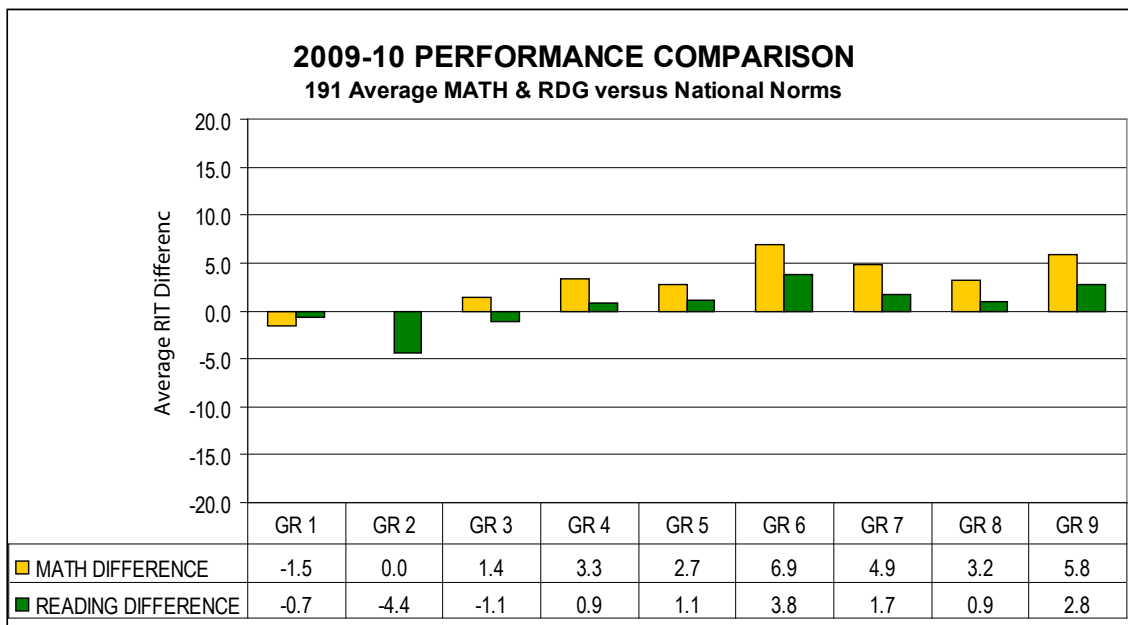
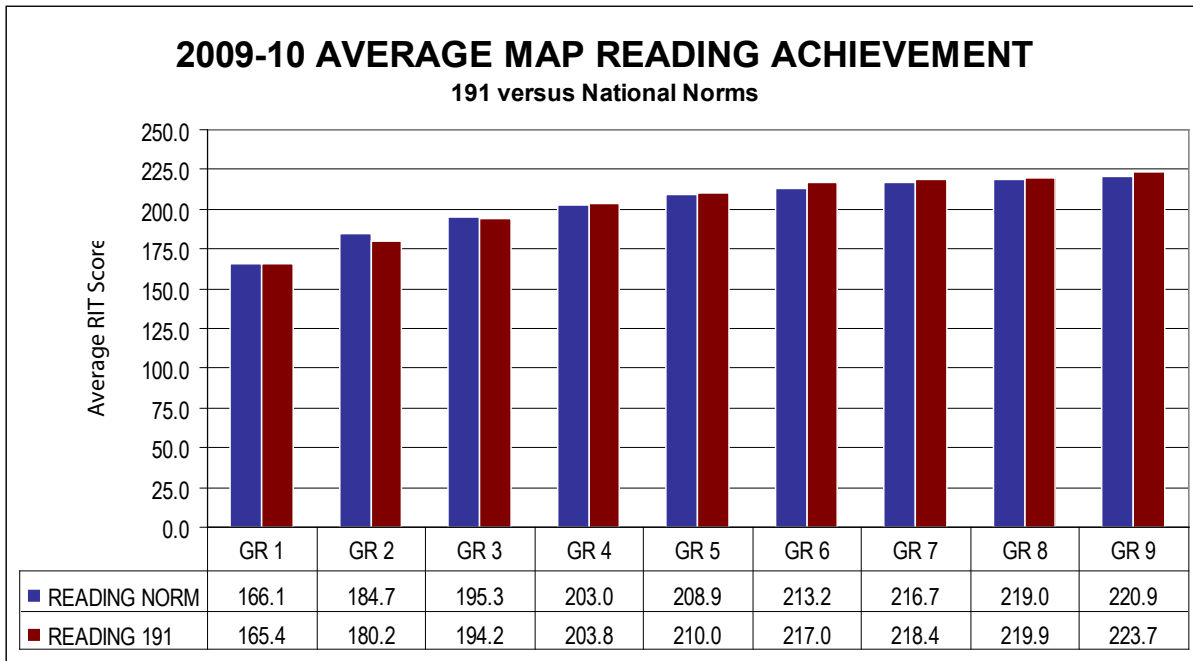


On the MAP reading tests, district students scored above the national norm throughout the upper elementary and secondary grades.

Scores ranged an average of nearly one point above the national norms, a lower margin than that of MAP

math score averages.

Greatest achievement occurred in grade 6 at approximately 4 RIT points above that national norm and in grade 9 at approximately 3 RIT points above the national norm.



When comparing 191 students in both math and reading to the MAP national norm, one can easily identify those grade levels which scored dramatically higher or lower than national norms on the bar chart, at left.

NOTE: National Norm is equal to zero.



Some students take alternative assessments

To meet the requirements of the federal No Child Left Behind Act, Minnesota provides an alternate assessment based on alternate achievement standards. The Minnesota Test of Academic Skills (MTAS) was developed for students with the most significant cognitive disabilities.

The MTAS measures the student's progress on the Minnesota Academic Standards which have been reduced in depth, breadth, and complexity. MTAS measures the extent to which students with significant cognitive disabilities are making progress in the general education curriculum. The MTAS is administered in reading, mathematics and science.

Determination about how an individual student with a disability will participate in statewide testing is made by the Individual Education Program (IEP) plan team. The decisions are documented on the student's IEP and address a variety of test purposes such as accountability, requirements for granting a diploma, and as needed, English Language Learner assessments.

The MTAS was given to students in the following grades and content areas during the 2009-10 school year: The percentage of proficiency is noted next to the academic area.

During the 2009-10 school year, 59 students in grades 3-10 took the MTAS in the area of reading. Students range from 45.5% proficiency in 4th grade to 100% proficiency in 8th grade. In the area of math, 62 students took the MTAS with a range of 40% proficient in 3rd grade to 100% proficient in 8th grade. Science proficiency scores were above the state average in two out of three grades with a total of 23 students taking the MTAS in this content area.

The district disseminated Individual Student Reports for the MTAS so that parents may view their child's test results. Parents, in collaboration with teachers, may use the reports to focus on their child's strengths and special challenges. District staff, including general and special education teachers, may use these reports as the basis for adjusting instructional strategies.

A second alternate assessment, the MCA-Modified, which is based on modified achievement standards is being developed and District 191 was a field test site during the 2009-10 school year. This test will be required for students who are not proficient two years in a row and who have a standards-based IEP.
