2024 Legislative Platform Survey

Please complete the following survey to assist the AMSD Legislative Committee in drafting a platform for the 2024 legislative session. The survey results will serve as the starting point for the development of the platform. Your participation is important and greatly appreciated.

Background

The 2024 session will convene on Feb. 12, 2024. Having adopted the biennial budget last session, legislators will focus on policy issues and perhaps approving a capital bonding bill. That said, if the November Budget and Economic Forecast projects a surplus, a supplemental budget bill will become a possibility.

As a reminder, the E-12 Education Bill approved last session increased funding by \$2.5 billion for the 2024-25 biennium and \$3.3 billion for the 2026-27 biennium, and included a formula increase of 4 percent for FY 24 and 2 percent for FY 25.

Several long-time AMSD priorities were included in the bill, including linking the formula to inflation with a minimum increase of 2 percent and a maximum increase of 3 percent; allowing locally elected school boards to renew an existing operating referendum one time; reducing the cross-subsidies in the special education and English learner programs; and expanding funding for the Voluntary Prekindergarten program and making funding for the previously approved seats permanent.

On the political front, 2024 is a presidential election year and Minnesota's eight congressional representatives and U.S. Sen. Amy Klobuchar will be on the ballot. Only House members will be on the ballot in state elections as the terms for the constitutional officers and state senators run through 2026. We also anticipate several AMSD member districts will have referendum questions on the ballot this fall, along with numerous school board and municipal elections.
