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Ends 404: SAFETY AND SECURITY

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Jordan School District will support and implement physically and emotionally safe school programs and procedures where learning can occur.

- A. School safety and security will be accomplished by providing a physically safe learning environment through safety and security programs that include:
1. Safe and secure buildings and grounds
  2. Emergency preparedness
  3. Student, staff and patron safety and welfare
  4. Timely communication to families (coordinated with police) if an emergency should occur
  5. Yearly communication to parents containing safety procedures and protocol
- B. School safety and security will be further accomplished by encouraging each school to foster an emotionally safe and a welcoming environment.
1. The updated District Plan addressing the mental, social, emotional, and physical well-being of students and employees will be implemented throughout the District and shall include the following components:
    - a. ~~1~~ Clearly articulated procedures and protocols regarding the wellness needs of students and employees
    - b. ~~2~~ Clearly defined resources regarding suicide prevention and anti-bullying strategies
    - c. ~~3~~ Clearly defined education process for students, parents, faculty, and staff
  2. Each school will create a Code of Conduct in collaboration with the school administration, faculty, and School Community Council. An anti-bullying program will be an element of each school's Code of Conduct and shall include the following components:
    - a. ~~1~~ Clearly articulated and defined desired actions and behaviors
    - b. ~~2~~ Clearly defined rules and consequences
    - c. ~~3~~ Clearly defined reporting process
    - d. ~~4~~ Clearly defined education process for students, parents, faculty, and staff
- C. Evidence of the above ~~will~~may be requested by a Board member and provided through multiple means.
1. The safety and security programs for physical safety shall be measured and assessed by:
    - a. Jordan Safety and Security Assessments (three times per year)
    - b. School Self-inspection Surveys (annually)
    - c. Jordan School District Online Satisfaction Surveys (annually)

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- d. Utah State Risk Inspections (annually)
  - e. Utah State Fire Inspections (annually)
  - f. Utah State Board of Health Inspections (annually)
  - g. End of year drill reporting from schools
  - h. Safety and Security Annual Report
2. The emotionally safe environment for schools shall be measured and assessed by:
- a. Code of Conduct from each school provided to the appropriate Administrator of Schools and available on the school's website (annually)
  - b. Dates of each school's Code of Conduct training provided to the appropriate Administrator of Schools (annually)
  - c. District Plan with clear procedures and protocols regarding the wellness needs of students and employees
  - d. Dates of training on the District Plan regarding the wellness needs of students and employees to be provided to the appropriate Administrator of Schools (annually)
  - e. Data from early warning systems for student interventions
  - f. Description of suicide, bullying, and violence prevention efforts
  - g. Data from Skyward behavior logs
  - d,h. School counselor student visit data
- D. The Board of Education will receive quarterly reports on school safety drills and incidents as well as anecdotal reports of efforts to establish an emotionally safe environment. review the policy quarterly ~~and~~ The Board will report annually to the community on the physical and mental safety of students.

President Miller presided and conducted. The Board of Education met in a study session to discuss the following:

**A. Math Presentation**

Carolyn Gough, administrator; Amanda Bollinger, staff assistant; and Amy Kinder, K-12 math consultant in Teaching & Learning, presented information on secondary mathematics. Ms. Gough explained there has been no established math curriculum for the past thirteen years and math scores are dropping district-wide. The presentation introduced the new optional math curriculum that the Teaching & Learning department hoped to implement district-wide. Ms. Bollinger explained that this program is cohesive, evidence-based, and capitalizes on three areas: focus, coherence, and rigor.

Dr. Kinder gave a detailed description of the curriculum: Imagine Math by Illustrative Mathematics. She explained that it is embedded in Canvas, can be customized, and will be piloted in 11 of 13 middle schools with at least three grade-level teams.

Mr. Dunford arrived at 4:19 p.m. and joined the meeting in progress.

Ms. Bollinger shared a recommended timeline for implementation and professional development. She explained the RFP process and noted the Imagine Math program purchase was approved by the Board in the February 28, 2023 Board meeting.

Dr. Godfrey said this will be a great support for students as well as teachers, who will receive more training and resources in the near future. He added that it is important to balance collective efficacy and teacher choice in curriculum materials, but he feels the program is a “huge leap forward.”

**B. Discussion on Full-day Kindergarten**

It was decided to postpone item B on the agenda to allow for full discussion of Summer 2023 Projects with those attending specifically for that agenda item. The discussion on full-day kindergarten will be introduced following the subsequent general session.

**C. Summer 2023 Project Review**

Marilyn Richards, Facilities Committee Chair, reported that although the summer projects budget was set at \$14 million this year, the bids came in significantly over budget. She asked Board members for input.

President Miller asked about grant funds from legislative bill HB61 that may be used for safety and security measures in schools. Dr. Anderson said preference will be given to lower enrollment districts and the amount districts may apply for is unclear at this time.

Ms. Miller asked about the deadline for the fuel network upgrades and Scott Thomas, Administrator of Auxiliary Services, said the State filling station requires replacing the fuel tanks in the near future and a portion of the total cost has already been committed to this project.

Board members discussed the purpose of financial reserves and the capacity for a lease revenue bond. Mr. Dunford gave a reminder there are six schools that will need to be built in the next few years and Board members expressed their voting preferences for the 2023 summer projects.

At 6:18 p.m., the meeting adjourned. The general session started at 6:38 p.m.

Senator Lincoln Fillmore said he was attending the meeting as a parent whose child is receiving a PTA Reflections award. He thanked the PTA and the Board for supporting the Reflections contest and giving students the opportunity to experience the arts.

##### **B. Patron Comments Regarding Non-Agenda Items**

Marsha Willcock, a teacher, expressed frustration about the new math curriculum. She feels teachers should have a choice and that there was not adequate information or training for the program.

Jessica Cadena, a teacher at West Jordan Elementary School, said teachers at the school are having difficulty with obtaining placement at other schools after the announcement of the school’s

pending closure. She asked the Board to revise their school closure policy to make the process less stressful for teachers trying to find new jobs.

Laura Nelson, an Elk Ridge Middle School teacher, thanked the Board and administration for allowing teacher choice in regard to the new math curriculum. She requested more training and information be given to teachers about the new program.

Lynsey Allred, a teacher, said she felt left out in the decision for the approved math curriculum. She discussed the process the steering committee went through and perceived lack of information. She feels the curriculum is inadequate compared with practices currently in use.

Jonathan Lawes, a teacher, said he feels the current math programs are working and is concerned with the lack of data to show improvement in student proficiency and growth using the new math curriculum.

President Miller presided and conducted. The Board of Education met in a study session to discuss the following:

**A. Continued Discussion on Board Policy E404 *Safety and Security***

Niki George gave a brief summary of the recent discussions about this policy noting the desire of the Board to add information quantifying data assessments for the physical and emotional safety of students.

Dr. Godfrey reviewed draft changes of Policy E404 which include the addition of two safety programs under item A: 1) timely communication to families in an emergency and 2) yearly communications to parents about safety procedures and protocol. He explained data assessment measures and anecdotal evidence that could be used and he shared examples with Board members. Dr. Godfrey explained that the Google document will automatically update as reports are entered so current data can be provided to the Board quarterly.

Ms. George advocated for candor in anecdotal reporting and President Miller asked about including reports in the yearly Superintendent Board report. It was decided to add wording to item C stating that evidence of providing an emotionally safe environment “may be requested” by Board members.

President Miller said the proposed changes will be added to the policy and it will be brought to the April 25, 2023 Board meeting for a final review and vote. Board members decided to discuss Policy E402 *Empowering Employees* at the next Board study session. Ms. Richards and Mr. Barnett agreed to lead the discussion.

**B. Board Priorities**

President Miller gave an overview of the Board’s current priorities and said the first priority, addressing hiring shortages of Education Support Professionals (ESPs), is currently being studied. A targeted approach for this issue was shared at the last Board meeting and negotiations will happen soon. Mr. Dunford announced the LEAC meeting will be held April 18, where ideas for addressing staffing shortages will be shared.

Ms. Miller said the next priority for the Board is the building bond plan. She noted the housing continuum was shared on BoardDocs and asked for Board member input.

Niki George wished to follow up on the ESP issue and said it would be helpful to obtain a comparative salary schedule with pay and benefits of nearby districts to reference in negotiations. Dr. Godfrey said he will have the data specified in Policy E402 (B2) available for the April 25, 2023 Board meeting.

President Miller resumed discussion about the building and bond priority and Marilyn Richards said the Facilities Committee is working on an updated plan based on documents and enrollment growth maps supplied by the Student Services department. Dr. Mike Anderson said the department is looking at permit priorities and ideas for streamlining the permit process during the upcoming enrollment permit window.

Ms. Miller explained that once the building plan is determined, the Finance Committee will look at options for financing new schools, with or without a bond.

**C. Review of National School Board Association (NSBA) Conference 2023**

President Miller mentioned the recent NSBA conference was attended by four Board members, Business Administrator Larsen and Superintendent Godfrey. She asked them to report on their experiences.

Darrell Robinson thanked the Superintendent and the Communications department for their informative and excellent presentation about district communication. He also attended classes on standardized testing, blended learning, electric buses and school safety.

Niki George enjoyed the District's communication presentation and said it is important to have a protocol in place for handling media requests. She attended classes on developing effective questioning techniques, curriculum adoption and board self-evaluation. From the latter class, she learned that schools that are outliers have a positive attitude about student learning despite challenges.

Lisa Dean enjoyed classes on student involvement, board self-assessment, modeling civility in the school district, and board member and public relationships. She suggested that self-assessment might be a good practice for the Jordan School Board as well as Board members taking opportunities to meet with stakeholders in a casual setting to hear their concerns and ideas.

Dr. Godfrey enjoyed participating in two presentations and thanked the Communications staff for their efforts, saying they did a great job in representing the District. President Miller agreed, noting the Communications staff gave a very professional and engaging presentation. Dr. Godfrey attended classes on preschool education, student engagement, energy and resource conservation, and how to pass bonds effectively. He also enjoyed sharing ideas with other superintendents.

Mr. Larsen attended classes on the different roles of school boards and superintendents, school safety, and the process of "going green." He offered Board members the opportunity to borrow professional development books he purchased at various conferences.

Tracy Miller said the conference reminded her that Jordan District does a great job. She attended classes about policies and planning, roles of committees, effective board communication, teacher retention, and school safety. She said she learned more about Robert's Rules of Order and how important it is for teachers to have a good relationship with principals.

President Miller announced next year's NSBA conference will be in New Orleans on April 6 through 8, 2024. She mentioned that Kristy Swett on the Salt Lake School Board has started her term as the president of NSBA.

President Miller requested Board members contact the Executive Committee if they have suggestions for future Board agendas.

Bryce Dunford said he is worried about the load placed on principals and their need for further leadership training. President Miller pointed out that principals must get an administrative license and the District provides training for them. Dr. Godfrey agreed with providing great support for administrators and pointed out the Deloitte Courageous Principals Training will be provided for principals this year. He suggested that principal support and training might be a good topic for further discussion in a future Board meeting.

**D. Board and Superintendent Reports and Comments**

Lisa Dean, Jordan Ethnic Advisory Committee (JEAC) Chair, reported on the meeting last week, saying they discussed the parent open house and how teachers and schools can provide more equity and emotional safety for students. She said they were reviewing a book titled *Street Data* by Shane Safir.

Bryce Dunford, Licensed Employee Advisory Committee (LEAC) Chair, gave a reminder of the April 18, 2023 meeting and invited Board members and administration to attend. He announced that the start time was changed to 4:15 p.m. and said he would appreciate more “listening ears” during the breakout portion of the meeting.

President Miller announced the Jordan Education Foundation Teacher of the Year Awards Banquet will be held April 13, 2023. The Foundation will also be holding the yearly Challenge Run on May 13, 2023 at Veterans Memorial Park in West Jordan. Registration is open now and all proceeds will be used for classroom grants.

Niki George, PTA representative, asked for ideas to recognize PTAs who have earned State PTA awards. Board members suggested a plaque or donation to their yearly fundraiser and Ms. George said she would look into these ideas.

Marilyn Richards, Utah High School Activities Association representative, reported that since recent realignment added another school to the 5A classification, the Association needs to elect an additional representative to serve on the Board of Trustees. She asked if Board members agreed with her casting this vote on their behalf and all agreed. She said the Association is considering sanctioning esports and since the initial vote failed, the topic will be revisited in November of 2023. Mr. Robinson asked about games being cancelled due to high school graduations and Ms. Richards said she will mention this to the Association.

President Miller reported that the Utah School Board Association is focusing on training board members and advocating for public schools with legislation.

Niki George asked if there was interest in expanding educational opportunities for Board members as she saw great value in attending the recent NSBA conference. Board members said conferences allow them to be more focused, make connections, and ask specific questions to presenters. President Miller said she would discuss this with the Executive Committee and bring back a proposal to a future Board meeting.

Superintendent Godfrey thanked everyone who made adjustments due to the recent snow day. He expressed gratitude for all who made the best of a difficult situation.

Dr. Godfrey announced that there is adequate funding and space available to provide full-day kindergarten in all schools next year. He thanked State legislators for making this possible and USBE for lobbying for the funding. He said parents have been informed of this change and given information on how to register for this option. He added that funding will be ongoing and will be folded into the FTE calculation.

Dr. Anderson said he had supplied all Board members with school Land Trust plans and reminded Board members of the process for approval. He requested Board members review and approve their respective school plans by April 21, 2023. He gave a “shoutout” to Nadine Page, administrative assistant, for her work on Land Trust plans and invited Board members to contact her if they have questions.

President Miller asked if Board members had interest in participating in city parades this year. It was decided that individual Board members may do so in their own voting district if they wish.

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Jordan School District will support and implement physically and emotionally safe school programs and procedures where learning can occur.

- A. School safety and security will be accomplished by providing a physically safe learning environment through safety and security programs that include:
1. Safe and secure buildings and grounds
  2. Emergency preparedness
  3. Student, staff and patron safety and welfare
  4. Timely communication to families (coordinated with police) if an emergency should occur
  5. Yearly communication to parents containing safety procedures and protocol
- B. School safety and security will be further accomplished by encouraging each school to foster an emotionally safe and a welcoming environment.
1. The updated District Plan addressing the mental, social, emotional, and physical well-being of students and employees will be implemented throughout the District and shall include the following components:
    - a. ~~1.~~ Clearly articulated procedures and protocols regarding the wellness needs of students and employees
    - b. ~~2.~~ Clearly defined resources regarding suicide prevention and anti-bullying strategies
    - c. ~~3.~~ Clearly defined education process for students, parents, faculty, and staff
  2. Each school will create a Code of Conduct in collaboration with the school administration, faculty, and School Community Council. An anti-bullying program will be an element of each school's Code of Conduct and shall include the following components:

    - b. School Self-inspection Surveys (annually)
    - c. Jordan School District Online Satisfaction Surveys (annually)

  - f. Description of suicide, bullying, and violence prevention efforts
  - g. Data from Skyward behavior logs

The Board of Education will receive quarterly reports on school safety drills and incidents as well as anecdotal reports of efforts to establish an emotionally safe environment. review the policy quarterly ~~and~~ The Board will report annually to the community on the physical and mental safety of students.
