## **New Courses For 2016-2017**



### **New Courses**

**Functions, Statistics and Trigonometry-** This is a math elective available for students that have completed Algebra, Geometry and Algebra II. This fills a need as currently the choices for students are Pre-Calculus, Statistics and Elementary Algebra. The class would focus on functions, statistics and trigonometry and would serve as a stepping stone to Pre-Calculus in New Glarus or in college. This course would use the CPM curriculum as the delivery model of the learning targets. The course will be two .5 credit trimesters and students can take either one or both if desired.

**Critical Thinking In Science-** This is another science alternative for junior students. Currently, junior students will take Physics or Advanced Placement Biology or Chemistry. This course will be centered around the ACT science standards and will focus on the ACT skills of “Interpretation of Data”, “Scientific Inquiry” and “Experimental Results.” The course is .5 credits.

**Understanding Music-** This course is a high school general music class and would align with the Wisconsin State Standards for Music. Students would have the opportunity to explore all types of music from a historical and cultural level. There is a clear connection between history and social studies to the arts and this course would combine those connections. The course will be worth .5 credits.

**Exploring Hospitality-** This course is a dual-credit course offered through Madison College. It is a course for 9-12 students and will better equip students for hospitality careers in the New Glarus Area. The course introduces students to the broad spectrum of hospitality and tourism services industry. The course explores typical career areas including lodging, cruising, restaurant and food services, managed services, beverages, club management, attractions, recreation management, convention services and event and meeting management.

**Social Studies Seminar-** Social Studies Seminar, a new class this year will be aligned with AP for next year, which will allow students to earn credit.
