
NFMS Pack Group Joins Dylan's Wings of Change

New Fairfield Middle School is taking on a new challenge this school year. They are working with Mr. Ian Hockley and Mrs. Erin Schumacher on the Wingman project with "Dylan's Wings of Change." Dylan Hockley, age 6, was a child with autism. This illness displayed many obstacles during his development. Tragically, Dylan lost his life in the Newtown shooting on December 14, 2012, along with 19 other students and six brave educators.

"Wingman is based on leadership principles, peer modeling, and recognizing positive behaviors in all children," Dylan'sWingsofChange.org states. Wingman originated when Erin Schumacher and her husband were aggravated with their school district for not allowing their autistic son to play a sport. Ian Hockley found out about this program and wanted to participate in Dylan's honor. They called this program Wingman. Hockley welcomed Wingman into his already existing organization, Dylan's
