The regular meeting of the Board of Education was called to order at 7:01 p.m. by Chairman Palmer in the Mabelle B. Avery Middle School-BOE Board Room.

4.1 Building Goals Presentation

Somers Elementary School’s building goal for 2010-2011 is to improve reading performance on formative, summative and state assessments by more clearly aligning instruction with the Grade Level Objectives and Connecticut Mastery Test strands and objectives. Classroom performance on formative and summative assessments and CMT scores indicates a need to improve students performance in the area of reading. Action plans have been developed and

are being implemented. Progress is being monitored by the building administrators, the Director of Curriculum and the Superintendent.

Mabelle B. Avery Middle School's has two building goals for 2010-2011. Goal one is to improve student performance on written work in all content areas using strategies to improve editing and revising/composing and the second goal is to improve student performance in the area of Geometry and Measurement. Action plans have been developed and are being implemented in all subject areas.

Somers High School's building goal for 2010-2011 is to improve academic performance across all content areas as measured by national, state and departmental assessments. Each department has identified where there is need for improvement and has developed goals and action plans to improve student performance in these areas.

The 2010-2011 goal for Technology and Information Services is to develop, implement and troubleshoot a K-3 standards based report card within PowerSchool.

The Pupil Services/Curriculum 2010-2011 goal is to improve student performance on the CAPT and CMT by implementing an effective intervention process that meets students' academic and behavioral needs.

All building and department goals have been aligned with the district Strategic Plan.

10.1 SHS Exit Survey Results
G.Cotzin, Somers High School Principal, presented comparative data from the exit surveys that were completed by the 2009 and 2010 graduating classes. Mr. Cotzin noted the areas of improvement but stated that the overall results reflected little change. Students seem very satisfied with their education, co-curricular activities and school environment.

ERASE will be conducting a survey this year through SADD. This survey is done every three years.

Mr. Cotzin presented the results of an Alumni Survey that was conducted with graduates from 2008 and 2009. Mr. Cotzin stated that the number of responses was very low but those who did respond, did so favorably. Mr. Cotzin will be looking at ways to improve survey participation by alumni.

Reader's
Workshop in
Kindergarten
through Grade 5

What is Reader's Workshop

- Reader's Workshop is a reading instructional model researched and developed at the Columbia University Teacher's College.
- It is designed to increase stamina and independence by controlling several of the factors that contribute to lack of success.
- It focuses on student engagement in reading and the development student-text connections.



How Does Reader's Workshop Work

- The teacher determines the independent reading level of each student in the class.
- The teacher puts together an array of books on that child's reading level and gives it to the student. The books include both fiction and non-fiction choices.
- The teacher teaches a “mini-lesson” about a specific topic in reading.



How Does Reader's Workshop Work

- The students use their independent reading books to practice the skill presented in the mini-lesson during a 70 minute block.
- Students keep journals of their responses to the books they are reading.
- While students are practicing independently and journaling, the teacher leads guided reading groups or conferences one-on-one with students to provide additional support.



What is a Mini-Lesson?

- The mini-lesson has several parts:
 - Readaloud
 - Explaining the reading skill/strategy
 - Modeling the reading skill/strategy
 - Providing instructions for the independent reading portion of the workshop.
- The mini-lessons are designed to cover the reading skills appropriate for students at that grade level.



What Happens During Independent Reading?

- Students use their “Just Right” books to practice what they learned during the mini-lesson.
 - Peer conferencing
 - Response writing
 - Note Taking
- Independent reading progress is monitored through conferences and group share-outs.



How Are We Monitoring the Workshop Model?

- Instructional Rounds
 - A group of teachers and administrators from throughout the district does visits to classrooms during the Reader's Workshop time and provides helpful feedback to the teachers regarding areas for growth.
 - The first Rounds visit for SES happened on October 21st and the second will be in February.



How Are We Monitoring the Workshop Model?

- DIBELS

- Students in K-2 are assessed twice a month on an early literacy skill to determine if they are making appropriate progress.

- MAZE Fluency

- Students in 3-5 are assessed twice a month on reading fluency and comprehension to determine if they are making appropriate progress.



How Are We Monitoring the Workshop Model?

- Connecticut Benchmark Assessment System (CBAS)
 - Students in 3-5 are assessed three times a year in their specific grade level reading strands.
- Students who are not showing proficiency in their grade level reading skills are provided additional assistance and monitored more closely. (SRBI)

4.1 Curriculum Presentations (Literacy/English & Technology Integration)

Director of Curriculum, K.Pezza, focused her presentation on the changes that are taking place at Somers Elementary School in regards to literacy and improving reading scores. Mrs. Pezza reported that the instructional model, Reader's Workshop, is being implemented at the elementary school to increase stamina and independence by controlling several factors that contribute to students lack of success. The program focuses on student engagement in reading and the development of student-text connections. Using a PowerPoint presentation, Mrs. Pezza explained how the program works.

Mrs. Pezza explained the ways in which the workshop model is being monitored and assessed. Mrs. Pezza will update the Board on the program's progress in mid-January.

Mrs. Pezza stated that students who are not showing proficiency in their grade level reading skills are provided additional assistance and monitored more closely using SRBI.

Prior to the meeting, Director of Technology and Information Services, J.Morrow, sent the Board members an email that included links to resources used by staff and students. Mr. Morrow used some of the links to demonstrate how technology is being integrated into the classroom.

Mr. Morrow reported that teachers have made improvements to their web pages.

A discussion was held regarding various ways professional development could be made available for teachers who want to know more about integrating technology into their lessons and web pages.

Chairman Palmer stated that the newly formed Board of Education Technology Committee discussed this at their first meeting.

Chairman Palmer reported receipt of a letter from CABE informing the Board that the district's publication, *Campus View*, won Honorable Mention in the CABE Award of Excellence for Educational Communications. Winning districts will be showcased at the 2010 CABE/CAPSS Convention in November. Chairman Palmer congratulated everyone who was involved in putting together *Campus View*.
