- Evolved into a longitudinal model that provides a continuous string of academic components.






#### **ANSEP History**

How to Apply: Placement Scores

- Minimum math placement:
  - MATH A105 Intermediate Algebra
    - ALEKS score > 30

- Minimum English placement:
  - WRTG A111 Writing Across Context
    - Accuplacer Scores (Writing: 265 & Reading: 265) or a combined score of 530



How to Apply: Application Dates & Deadlines

- Fall Acceptance:
  - Early March: Priority application deadline
  - Late March: Application notifications
  - Early April: Student meetings start for fall class registration
  - Mid April: Open Registration for Fall Courses
  - Early August: Final Application Deadline
  - Week Before Classes: Fall Orientation Week \*Overnight at UAA Anchorage campus\*
  - Late August: Fall Classes Start
