BOARD OF EDUCATION

Bristol, Connecticut Regular Meeting – October 3, 2012

The regular monthly meeting of the Bristol Board of Education was held on Wednesday, October 3, 2012, at 7:00 p.m., at the Board of Education Administration Building, located at 129 Church Street, Bristol, Connecticut.

PRESENT: Commissioners: Lawrence Amara, Karen Bourassa, Genard Dolan, Jill Fitzgerald, Karen Hintz, Jeffrey Morgan, Thomas O'Brien, Karen Vibert, Christopher Wilson; Ellen Solek, Superintendent of Schools, Susan Kalt Moreau, Deputy Superintendent of Schools, Kim Hapken, Director of Special Services, Dennis Bieu, Director of Human Resources and David Mills, City Council Liaison

CALL TO ORDER, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, MOMENT OF SILENCE

Chairman Wilson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and invited the audience to join him in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. He informed the Board that October 5th is World Teacher Day. It is a day that you stand up for a teacher; reach out to a teacher and let them know that you appreciate them.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

On motion of Commissioner O'Brien, seconded by Commissioner Hintz, it was unanimously

VOTED: That the minutes of the October 3, 2012 Regular Board of Education meeting be approved as written.

Committee Reports

Finance Committee

Commissioner Vibert reported that the committee met earlier this evening and they received an update on the current budget situation from Mr. Franzi. The Board is currently \$400,000 in the black; however there is risk and exposure going towards that as there a Transportation deficit in the amount of \$300,000. We are working hard to stay on track; we are also working with the Mayor's committee on combining services and Commissioner O'Brien is working with bargaining units to continue finding ways to save money as we are in year four of level funding.

Operations Committee

Commissioner Fitzgerald reported that the committee met on September 20th. They heard a presentation from DCS Energy regarding placement of solar panels on our school buildings. They also heard a presentation by the Bristol Eastern lights project subcommittee regarding their fundraising efforts. The committee was provided information on the Solar Credit Legislation. Commissioner Fitzgerald thanked Commissioner Hintz for providing someone to share that information with the group. There was also a presentation by Metro PCS regarding a change of the siting of the cellular tower request that previously submitted and approved by the board. The initial siting did not meet the setback requirement from the property line. Therefore we are asking the board to re-approve this project.

On motion of Commissioner Fitzgerald, seconded by Commissioner Bourassa, it was unanimously

VOTED: That the Board of Education add the Metro PCS Tower item to the agenda for a vote.

Commissioner Fitzgerald made a motion to approve the siting of a Metro PCS cellular tower on property at Northeast School and refer this matter to City Council for further. *The motion was approved by Commissioner Dolan and seconded by Commissioner Amara.*

Superintendent Report

Dr. Solek provided a report on the following topics: 2012 CAPT/CMT Testing results for the district, Identified Goals and Objectives for Growth, Statewide Changes and Implications for Testing/Accountability and a Middle School Intramurals Update.

Highlighted information from that report include: District wide growth on CAPT, with Science being a continued focus area, as we have shown little or no growth in this area. We continue to show significant gains in Math, Reading and Writing so we will continue current interventions and strategies. All standardized testing for CAPT and CMT will transition to on-line administration by 2014-2015. The State would like all districts to administer these tests online; however we need to insure that our transition hardware and software can support the demands that state has placed on all districts. The CMT results for Bristol continue to reflect performance improvement. We will want to seed growth in the areas of focus. So, in Cohorts 3 and 4 we will continue current interventions, in Cohort 5 will become a focus areas for Math and Writing and Cohort 6 will have math as a focus area.

Dr. Moreau presented Statewide Changes and Implications for Testing/Accountability. A full accountability report will be brought to the board later in the fall, and once the schools have completed their accountability plans, they will be reporting their plans to you as well.

Denise Carabetta discussed the Smarter Balance Assessment that will be rolled out soon.

The Middle School Intramurals program is a work in progress, participation numbers have increased from 280 last year to 506 this year. The program rolled out fall type sports; soccer and running were the only sports being offered at Greene Hills and West Bristol. Jamboree preparation will be announced next week. The winter season sign-ups will begin in mid-November with basketball, Zumba and weight training being offered.

Following the Superintendents report, there was discussion regarding transportation for the intramural program, coaching positions, participation numbers and suggestions for improvement.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Shelly D'Amato – 45 Concetta Lane – She addressed the board regarding her opposition to the elimination of interscholastic sports. She feels that the cuts that are being made are cheating the students out of competitive sports, which is so important it drives them to perform better academically. For kids that have played competitively, it's more like no more than a social hour. Education does not end in the classroom, Teamwork, discipline, time management, winning and losing are all part of the learning process. The Board request the funds to reinstate interscholastic sports in the middle schools.

Chairman Wilson briefly explained the budget process.

Paige McLaughlin - 110 Old Farms Road – She addressed board regarding intramural sports. She believes that the removal of sports will bring about negative effects such as fallen grades and less competitive high school teams. Bristol has a history of highly competitive high school sports, a history that brings great pride with it. Please reconsider reinstatement of middle school competitive sports program, if not now, then for the 2013- 2014 school year.

Gerard Couture - 94 View Street – He addressed the board regarding middle school sports. He believes in the formula for education that the Superintendent spoke about, but part of that formula is competitive sports. He is asking the board go to the Board of Finance to ask for an appropriation to support interscholastic sports in the middle schools.

William Cushing - 214 Brentwood Drive – He addressed the board regarding middle school. He feels that the board can make corrections in 2013-2014, for the hits that the middle school took this year. The curriculum in the middle school needs to be looked at; he gave an example of a current schedule, and how the schedule needs to be looked at because it is confusing and the students are still missing out on some of the classes. In regards to interscholastic sports and intramurals, he knows that it is a work in progress, but he feels the program should have started in early September, not late September. Next year we need to start the program earlier and build in some competitiveness.

Paul Johndrow – addressed the board regarding sports. The district seems to do a lot of testing and retesting, perhaps we need look at things that can be changed, or eliminated so that things are not so complicated. Board of Education should be able to go to the City for additional funds to add the programs that have been cut back into the budget.

Old Business

Commissioner Fitzgerald asked if we had looked at the Pay to Play option? Chairman Wilson stated that yes we have looked at it, but with a 42% Free and Reduced population, in order to use that program, we would have to subsidize too many students; we would simply break even by the time we implemented the program. Commissioner Vibert added that the Free and Reduced lunch population would be subsidized, but those families that are just above that level could not be subsidized and they would not be able to afford it. Dr. Solek also added that she recently had experience in looking at the Pay to Play program, and that the cost to implement such a program works out to be quite costly In fact, there are a few districts that have forfeited the programs all together, due to the expenses related to the program. Council Liaison David Mills encouraged looking at the current program and trying to make it much more competitive, by looking at the amount of time spent, and the way it is organized. With the right leadership from the staff, and getting over the learning curve, the program could work. We just need to make it more competitive as the year goes along and try to get the most out of the program. One of things that will need to be looked at is the bus situation. If you do not provide rides, kids are not going to be available to participate.

City Council Correspondence Regarding Stafford School Property

Chairman Wilson and Dr. Solek walked the property and having done so, she agrees with the board's previous decision.

Commissioner Vibert asked if the Board had other land that could be developed, such as at West Bristol. The City owns the property at West Bristol, but it abuts the school property. There are a couple of acres that were not developed, and with funding we would be able to convert to additional fields.

On motion of Commissioner Vibert, seconded by Commissioner Morgan, it was unanimously

VOTED: That the Board of Education reaffirm the boards decision to recommend the sale to the City Council for the property abutting Stafford School and Patricia Drive.

Commissioner Dolan walked the property as well, and the cost to develop the land would not be in the best interest of the board

New Business

Commissioner Fitzgerald ask if the board could revisit the changes that were made to the middle school program in regards to music, band and the health curriculum. A report will be provided at the next regular meeting.

Building Committee Reports

Forestville School

Dr. Moreau reported that the old school is gone; drainage is being put in and we will hopefully have asphalt laid by the middle of November. That will free up space for parents to drive through and exit on Daley Street. There are still snags in the construction of the millwork. The cubbies have not been completed for Kindergarten and First grade but they are working with the company on that, as well as getting all the shelving in the library installed and getting all the boxes unloaded. We regret not having the library completed when the building opened, but without the shelves, no books could go in.

West Bristol School

Commissioner Wilson reported that they are knocking out punch list items, addressing phone system problems and sidewalk issues. The City has a bid out to fix where there are gaps in the sidewalk and movement of the pole around the firehouse, this will make it safe for children to walk; this work should be completed by the end of November. We are currently accommodating parents by busing those students

instead of having them walk. The progress on the two schools has been going well. We hope to have an open house at West Bristol at the beginning of November. We will have to see how the weather treats us in terms of Greene Hills, we cannot have an open house until the parking lot is complete. We will make sure that the press writes something about the public open house, and everyone it will be open to everyone. and open it for everyone to see.

Information

Commissioner Hintz told the board that she had attended the Hubbell Welcome Back Night Open House. Rochelle Schwartz and her staff put on a great age appropriate scavenger hunt that had the students and parents really engaged. It was a warm and welcoming event. Bristol Eastern hosted its annual at home football game, it went well except for the score.

Genard Dolan attended the Bristol Eastern football game, and that was all he needed to say.

Chairman Wilson said CABE they are going to try to engage with some of the legislators at the State House; Education Committee in particular about how to deal with the underfunded and unfunded mandates; we have discussed this before, hopefully we can make some headway this time.

FEDERAL CONSOLIDATED GRANT

Title I, Part A Grant
Public Total \$1,564,049
Neglected Total \$1,250

The Title IA, Improving Basic Programs grant, funds a total of 11.7 certified staff, who are the instructional support teachers at the elementary and middle school level. In addition, the grant funds, 0.5 middle school support staff, 0.2 secretary, 0.5 grants clerk, 0.5 grants manager, 0.3 grant accountant, 2.0 literacy interns, parent involvement coordinator, 0.5 outreach worker, and employee benefits for teachers, the grants clerk, the grants manager, and the grants accountant. The remaining grant funds are used to provide professional development in literacy and mathematics, provide for literacy teacher participation in literacy seminars, provide tutoring, provide for parent activities programs, provide field trips for students, and purchase teaching materials and equipment.

Title II, Part A Grant total: \$210,742

The Title IIA, Teacher and Principal Training grant, funds salaries for 2.0 elementary teaching positions employee benefits for teachers, and professional development programs for teachers.

Private School grants

In addition, the Bristol Public Schools manages \$4258 in Title IA and \$24,715 in Title IIA for the local non-public schools.

11-12 E-rate Narrative

The *Telecommunications Reform Act of 1996* created a tax supported fund to assist schools and libraries with technology improvements. Funds provided to the district are reimbursements for telecommunications costs that include telephone services, network connectivity, & cell phone use.

The Federal Communications Commission oversees this program and distributes funding to our school district through the not for profit Schools and Libraries Division (SLD) of the Universal Service Administration.

Applications to the SLD for telecommunications reimbursement occur on an annual basis and require a complex process of filing multiple electronic forms over the Internet. Reimbursement rates are never a guarantee and vary from year to year based upon the free & reduced price lunch counts for the school district as reported by the federal government. Funds from these reimbursements must be used to support the technology infrastructure of the school district.

The **11-12** reimbursement will be used to purchase:

- Installation services on network equipment and projectors;
- Replacement of 7-8 year old switching equipment within individual school networks;
- Electrical and data networking components for school computer labs;
- SmartBoards and projectors for school classrooms; and,
- Chromebook computers for pilot projects in schools.

GRANT FUNDS from the CARL D. PERKINS CAREER and TECHNICAL EDUCATION ACT OF 2006 (Public Law 109-270).

Signed into law on August 12, 2006, the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act promote a new vision for technical education in the 21st century. The goals for this new vision are focused on improving student achievement, and;

- integrating academic and technical education;
- promoting student attainment of challenging academic and technical standards;
- providing students with a strong experience in, and understanding of, all aspects of industry;
- involving parents and employers;
- providing strong linkages between secondary and post-secondary education;
 and.
- developing, improving and expanding the use of technology.

Funds from the Perkins Act must be used to promote innovation and continuous improvement in technical education so that students acquire the skills and knowledge they need to meet challenging state academic standards and industry-recognized skill standards.

Carl Perkins funding for Bristol will be used to support ongoing curriculum revision efforts in the Business, Family & Consumer Sciences, and Technology programs at each high school. Professional development activities and sessions for teachers are aimed at increasing their content knowledge in support of work to align courses with state and national standards. Teachers are also working to integrate the development of reading and mathematics skills along with the technical skills required within specific career pathways.

Equipment funds will be used to purchase a studio mixing board for each school's TV studio. Laptop computers will be purchased for Child Development classes at Bristol Central High School. Plans also call for the purchase of supplemental reading materials to support both in-class and out-of-class reading and the development of common core required skills within technical content areas.
