RECOMMENDATION:

Pending the Board Curriculum Committee recommendation, approve the purchase of AP Calculus instructional resources associated with Demana, *Advanced Placement Calculus Graphical Numerical Algebraic 6th edition* for the Advanced Placement (AP) Calculus courses from Savvas Learning at a cost not to exceed \$107,000 with 6-year online licenses and 2 hours of resource training.

FUNDING SOURCE: General Fund

BACKGROUND:

- The print and digital resources meet the curricular requirements of AP Calculus as outlined by the College Board. Current, high-quality resources will support teachers and students in these Advanced Placement courses.
- Updated print and online digital resources are needed to support instruction and learning of AP Calculus. The resources integrate with the district learning management system Canvas.
- Calculus was last reviewed in 2010. An earlier edition of this textbook was selected: Prentice Hall—Calculus: Graphical, Numeric ©2010.
- During the AP Precalculus review process in 2023-2024, AP Calculus teachers worked with AP Precalculus teachers and decided to continue with the text they are currently using and to update to the ©2020 6th edition. AP Calculus and AP Precalculus teachers will use the same line of texts, publisher, and online platform for consistency for both students and teachers.
- The resources associated with this resource will provide experiences for teachers and students:
 - O Digital aspects will allow teachers to organize components to support students' best learning using online text, video, and audio resources.
 - These resources' various capabilities will support students through features such as Advanced Placement study items, translation options, and various study assistant tools.

Minutes of the Curriculum Committee of the Board of Education Held on August 14, 2024

Present: Maggie Terryn and Malorie Ninemeier Staff: Scott Haid, Julie Davis, Christine Annese

Meeting began at 3:30 p.m.

I. Public Comments

There was public comment related to the BOE meetings being posted to youTube and regarding class rankings/Valedictorian/meanings of regalia.

II. Updates

Finance

Provided by Julie Davis, Assistant Superintendent for Finance and Operations

- A. Assistant Superintendent Davis provided a bond construction update and a budget update and shared that the auditors will be here next week. She shared that the EHS cell tower project has been paused. Due to that, the handheld unit connectivity has been enhanced at EHS for security.
- B. Assistant Superintendent Davis shared information about the action items that will move to the Board for approval. The Instruction Department has three items moving forward that are referenced below. There will be requests for diesel fuel purchase, Allied Electric (EMS), Parkway Electric (FAC), and one property tax refund.
- C. Member Terryn asked about the Section 35J grant spending. Assistant Superintendents Davis and Haid clarified that the Section 35J grant spending was set up with a 2-year planned approach.

Instruction

Provided by Scott Haid, Assistant Superintendent for Instruction

- A. Assistant Superintendent Haid shared with the committee data from the 23-24 Culture & Climate Survey. The data presented covered the areas of academics, behavior, and culture & climate. It was presented as trend data 2019-2024, omitting 2020 because there was no data collected.
- B. Assistant Superintendent Haid shared that the 2023-2024 Culture & Climate data and trend data would be used by the Instruction Learning Teams (ILT) on Thursday, August 15, 2024. The teams would be unpacking the data and using it for 2024-2025 planning.
- C. Review the Instruction Department's Board Finance Requests
 Assistant Superintendent Haid shared the items being requested for purchase:

IV. Superintendent's Update

Dr. Kirby shared that staff have been getting ready to greet students by attending meetings and trainings related to PLC+, new administrators, technology onboarding, specials scheduling, full leadership team (supported by OAK Construction), DCIT, BenQ Boards, area staff, transportation, building secretary, transportation, ISD transportation, new staff, CPR, and Instructional Leadership Team (ILT).

The district also provided two online parent portal open houses which were well received and serviced over 100 families.

Dr. Kirby also shared that contract negotiations were almost complete with two left to finalize.

Meeting ended at 3:33 p.m.
